## WOOO PIG CLASSIC

No. 7 Arkansas opens the month of March with the Wooo Pig Classic (March 2-5), welcoming Iowa State, North Texas and Texas A&M-CC to the friendly confines of Bogle Park. The Razorbacks launch into the weekend Thursday at 2 p.m. vs. Iowa State on SEC Network+. On Friday, Arkansas tackles a double header against Texas A&M-CC at 3 p.m. before ending the day with a 5:30 p.m. first pitch against North Texas. Both games will be available on SEC Network+. Saturday's schedule includes another twin bill beginning with Iowa State at 3 p.m. and Texas A&M-CC at 5:30 p.m. The Hogs conclude the weekend on Sunday with a 12:15 p.m. matchup against North Texas on SEC Network+.

## RAZORBACK NOTABLES

### Familiar with Weekend Competition

Arkansas is no stranger to Iowa State, North Texas and Texas A&M-CC, having played all three programs multiple times heading into the weekend. Holding a 2-1 all-time record against the Cyclones, Arkansas and Iowa State will meet for the first time since March 16, 2018, when the Hogs captured an 8-3 victory. The series dates back to Feb. 14, 2010 when Arkansas defeated Iowa State 4-2 in Minneapolis.

The Hogs hold a 3-1 series edge against North Texas. The Mean Green and Razorbacks last faced one another on Feb. 12, 2017, with Arkansas earning a 7-0 victory in Denton, Texas. For the second time in history, the two programs will meet in Fayetteville beginning with Friday's 5:30 p.m. duel. The two teams first met on March 6, 2007, with Arkansas recording a 7-3 decision in Fayetteville.

Despite not playing one another since Feb. 26, 2011, Texas A&M-CC holds a 4-3 series lead over Arkansas. The series dates back to Feb. 1, 2003 with Texas A&M-CC defeating the Razorbacks 3-0 in San Marcos, Texas. Texas A&M-CC's last trip to Fayetteville took place on April 4-5, 2008. The Hogs swept Texas A&M-CC in a three-game set.

### Home Sweet Home

- Thursday's clash with Iowa State will be the seventh of a 16-game homestand. Dating back to last season, Arkansas is 29-5 at home during the regular season. Since the 2021 season, Arkansas is a combined 57-14 at Bogle Park.

### Delce Deals

- Redshirt senior RHP Chenise Delce hauled in the weekly honors following her sensational performance at the Razorback Invitational. Delce was named Wilson/NFCA's National Pitcher of the Week and the SEC Co-Pitcher of the Week after spinning to a 4-0 weekend that included two ranked wins. Acquiring a .076 ERA, Delce (7-1) surrendered just two runs across 18.1 innings pitched and also checked opponents to a .127 batting average with 25 strikeouts. Delce is 7-1 on the season with four wins against opponents currently ranked inside ESPN.com/USA Softball's Top 25 (Arizona twice, Baylor and Louisiana).

### Top Hogs

- The Hogs are a consensus Top 10 team three weeks into the season, checking in at No. 6 in the USA Today/NFCA poll and No. 7 in ESPN.com/USA Softball Top 25. Arkansas sits at No. 8 in DI Softball, No. 10 in Extra Inning Softball and No. 9 in Softball America's poll, respectively.

### Last Time Out

- The Razorbacks went 5-1 at the Razorback Invitational (Feb. 23-26), conquering two wins over No. 13/19 Arizona and swiping three wins against Drake.
- Taking two from Arizona, Arkansas currently has four wins against teams currently ranked inside ESPN.com/USA Softball's Top 25 (Arizona twice, Baylor and Louisiana).

### Walk It Off

- The Razorback Invitational included three walk-offs and a go-ahead home run to secure Arkansas victories. Hannah Gammill was heroic in Arkansas' 3-2 win in the tournament's Feb. 23 opener vs. Arizona, hitting a walk-off RBI single to right center in the bottom of the seventh for the 3-2 win. The Hogs got their second walk-off on Feb. 24 vs. Drake when Cylie Halvorson rocketed an RBI single to left in the bottom of the 11th to seal the 4-3 (11) dub. Reagan Johnson was the third Hog to walk-off the weekend when she scattered a two-RBI double to right center on Feb. 26 vs. Drake for the 8-0, five-inning decision.

### Deifel Becomes Program's All-Time Wins Leader

Head coach Courtney Deifel became the program's all-time wins leader on Saturday, Feb. 18 when Arkansas defeated No. 22 Louisiana 7-6. Deifel bested former Razorback head coach Carrie Dever-Boaz's (1997-2004) 244 career wins at helm.

Drawing 67 walks so far this season, Arkansas ranks fifth nationally and second in the SEC in walks.

### Arkansas Picked to Finish 3rd in SEC

The back-to-back defending Southeastern Conference champion Arkansas Razorbacks have been picked to finish third in the league this season by conference's coaches. It's the second straight year the Hogs have been predicted to finish third in the SEC. Head Coach Courtney Deifel and the No. 6 Razorbacks received five first-place votes and 122 points overall in the poll finishing behind preseason favorite No. 5 Florida - five-first place votes, 134 total points - and No. 12 Tennessee, three first-place votes, 126 total points.

Points were compiled on a descending basis. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team.

### First Name 'Robyn' Last Name 'Herron'

Freshman southpaw Robyn Herron (3-1) had herself a week-end at the TaxAct Clearwater Invitational and followed with a strong showing at the Razorback Invitational. In Clearwater, the Tampa product went 2-0 in the circle and threw her first complete game shutout in the 7-0 win against Indiana on Feb. 18. Also against the Hoosiers, Herron tabbed her first career double-digit strikeout performance finishing with 12 punchouts. Herron amassed a career high 14 strikeouts against Drake Feb. 24, becoming the first Hog freshman pitcher to record multiple double-digit strikeout performances in since Mary Haff did in 2018. So far this season, only one other true freshman power five pitcher has amassed more strikeouts in a single game than Herron's 14 vs. Drake Stanford's NiJaree Canady tossed 16 Ks vs. Charlotte on Feb. 17.

### Lucky Number 7

#7 Chenise Delce's seven wins this season rank fifth nationally, only two behind UCLA ace Megan Faraimo's nine victories. Four of Delce's wins come against foes currently ranked inside ESPN.com/USA Softball's Top 25.

### Strike 'Em Out

Behind the arms of Robyn Herron (14), Chenise Delce (2), Hannah Camenzind (2) and Nikki McGaffin (1), Arkansas posted the third-most single-game strikeouts in DI softball this season after ringing up 19 batters vs. Drake on Feb. 24. Arkansas trails Illinois' 21 strikeouts vs. Fordham on Feb. 11 and Utah State's 20 punchouts vs. Cal State Bakersfield on Feb. 11.

### 15 Games Slated for National TV

The Razorbacks will appear on ESPN's family of networks 15 times during the regular season this spring in addition to having games available on SEC Network+. All of Arkansas' home games that will not be broadcast on ESPN's family of networks are scheduled to be available on SEC Network+, starting March 5. Arkansas' Feb. 23 doubleheader against Arizona will be available on SEC Network+. During the Wooo Pig Classic (March 2-5), all Arkansas games will be available on SEC Network+ EXCEPT the March 4 games. Arkansas will make its linear debut on Feb. 17 at noon against No. 7 Florida State on ESPN.

age attendance (1,948) at home. Nine of the 10 highest attended games in Bogle Park history were played in 2022. Bogle Park also sold out nine times in 2022. The 2022 Fayetteville Super Regional matchup between Arkansas and Texas at Bogle Park was the most-viewed NCAA Regional or Super Regional on record across ESPN networks and averaged 1.02 million viewers and a 0.53 rating.

### There's No Place like Bogle

For the second straight year, Bogle Park shattered its opening day attendance record. 2696 were in attendance for Bogle Park's opening day doubleheader against Arizona on Feb. 23.

Bogle Park, home of the Arkansas Razorback softball team, was recognized by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) as the 2022 Netting Professionals/NFCA DI Field of the Year in October. The playing surface is tended by a crew led by Austin Freeman.

### Bogle Bombers

Arkansas blasted a program-record 109 home runs in 2022. Arkansas' 109 homers also tie for the second-most by an SEC team in a single season while also being the most by a league team since 2011. 12 different Razorbacks homered, led by NFCA First Team All-Americans Linnie Malkin (22), Danielle Gibson (20) and Hannah Gammill (18).

The Razorbacks are up to 20 home runs so far this season led by Rylin Hedgecock's five jacks.

### Razor-Back-to-Back

- Winning the SEC regular season crown in 2021 and 2022, Arkansas added the program's first tournament title in 2022 after downing the Missouri Tigers, 4-0, in Gainesville, Fla. The Razorbacks were the only power five program last season to win their conference's regular season and tournament championships.
- Arkansas is one of four SEC program's to win back-to-back regular season crowns, joining Alabama, Florida and LSU. After winning the league's regular season in 2021, Arkansas became the first team not named Florida or Alabama to win the conference's regular season title since Tennessee did in 2007.
- The Hogs posted a 2022 48-11 overall record, recording the most single-season wins in program history.
- In the 2022 NCAA Tournament, Arkansas achieved the program's highest overall seed (No. 4) and swept the Fayetteville Regional before hosting the program's second consecutive Super Regional and garnering the program's first victory in Super Regionals while taking down the Texas Longhorns, 7-1, in game one of the Fayetteville Super Regional.

### Playing the Nation's Best

Throughout the regular season, Arkansas will face 24 teams ranked inside ESPN/USA Softball's Top 25. Before SEC play begins, Arkansas will have tussled six ranked teams (Florida State, Duke, Louisiana and Arizona three times).

It doesn't get any easier for the Hogs during SEC play. Arkansas will clash with No. 25 Texas A&M (March 10-12), No. 9 Alabama (March 18-20), No. 10 Florida (March 24-26), Mississippi State (March 31-April 2), No. 116 Georgia (April 6-8), No. 116 Kentucky (April 21-23), No. 6 Tennessee (April 29-May 1) and No. 23 Missouri (May 5-7). Arkansas is also scheduled to play midweek contests against strong opponents including Wichita State, Central Arkansas and Western Kentucky while also hosting UAB during its league bye week.

**Roo's Big Weekend**

Redshirt junior Rylin Hedgecock shined for Arkansas at the TaxAct Clearwater Invitational finishing with team highs in hits (8), batting average (.533), slugging percentage (1.200), on-base percentage (.588), total bases (18), home runs (3) and RBIs (7) throughout the weekend. Hedgecock also tied for the tournament lead in hits with eight at the star-studded event. In a dominant outing against No. 22 Louisiana, Hedgecock tied her career high in hits with three against the Ragin' Cajuns. Hedgecock also homered in back-to-back games against Indiana and No. 22 Louisiana.

**Sooie Shutouts**

10 games into the season, Arkansas ties for 11th nationally in shutouts with four. 10 others teams sit in front of the Hogs with Oklahoma leading the way with six and Auburn, GCU, Kentucky, Presbyterian, South Dakota St., Texas A&M, UCLA, Utah and Wichita State holding five shutouts apiece.

**Sooie Spinners**

Arkansas' pitching staff had a stellar opening weekend in Las Vegas. For the first time in program history, Arkansas shut out its first three opponents faced to start a season. Callie Turner, Chenise Delce, Robyn Heron and Nikki McGaffin were all a part of this feat after shutting out Weber St. twice and UNLV to kick off the 2023 campaign. Through five games (approximately 29 innings), the Sooie spinners have limited opponents to a miniscule one earned run.

**Delce Back for 2023**

SEC Pitcher of the Year Chenise Delce is back for her final collegiate season, pitching to a 19-3 record with three saves and a team-best 2.12 ERA over 151.2 innings pitched. She struck out 188 hitters compared to just 35 walks issued. Putting together one of the most decorated seasons ever by a Razorback spinner and earning the program's second straight SEC Pitcher of the Year accolade, Delce collected an abundance of honors, including NFCA Second Team All-American, SEC Tournament MVP, All-SEC First Team, NFCA All-South Region First Team, Wilson/NFCA Pitcher of the Week and Softball America Third Team All-American. The righthander notched 11 wins and two saves against opponents ranked inside ESPN.com/USA Softball's Top 25. Her 8.70 strikeouts per 7.0/IP rank second in single-season program history.

**Delce, Gammill Named Preseason All-SEC**

Redshirt senior Chenise Delce and junior Hannah Gammill have been named preseason All-SEC by the league's coaches. The duo has also been selected to preseason All-America teams by Softball America (Gammill - First Team, Delce - Second Team). Delce is coming off a stellar 2022 season earning SEC Pitcher of the Year along with NFCA Second Team All-America and All-SEC honors. She became the second consecutive Arkansas pitcher to capture SEC Pitcher of the Year status. She went 19-3 last season with three saves and a team-best 2.12 ERA, 188 strikeouts, 14 complete games and five shutouts. Gammill slugged her way through the 2022 season, slashing .374/.781/.513 with 18 home runs and 51 RBIs to pick up NFCA First Team All-America honors, becoming the youngest Razorback in program history to be named a First Team All-American. She also added All-SEC First Team and SEC All-Defensive Team accolades to her sophomore campaign that helped Arkansas to its second straight Southeastern Conference title in 2022.

**The Portal Delivers**

Arkansas dipped into the transfer portal this offseason and came away with three athletes who are expected to contribute this season: Kristina Foreman, Cylie Halvorson and Tymber Riley.

- Graduate infielder Kristina Former joins the Razorbacks from Duke. Foreman was a staple in the Blue Devil's lineup over the last four years, starting 165 games in her career. An All-ACC selection in 2022, she started all 48 games she played in and hit .398 with 15 home runs and a Duke single-season program record 56 RBIs. The Tampa product had one of the best games of
- Junior infielder Cylie Halvorson joins the Hogs from South Dakota State where she was named Summit League Player of the Year in 2021 after averaging .352 at the plate and shattering the school's home run record with 19. In 2022, Halvorson started 54 games while hitting .311 with 19 home runs, 55 hits, 46 RBIs and 40 runs scored.
- Graduate utility Tymber Riley, an Arkansas native, joins the Razorbacks from DII Arkansas Tech where she was one of the best players in program history. Riley, who also participated in volleyball at Arkansas Tech, was named GAC Female Athlete of the Year and GAC Player of the Year in softball in 2022. Riley led the GAC conference in batting average (.432), on-base percentage (.529), slugging percentage (.840), home runs (15), hits (73), runs scored (58), doubles (22) and total bases (142).
- Coach Deifel has made splashes in the portal over recent years. Notable transfers Deifel has picked up include Chenise Delce, Callie Turner, Danielle Gibson, KB Sides, Taylor Ellsworth and Braxton Burnside.

**An All-American Duo**

Arkansas is one of three DI softball programs to return multiple 2022 NFCA All-Americans. Hannah Gammill was named an NFCA First Team All-American and Chenise Delce was tabbed a Second Team All-American after sensational 2022 campaigns.

**Homegrown Hogs**

Arkansas' 2023 roster features seven Arkansans - the most of any state. Madi Conklin (Ft. Smith), Hannah Gammill (Beebe), Kaitlyn Howard (East End), Cally Kildow (Gravette), Chelsi Passage (Greenwood), Tymber Riley (Bentonville) and Ally Sockey (Greenwood) all hail from the Natural State.

**Deifel Era Continues**

Following a pair of historic seasons, including back-to-back Southeastern Conference (SEC) regular season championships and a 2022 SEC Softball Tournament title, Coach Courtney Deifel signed a new employment agreement in August that could keep her in the third base coaching box at Bogle Park through 2030.



**Back-to-Back Coach of the Year**

Back-to-back SEC Coach of the Year Courtney Deifel returns for her eighth season at the helm. In seven seasons in Fayetteville, Deifel has orchestrated the Razorbacks' return to postseason play and guided the program to two SEC regular season championships, one SEC Tournament crown and five NCAA Tournament appearances, which includes five consecutive berths from 2017-22. The Hogs have qualified for the national tournament every year it has been held since 2017. Deifel led the program to its first NCAA Tournament Super Regional appearances in 2018, 2021 and 2022. Since her first season in 2016, the Razorbacks have been ranked 71 times in the NFCA Coaches' Poll after being previously ranked only once in program history. Nine of the program's 10 NFCA All-American nods and 78 Easton/NFCA All-America Scholar-Athlete awards have been accumulated under Deifel.

**Just a Kid from Beebe**

Hailing from Beebe, Ark., First Team All-American Hannah Gammill returns to Razorback lineup for her junior season in 2023. Gammill became the Young Hog in program history to garner NFCA First Team All-American honors after doing so in 2022. Gammill started all 59 games at third and slashed .374/.781/.513 with 18 homers, 58 hits, 51 RBIs and 50 runs, which also earned her spots on the All-SEC First Team and All-SEC Defensive Team. Gammill ranked seventh in the SEC and third on the team in home runs with 18, which ties for fourth-most in single-season program history. A rock at the hot corner, Gammill compiled a .964 fielding percentage on 140 total chances and committed just one error during SEC play. Gammill's .781 slugging percentage ranks fourth in Arkansas' single-season history while her .513 on-base percentage ranks fifth in single-season program history. Her 51 RBIs tied for sixth-most in single-season program history while her 121 total bases ranked seventh in single-season program history. The slugger posted 15 multi-hit games, including four games with three hits, and registered 16 games with multiple RBIs. In addition, Gammill was hit by pitches a program-record 20 times last season.

# Woo Pig Classic



Courtney Deifel became the fourth head coach in program history when she was hired on June 11, 2015, and recently completed her seventh season at Arkansas in 2022. In eight seasons in Fayetteville, she has orchestrated the Razorbacks' return to postseason play and guided the program to two SEC regular season championships, one SEC Tournament crown and five NCAA Tournament appearances, which includes five consecutive berths from 2017-22. The Hogs have qualified for the national tournament every year it has been held since 2017. Deifel led the program to its first NCAA Tournament Super Regional appearances in 2018, 2021 and 2022. Since her first season in 2016, the Razorbacks have been ranked 72 times in the NFCA Coaches' Poll after previously being ranked only once in program history. Nine of the program's 10 NFCA All-American awards and 78 Easton/NFCA All-America Scholar-Athlete accolades have been accumulated under Deifel since 2016. Deifel became the program's all-time wins leader after Arkansas defeated No. 22 Louisiana, 7-6, Feb. 18, 2023.

In 2022, Deifel guided the Razorbacks to their most successful season in school history, collecting back-to-back SEC regular season titles, headlined by the program's first outright regular season crown, and the program's first SEC Tournament championship after blanking Missouri, 4-0, in Gainesville, Fla., on May 13. Arkansas concluded the season with the most single-season wins in program history and a 48-1 record, marking a program record .814 win percentage. Arkansas finished SEC play with a 19-5 record, producing the second consecutive 19-win conference season for the Hogs. Against Missouri State on March 3, Deifel became its second head coach in program history to reach 200 career wins. The Hogs made their 11th NCAA Tournament appearance, earning the program's highest overall seed (No. 4) and hosted their second straight Super Regional. The Razorbacks hosted the highest attended Regional and Super Regional in the NCAA in 2022. The Razorbacks tabbed an SEC-best 12 all-conference honors and a school-record five NFCA All-American nods to round out yet another enormous postseason awards haul. Arkansas became the first SEC program since 2006 to have four first team all-Americans. Danielle Gibson (first team) became the program's first two-time NFCA All-American while KB Sides (first team), Linnie Malkin (first team), Hannah Gammill (first team) and Chenise Delce (second team) earned their first All-American honors. For the first time in program history, all eight NFCA All-Region nominees secured spots on All-South Region teams. Deifel was named SEC Coach of the Year for the second straight season while KB Sides became the program's its first-ever SEC Player of the Year honor and Chenise Delce earned the Hogs' second consecutive SEC Pitcher of the Year accolade after Mary Huff collected the award in 2021. Arkansas tabbed a league-best 12 all-conference honors and eight NFCA All-Region distinctions to round out an enormous postseason awards haul. The 2022 coaching staff was named the NFCA's South Region Staff of the Year for the second straight season.

Deifel, the SEC Coach of the Year, directed the most successful year in program history in 2021 by claiming the school's first SEC regular season title and hosting NCAA Tournament Super Regionals for the first time. The team finished 43-11 (19-5 SEC), producing a then-school record .796 win percentage. The Hogs earned a No. 6 national ranking, the highest in program history, and captured the No. 6 national seed in the NCAA Tournament. Arkansas began conference play winning 12 straight games, notching the fifth-best league-only start in SEC history. A 19-game winning streak in non-conference action also set a school record. The Razorbacks received many postseason superlatives as infielders Braxton Burnside and Danielle Gibson, and pitcher Mary Huff were named NFCA All-Americans. Huff also took home the school's first SEC Pitcher of the Year award. Offensively, the Razorbacks shattered the school's single-season home run record, smashing 95 long balls with Burnside setting the individual single-season program mark hitting 25. Deifel's 216 wins in Fayetteville rank second among all coaches in program history. The NFCA named the 2021 coaching staff the South Region's Staff of the Year.

Deifel guided the Razorbacks to a 19-6 (12-2 SEC) record in the COVID-19 shortened 2020 campaign. In the only league series of the season, the Razorbacks earned a 1-0 conference-opening victory, their first road win over Alabama since 2000. Arkansas remained in the national polls throughout the year and climbed from a preseason No. 24 ranking to the No. 19 slot in the final release of the NFCA Coaches' Poll. Junior catcher Kayla Green was honored with SEC Player of the Week recognition for the first time in her career and freshman pitcher Jenna Bloom emerged as one of the rising stars in the league, leading all freshmen in the nation striking out 10.9 hitters per seven innings.

Deifel led the Razorbacks to their third consecutive postseason appearance in 2019, earning an at-large bid to the Stillwater Regional. The Hogs finished the season 38-20 and 12-12 in SEC play. It marks the first time since 1999-00 that the Razorbacks finished the season .500 or better in conference play in back-to-back seasons. The Razorbacks garnered their highest in-season ranking during weeks one and two, coming in at 12th and 11th in the NFCA and ESPN polls respectively.

Arkansas saw two players named to the All-SEC teams, pitcher Autumn Storms was named second team and outfielder Hannah McEwen garnered first-team recognition. McEwen's first-team selection was the first for Arkansas since 2012 and only the second in program history. In year four under Coach Deifel, the Razorbacks also earned two SEC Player of the Week awards, three SEC Pitcher of the Week awards, and one USA Softball Co-Player of the Week. A record five Razorbacks were named to the NFCA All-Region teams, with Storms garnering the first, first-team selection of her career. Storms went on to be named NFCA Second Team All-American as a pitcher, the first Razorback since 2010.

Year four with Coach Deifel and the Razorback staff saw growth in all aspects as the game, including a team .288 batting average, which ranks second-highest in program record book. In fact, four of the top seven team batting averages in program history come from the Deifel era.

In the 2018 campaign, Arkansas wrapped up the year with a 42-17 (12-12 SEC) record, the third most wins in program history, and the most victories since 2000. The team earned a national seed (13) in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history and went 3-0 defeating DePaul and Wichita State twice to earn the Fayetteville Regional Championship on its home field. The Hogs made their first ever NCAA Super Regional appearance but fell to eventual national semifinalist, Oklahoma, in Norman. Arkansas finished 17th in the final NCAA RPI report and the coaching staff earned 2018 NFCA Division I South Region Staff of the Year. Just two seasons removed from a one-win conference tally, Deifel guided the Razor-

backs to a 12-12 mark in SEC play. As the No. 7 seed at SEC Tournament, the program made its first semifinal appearance since 2001. The Razorbacks finished the season with a 27-2 record on their home field, establishing a new program record for home wins in a single season. Part of Arkansas' home triumphs included the program's first three-game sweep of a ranked team (No. 20 Mississippi State) and its first-ever series win over Alabama.

Deifel piloted the 2017 Razorbacks to a 31-24 record and the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2013. The Razorbacks improved their win total by 17 games from the previous season, marking the largest increase in the country among Power 5 programs. Arkansas also tallied seven wins in SEC play, equaling the combined total from the previous three seasons. In recognition of the team's performance, Deifel was named the 2017 DII Softball News Coach of the Year.

From year one to two under Deifel, Arkansas' pitching staff lowered its combined ERA by more than four runs (6.98 to 2.82) and added more than 20 points to its batting average (.260 to .284). The Razorbacks also led the SEC and tied for 17th in the NCAA with 59 home runs. During the year, Arkansas earned its first national ranking since 2013 when it was slotted at No. 24 in the March 7 release ESPN/USA Softball poll.

Individually, Deifel saw two Razorbacks earn NFCA All-South Region accolades with Nicole Schroeder and Autumn Storms earning second-team and third-team honors, respectively. Storms was also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team while A.J. Belans was voted to the All-SEC Second Team. Schroeder went on to be drafted by the Akron Racers as the program's second NPF selection.

Deifel's first win over a ranked team at Arkansas came during the 2016 season when the Razorbacks knocked off No. 23 Nebraska, 11-0, during the Easton Tournament in Fullerton, Calif.; the team added five ranked wins in 2017. The 2016 campaign also saw newcomer Ashley Diaz make an immediate impact as a member of the NFCA All-South Region Second Team and garnered NFCA National Freshman of the Year Top 25 Watch List recognition.

During her playing and coaching careers prior to coming to Arkansas, Deifel advanced to 11 NCAA Tournaments including a four-year run to the Women's College World Series (WCWS) as an All-American catcher at California that was highlighted by winning the 2002 national title. The Bears also finished second (2003), fifth (2001) and seventh (2000) at the WCWS over her four-year run. Her postseason successes also featured a pair of Super Regionals as a graduate assistant at Oklahoma and five NCAA Regionals as an assistant at Maryland and Louisville.

As a first-year head coach, Deifel ushered in a culture of change for Maryland in 2015. Along with the program's 16-game improvement from the previous season, the Terrapins' offense showed tremendous growth. Maryland finished 27th in the NCAA with 6.28 runs per game behind 339 runs scored, up more than 150 runs from 2014. Deifel also led her team to a .309 batting average, a 40-point jump from 2014 which also ranked 57th in the NCAA.

Individually, Deifel guided three players to all-conference accolades and a pair of NFCA All-region honors. Lindsey Schmeister was an All-Big Ten first team performer while Shannon Bustillos and Erin Probonis landed on the All-Big Ten second team. Probonis and Corey Schwartz were also named to the NFCA All-Midwest Region Third Team. Under Deifel's watch, the trio helped Maryland to single-season school records in doubles, home runs, RBI and walks.

Prior to taking the head job at Maryland, Deifel spent four seasons as an assistant coach at Louisville in which she helped the Cardinals to four NCAA appearances, the 2014 American Athletic Conference Tournament title and an overall record of 176-60 (74). Louisville averaged 44 wins in that time with a program-record 55 wins in 2012. Her student-athletes at Louisville racked up four NFCA All-America certificates and 29 all-conference selections.

She also spent two seasons as a graduate assistant at Oklahoma where she was a member of a staff that guided the 2008 Sooners to a 47-14 record and a Super Regional appearance.

As a player, Deifel was the starting catcher for California from 2000-03 and led the Golden Bears to four Women's College World Series appearances including a national championship run in 2002 and national runner-up showing in 2003. She appeared in 285 games missing just three behind the plate over her four seasons. As a four-year starter behind the plate, she was a 2003 All-American, two-time All-Pac 10 selection and caught seven no-hitters. She is still the program's career leader with 1,969 putouts.

Aside from her accomplishments in collegiate softball, Deifel had a successful professional career following her days at Cal. In 2004, she helped the NY/NJ Juggernaut to the National Professional Fastpitch (NPF) league title. Deifel also spent three years with Leopalace21 in Japan that resulted in a runner-up showing and a pair of third-place finishes.

She graduated from California in 2003 with a bachelor of arts in American Business and Globalism and American Studies. Deifel earned her master's of arts in Human Relations from Oklahoma in 2008.

Deifel's sister, Amanda Scott, is currently the head softball coach at Missouri-St. Louis and won a Women's College World Series title at Fresno State in 1998.

Deifel and her husband Joe are the parents of two sons, Trip and Walt. The family resides in Fayetteville.
