Coming off a 5-0 opening weekend in Las Vegas, the No. 4 Arkansas Razorbacks travel south to the Sunshine State Feb. 17-19 for the TaxAct Clearwater Invitational. Arkansas opens the tournament against No. 7 Florida State at noon CT Friday on ESPNU. In Friday's nightcap, the Hogs will take on No. 19 Duke at 5 p.m. on ESPN+. Saturday's tilt includes Indiana and No. 24 Louisiana at noon and 3:30 p.m. with both games available on ESPN+. Arkansas faces a tough Nebraska squad at 8:30 a.m. Sunday on SEC Network.


RAZORBACK **NOTABLES**

Need to Know

- Head coach Courtney Deifel is just TWO wins away from becoming the program's all-time wins leader. Deifel, who currently has 243 wins at Arkansas, needs one win to match former head coach Carrie Dever-Boaz's (1997-2004) program-record 244 victories. Deifel needs two wins (245) to become the program's all-time wins leader.
- Arkansas will make its first appearance in the TaxAct Clearwater Invitational this weekend.
- The Razorbacks are familiar with playing in Florida. Last season, the Hogs went a perfect 6-0 in the Sunshine State, sweeping Florida for the first time in Gainesville (April 22-24) and going 3-0 in the SEC Tournament hosted by Florida for the program's first SEC tournament crown.
- Three Hogs are natives to the Clearwater area: fifth-year Kristina Foreman (Tampa), freshman Robyn Herron (Tampa) and junior Callie Turner (Land O'Lakes). Former Hog and 2021 SEC Pitcher of the Year Mary Haff (Winter Haven) is also from the area.
- Arkansas will face ranked competition for the first time this season as they battle three ranked teams in Clearwater: No. 7 Florida State, No. 19 Duke and No. 22 Louisiana. The Razorbacks were 12-5 against ranked competition during the regular season last year (ESPN.com/USA Softball Top 25).
- The Razorbacks are coming off a 5-0 opening weekend at the Rebel Kickoff in Las Vegas where they outscored competition 51-9 and recorded three shutouts. Arkansas' 51 runs are the most opening weekend runs produced in program history.
- For the first time in program history, the Razorbacks shut out three straight opponents to start the season.
- The Hogs checked in at No. 4 in several polls this week, which matches the program's best in-season ranking.
- Rookie shortstop Atalyia Rijo earned SEC Freshman of the Week after slashing .636/1.000/.733 with a teambest seven hits along with six runs scored, five RBIs, one home run and a double. Rijo and Hannah Camenzind are the first Arkansas freshmen to homer opening weekend since current Hog Hannah Gammill did in 2021.
- Arkansas, who won the 2022 SEC Regular Season and Tournament titles, will take on the 2022 ACC Tournament Champions Florida State, the 2022 Sun Belt Regualr Season and Tournament Champions Louisiana and the 2022 Big Ten Tournament Champions Nebraska.
- Deifel's best start to a season at Arkansas was in 2018, when her squad culminated a 9-0 mark before falling in their 10th game of the season to McNeese.
- The Hogs will compete against Duke and Indiana for the first time in history.

- Winning the SEC regular season crown in 2021 and 2022. Arkansas added the program's first tournament title in 2022 after downing the Missouri Tigers, 4-0, in Gainesville, Fla. The Razorbacks were the only power five program last season to win their conference's regular season and tournament championships.
- Arkansas is one of four SEC program's to win back-to-back regular season crowns, joining Alabama, Florida and LSU. After winning the league's regular season in 2021, Arkansas became the first team not named Florida or Alabama to win the conference's regular season title since Tennessee did in 2007.
- The Hogs posted a 2022 48-11 overall record, recording the most single-season wins in program history.
- In the 2022 NCAA Tournament, Arkansas achieved the program's highest overall seed (No. 4) and swept the Fayetteville Regional before hosting the program's second consecutive Super Regional and garnering the progam's first victory in Super Regionals while taking down the Texas Longhorns, 7-1, in game one of the Fayetteville Super Regional.

Arkansas Picked to Finish 3rd in SEC

The back-to-back defending Southeastern Conference champion Arkansas Razorbacks have been picked to finish third in the league this season by conference's coaches. It's the second straight year the Hogs have been predicted to finish third in the SEC. Head Coach Courtney Deifel and the No. 6 Razorbacks received five first-place votes and 122 points overall in the poll finishing behind preseason favorite No. 5 Florida - five-first place votes, 134 total points - and No. 12 Tennessee, three first-place votes, 126 total points.

Getting Prigge With It

Sophomore third baseman Spencer Prigge was hotter at the plate than Las Vegas' summer temperatures at the Rebel Kickoff last weekend. The Phoenix native started 21 games at shortstop as a true freshman in 2022 but was severely limited due to an ongoing back issue that lasted throughout the season. Feeling better and back at the position she played growing up, Prigge is coming off a weekend where she hit .500 with six hits, three home runs, 12 RBIs, nine runs scored, five walks, one double and one stolen base. Prigge tied her career high in RBIs (3) three times over the weekend while pacing Arkansas in RBIs, home runs, runs scored, total bases (16) and slugging percentage (1.333). The slugger recorded at least one hit, one RBI and one run scored in all five games played. Prigge finished the weekend homering in back-to-back games, including a critical two-run homer against Baylor (Feb. 12) in the top of the seventh to extend Arkansas' lead to 10-7. Prigge enters Clearwater with a five-game hit, RBI and run scored streak.

All of Arkansas' home games that will not be broadcast on ESPN's family of networks are scheduled to be available on SEC Network+, starting March 5. Arkasas' Feb. 23 doubleheader against Arizona will be available on SEC Network+. During the Wooo Pig Classic (March 2-5), all Arkansas games will be available on SEC Network+ EXCEPT the March 4 games. Arkansas will make its linear debut on Feb. 17 at noon against No. 7 Florida State on ESPNU.

Callie Turner's 10u softball team won a tournament at the complex. Foreman and her Berkeley Prep High School team played some games there, and she used to attend the tournament as a fan when she was in junior high and high school. Herron played in a lot of travel ball tournaments at the complex.

Top 10 Hogs

Leading up to the 2023 season, Arkansas found itself landing inside the Top 10 in several preseason polls. Arkansas' No. 6 preseason ranking in ESPN.com/USA Softball's Top 25 is the highest preseason ranking in program history. The Razorbacks also found themselves sitting at preseason No. 7 in the USA Today/NFCA Coaches and Softball America Top 25 polls. Arkansas checked in at No. 8 in D1Softball's Preseason Top 25 and No. 12 in Extra Inning Softball's Top 25.

Roses are Red, Violets are Blue, the Razorback Freshmen Made Their Debut

Several freshmen made their collegiate debuts this past weekend with center fielder Reagan Johnson and shortstop Atalyia Rijo cracking head coach Courtney Deifel's starting lineup in all five contests. Pitchers Hannah Camenzind, Robyn Herron and Nikki McGaffin also made their debuts in Las Vegas.

At the leadoff spot. Johnson slashed .294/.350/.353 with five hits, four runs scored, three RBIs. a double and a stolen bases. Johnson filed her first career multi-hit game after finishing with two against Baylor on Sunday. The Karnes City, Texas, product also tallied a perfect fielding percentage on 10 total chances.

Atalyia Rijo earned SEC Freshman of the Week Monday after also making an immediate impact in Arkansas' opening weekend. The Horseheads, N.Y., native cracked head coach Courtney Deifel's opening weekend lineup at shortstop. In five games, Rijo paced Arkansas in batting average (.636), hits (7) and on-base percentage (.733). Rijo went 7-for-11 at the plate while slugging her first career home run and double. The rookie also scored six runs and compiled 11 total bases, five RBIs, four walks and a 1.000 slugging percentage. Rijo had a career day in the Hogs' win against Baylor Sunday, leading Arkansas with three hits and three RBIs while towering her first career home run. The rookie put Arkansas on the board in the second inning with a two-out, RBI double to left for an early 1-0 lead. Up to bat again in the fourth, Rijo drove in her second run on a single to left center. Rijo finished her dominant performance with a solo home run in the top of the seventh to ensure an 11-7 victory. Showcasing her defensive prowess, Rijo held it down at short with a .938 fielding percentage on 16 total chances and turned Arkansas' first double play of the season. Current Razorbacks Kacie Hoffmann and Spencer Prigge received SEC Freshman of the Week honors last season.

LHP Robyn Herron made her debut opening day after combining with junior LHP Callie Turner for a two-hit shutout against Weber State last Friday. In the game's final inning, Herron pitched to a 1-2-3 frame forcing two ground outs and punching one striking out to seal the five-inning dub. Herron combined with fellow freshman Nikki McGaffin for one-hit shutout in the Saturday matinee against Weber St. in her first collegiate start and victory. In the 11-0 win, Herron gave up only one hit, punched out five Wildcats and did not allow a walk. Getting handed the keys in the fourth, McGaffin took care of business as she retired six of seven batters faced while striking out one and working around a walk.

All Eyes on the Razorbacks

It comes to no surprise that Bogle Park is regarded as one of the premier college softball stadiums and atmospheres in the nation as it hosted the highest attended Regional and Super Regional in the NCAA in 2022. Arkansas finished the 2022 season third in cumulative attendance (66,247) and fourth in average attendance (1,948) at home. Nine of the 10 highest attended games in Bogle Park history were played in 2022. Bogle Park also sold out nine times in 2022. The 2022 Fayetteville Super Regional matchup between Arkansas and Texas at Bogle Park was the most-viewed NCAA Regional or Super Regional on record across ESPN networks and averaged 1.02 million viewers and a 0.53 rating.

Bogle Park, home of the Arkansas Razorback softball team, was recognized by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) as the 2022 Netting Professionals/NFCA DI Field of the Year in October. The playing surface is tended by a crew led by Austin Freeman.

Bogle Bombers

Arkansas blasted a program-record 109 home runs in 2022. Arkansas' 109 homers also tie for the second-most by an SEC team in a single season while also being the most by a league team since 2011. 12 different Razorbacks homered, led by NFCA First Team All-Americans Linnie Malkin (22), Danielle Gibson (20) and Hannah Gammill (18).

Arkansas blasted 11 opening weekend homers to start the 2023 season. Six different Hogs homered in Las Vegas: Prigge (3), Foreman (3), Halvorson (2), Gammill (1), H. Camenzind (1) and Rijo (1).

Sooie Spinners

Arkansas' pitching staff had a stellar opening weekend in Las Vegas. For the first time in program history, Arkansas shut out its first three opponents faced to start a season. Callie Turner, Chenise Delce, Robyn Herron and Nikki McGaffin were all a part of this feat after shutting out Weber St. twice and UNLV to kick off the 2023 campaign. Throught five games (approximately 29 innings), the Sooie spinners have limited opponents to a miniscule one earned run.

Delce Back for 2023

SEC Pitcher of the Year Chenise Delce is back for her final collegiate season, pitching to a 19-3 record with three saves and a team-best 2.12 ERA over 151.2 innings pitched. She struck out 188 hitters compared to just 35 walks issued. Putting together one of the most decorated seasons ever by a Razorback spinner and earning the program's second straight SEC Pitcher of the Year accolade, Delce collected an abundance of honors, including NFCA Second Team All-American, SEC Tournament MVP, All-SEC First Team, NFCA All-South Region First Team, Wilson/NFCA Pitcher of the Week and Softball American Third Team All-American. The righthander notched 11 wins and two saves against opponents ranked inside ESPN.com/USA Softball's Top 25. Her 8.70 strikeouts per 7.0/IP rank second in single-season program history.

Just a Kid from Beebe

Hailing from Beebe, Ark., First Team All-American Hannah Gammill returns to Razorback lineup for her junior season in 2023. Gammill became the Young Hog in program history to garner NFCA First Team All-American honors after doing so in 2022. Gammill started all 59 games at third and slashed .374/781/513 with 18 homers, 58 hits, 51 RBIs and 50 runs, which also earned her spots on the All-SEC First Team and All-SEC Defensive Team. Gammill ranked seventh in the SEC and third on the team in home runs with 18, which ties for fourth-most in single-season program history. A rock at the hot corner, Gammill compiled a .964 fielding percentage on 140 total chances and committed just one error during SEC play. Gammill's .781 slugging percentage ranks fourth in Arkansas' single-season history while her .513 on-base percentage ranks fifth in single-season program history. Her 51 RBIs tied for sixth-most in single-season program history while her 121 total bases ranked seventh in single-season program history. The slugger posted 15 multi-hit games, including four games with three hits, and registered 16 games with multiple RBIs. In addition, Gammill was hit by pitches a program-record 20 times last season.

Delce, Gammill Named Preseason All-SEC

Redshirt senior Chenise Delce and junior Hannah Gammill have been named preseason All-SEC by the league's coaches. The duo has also been selected to preseason All-America teams by Softball America (Gammill - First Team, Delce - Second Team). Delce is coming off a stellar 2022 season earning SEC Pitcher of the Year along with NFCA Second Team All-America and All-SEC honors. She became the second consecutive Arkansas pitcher to capture SEC Pitcher of the Year status, She went 19-3 last season with three saves and a team-best 2.12 ERA, 188 strikeouts, 14 complete games and five shutouts. Gammill slugged her way through the 2022 season, slashing .374/.781/.513 with 18 home runs and 51 RBIs to pick up NFCA First Team All-America honors, becoming the youngest Razorback in program history to be named a First Team All-American. She also added All-SEC First Team and SEC All-Defensive Team accolades to her sophomore campaign that helped Arkansas to its second straight Southeastern Conference title in 2022.

Diamond Sports Run in the Rijo Family

Freshman shortstop Atalyia Rijo comes from a diamond sport family. Her mother Audrey played DI softball at the University of North Carolina-Wilmington and her dad Fernando pitched 11 seasons in the minor leagues for the Los Angeles Dodgers, Baltimore Orioles, Montreal Expos, Milwaukee Brewers and Houston Astros organizations. Her cousin Jose Rijo pitched 14 seasons in the MLB and won the 1990 World Series with the Cincinatti Reds and was named World Series MVP. Jose Rijo, who was inducted into the Cincinnati Reds Hall of Fame, was named to the All-Stargame in 1994 and was the NL strikeout leader in 1993.


The Portal Delivers

Arkansas dipped into the transfer portal this offseason and came away with three athletes who are expected to contribute this season: Kristina Foreman, Cylie Halvorson and Tymber Riley.

An All-ACC selection in 2022, she started all 48 games she played in and hit .398 with 15 home runs and a Duke single-season program record 56 RBIs. The Tampa product had one of the best games of

- Graduate utility Tymber Riley, an Arkansas native, joins the Razorbacks from DII Arkansas Tech where

Riley, who also participated in volleyball at Arkansas Tech, was named GAC Female Athlete of the Year and GAC Player of the Year in softball in 2022. Riley led the GAC conference in batting average (.432), on-base percentage (.529), slugging percentage
 (.840), home runs (15), hits (73), runs scored (58), doubles (22) and total bases (142).
- Coach Deifel has made splashes in the portal over recent years. Notable transfers Deifel has picked up include Chenise Delce, Callie Turner, Danielle Gibson, KB Sides, Taylor Ellsworth and Braxton Burnside.

Freshmen Razorbacks Named Nation's No. 1 Recruiting Class

Arkansas welcomes nine freshmen to the fold this season. After signing with the Hogs back in 2021, the class was tabbed as the No. 2 recruiting class in the nation by Extra Inning Softball. The decorated freshman class consists of Hannah Camenzind, Lauren Camenzind, Rylee Cloud, Kiki Estrada, Nyjah Fontenot, Robyn Herron, Reagan Johnson, Nikki McGaffin and Atalyia Rijo. Eight commits were nationally ranked inside the top 30 of Extra Inning Softball's Extra Elite 100. The class also hails from seven different states (California, Colorado, Florida, Louisiana, Nebraska, New York and Texas).



Deifel Era Continues

Following a pair of historic seasons, including back-to-back Southeastern Conference (SEC) regular season championships and a 2022 SEC Softball Tournament title, Coach Courtney Deifel signed a new employment agreement in August that could keep her in the third base coaching box at Bogle Park through 2030. The new five-year agreement runs from July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2027 and includes a series of scheduled salary increases and up to two one-year agreement extensions based on NCAA Tournament appearances. Additional incentive payments will be based on success in the SEC and the NCAA Tournament and graduation of softball student-athletes.

Playing the Nation's Best

Throughout the regular season, Arkansas will face 24 teams ranked inside ESPN/ USA Softball's Top 25. Before SEC play begins, Arkansas will have tussled six ranked teams (Florida State, Duke, Louisiana and Arizona three times).

After battling five dominant teams in Clearwater, including three ranked inside the Top 25, Arkansas will return home to Bogle Park on Feb. 23 against No. 15 Arizona for a doubleheader. Arkansas tussles the Wildcats three times next weekend before hosting the Wooo Pig Classic March 2-5 with North Texas, Iowa State and Texas A&M-CC coming to town.

It doesn't get any easier for the Hogs during SEC play. Arkansas will clash with Texas A&M (March 10-12), No. 12 Alabama (March 18-20), No. 3 Florida (March 24-26), Mississippi State (March 31-April 2), No. 10 Georgia (April 6-8), No. 16 Kentucky (April 21-23), No. 8 Tennessee (April 29-May 1) and No. 23 Missouri (May 5-7). Arkansas is also scheduled to play midweek contests against strong opponents including Wichita State, Central Arkansas and Western Kentucky while also hosting UAB during its league bye week.

Courtney Deifel became the fourth head coach in program history when she was hired on June 11, 2015, and recently completed her seventh season at Arkansas in 2022. In seven seasons in Fayetteville, she has orchestrated the Razorbacks' return to postseason play and guided the program to two SEC regular season championships, one SEC Tournament crown and five NCAA Tournament appearances, which includes five consecutive berths from 2017-22. The Hogs have gualified for the national tournament every year it has been held since 2017. Deifel led the program to its first NCAA Tournament Super Regional appearances in 2018, 2021 and 2022. Since her first season in 2016, the Razorbacks have been ranked 70 times in the NCAC Ocaches' Poll after previously being ranked only once in program history. Nine of the program's 10 NFCA All-American awards and 78 Easton/NFCA All-American Scholar-Athlete accolades have been accumulated under Deifel since 2016. In 2022, Deifel guided the Razorbacks to their most successful season in school history, collecting back-to-back SEC regular season titles, headlined by the program's first outright regular season crown, and the program's first SEC Tournament championship after blanking Missouri, 4-0, in Gainesville, Fla., on May 13. Arkansas concluded the season with the most single-season wins in program history and a 48-II record, marking a program-record. 8I4 win percentage. Arkansas finished SEC play with a 19-5 record, producing the second consecutive 19-win conference season for the Hogs. Against Missouri State on March 3, Deifel became just the second head coach in program history to reach 200 career wins. The Hogs made their ItI N NCAA. Tournament appearance, earning the program's highest overall seed (No. 4) and hosted their second straight Super Regional. In the Razorbacks hosted the highest attended Regional and Super Regional in the NCAA in 2022. The Razorbacks tabbed an SEC-best 12 all-conference honors and a school-record five NFCA All-American nods to round out yet another enormous postseason awards haul. Arkansas became the first SEC program since 2006 to have four first team all-Americans. Danielle Gibson (first team), Linnie Malkin (first team), Hannah Gammill (first team) and Chenise Delce (second team) earned their first All-American honors. For the first time in program history, all eight NFCA All-Region nominees secured spots on All-South Region teams. Deifel was named SEC Coach of the Year for the second straight season while KB Sides became the program's its first-ever SEC Player of the Year accolade after Mary Haff Collected the award in 2021. Arkansas tabbed a league-best 12 all-conference honors and eight NFCA All-Region distinctions to round out an enormous post-season awards haul. The 2022 coaching staff was named the NFCA's South Region Staff of the Year for the second straight season.

Deifel, the SEC Coach of the Year, directed the most successful year in program history in 2021 by claiming the schools first SEC regular season title and hosting NCAA Tournament Super Regionals for the first time. The team finished 43r1 (19-5 SEC), producing a then-school record .796 win percentage. The Hogs earned a No. 6 national ranking, the highest in program history, and captured the No. 6 national seed in the NCAA Tournament. Arkansas began conference play winning 12 straight games, nothining the fifth-best leaque-only start in SEC history. A 19-game winning streak in non-conference action also set a school record. The Razorbacks received many postseason superlatives as infeliders Braxton Burnside and Danielle Gibson, and pitcher Mary Haff were named NFCA All-Americans. Haff also took home the school's first SEC Pitcher of the Year award. Offensively, the Razorbacks shattered the school's single-season home run record, mashing 95 long balls with Burnside setting the individual single-season program mark hitting 25. Deifel's 216 wins in Fayetteville rank second among all coaches in program history. The NFCA named the 2021 coaching staff the South Region's Staff of the Year.

Deifel guided the Razorbacks to a 19-6 (1-2 SEC) record in the COVID-19 shortened 2020 campaign. In the only league series of the season, the Razorbacks carned a 1-conference-opening victory, their first road win over Alabama since 2000. Arkansas remained in the national polls throughout the year and climbed from a preseason No. 24 ranking to the No. 19 slot in the final release of the NFCA Coaches' Poll. Junior acther Kayla Green was honored with SEC Player of the Week recognition for the first time in her career and freshman pitcher Jenna Bloom emerged as one of the rising stars in the league, leading all freshmen in the nation striking out 10.9 hitters per seven innings.

Deifel led the Razorbacks to their third consecutive postseason appearance in 2019, earning an at-large bid to the Stillwater Regional. The Hogs finished the season 38-20 and 12-12 in SEC play. It marks the first time since 1999-00 that the Razorbacks finished the season .500 or better in conference play in back-to-back seasons. The Razorbacks garnered their highest in-season ranking during weeks one and two, coming in at 12th and 11th in the NFCA and ESPN polls respectively.

Arkansas saw two players named to the All-SEC teams, pitcher Autumn Storms was named second team and outfielder Hannah McEwen garnered first-team recognition. McEwen's first-team selection was the first for Arkansas since 2012 and only the second in program history, in year four under Coach Deifel, the Razorbacks also earned two SEC Player of the Week awards, three SEC Pitcher of the Week awards, and one USA Softball Co-Player of the Week. A record five Razorbacks were named to the NFCA All-Region teams, with Storms garnering the first, first-team selection of her career. Storms went on to be named NFCA Second Team All-American as a pitcher, the first Razorback since 2010.

Year four with Coach Deifel and the Razorback staff saw growth in all aspects as the game, including a team. 288 batting average, which ranks second highest in program record book. In fact, four of the top seven team batting averages in program history come from the Deifel era.

In the 2018 campaign, Arkansas wrapped up the year with a 42-17 (12-12 SEC) record, the third most wins in program history; and the most victories since 2000. The team earned a national seed (13) in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history and went 3-0 defeating DePaul and Wichita State twice to earn the Fayetteville Regional Championship on its home field. The Hogs made their first ever NCAA Super Regional appearance but fell to eventual national semifinalist, Oklahoma, in Norman. Arkansas finished 17th in the final NCAA RPI report and the coaching staff earned 2018 NFCA Division I South Region Staff of the Year.

Just two seasons removed from a one-win conference tally, Deifel guided the Razorbacks to a 12-12 mark in SEC play. As the No. 7 seed at SEC Tournament, the program made its first semifinal appearance since 2001. The Razorbacks finished the season with a 27-2 record on their home field, establishing a new program record for home wins in a single season. Part of Arkansas' home triumphs included the program's first three-game sweep of a ranked team (No. 20 Mississippi State) and its first-ever series win over Alabama.

Deifel piloted the 2017 Razorbacks to a 31-24 record and the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2013. The Razorbacks improved their win total by 17 games from the previous season, marking the largest increase in the country among Power 5 programs. Arkansas also tallied seven wins in SEC play, equaling the combined total from the previous three seasons. In recognition of the team's performance, Deifel was named the 2017 DtSoftballNews Coach of the Year.

From year one to two under Deifel, Arkansas' pitching staff lowered its combined ERA by more than four runs (6.98 to 2.82) and added more than 20 points to its batting average (.260 to 2.84). The Razorbacks also led the SEC and tied for 17th in the NCAA with 59 home runs. During the year, Arkansas earned its first national ranking since 2013 when it was slotted at No. 24 in the March 7 release ESPN/USA Softball poll.

Individually, Deifel saw two Razorbacks earn NFCA All-South Region accolades with Nicole Schroeder and Autumn Storms earning second-team and third-team honors, respectively. Storms was also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team while A.J. Belans was voted to the All-SEC Second Team, Schroeder went on to be drafted by the Akron Racers as the program's second NPF selection.

Deifel's first win over a ranked team at Arkansas came during the 2016 season when the Razorbacks knocked off No. 23 Nebraska, 11-10, during the Easton Tournament in Fullerton, Calif; the team added five ranked wins in 2017. The 2016 campaign also saw newcomer Ashley Diaz make an immediate impact as a member of the NFCA Ali-South Region Second Team and garnered NFCA National Freshman of the Year Top 25 Watch List recognition.

During her playing and coaching careers prior to coming to Arkansas, Deifel advanced to 11 NCAA Tournaments including a four-year run to the Women's College World Series (WCWS) as an All-American cathcher at California that was highlighted by winning the 2002 national title. The Bears also finished second (2003), fifth (2001) and seventh (2000) at the WCWS over her four-year run. Her postseason successes also featured a pair of Super Regionals as a graduate assistant at Oklahoma and five NCAA Regionals as an assistant at Maryland and Louisville.

As a first-year head coach, Deifel ushered in a culture of change for Maryland in 2015. Along with the program's 16-game improvement from the previous season, the Terrapins offense show fremendous growth. Maryland finished 27th in the NCAA with 6.28 runs per game behind 339 runs scored, up more than 150 runs from 2014. Deifel also led her team to a .309 batting average, a 40-point jump from 2014 which also ranked 57th in the NCAA.

Individually, Deifel guided three players to all-conference accolades and a pair of NFCA all-region honors. Lindsey Schmeister was an All-Big Ten first team performer while Shannon Bustillos and Erin Pronobis landed on the All-Big Ten second team. Probonis and Corey Schwartz were also named to the NFCA All-Midwest Region Third Team. Under Deifel's watch, the trio helped Maryland to single-season school records in doubles, home runs, RBI and walks.

Prior to taking the head job at Maryland, Deifel spent four seasons as an assistant coach at Louisville in which she helped the Cardinals to four NCAA appearances, the 2014 American Athletic Conference Tournament title and an overall record of 176-60 (7.46), Louisville averaged 44 wins in that time with a program-record 55 wins in 2012. Her student-athletes at Louisville racked up four NFCA All-America certificates and 29 all-conference selections.

She also spent two seasons as a graduate assistant at Oklahoma where she was a member of a staff the guided the 2008 Sooners to a 47-14 record and a Super Regional appearance.

As a player, Deifel was the starting catcher for California from 2000-03 and led the Golden Bears to four Women's College World Series appearances including a national championship run in 2002 and national runner-up showing in 2003. She appeared in 285 games missing just three behind the plate over her four seasons. As a four-year starter behind the plate, she was a 2003 All-American, two-time All-Pac 10 selection and caught seven no-hitters. She is still the program's career leader with 1,969 putputs.

Aside from her accomplishments in collegiate softball, Deifel had a successful professional career following her days at Cal. In 2004, she helped the NYNJ Juggernaut to the National Professional Fastpitch (NPF) league title. Deifel also spent three years with LeoPalace21 in Japan that resulted in a runner-up showing and a pair of thirdnlace fishess.

She graduated from California in 2003 with a bachelor of arts in American Business and Globalism and American Studies. Deifel earned her master's of arts in Human Relations from Oklahoma in 2008.

Deifel's sister, Amanda Scott, is currently the head softball coach at Missouri-St. Louis and won a Women's College World Series title at Fresno State in 1998.

Deifel and her husband Joe are the parents of two sons, Trip and Walt. The family resides in Favetteville.
