BY THE NUMBERS...

With the win at Missouri earlier this month, Memphis is now 5-1 against the SEC the last two seasons. The only defeat came at #4 Alabama (91-88) last December. The Tigers are 7-1 against Power Five programs the last two years. Over that same stretch, the rest of the AAC is 11-20 against P5 teams with Houston, UCF and Cincinnati owning eight of those 11 victories.

Memphis' record since 2010-11 when holding opponents to 36.0 percent shooting or less; the Tigers limited Missouri to 31.6 percent last week and then held Alabama State to 31.4 percent on Friday. They have won 18-straight games when holding opponents to 36.0 percent or less, with the last loss coming at Ole Miss on Dec. 4, 2021.

Ashton Hardaway's 5 three-pointers was the best 3-point show by a Memphis freshman since Boogie Ellis in 2019. He hit 6 vs. Illinois-Chicago.

Though separated by only 300 miles, Memphis and Arkansas will be meeting for the first time in two decades on Thanksgiving. The Tigers and Hogs haven't played since Jan. 2, 2003 when Memphis earned a 72-67 victory in Fayetteville.

Leading Assists

Memphis was outrebounded by Michigan, 50-28, on Wednesday. It marked the first time since at least 2010-11 that the Tigers have been outrebounded by 22 or more in a winning effort.

- The Memphis men's basketball team gears up for a hearty Thanksgiving feast againt longtime rival No. 20 Arkansas in the semifinals of the Battle 4 Atlantis. Game time is set for 4 p.m. on FSPN
- Memphis (4-0) is coming off a 71-67 win over Michigan in the opening round.
- Freshman Ashton Hardaway had a coming out party on national television with a careerhigh 17 points to lead a trio of Tigers in double figures.
- In 18 minutes of action, he shot 6-of-9 overall and connected on five three-pointers, despite entering the night with only 2 career points through three games.
- The team's leading scorer and rebounder David
 Jones struggled much of the night, but finished
 with 11 points, four rebounds, two assists and
 knocked down six crucial free throws in the
 final minute to seal the win.
- Caleb Mills added 10 points, four rebounds and put a Michigan defender on his back with a crossover in the first half that is likely to be talked about the rest of the season.
- Point guard Jahvon Quinerly nearly posted a double-double with nine points and a seasonhigh eight assists.
- With head coach Penny Hardaway on the sideline for the first time in 2023-24, the Tigers put on a defensive show that had not been showcased this season.
- They held Michigan, a team putting up 91.5 points per game entering the night, to 24.5

points below its season average. The 18 turnovers from the Wolverines are a season high and their 39.3-percent mark from the field was a season low. They held Michigan scoreless for multiple four-minute-long periods in the first 20 minutes and forced 13 of the 18 miscues.

- The Tigers scored 21 points off those turnovers and led by as many as 16 in the second half.
- Memphis took advantage of a sputtering Wolverine offense and closed the first half on a 17-6 run to go into the locker room up 37-25.
- Michigan (3-2) stormed back in the second half, cutting it to a two-point deficit with 9.1 seconds to play, but Jones scored the last nine points to keep the Tigers in front.
- The Wolverines got 18 points and seven rebounds from Olivier Nkamhoua, while Nimari Burnett totaled 16 points and nine rebounds.
- This week marks Memphis' second time participating in the Battle 4 Atlantis, as the Tigers took home a 7th-place finish in 2012 after defeating Northern Iowa, 52-47, in the final game. The Tigers are 1-2 overall in the event.
- Memphis was scheduled to participate in the B4A in 2020, but the tournament was canceled due to COVID-19.
- Depending on the result of Thursday's semifinal game in the Bahamas, Memphis will face either No. 14 North Carolina or Villanova. In result of a win, tip-off will be at 2:30 p.m. CT on ESPN for the title. If Arkansas wins Thursday, Memphis will play at Noon CT on ESPN2.
- Memphis is the reigning American Athletic Conference champion after finishing last season 26-9 overall and 13-5 in league play.
- However, Penny Hardaway's Tigers are replacing 13 players, including two all-conference first team members, from that squad.
- The sixth-year head coach hit the transfer portal hard in the offseason and brought in a wealth of experience with 10 transfers.
- The Tigers were picked to finish second in the 2023-24 American Athletic Conference Preseason Coaches Poll, just behind 2023 Final Four participant and league newcomer, Florida Atlantic.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

- The Tigers have won 21 of their last 23 games at FedExForum and are 71-11 at home under head coach Penny Hardaway.
- The last two losses at home have been by a combined three points - Tulane (1), #1 Houston
- Six of the 11 defeats in Hardaway's tenure have finished as one-possession games.

TIGERS IN PARADISE

- This week marks Memphis' second time participating in the Battle 4 Atlantis, as the Tigers took home a 7th-place finish in 2012.
- No. 19 Memphis lost to VCU (78-65) and then Minnesota (84-75) before defeating Northern lowa, 52-47, in the final game.
- The Tigers were supposed to participate in 2020 but the tourament was canceled due to COVID.

MR. JONES

- Entering the week, David Jones has been nearly unstoppable his first three games as a Tiger.
- The St. John's transfer is averaging 15.7 points and 7.3 rebounds while shooting 10-19 from long distance (.526).
- He recorded back-to-back double-doubles at Missouri (10-10) and vs. Jackson State (22-10) for just the second time in his career.
- He is one of only three players in D-I averaging at least 15.0 ppg and 7.0 rpg with 10+ made three-pointers.
- David was named to the AAC Weekly Honor Roll for his 22-point, 10-rebound and 3-steal effort against Alabama State. It is his first-career weely award as a Tiger.

BROWN'S COMPANY

- Jordan Brown is one of just six active players in Division I that has 1400 points, 700 rebounds and 100 blocks for their career.
- Joining the big man on the list is Armando Bacot (UNC), Hunter Dickinson (Kansas), Zach Edey (Purdue), Johni Broome (Auburn) and Josh Oduro (Providence).

JQ IN HIS BAG

- With his vintage performance at Missouri,
 Jahvon Quinerly is one of only four players in
 Division I this season to have a single-game stat
 line of at least 18 points, eight rebounds, five
 assists and three steals.
- His 70.0-percent mark from the floor (7-10) is the highest mark of the group.
- It marks the first time in his career that Quinerly has put up those numbers in a game.

PENNY VS. THE SEC

- In Penny's six seasons at the helm of the Tigers,
 Memphis is 9-7 against SEC opposition.
- In the last two seasons, however, the Tigers are 5-1 overall against the SEC with the only loss a 91-88 defeat at Alabama last season.
- Memphis will get at least three more games against the SEC this season (@Ole Miss, @Texas A&M and vs. Vanderbilt) with a potential fourth game against Arkansas in the Bahamas.

TIGER DEFENSE

- Defense has been a staple under Penny Hardaway, with his teams always ranking near the top of the nation in defensive categories.
- In his six seasons when Memphis has held an opponent to 60 points or less, the Tigers are 40-3.
- They have won 20-straight games in the stretch.
- His defense this season ranks 2nd in the AAC in field goal percentage (35.9), blocked shots (5.67) and third in steals (9.7).

50 A MAGIC NUMBER

- Shooting better than 50.0 percent in games seems to be a great indicator of success for the Tigers in recent years.
- The Tigers have won 57 of the last 58 games when shooting better than 50.0% from the floor.
- That stretch includes a streak of 47-straight

HARDAWAY SAT THREE

- · Head coach Penny Hardaway was sidelined the first three games of the regular season.
- An NCAA infractions panel handed down the suspension for recruiting violations two years ago.
- The penalty follows a negotiated resolution in December that allowed the school to resolve the case and begin probation.
- He was not allowed to have any contact with the program nor be involved with any team-related activities from midnight to 11:59 pm the day of the first three games.

- games before falling 107-104 in 20T at UCF on Jan. 11, 2023 where they shot 50.7%.
- The streak started after shooting 54.4 percent (31-57) in an 87-74 loss at Cincinnati on Feb. 23, 2017.
- · The Tigers were 14-1 last season when reaching the 50-percent mark.
- They are 2-0 in 2023-24.

BIG DAWG MALCO

- Malcolm Dandridge is shooting an AAC-best .900 from the field this season.
- He enters the B4A 9-of-10 on the year.

LONG DISTANCE PLAN

- Memphis is one of 2 schools in the AAC to have three players ranked inside the top-10 in threepoint shooting.
- Jaykwon Walton is third in the league (.538) with 7-of-13 made, while David Jones ranks fourth at .526 (10-19) and Jahvon Quinerly stands 10th at .429 (6-14).
- SMU is the only other team with three.

ABOUT MEMPHIS

- Memphis put up big wins in exhibition play with a 106-49 win over Lane College and a 104-63 win against LeMoyne-Owen College.
- It marked the first time since Nov. 2002 that the Tigers have scored 100+ in back-to-back games, regardless of regular season or exhibition play.
- Memphis is coming off a 26-9 season in which it won the program's first AAC Championship with a 75-65 victory over No. 1 Houston.
- Memphis returns just two players Malcolm Dandridge and Jayden Hardaway - from last season. They accounted for 9.7 percent of last season's scoring, 4% of assists and 8% of rebounding.
- The Tigers welcome 13 newcomers, including 2022-23 SEC Co-Sixth Man of the Year Jahvon Quinerly and reigning Lou Henson Award winner Jordan Brown.
- In August, Memphis went 2-1 in three exhibition contests in Dominican Republic.
- Jaykwon Walton led the team with 16.3 points per game, while Brown averaged 15.6 points and 7.0 rebounds.
- Quinerly paced Memphis with 6.7 assists per contest.

A former prep standout at Treadwell High, he averaged 36.6 points and 10.1 rebounds as a senior in 1990 and was named Parade



Magazine National High School Player of the Year.


A two-time All-American and two-time Great Midwest Conference Player of the Year, Hardaway averaged 22.8 points, 8.5 rebounds, 6.4 assists and 2.4 steals in 1992-93.

Hardaway remains the only Memphis player to have two career

triple-doubles and his 1,319 points (in only two seasons) rank 17th on the school's career scoring list. The 729 points he scored during the 1992-93 season are the most by a junior in Tigers history.

In his two seasons, Hardaway led the team to a 43-23 record - including eight wins over nationally ranked schools -- and directed the Tigers to two NCAA Tournament appearances, including an Elite Eight trip in 1992.

After his junior year, Hardaway declared for the NBA Draft and began a 14-year pro career with the Orlando Magic (1993-99), the Phoenix Suns (1999-2004), the New York Knicks (2004-06) and the Miami Heat (2007).



During the 1994-95 season, he averaged 20.9 points and 7.2

assists, started the NBA All-Star Game and was named to the All-NBA First Team, while leading Orlando to the NBA Finals against the Houston Rockets. Hardaway averaged 25.5 points and

eight assists in the series.

After the 1995-96 season, he played on the U.S. Olympic basketball team that won a gold medal in Atlanta, Ga.



Hardaway had a successful run at East High School, which won state titles in 2016, 2017 and 2018. With Hardaway as head coach, the Mustangs defeated Whitehaven High for the 2018 Class AAA championship.





Hardaway returned to his alma mater and becomes the school's 19th head coach and the third former Tiger player to hold the position.

Hardaway was inked to a six-year, \$16.5 million extension on Oct. 12, 2022, which takes him through April 15, 2028.

MEMPHIS & THE ASSOCIATION

The Memphis Tigers have had significant success in the Draft in recent seasons. After James Wiseman (PK2) and Precious Achiuwa (PK15) were selected in the first round in the 2020 NBA Draft, Jalen Duren (PK13) followed suit in the 2022 Draft.

- · Duren was the 16th Tiger selected in the first round and the 53rd Tiger selected overall, while Josh Minott was taken No. 45 in the second round.
- Besides 2020, the last and only other time Memphis had two NBA first rounders was in 2006 (Rodney Carney, No. 16 to Chicago; Shawne Williams, No. 17 to Indiana).
- Memphis, Kentucky, and North Carolina are the only schools to have players selected each of Nos. 1-7 in NBA Draft history.
- · After coaching Wiseman, Tigers head coach Penny Hardaway is the only NCAA head coach to have been picked in the top three of the NBA Draft and have been the college head coach of a player taken in the top three.

FEDEXFORUM THE HOME OF THE TIGERS

The 2023-24 season marks the 20th for the Tigers in their home arena, FedExForum, which officially opened in September 2004. Located just a few feet off Beale Street on historic Highway 61, FedExForum rises to extend the heart of the Memphis entertainment district.

Memphis plays its home contests in the 18,400-seat arena, which served as host for 2019 American Athletic Conference Championship. It also will be the site for the 2024 NCAA Tournament First and Second Rounds. Since it opened in 2004, FedExForum has hosted six Conference USA Tournaments, three NCAA Men's South Regionals (2009, 2014, 2017), two American Athletic Conference Tournaments (2014, 2019) and one NCAA Women's South Regional (2010).

The 805,850 square-feet arena, covering 13.8 acres, features five levels as well as state-of-the-art locker rooms and facilities for sports teams, as well as an exceptional dining and entertainment experiences for its patrons.

At 135 feet high, FedExForum provides a backdrop for historic Beale Street.

Memphis men's basketball moved into its new practice facility, the Laurie-Walton Family Basketball Center, Nov. 17, 2017. It is a comprehensive, 62,000-square-foot training facility on the University's Park Avenue Campus.

This stand-alone facility encompasses offices, locker rooms, 3,250-square-foot weight room, training facilities, two NCAA regulation courts, as well as spaces for student-athletes to study, train, eat and develop.





In addition, the history of Memphis basketball is showcased via a large atrium in the grand lobby known as Traditions Hall, a 7,300-square-foot area that will double as a museum designed to be an interactive celebration of Tigers basketball for the general public.

The new practice facilities, part of the University's "Time to Shine" capital campaign, represent a major commitment from the University and Memphis community to compete at the highest

- Jaykwon Walton led five Tigers in double figures behind a game-high 19 points to go along with five rebounds and three steals, while shooting 7-of-11 from the field. David Jones added 15 points, a pair of rebounds and three assists.
- The Tigers were sluggish out of the gate, turning the ball over 10 times in the first 11 minutes and falling behind by as many as six. Midway through the first half, Walton nailed a triple to spark a 10-0 run and put Memphis in front for good.

NOV. 10, 2023 | MEMPHIS 70, MISSOURI 55 | COLUMBIA, MO.

- The Memphis Tigers trailed Missouri by 14 late in the first half but stormed back and earned a 70-55 road win Friday night in Columbia, Missouri.
- Memphis struggled to find any rhythm throughout much of the first half, falling behind 29-15 with 6:45 to play in the opening period. From that moment on, the Tigers outscored Missouri 55-26 the rest of the way.
- Jahvon Quinerly led Memphis with 18 points, eight rebounds, five assists and three steals, while David Jones pulled down his first double-double as a Tiger with 10 points and 10 rebounds. Jaykwon Walton hit three triples and scored 13 points, while Jordan Brown added 12 points and five boards off the bench.
- Memphis locked down the home Tigers with its patented defense in the final 20 minutes, limiting Missouri to just 5-of-26 (19.2 %) from the floor. Memphis shot 51.6 percent in the second half and outscored Missouri 44-22.
- Memphis outscored Missouri 38-20 in the paint, 12-0 on second-chance points and 23-17 off the bench.

NOV. 17, 2023 | MEMPHIS 92, ALABAMA STATE 75 | MEMPHIS, TENN.

- Memphis took care of business Friday at FedExForum, defeating Alabama State 92-75 behind David Jones' 22-point, 10-rebound effort.
- Jones recorded his second-straight double-double to lead four Tigers in double figures.
- Jahvon Quinerly posted another big game with 16 points, eight rebounds and a team-high four assists, while Jaykwon Walton poured in 12 points, seven boards, three dimes and two blocks. Caleb Mills earned his first start in a Memphis uniform and turned in 10 points and three assists.
- Memphis shot 52.5 percent from the floor (32-61) and led by as many as 22 with less than two minutes remaining in the game
- The Tigers connected on a season-high 11 three-pointers and drained 17-of-23 at the free throw line.
- Memphis outscored ASU 40-22 in the paint and won the battle on the boards, 50-42.

- In 18 minutes of action, Hardaway shot 6-of-9 overall and connected on five three-pointers. David Jones finished with 11 points, four rebounds, two assists and knocked down six crucial free throws in the final minute to seal the win.
- Caleb Mills added 10 points, four rebounds and put a Michigan defender on his back with a crossover in the first half that is likely to be talked about the rest of the season. Point guard Jahvon Quinerly nearly posted a double-double with nine points and a season-high eight assists.
- Memphis held Michigan, a team putting up 91.5 points per game entering the night, to 24.5 points below its season average. The 18 turnovers from the Wolverines are a season high and their 39.3-percent mark from the field was a season low. They held Michigan scoreless for multiple four-minute-long periods in the first 20 minutes and forced 13 of the 18 miscues.
- The Tigers scored 21 points off those turnovers and led by as many as 16 in the second half. Memphis shot 43.9 percent overall (25-57) and drained 41.7 percent from long distance (10-24).
