Tigers Move Into No. 9 Spot in United Soccer Coaches Rankings

• After securing wins over Furman and Western Carolina, the Clemson Tigers earned the No. 9 slot at the conclusion of week three, as announced by United Soccer Coaches. The Tigers entered the season ranked 25th but have continued to climb in the rankings each and every week. After week one, the Tigers moved into the 19th slot but then jumped to No. 11 after week two, as they now sit in the Top 10 at the end of week three.

Halle Mackiewicz Leads the Nation in Shutouts with Five Clean Sheets on the Season

• After Clemson's 5-0 victory against Western Carolina, senior goalkeeper Halle Mackiewicz earned her fifth clean sheet of the season as she now leads the NCAA in shutouts with five. Mackiewicz is one of six keepers in the nation with a perfect save percentage of 1.000, however she is the only keeper in the ACC with that accolade. After earning her fifth clean sheet, Mackiewicz posted her 15th-career shutout, which ties with Sandy Maclver (2016-2018) for fourth most by a Tiger.

• The No. 9 Tigers are set to host No. 7 Arkansas in a Top-10 matchup at Historic Riggs on Thursday. Arkansas enters the match with a 3-1-1 record against Clemson's 5-0-1. PREVIOUS GAME RECAP

CLEMSON, S.C. – Behind five goals from four Tigers and another shutout from goalkeeper Halle Mackiewicz, the No. 11 Clemson Tigers take down Western Carolina, 5-0, at Historic Riggs Field on Sunday evening. Makenna Morris, Maria Manousos, Megan Bornkamp and Samantha Meredith all scored at least one goal, as Mackiewicz earned her fifth clean sheet of the season. Jenna Tobia also came away with three assists for the Tigers.

"All we are looking for in each and every game is, 'are we continuing to get better? Are we making strides in different areas?' And I think we took a good step forward this weekend," Head Coach Eddie Radwanski said. "The season is getting ramped up soon, ACC play is approaching so where we are now at this point, I'm pleased with the team. We are going to have to continue to do all the things we are doing well when we face our next opponent next week."

Morris, a senior, started the action early for the Tigers as scored off a header in the sixth minute of the first half. Tobia, who garnered the assist, passed it over to Morris who was able to head it in high over the Western Carolina keeper in the left side of the net. Morris' header was not her only goal of the night as the defender launched another goal past the keeper in the 72nd minute of the second half off another assist from Tobia.

Manousos, who scored her first goal of the 2023 campaign, ended the first half of the match with an impressive shot off her left foot, which flew past the keeper. Sophomore forward Emma Wennar and Sydney Minarik were credited with the assist.

Bornkamp tabbed her second goal of the 2023 campaign to put the Tigers up 3-0 just 43 seconds into the second half. After Western Carolina kicked off to start the half, Clemson quickly gained control and marched down the field. After swinging the ball from a left attack to the right side of the field, Tobia sent a cross field pass just outside the six-yard box that Bornkamp got her head on and sent into the lower left corner.

"I'm trying to help the team in any way I can and I think my role on the field has helped us a lot with getting in on transition and with my speed, I think it's helped us put it in the back of the net," Tobia said.


Clemson didn't slow down, adding another insurance goal with just under 15 minutes remaining in the match. Clemson was awarded a corner kick that Dani Davis put into play. The ball was quickly sent back out to her in the lower right corner of the field by a Catamount defender. With pressure on, Davis sent a cross pass that Meredith got her head on through traffic to send to the lower right corner for the fifth and final goal of the match.

In goal for the Tigers in all 90 minutes was Mackiewicz who has now earned five clean sheets. By the end of the match, the star goalkeeper recorded three saves against the Catamounts to post her 15th-career shutout, which ties with Sandy Maclver (2016-18) for fourth-most by a Tiger.

Up next, the Tigers will host No. 8 Arkansas at Historic Riggs Field on Thursday, September 7th as Clemson will look to secure their third win in a row at home. Kick-off is slaked for 6 p.m. and the match will be streamed on ACCNX.



2023 SEASON PREVIEW



CLEMSON, S.C. – As the 2023 roster blends together a group of nationally regarded returners, highly skilled reserves and some talented new faces, a new era will begin for Clemson Women's Soccer. Coming off a successful preseason run, these Tigers are ready to prove themselves at the national level.

"Our group is very much looking forward to the 2023 fall season. We have been working for this moment ever since the start of the spring semester of last year," Head Coach Eddie Radwanski said. "Our group is dialed in, intense and looking forward to getting after it and competing in the ACC and NCAA. I think we have a little bit of something to prove this year, a little bit of a chip on our shoulder and I think we just need to continue our theme of 'were just going to worry about us, were going to be the best version of us we can be and we will trust that our results will carry themselves'."

Ranked No. 25 in the nation, the Tigers bring back a unique force of returners with Hal Hershfelt, Megan Bornkamp and Caroline Conti leading this team in the orange and purple. Both Bornkamp and Hershfelt were named to the Preseason All-ACC Team and were named players to watch by the United Soccer Coaches. Conti led the team in points in the 2022 season as she tallied 13 total points with five assists and four goals on the year.

"I'm excited to be back playing with the team I love and to play another season at Riggs. The atmosphere we have at home games is unreal," Hershfelt said. "We have a lot of goals this season, and it being my last year it really is all or nothing. We have to do all we can to leave our mark."

The Tigers wrapped up the 2022 season with an 8-5-5 overall record and a 4-3-3 record in conference play. For the ninth-straight season, the Tigers continued their run in the postseason as they earned a No. 5 seed and a bid to the NCAA tournament where they took on Vanderbilt in the first round to end the season.

Wearing the gloves for the Tigers this season will be Halle Mackiewicz, who was a key component for this team in the 2022 campaign. Mackiewicz started all 18 matches last season and ended the campaign with 59 saves and .759 save percentage.

Also returning to the roster for Clemson is senior Makenna Morris and junior Renee Lyles. Both players were in the top three for total points at the end of the 2022 season as they followed Conti with 11 (Lyles) and 10 (Morris) points.

Putting on the Tiger threads for the first time this season is Jenna Tobia, Tatum Short, Eleanor Hays and Dani Lynch. Tobia and Short impressed all with their preseason performances and will look to continue that success in their freshman campaigns.

The coaching staff of 13 seasons is made up of Head Coach, Eddie Radwanski who will look to lead this team to the top. Radwanski is supported by Associate Head Coach Jeff Robbins and Assistant Coach Siri Mullinix. The trio also added Allison Wetherington to their staff as she takes on the role of an assistant coach and will add a professional perspective with her experience in the NWSL as a guiding light.
