What's Happening?

Florida continues road action versus teams getting mention in the United Soccer Coaches poll. Sunday, the Gators were at Georgia – a team receiving votes in the poll. Now the Gators are at No. 10 Arkansas Thursday. One more ranked opponent awaits Florida later this month as the Gators close regular-season action playing host to No. 15 South Carolina. Thursday's match airs on SEC Network at 7 p.m. ET.

Last UF-ARK Meeting:

An early goal was the difference as then No. 9 Arkansas edged Florida 1-0 at Disney Stadium on Oct. 6, 2022. It was Florida's eighth of a 10 match span decided by a single goal. Razorback Sophia Aragon's shot hit hard off the near post in the sixth minute. That deflection landed just above the six-yard box where Jessica De Filippo stepped up to score with a right-footed shot.

Florida's **Alexa Goldberg** was replaced in goal by senior **Francesca Faraci** with seven minutes remaining in the opening half. Goldberg and Arkansas' Anna Podojil collided, resulting in Goldberg's head laceration. Goldberg returned to Florida's starting lineup for its next match on Oct. 9 at Missouri.

Last Time Out:

Gators:

Florida and Georgia played to a scoreless tie Sunday, Oct. 8 on a sunny afternoon in Athens, Ga. At 39 all-time meetings, Georgia is Florida's most frequent opponent. This result was just the second scoreless tie and first since the debut meeting on Oct. 15, 1995 in Gainesville, Fla. It was Florida's seventh shutout of the season, the most since also posting seven shutouts in 2018.

Razorbacks:

Arkansas lost its first SEC match in a 2-1 decision at Auburn. It was AU's first win in the last 10 meetings versus Arkansas. The Tigers took an early lead off Anna Haddock's goal in the third minute. A seven-minute second half span contained the final goals of the match. Arkansas' Ava Tankersley tied the match with her goal at 53:14. Sydnie Thibodaux hit the game-winning goal off a right-footed strike in the 60th minute.

Gator Soccer:

This is Gator Soccer's 29th season. UF soccer advanced to the NCAA Tournament 22 times and is one of 11 programs to win a NCAA title in the 41-year history of NCAA play. Florida's 14 SEC titles leads the league.

Florida's 36 player roster is second only to the 39 who made up the Gators' 2016 roster. The 18 returners includes six with 11 or more starts in last season's 17-match schedule. This is the 15th time in the program's 29 seasons that 30 or more players make up UF's roster.

Florida was 2-14-1 in 2022 and were last in SEC action with a 0-9-1 record. Four who turned in UF's season-leading goal totals return in 2023 – seniors **Delaney Tauzel** (2 goals, 3 assists, 7 points), **Julianne Leskauskas** (2g, 2a), **Tessa Barton** (2g, 1a) and junior **Madison Young** (2g). Senior goalkeeper **Alexa Goldberg** started 16 matches and made 58 saves.

The Gators closed 2023 non-conference action at 2022 NCAA College Cup semifinalist Florida State on Sept. 10 with 1-0 loss. That meeting started a stretch that includes eight 2022 NCAA Tournament teams in UF's final 11 matches of regular-season action.

The Gators' 2023 fall schedule includes three opponents ranked in the United Soccer Coaches preseason top 25 – at No. 6 Florida State (Sept. 10 – 1-0 loss), at No. 8 Arkansas (Oct. 12) and No. 12 South Carolina (Oct. 26).

About this Week's Opponents:

No. 10 Arkansas (9-3-1, 5-1 SEC)



In 2022, Arkansas was 13-4-5 overall and third in the Southeastern Conference with a 6-2-2 record. The Razorbacks lost 1-0 at Florida State in NCAA Quarterfinal action. The Razorbacks return eight starters, including four-time All-American Anna Podojil who is the program's career leader for goals and points.

At No. 10, Arkansas leads the three SEC teams on the current United Soccer Coaches poll. The Razorbacks have played three ranked teams on the road – then No. 12 Notre Dame (2-2 tie), then No. 4 North Carolina (3-1 loss) and then No. 9 Clemson (1-0 loss). The Razorbacks are coming off their first SEC loss of 2023 (2-1 at Auburn) and top the SEC standings with 15 points. Arkansas' schedule in No. 12 in the NCAA's 2023 Toughest Schedule Report. A league-high 15 Razorbacks have scored goals this season. Morgan White's six goals and Podojil's five assists lead the Razorbacks this season. Sierra Cota-Yarde has 12 starts in goal this season and owns a goals-against-average of 1.41.

2023 Gator Schedule

Florida's schedule presents plenty of challenges in 2023.

- United Soccer Coaches preseason top 25 includes three Gator opponents: at No. 6 Florida State (Sept. 10), at No. 8 Arkansas (Oct. 12) and versus No. 12 South Carolina (Oct. 26).

- Florida faces two different 2022 champions this season. The Gators close their 2023 non-conference slate at 2022 co-Atlantic Coast Conference champion Florida State on Sept. 10. Then Florida ends regular-season action by playing host to 2022 SEC Tournament champion South Carolina on Oct. 26.

- Of the nine Southeastern Conference teams to advance to the 2022 NCAA Tournament, seven are among Florida's 2023 schedule – Arkansas, Georgia, LSU, Mississippi State, South Carolina, Tennessee and Vanderbilt. Arkansas advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinal round.

Another 2023 opponent among last season's 64-team NCAA Tournament field was Florida State, who advanced to the NCAA semifinals.

Florida's 37th Teammate

Florida's 2023 roster actually runs 37 deep. Just before 2019 preseason camp began, the Gators added - **Brooke Dunn** of Leesburg, Fla.

Ten-year old Brooke, a Gator fan since birth, made her Florida allegiance official with her adoption through the [Friends of Jaclyn](#) organization. She was diagnosed in April of 2018 with neuroblastoma, a cancer of the central nervous system and nerve tissue. The first step of the treatment, chemotherapy, started soon after the diagnosis. The treatment disrupted Brooke's plans to attend the Gators' Orange & Blue game (a big disappointment for Brooke!).

Friends of Jaclyn's mission is "to improve the quality of life for children and families living with pediatric brain tumors and other childhood cancer. Friends of Jaclyn matches children with high school and college athletic teams to provide support for the child and spread awareness of brain tumors throughout the community. Brooke is the 261st child to join a team through the Friends of Jaclyn program.

Two days after her adoption by the Gator program, **Brooke got some further good news. She rang the bell at Shands Pediatrics to signal NEC (no evidence of disease).**

GAINESVILLE, Fla. – It’s another shutout win as Florida soccer moves to 2-0 in this young campaign after Sunday’s 1-0 win over Maryland at the Donald R. Dizney Stadium.

It is the 16th time – and first since 2019 - UF has opened a season 2-0. Florida’s now started six of its 29 seasons with a pair of shutouts, with the last coming in 2017.

Tonight’s Match
It was a gritty effort throughout the match, just as Florida Coach **Samantha Bohon** expected. And tonight’s effort was just what the Florida coaching staff was looking for.

“We knew this was gonna be a gritty effort because Maryland didn’t get the result they wanted on Thursday so we were ready for battle and that’s exactly what we got. I think the game had ebbs and flows of who was on the front foot but at the end of the day, if you would have told me that we would kind of gut out a win this early in the season, that’s really encouraging for me because we always kind of have our foundation on that mentality of that blue collar work rate. You saw that tonight for us to get a result against a good Maryland team.”

The only goal of the match came six minutes after freshman **Lena Bailey** entered the match.

The first goal of **Bailey’s** career started in the 41st minute with a throw-in at the top corner of the box. Bailey received the ball, spun to distance her defender and then took a couple of steps before sending a right-footed shot to the far corner.

“I just got the ball, took a touch and I hit it back post,” Bailey said. “I didn’t even know what to feel [after the goal]. I was just running back but there was definitely a lot of emotion and joy in that moment.

A combined effort on a pair of shots by UM’s Lauren Wrigley helped keep the Terrapins off the scoreboard in the final three minutes. Wrigley’s first shot was blocked by UF junior **Madison Young**. Then UF senior goalkeeper **Alexa Goldberg** made the stop at the back post on Wrigley’s second attempt.

Goldberg is encouraged about what she’s seen from the team in the opening weekend.

“With two wins under our belt, that’s definitely going to help us keep the ball rolling. It give us the confidence to keep putting together the connections through each area of the field and to do what Sam [Bohon] is planning for us to do throughout the season,” Goldberg said.

“I’m really excited to see how we progress from these first two games because you can see the difference already in just our speed of play, our connections from the defense, midfield to the frontline, how dynamic we become. It’s really exciting to see that and I think it’s going to continue super quickly.

Not only was it Florida’s first road match, it was also the Gators’ first weather delayed match. Lightning forced the players from the field in the 48th minute. The match resumed after an hour and 25 minute delay at 8:36 p.m.

“It is especially early in the season so you’re looking to keep learning and growing and progressing. We’ll come away from this game having learned a lot such as just dealing with the delay. I thought we came out after the delay like a shot out of a cannon, really pushing to try and get that game winner,” Bohon said. “Overall, we’re actually pretty pleased with the growth even just within this game. To have a third shutout against three good opponents is really a commitment to our whole team defense not so just by the backline but from our entire team.

For the match, Florida outshot the Hurricanes 14-1.

“Obviously, we’re really disappointed because we thought we did enough to win the game. There’s a lot of things that we’re going to take away from tonight,” Bohon said. “So we’re going to move forward to a tough Stetson team on Sunday.”

There isn’t a Gator on the current team who was around when Florida last scored eight goals in a match - Oct. 3, 1999 in 8-0 win versus Florida International.

It is the seventh time – and first since 2017 - UF has opened a season unbeaten through the opening four matches. This is the first time in the program’s 29 seasons that a Gator team opened a season with four consecutive shutouts.

Tonight’s Match

Three turned in their first Gator goals tonight. That included a double first-half goal effort from both freshman **Megan Hinnenkamp** and graduate transfer **Molly Grant**.

Hinnenkamp, Missouri’s 2023 Gatorade Player of the Year, got the Gator scoring going in the 17th minute off assists from Tori Grambo and Lauren McCloskey. Just over two minutes later, Hinnenkamp earned her first collegiate brace after she took the ball down the right sideline and then hit a right footed 17-yard shot to far corner.

Then it was Grant’s turn to tally a brace. Grant scored her first Gator goal in the 22nd minute when she put in the ball from the eight yards off assists from **Tatum O’Coyne** and **Anna DeLeon**. Then in the 28th minute, Grant got the tap in at the far post off assists from **Charlotte McClure** and **Amelia Malkin**. It was the 28th time– and first since Sept. 20, 2018 at Kentucky – opened a match with four goals.

Freshman **Lena Bailey** started the second half scoring putting in **Njeri Butts’** cross in the 51st minute. It was the second consecutive Sunday score for Bailey, as the reigning Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Week scored the only goal in the 1-0 win versus Maryland.

Senior **Julianne Leskauskas** hit a bullet from 22 yards to the right upper slot at 56:47 for her opening score of 2023.

In her first appearance as a Gator, freshman **Liwa Nilsson** scored her first collegiate goal at 67:46. The ball was sent in by an **Oakley Rasmussen** corner kick. Grant touch the ball out to Nilsson located at the top of the box. She took a touch before hitting a right-footed shot to the right corner.

Scoring closed in the 81st minute when O’Coyne sent a cross from deep in the Hatter half. **Tessa Barton** let the ball roll past her to a wide open **Maddy Rhodes** at the far post. The goal was Rhodes first since her freshman season.

Coach Samantha Bohon Said:

"I think the thing that I'm most proud of is another clean sheet. We've worked really hard on that and sometimes you can get a little casual in these games and have mental lapses. I thought we were really solid, allowing one shot the whole 90 minutes. So really proud of that and obviously being able to put a bunch of the back of net.

"We were disappointed with Miami [0-0 tie last Thursday] because we thought we created chances to win that game. So it's nice to see this response tonight. We got stronger tonight. We had some people back [from injuries] who got valuable minutes which is really important for developing our depth. So that's the frustration is those all three of those goals were exactly how they've been scoring this year and in my opinion, they're preventable from our end. So that's really disappointing.

"I'm obviously pleased with how we kept fighting even though we were down two goals in the second half. We created incredible chances. Really a credit to that keeper because she was outstanding. But again, we just can't expect to be able to have a frantic finish in the last 25 minutes.

"I was pleased with aside from the first 20 minutes of the first half and then maybe the first 10 of the second half. I actually thought we played a little bit better. And we created some really good chances. The girls kept fighting but that's not enough. So we've got to be better for 90 minutes. And not 70." – Florida Soccer Head Coach **Samantha Bohon**

BATON ROUGE, La. – It's going to be an enjoyable flight back to the Sunshine State tonight for the Gator soccer team.

Double goals in each half gave Florida a 4-0 win over Louisiana State Friday evening in front of season-high 2,029 fans at the LSU Soccer Stadium.

It is Florida's first Southeastern Conference win this season and pushes out the Gators all-time record in Baton Rouge to 10-0-1. Florida also won 4-0 when these two teams last met Oct. 24, 2021 at the Donald R. Dizney Stadium.

This Evening's Scoring:
From the opening kick, Florida was on the attack. That effort was rewarded in the 16th minute when **Julianne Leskauskas** jumped on the LSU goalkeeper's misplay of a backpass, scoring on an empty net from just inside the top of the box. It was Leskauskas' second score of the season and Florida's earliest first-half goal of 2023.

Then just under six minutes later, Florida scored on a set play. Junior **Madison Young** sent the long free kick to **Megan Hinnenkamp** located a step above the six-yard box. Sandwiched between a Tiger defender and the LSU goalkeeper, Hinnenkamp's header flick scored at 21:26.

The second half produced two more Gator goals.

In the 68th minute, **Madeline Pirrello's** deep cross was headed in by senior **Anna DeLeon** from the far corner of the six-yard box. It was DeLeon's second collegiate goal and first since starting UF's scoring for the 2022 season at Stetson.

Hinnenkamp earned the brace in the 74th minutes. Florida's **Oakley Rasmussen** cleared the LSU free kick to midway of the Florida half. Hinnenkamp headed the ball to herself and then moved down the right side of the field, scoring from 22 yards on a right-footed shot. It is the second double-goal match for Hinnenkamp, who leads UF and all SEC freshmen with six goals.

For the match, Florida outshot the Tigers 16-6 as LSU was unable to register any shots on goal.

Hear from Coach Bohon:
On Florida's performance today:
"This was long overdue. Our group has done enough to win a few times in conference play and it's not fallen our way, so I'm really happy for them to have a win like this. Wins are hard to come by but road wins are even harder, so this is something our group should be proud of.

"LSU has some weapons so to keep a clean sheet with no shots on goal says a lot about the mental and physical commitment we had tonight. It makes for a happy flight home, that's for sure. We'll enjoy it tonight and get back with the rest of our group and have an enjoyable film session before turning our attention to Mississippi State. But we hope this will give us a little momentum going into a crucial part of SEC play."
