NEED TO KNOW

- » Closing out the first month of the 2023-24 season, Duke travels to Arkansas for its inaugural game in the ACC/SEC Challenge on Wednesday night.
- » In the last conference challenge -- the ACC/BIG Challenge -- Duke owned the best record, by six wins, with a 20-4 ledger.
- » The matchup with Arkansas represents the third different power conference foe on Duke's non-conference schedule, having already played Arizona (Pac-12) and Michigan State (BIG). The Blue Devils round out their power-conference tour with Baylor (Big 12) in December.
- » The Blue Devils and Razorbacks have faced off four previous times, all on a neutral floor, with each team winning twice. Wednesday night marks the first meeting between the two programs in a team's home gym.
- » The Razorbacks have won nearly 82% of the time when playing at Bud Walton Arena, currently with a 422-95 record in the building.
- » Three of the four meetings have come in the NCAA Tournament -- including twice in the Final Four. The most recent matchup was in the 2022 Elite Eight, a 78-69 win by Duke. Current senior guard Jeremy Roach played 35 minutes in that game, scoring nine points.
- » Duke is coming off an 80-62 victory over Southern Indiana, capping off a 3-0 showing in the Blue Devil Challenge.
- » **Kyle Filipowski** (right) led Duke's efforts against the Screaming Eagles, scoring 21 points while grabbing a season-high 14 rebounds -- including 10 on the defensive glass.
- » Layden Blocker, a freshman for the Razorbacks, attended Sunrise Christian Academy prior to college -- the same high school as Duke sophomore Mark Mitchell.
- » Arkansas head coach Eric Musselman is in his fifth season as head coach for Arkansas and currently holds a 99-45 record in Fayetteville and a 209-79 record as a collegiate coach.
- » Wednesday night will mark the first game against an SEC team for Duke on Nov. 29 -- the Blue Devils had played three games in the ACC/BIG challenge on this date.

NOTES & CONNECTIONS

- » Duke opens ACC play on Saturday afternoon, traveling to take on Georgia Tech at 2:15 p.m.
- » The matchup is the first of two regular-season meetings between the two teams, with the Blue Devils and Yellow Jackets scheduled to play in Cameron Indoor Stadium on Jan. 13, 2024.
- » In the most recent meeting, Duke won in Atlanta, 86-43, on Jan. 28, 2023. The 43-point victory was the second-largest ACC road win in school history and just the third 40-point ACC road win in school history.
- » Duke owns a 77-24 advantage in the overall series, but is on just a two-game win streak.
- » The Jackets have four players averaging double-digit scoring so far this season, led by Miles Kelly's 18.8 points per game.
- » Damon Stoudamire is in his first year as head coach of the Georgia Tech program, after being hired in March of this year.
- » Stoudamire most recently coached for the Boston Celtics as an assistant coach -- a position that former Duke player and assistant coach, Amile Jefferson, was hired for following Stoudamire's departure.

Last Time Out

- » Duke used a 20-3 run, spanning the halftime break, to turn a 10-point deficit into an eight-point lead and never trailed again in an 80-62 victory over Southern Indiana on Friday night.
- » **Jeremy Roach** scored 16 second-half points and **Kyle Filipowski** secured the first double-double of his season, with 21 points and 14 rebounds.
- » The Blue Devils finished with four in double-figures, as **Tyrese Proctor** and **Jared McCain** joined their teammates with at least 10 points.
- » Proctor dished a game-high seven assists, his fourth game with at least five assists this season.
- » Duke out-rebounded the Screaming Eagles, 38-33. The Blue Devils are 5-0 when grabbing more boards than their opponent this season.

1st ACC/SEC Challenge; Fifth Meeting With Arkansas

- » The Blue Devils travel to an opposing arena for the first time this season, playing in the first ACC/SEC Challenge and playing at Arkansas for the first time in the all-time series with the program.
- » In the previous challenge, the ACC/BIG Challenge, Duke held the best overall record (20-4), six more than any other team.
- » Duke and Arkansas have played a total of four previous times, all on a neutral floor -- and three in the NCAA Tournament.
- » Two of the four matchups have come in the Final Four, with each team claiming a victory in the national semifinal. The Blue Devils won, 97-83, in 1990 and the Razorbacks prevailed, 76-72, in 1994.
- » Most recently, the two teams met in the 2022 Elite Eight, with Duke winning 78-69. Current Duke senior Jeremy Roach played 35 minutes in that game, scoring nine points.

Turning Defense Into Offense

- » Duke has held each of its opponents below their scoring average so far this season and has finished with an advantage on the glass in five of its first six games.
- » In each of the last three games, the Blue Devils have reeled in at least 38 rebounds.
- » Since being out-rebounded versus Arizona, the Blue Devils have averaged 40.3 boards across the last four contests.
- » On the offensive end of the floor across the last three games, Duke has valued the ball while averaging nearly 90 points per game and an eFG% of .570

Sharing the Rock

- » Against Bucknell and La Salle, the Blue Devils finished with 23 and 21 assists, while committing just seven and five turnovers -- good for a total of 44 assists and just 12 turnovers and a 3.7 assist-turnover ratio.
- » **Tyrese Proctor** has spearheaded the efforts, logging 21 assists with just three turnovers across the last three games. The sophomore guard has a total of 34 dimes and just seven turnovers through six games, a 4.86 assist-turnover ratio -- which is 16th best nationally overall and leads all underclassmen in the country with at least 30 assists.
- » The Blue Devils have scored over 90 points in two of their last three ballgames and have eclipsed the 90-point threshold three times in the first six games of the season.

Roach Reaches 1K

- » Senior guard **Jeremy Roach** became the 68th Blue Devil all-time to eclipse 1,000 career points in his Duke career, scoring 17 points against Arizona on Nov. 10.
- » The Blue Devils are now solo third in NCAA Division I for most 1,000-point scorers in program history, ahead of Notre Dame and Villanova.
- » Roach is the first Duke player to cross the threshold since **Grayson Allen**, **Luke Kennard** and **Amile Jefferson** all did so during the 2016-17 season.
- » The senior point guard reached another career milestone recently -- his 100th game in a Duke jersey came against La Salle on Nov. 21.

Duke's Three-Point Streak

- » Duke has connected on at least one three-pointer in 1,195 straight games, the second-longest streak nationally.
- » It has been more than 30 years since Duke was held without a three-point field goal -- Dec. 30, 1989, versus Hawai'i.

Trio of Captains

- » Three players have been selected as team captains for the 2023-24 season -- **Tyrese Proctor**, **Jeremy Roach** and **Ryan Young**. The trio were elected via a vote of the players and coaches.
- » Roach serves as captain for the second straight year, after serving as the team's lone captain last season.
- » Both Proctor and Young are first-time captains. Proctor is just the fourth sophomore in program history to serve as team captain, joining **Tre Jones** (2020) and **Greg Paulus** and **Josh McRoberts** (2007).
- » "Being named a captain is something that has been meaningful in our program for a long time," said Scheyer. "I'm proud of these three guys. I let each of our players vote - and it was a consensus with our staff as well - so it's certainly more meaningful when it comes from both the players and the staff."

Scheyer Announces Early Signing Period Class

- » Head coach **Jon Scheyer** announced his second No. 1 recruiting class in three years with the signing of five players to the class of 2024 during the NCAA early signing period.
- » The top-ranked class would mark the third consecutive top-two class for Scheyer, after inking the top class for 2022 and the No. 2 group in 2023.
- » The five-player class is led by No. 1 overall prospect, Cooper Flagg, and includes four ranked in the top 20 by 247Sports.
- » Four of the signees are rated as the top player in their respective states by either ESPN or 247Sports - Flagg (Maine), Isaiah Evans (North Carolina), Kon Il Knueppel (Wisconsin) and Patrick Ngongba II (Virginia).

AP Poll Streak Extends

- » With the release of the *Associated Press* preseason poll on Oct. 17, Duke was ranked No. 2 -- extending a notable streak.
- » The Blue Devils have now been ranked in the top 10 at least once in 28 consecutive seasons -- the longest active streak nationally. The next closest program is Kansas, which has held a top-10 ranking at some point in each of the last 18 seasons.
- » The No. 2 ranking also marked the 16th consecutive season that the Blue Devils made their debut in the top 10.
- » Duke has now debuted inside the top-three 17 times, most recently prior to the 2017-18 season.

Historic Debut for Head Coach Jon Scheyer

- » Former Duke All-American and two-time team captain **Jon Scheyer** made history with his head-coaching debut last season. He became just the third coach in ACC history to win the ACC Tournament in their first season and is the first to win an ACC title as both a player (2009, 2010) and as a coach (2023).
- » Scheyer was named a finalist for the Joe. B Hall Award, given to the best first-year head coach, as the Blue Devils finished ranked No. 12 in the final *Associated Press* poll, captured the program's 22nd ACC Tournament title, reached the NCAA Tournament for the 45th time and posted an overall record of 27-9 and a conference record of 14-6.
- » Duke entered the NCAA Tournament on a nine-game winning streak -- just three other Duke teams in history entered the NCAA Tournament on longer winning streaks (1999, 27-game streak; 1963, 18-game; 1986, 16-game). The Blue Devils pushed the streak to 10 games with a win over Oral Roberts in the first round.
- » The Northbrook, Ill., native has been integral in the recruiting and development of several young Duke stars since joining the staff, and as head coach, has landed the nation's No. 1-ranked recruiting class (2022-23) and No. 2-ranked recruiting class (2023).
- » Duke has signed a top-three recruiting class per ESPN in every season since Scheyer joined the staff, including the No. 1 class five times in 10 seasons (2014, 2015, 2017, 2018, 2022).

Continuity From Last Season

- » Duke returns 60.4 points per game from last year's roster, the most by a Duke team since the 2008-09 season, and brings back 77.9% of points scored in 2022-23 -- the most since the 2007-08 Duke team returned 81.3%.
- » Each of the Blue Devils' top-four scorers from a year ago are on the 2023-24 roster, which is the first time since at least 1997 -- as far back as research allows -- according to ESPN.
- » Four different players who made 30 or more starts in 2022-23 have returned to Durham, which marks the first time in Duke lore since the 2000-01 roster that included **Shane Battier**, **Carlos Boozer**, **Nate James** and **Jay Williams**. The 2000-01 team went on to win the program's third national championship.

ACC Preseason Picks: Duke First; Filipowski Player of the Year; Proctor Second Team

- » Duke was selected to finish first in the ACC this season, as chosen by media members in their preseason predictions.
- » The Blue Devils earned 44 of the 51 first-place votes and finished with 757 points, leading Miami, North Carolina and Virginia atop the preseason poll.
- » Sophomore forward **Kyle Filipowski**, reigning ACC Rookie of the Year, was named ACC Preseason Player of the Year and was a unanimous pick for the Preseason All-ACC First Team while his classmate, **Tyrese Proctor**, landed on the Second Team.
- » Filipowski received 35 votes for Preseason Player of the Year and Proctor also received a vote.

Four on Preseason Positional Awards

- » The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced its preseason watch lists for national positional awards, with four different Blue Devils earning recognition:

Tyrese Proctor -- Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year

Jeremy Roach -- Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year

Mark Mitchell -- Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year

Kyle Filipowski -- Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year

- » The most recent Duke winner of a Hall of Fame positional award was Wendell Moore Jr., who earned the Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year award in 2021-22.

Freshman Class Ranked No. 2 Nationally -- Duke's 10th Consecutive Top-3 Class

- » The second class fully recruited and signed by Scheyer was ranked No. 2 nationally by both *ESPN* and *247Sports*.
- » It marked the second consecutive top-two class signed by Scheyer after inking the nation's No. 1 class in 2022 for his first season as the Blue Devils' head coach.
- » The class was made up of four players, all ranked in *247Sports*' top 25, and three were ranked as the top player in their respective states per ESPN. **Jared McCain** was 10th on ESPN's Top 100, while **TJ Power**, **Sean Stewart** and **Caleb Foster** rounded out the class at No. 17, 22 and 23, respectively, in *247Sports*' rankings.
- » The class included two McDonald's All-Americans (Stewart, McCain), two named the Gatorade Player of the Year in their state (McCain, Power) and all four made the roster for the Jordan Brand Classic.

Duke Adds Two More McDonald's All-Americans

- » Following the announcement of the 2022 McDonald's All-American Game rosters, Duke has signed 90 McDonald's All-Americans all-time -- the most of any NCAA program.
- » The Blue Devils' most recent selections are **Jared McCain** and **Sean Stewart** while current Blue Devils **Jeremy Roach** (2020) and **Mark Mitchell** (2022) are also on Duke's roster.
- » Duke has added at least one McDonald's All-American in 39 consecutive years.

New Faces on the Bench

- » Scheyer made two new hires to Duke's coaching staff during the offseason -- **Will Avery** and **Emanuel Dildy**.
- » Avery was hired after new NCAA rules went into effect that included the addition of two full-time on-court coaching positions in men's basketball.
- » Avery, who starred at Duke from 1997 to 1999, had spent the last four seasons assisting with various aspects of the program while completing his undergraduate degree in African American studies. He left Duke after his sophomore year as the 14th overall pick by Minnesota in the 1999 NBA Draft.
- » Dildy was hired in August to fill the position vacated by **Amile Jefferson**, who was hired by the Boston Celtics in July.
- » Regarded in the coaching ranks as one of the nation's top recruiters, Dildy spent three years on the staff as an assistant coach under Chris Collins at Northwestern from 2018-21. He comes to Duke after a two-year stint as assistant coach for Porter Moser at Oklahoma, having recently been promoted to associate head coach.

Looking to Build on End of 2022-23

- » Duke ended the season with 10 wins in its last 11 games, and entered the NCAA Tournament on a nine-game winning streak.
- » Just three other Duke teams in history entered the NCAA Tournament on longer winning streaks (1999, 27-game streak; 1963, 18-game; 1986, 16-game).
- » Finding continuity towards the end of the season after a year full of injuries, Duke played 11 of its final 12 games with a full complement of players available and started the same lineup in 15 of its final 16 games. Duke finished the year with a 19-1 overall record in games with its full roster available -- was 8-8 otherwise.
- » Duke returns four starters from last year's team and 80% of its scoring.

NBA Season Begins with 24 Blue Devils on Opening Day Rosters

- » When the NBA season began on Oct. 24, Duke had 24 members of The Brotherhood on opening-day rosters.
- » The list was compiled from the NBA's official opening-day rosters (including two-way and inactive lists) and includes any Blue Devil that played and finished their college basketball careers at Duke.
- » Duke's players are spread across the country at a total of 18 NBA franchises, including a trio of Blue Devils with the Dallas Mavericks (**Kyrie Irving**, **Seth Curry**, **Dereck Lively II**), and duos in Atlanta (**Jalen Johnson**, **AJ Griffin**), Orlando (**Paolo Banchero**, **Wendell Carter Jr.**), Brooklyn (**Harry Giles**, **Dariq Whitehead**) and New Orleans (**Zion Williamson**, **Brandon Ingram**).
- » Duke's two first-round picks from the 2022-23 squad, Lively and Whitehead, are set to make their NBA debut this season. Lively had a historic debut, becoming the first player in NBA history to record at least 15 points and 10 rebounds while shooting better than 85 percent from the field in an NBA debut.
- » Whitehead, the third-youngest player in the NBA this season, has recovered from his off-season foot surgery and has progressed to live-action rehab.
- » Duke's two dozen players also join a long list of former players, coaches, managers and Duke graduates that serve on NBA coaching staffs or in front office roles for 26 of the league's 30 teams. That includes former Hall of Fame head coach **Mike Krzyzewski**, who joined the NBA this summer as a special advisor, 1984 Duke graduate **Adam Silver** (NBA Commissioner), **Grant Hill** (part owner of the Atlanta Hawks), **Elton Brand** (General Manager of the Philadelphia 76ers), **Trajan Landon** (General Manager of the New Orleans Pelicans), **Quin Snyder** (Head Coach of the Atlanta Hawks) and **Mike Dunleavy** (General Manager of the Golden State Warriors).

BIO

Former Duke All-American and two-time team captain Jon Scheyer is the 20th head coach in Duke University's storied basketball history. He was named to the position on June 4, 2021, succeeding Hall of Fame head coach Mike Krzyzewski.

Scheyer, who enters his second season as head coach in 2023-24, has vast experience on the Duke bench, having served on Krzyzewski's staff since the 2013-14 season. His previous roles with the Blue Devils include special assistant, assistant coach and the previous three years as associate head coach. Scheyer and Duke agreed to a new six-year contract in October of 2023, extending him through the 2028-29 season.

The 35-year-old Scheyer was among the youngest head coaches in Division-I men's basketball, and the youngest at a power conference institution. He was named to *The Athletic's* 40 Under 40 in college sports in 2022, and was previously touted as one of the best assistant coaches in college basketball.

As a player, Scheyer sparked the Blue Devils to two ACC championships and the 2010 NCAA title as a player from 2007-10. In his time on the coaching staff, he has helped Duke compile a 272-80 (.773) record, a national championship (2015), two Final Fours (2015, 2022) and three ACC Tournament crowns (2017, 2019, 2023).

The Northbrook, Ill., native has been integral in the recruiting and development of several young Duke stars since joining the staff, and landed the nation's No. 1-ranked recruiting class for the 2022-23 campaign and No. 2-ranked class for 2023-24.

Duke has signed a top-three recruiting class per ESPN in every season since Scheyer joined the staff, including the No. 1 class five times in 10 seasons (2014, 2015, 2017, 2018, 2022).

2022-23 IN REVIEW

SEASON SUMMARY

- » The 118th season of Duke Basketball ushered in a new era for the program with **Jon Scheyer** succeeding Hall of Famer **Mike Krzyzewski** as the 20th head coach in the team history.
- » In an historic debut campaign for Scheyer, the Blue Devils finished ranked No. 12 in the *Associated Press* poll, captured the program's 22nd ACC Tournament title, reached the NCAA Tournament for the 45th time and posted a 27-9 overall record and a 14-6 mark in ACC play.
- » Scheyer inherited one of the nation's youngest rosters, with junior captain **Jeremy Roach** as the lone returning starter from a Duke team that reached the Final Four in 2021-22.
- » Eighty percent of Duke's minutes in the 2022-23 season were logged by players not on the roster the previous year -- the highest percentage on record in team history.
- » Finding continuity towards the end of the season after a year full of injuries, Duke played 11 of its final 12 games with a full complement of players available and started the same lineup in 15 of its final 16 games. Duke finished the year with a 19-1 overall record in games with its full roster available -- was 8-8 otherwise.
- » Duke entered the NCAA Tournament on a nine-game winning streak -- just three other Duke teams in history entered the NCAA Tournament on longer winning streaks (1999, 27-game streak; 1963, 18-game; 1986, 16-game).
- » With a priority on defense and rebounding, the Blue Devils held opponents below their season scoring average 31 times and were 27-4 in those games. They out-rebounded 29 opponents and were 25-4 when doing so.
- » Duke's 63.6 points allowed were its fourth fewest since 1950-51 and the fewest since the school-record 61.0 allowed by the 2010 squad.
- » The tallest team in the nation, Duke used its length on the perimeter and height at the rim to finish as one of just three Division I teams in the NCAA's top 40 for scoring defense (30th), field goal defense (27th), three-point defense (24th) and blocked shots (37th) -- Houston and Connecticut were the others.
- » On the glass, Duke was fifth nationally and led the ACC in rebounding margin (+7.9), while also leading the ACC and ranking 21st in rebounds per game (38.7). Duke was second in the conference in total rebounds (38.7) and third in defensive boards (26.7).
- » Freshman **Kyle Filipowski** recorded 16 double-doubles to lead all Division I freshmen, rank second in the ACC overall and 11th nationally and was tied for the second most by a Duke freshman all-time. He led all power conference freshmen in rebound average and his 322 boards were tied for third most by a Duke freshman.
- » Filipowski was a second-team All-ACC pick and joined Roach (honorable mention) on the All-ACC Team. Filipowski, **Tyrese Proctor** and **Dereck Lively II** were each tapped to the ACC All-Freshman Team, while Lively also earned one of the five spots on the league's All-Defensive Team.
- » Once again emerging as a postseason star, Roach poured in a career-high 23 points in the ACC Tournament title game win over Virginia and dropped 23 more in the NCAA First Round win over Oral Roberts. As a sophomore the year prior, Roach averaged 11.8 points, shot .438 from the field and led the team with 20 assists in Duke's five-game run to the Final Four.
- » Roach and Filipowski were presented Duke's Most Valuable Player Awards at the team's annual banquet. Sophomore Jaylen Blakes was the recipient of both the Glenn E. "Ted" Mann Award, given to the reserve who most contributed to team morale, and the Dr. Deryl Hart Award for the team's top scholar athlete. The Pagliuca Family Coach's Award, given to the player that best exemplified the commitment and values of Duke Basketball, was presented to freshman Mark Mitchell. **Dereck Lively II** was honored as the team's Best Defensive Player.




