#### **SNAPSHOT:**

- Began final season with 17 points on an efficient 7-of-11 shooting with three 3s in win vs. ULM
- No. 10 (1.480) on all-time scoring list at Arkansas
- Leading league in career assists among active players (315) and is ninth in scoring (after one game)
- SEC Preseason Second Team selection

#### **SNAPSHOT:**

- Put up a near double-double with 16 points and eight boards vs. ULM in the win
- Was a solid 10-of-12 from the charity stripe in win
- Now sits at No. 20 in career assists with 254
- Tabbed the 2022 SEC Freshman of the Year

#### **SNAPSHOT:**

- Began collegiate career with a bang with 29 points and six boards vs. ULM in the win
- The 29 points is most by a freshman in Arkansas debut
- Her 29 points is the most scored by an SEC player to start the year, 14th in the country
- McDonald's All-American and No. 11 recruit in class

#### SNAPSHOT:

- Was one rebound away from tying the single-game record with 21 vs. ULM, which is the most in the NCAA
- Her 21 rebounds became a sophomore class record
- SEC All-Freshman Team & five-time FOW last year
- Started in all 37 games as a redshirt freshman

#### **SNAPSHOT:**

- Made first career start vs. ULM, logging four points, seven boards and two blocks
- Was 42 percent from the field last season
- Logged four double-digit scoring games and seven 5+ rebounding contests last season
- Last year was her first off an ACL injury





#### 2023-24 NOTES

#### **NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH**

- Arkansas women's basketball got the 2023–24 season started with a victory over ULM, 81–76, to open the season 1–0 for the 12th straight year, 29th in the last 31 years
- The win over ULM marked **Mike Neighbors'** season-opening record to 9–2 as a head coach
- Taliah Scott enjoyed quite a collegiate debut with a team—leading 29 points, which marked the most points scored by a freshman in their Arkansas debut vs. the Warhawks
- As one of the best rebounders in the country, **Saylor Poffenbarger** pulled down a career-high 21 rebounds, which was one shy of tying the individual game record. She broke the sophomore game record and has pulled down the most boards in an NCAA game thus far
- Arkansas is set to host Elementary Day with an expected 7,000 kids in attendance, which would break the Elementary Day record. Good luck to listening to Baby Shark 5 million times
- Coach **Neighbors** has brought the program five straight postseason appearances and three 20-win campaigns
- The Hogs were picked to finish sixth and seventh in the SEC Preseason Media and Coaches Poll, respectively
- Arkansas came just short of qualifying for the NCAA Tournament, but the team made the most out of their opportunity to play in the postseason, finishing in the Great 8 of the Postseason WNIT, which marked the fourth time in program history the Razorbacks advanced to the fourth round of that tournament
- Fifth-year **Makayla Daniels** was selected on the All-SEC Preseason Second Team, as chosen by the league's coaches. After 17 points on an efficient 7-of-11 shooting from the field against ULM, **Daniels** has 1,480 points to sit No. 10 all-time in school history and has started in all 123 games she has appeared in
- Samara Spencer is the leading returning scorer from last year, having averaged 14.4 points per game and pacing the team with 154 assists. She picked up from where she left off in the season opener, logging a near double-double of 16 points and eight boards vs. ULM
- After one game, Sasha Goforth leads the team in blocks with three and steals with three, as well, after capturing those vs. ULM in the opener
- Arkansas is one of two schools in the SEC to have finished in the top 50 in NET/RPI rankings in the past four years (South Carolina the other) and one of three in the SEC to qualify for the past five consecutive postseason tournaments (SC and Tennessee the others, including 2020 when the tournament was cancelled due to COVID-19)
- Coach **Neighbors** returns three starters from the 2022–23 team, seven total returners, while bringing in the No. 17 ranked recruiting class, according to ESPN
- Scott comes to Fayetteville as a five-star prospect, No. 11 in the country, logging 36.2 points, 9.2 rebounds, 4.8 assists and 3.0 steals per game during her senior year of high school. Fellow freshman Jenna Lawrence was a four-star recruit, No. 61 recruit in the country, out of Farmington High School down the road, who won the 2023 4A Girls State Championship. Maryn Archer was a January enrollee and three-star player out of Kansas, while JUCO transfer Carly Keats and Spanish National Team member Cristina Sanchez Cequeira make up one of the most talented recruiting classes Arkansas has seen

#### **STORYLINES**

- Bud Walton Arena is expected to welcome over 7,000 kids for Elementary Day on Friday, which alone without normal fan attendance would break an Elementary Day record
- Arkansas is pushing for a crowd of 10,000 attendants, which would mark the largest crowd at Bud Walton Arena since 2003
- The program is 11-1 all-time in Elementary Day games, 11-0 at home
- Taliah Scott put the nation on notice with her 29 points vs. ULM in her collegiate debut, which was the most by an Arkansas freshman in their first game as a Hog
- Saylor Poffenbarger 21 rebounds is the most pulled down by a player in the NCAA thus far this season and was just one shy of tying the school record (22 by Shelly Wallace vs. SMU in 1988)
- Arkansas is looking to extend its streak of starting out a season 2-0 to 12 games with a win over Murray State
- The Hogs are playing Murray State for the third time in program history, holding a 2-0 record over the Racers. Both teams haven't faced one another since December 5, 1990

# **SCOUTING MURRAY STATE**ABOUT THE RACERS

- Friday's game will serve as Murray State's season opener
- Murray State was chosen to finish seventh out of 12 teams in the Missouri Valley Conference Preseason Poll, as chosen by the league's coaches
- Katelyn Young was chosen to the All–MVC Preseason First Team. Young is coming off last season having averaged 21.4 points per game, which led the MVC, and 7.8 rebounds per game. The rising senior was the 2021–22 Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Year and found herself on the 2024 Becky Hammon Mid–Major Player of the Year Watchlist

- The Racers finished last season 15–16, 7–13 in the MVC, which was eighth in the league. Murray State beat Evansville in the MVC Tournament, 88–46, before almost upsetting No. 1–seed Illinois State, 75–73, in the quarterfinals
- The Racers have a veteran-heavy roster, as 10 of the 15 are upperclassmen

#### ABOUT THE HEAD COACH

- Head coach **Rechelle Turner** is in her seventh season at the helm at Murray State, coming into this year with a 91–89 career record
- Turner tied a school record for most regular season wins with 21 in 2021–22, while guiding the Racers to back-to-back OVC semifinal appearances in 2021 and 2022
- A Kentucky native and former Murray State player, **Turner** was the head coach at Murray High School for 21 years, leading the Tigers to a 460–178 all—time record

#### SERIES HISTORY OF MURRAY STATE VS. ARKANSAS

- Arkansas is 2-0 in the all-time series against the Racers, with Arkansas reaching triple digits in both victories
- These two teams haven't squared off since 1990, as Arkansas defeated Murray State, 102–48 on Dec. 5, 1990
- Both games in this series have been played in Fayetteville
- The first game of the series was on Feb. 4, 1983, as Arkansas won, 100-69

#### **LAST TIME OUT**

- Arkansas pulled out a hard-fought victory over a talented ULM team, 81–76 in the season opener. The Hogs held a 14-point lead with about 3.5 minutes left in the game, but a late surge by the Warhawks made it a one possession game with 19 seconds left in the contest. Arkansas was able to hit 6-of-8 from the charity stripe down the stretch to pull out the win
- Taliah Scott led the Hogs with 29 points, which is the most scored by an Arkansas freshman in their debut. She was 9-of-13 from the line and added six boards in 32 minutes played in the start
- Makayla Daniels was an efficient 7-of-11 from the field, 3-of-5 from 3-point for 17 points with two steals
- **Samara Spencer** logged 16 points, shooting 10-of-12 from the line with eight boards
- In her first game back since March 2022, **Sasha Goforth** registered four points, seven rebounds, three blocks and three steals
- Maryam Dauda had four points, seven rebounds and two blocks in her first career start
- The Hogs' 44 free throws attempted went down as the third most in a game in school history

#### AN ARKANSAS WIN MEANS...

- Opening the season 2-0 for the 12th consecutive year
- Going 12-0 in Elementary Day games played at home, 12-1 overall
- A victory over an expected top 5-10 crowd all-time in Bud Walton Arena
- Staying undefeated in the series vs. Murray State to extend the Hogs' all—time record against the Racers to 3–0

#### **RETURN OF THE MAK**

- Granted a fifth-year of eligibility due to COVID-19, Makayla Daniels is making the most of it and finishing what she started at Arkansas
- Began her fifth season with 17 points off an efficient 7-for-11 shooting from the field, 3-of-5 from beyond the arc vs. ULM. Made some huge shots down the stretch and came up with big defensive stops, finishing with two steals and no turnovers
- Scrappy player, creates for herself and teammates and an incredibly underrated defender who can hold a team's leading guard well below their scoring average
- Sits at No. 10 on the all-time scoring list at Arkansas with 1,480 points, which is the second most among Hog point guards. She needs 78 more points to surpass **C'eira Ricketts** to be the highest scoring point guard in Arkansas WBB history
- Has the opportunity to move up further among several career statistical categories in the record book at Arkansas. Sits third in games started (123), seventh in 3-pointers made (183), 3-pointers attempted (524) and free throws made (366), ninth in free throw percentage (.784) and free throws attempted (467), 10th in 3-point percentage (.347) and 13th in assists (315)
- Daniels has started in every game she has appeared in since her freshman year with 123 total starts. Out of players across the country who have also started in every game they have appeared in throughout their collegiate career, she has the second most starts among NCAA DI players
- SEC statistical rankings: third in 3-point field goal percentage (.600) and 3-pointers/game (3.0), sixth in minutes played/game (33.5), ninth in



scoring (17.0) and steals/game (2.0) and 12th in field goal percentage (.636)

- Owns most assists, second most steals (194) and third most points among active players in SEC
- Named All—SEC Preseason Second Team twice in a row, including at the beginning of this 2023–24 season
- Averaged 11.3 points per game off 13-of-24 shooting and led the way with seven steals through three games during the Europe trip
- Paced the team with 56 steals last season and was third in scoring with 13.2 points/game
- Logged 27 double-digit scoring games with 12 4+ assists contests in 2022-23
- Finished the season with a bang by averaging 14.5 points, 5.8 rebounds and 2.3 assists per game throughout the Postseason WNIT
- Won Paradise Jam Reef Tournament MVP, averaging 17.3 points, 5.7 rebounds, 2.7 assists and 2.0 steals per game
- Was No. 1 on Sportscenter for her buzzer beater against Vanderbilt in game where she finished with 16 points

#### **SUNSHINE STATE STUD**

- South Florida product **Samara Spencer** made an impact on the Hogs the moment she stepped foot on campus, being named the 2022 SEC Freshman of the Year and averaged 14.4 points per game and tallying 154 total assists as a sophomore
- Coming off a near double-double with 16 points, 10-of-12 from the free throw line, with eight rebounds against ULM in the season opener. Also drew an impressive 10 fouls
- One of the fastest on the court (easily beating her defenders to the rack), gets to the free throw line frequently and catches fire from beyond the arc
- SEC statistical rankings: first in free throw makes (10), second in free throw attempts (12), seventh in defensive rebounds/game (7.0), eighth in free throw percentage (.833), 12th in minutes/game (30.48), 13th in scoring (16.0) and 16th in rebounding (8.0)
- NCAA statistical rankings: sixth in free throws made and free throw attempts
- Her 10 free throws made and 12 attempts is the first and second most in the league thus far
- Among active SEC players, fourth in career assists (252) and ninth in career scoring (926, needing 74 points for 1,000)
- In Europe, averaged 6.3 points per game and

tallied six steals and a team-leading 13 assists through three games

- Finished her sophomore campaign with 27 double-digit scoring games, eight 20-point performances, two double-doubles in points and assists and had 13 games with 5+ assists
- Logged a career-high 32 points vs. Oral Roberts, shooting 10-of-17 from the field with a career-high six 3-pointers last season

#### SHE'S POFFEN OFF!

- Saylor Poffenbarger is a big guard who can be placed at all five positions on offense and defense if needed. One of the best defenders in the league, having a track record for holding the opposing team's top scorer to well below their normal level of production
- Coming off a career—high 21 rebounds vs. ULM, which was the second most in a single game in school history. Added seven points, as well as a block and steal
- SEC statistical rankings: first in rebounding (21.0) and defensive rebounds/game (18.0) and second in minutes/game (37.85)
- Her 21 rebounds is the most pulled down by any player in the country this year, leading the NCAA in rebounds and defensive rebounds, while playing the 40th most minutes in the country
- Throughout the Europe trip games, averaged a team's most 20.9 minutes per game with 9.3 points and 7.0 rebounds per game along with 10 assists
- Poffenbarger broke the single-season defensive rebound record as a freshman with 225 and finished second in single-season rebounds with 255
- Led the team in rebounds/game (6.9) and blocks (40) last season, finishing with 13 double-digit scoring games, nine 10+ rebounding contests, five 5+ assist games and four double-doubles (most on team)
- Registered a career-high 24 points at

- Spent the second half of the 2020–21 season at UConn as an early enrollee, coming in as the No. 30th player in the 2021 class

#### I'M TELLING A FRIEND TO **TELL A FRIEND**

- Hog fans and SEC women's basketball fans in general were elated with joy on a Saturday in April when Sasha Goforth announced she was returning back to basketball. The crowd's cheer when Goforth checked into the game against ULM was loud

# MIKE NEIGHBORS

Seventh Season | Career Record: 219-118 (11) | Arkansas Record: 121-77 (7)

Arkansas women's basketball has been transformed into a nationally recognized program in just six short years thanks to head coach Mike Neighbors. During his time back home at his alma mater, Neighbors has guided his Hogs to the best six-year period of sustained success in program history with 120 wins and five postseason qualifications in that time. The proof of his success, and the success of his system, lies in the numbers - Neighbors has accumulated 218 wins during his 10 seasons as a head coach, the most of any Power 5 head coaches in 10 or fewer seasons, as well as one of only two NCAA Division I Head Coaches.

Entering his seventh season on the bench for Arkansas, the program is coming off its fifth consecutive winning season, four straight postseason appearance (would be five had the 2020 NCAA Tournament had not been cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, as Arkansas was a lock to make the Big Dance) and third 20+ win season in the Neighbors' era.

In 2022-23, the Hogs started out the season 13-0, which was tied for the second-best start in program history. Going into Mid-December, the Hogs were ranked as high at No. 17 in the AP Poll. The Hogs won another SEC Tournament game in comeback fashion versus Missouri to make it to the quarterfinals and hold the best winning percentage in the SEC Tournament among all coaches in Arkansas history with an 8-6 record. Continuing into postseason, Arkansas became the automatic bid out of the SEC to the Postseason WNIT, making it to the Great 8, while being able to host three of its four games at Bud Walton Arena. Neighbors led the Hogs to two All-SEC selections, including Second Team choice Erynn Barnum, who was also on the Midseason Top 10 List for the Katrina McClain Award, as well as All-Freshman selection Saylor Poffenbarger, who broke a school record for five SEC Freshman of the Week accolades. The Hogs finished the season with 24 wins, which tied for the most in the Neighbors' era and matches the fourth most in a single season in program history. Additionally, four players averaged double digits in scoring, the most in the Southeastern Conference.

Prior to Arkansas, Neighbors guided Washington to four seasons of unprecedented success, highlighted by the 2016 NCAA Final Four and two NCAA Sweet 16 appearances. Neighbors was an assistant for the Huskies prior to this promotion and also has had stops at Xavier, Tulsa, Colorado and Arkansas as an assistant.

A native of Greenwood, Arkansas, Neighbors received his associate degree at the University of Arkansas – Fort Smith and his bachelor's degree from the University of Arkansas in 1993. Neighbors is married to Jayci Stone. He has four children, a daughter, Abby and three sons, Alec, Bowen and Barrett, as well as a granddaughter, Emzey.


