GAME NOTES

NO. 11 SOFTBALL HEADS TO NO. 19 ARKANSAS FOR WEEKEND SEC SERIES

- The No. 11 University of Missouri softball team (29-8, 4-5 SEC) heads to Fayetteville, Arkansas, this weekend to face No. 19 Arkansas (26-9, 5-4 SEC). The three-game series opens on Friday at 5 p.m., CT from Bogle Park. The Tigers continue play on Saturday at noon, followed by a 2 p.m. Sunday finale.
- Fans can catch the three-game series with Arkansas on SEC Network (Friday and Sunday, Roy Philpott, and Erin Miller) and SEC Network+ (Saturday, Dorian Craft and Hannah McEwan).
- Mizzou was ranked #11 in all four of this week's polls after first appearing following week one (Feb. 13).
- The Tigers entered the week after putting together a perfect 4-0 weekend over their East Coast Spring Break Trip, claiming key victories over Hofstra, George Mason, Fordham, and Villanova.

ARKANSAS SERIES HISTORY

- Mizzou leads the all-time series with Arkansas, 16-11.
- Head coach Larissa Anderson is 4-3 against the Razorbacks in her career.
- The pair last met during the 2023 campaign, as the Tigers took two games off the Razorbacks (9-0 loss, 4-3 win, 7-6 win) to claim the series May 5-7 in Columbia, Missouri.
- Missouri last made the trip to Fayetteville, Arkansas, in 2021. The Tigers opened their time at Bogle Park with a pair of victories (6-3 win, 10-1 win) before dropping the final contest, 8-4 (April 24-26).

SEMO MIDWEEK

- No. 11 Mizzou fell to Southeast Missouri, 1-0, Wednesday at the Mizzou Softball Stadium.
- Jenna Laird led Mizzou at the plate, going 1-for-2 with a walk. She has now reached base in each of the last 11 games.
- Maddie Gallagher has reached base in the last five contests with a hit-bypitch in the game.
- Alex Honnold pushed her reached-base streak to six games, after tallying a single. She finished 1-for-3 Wednesday.
- Abby Hay made her fourth career start and earned her fourth career hit with a single (1-for-3) in the third inning.
- Kayley Lenger extended her reached-base streak to five games with an HBP.

Others receiving votes: Kentucky (39), Boston U (29), Kansas (27), Arizona (16), Miami-OH (10), Northwestern (10), Penn State (8), Auburn (3), Utah (3), Nevada (1) Laurin Krings pitched 4.0 innings, allowing no earned runs (one run) on four hits. Krings recorded four strikeouts to mark her first appearance since Auburn (March 8) with four or more punchouts.

NOTES

- Marissa McCann pitched three scoreless innings and matched a career-best five strikeouts in the contest. She let up just one hit in the relief appearance.
- It marked the fourth time in 2024 that Marissa McCann notched five strikeouts.

QUICK HITTERS

- The Tigers head into the weekend with a 29-8 record and 4-5 SEC mark.
- The Tigers 29-8 record to open the season is the best start for Missouri since the Tigers began the 2013 campaign 23-3 en route to a 38-14 finish. Prior to that, the 2011 Tigers commenced the season 27-3 en route to a 53-10 finish.
- Mizzou was ranked #11 in all four of this week's polls after first appearing following week one (Feb. 13).
- The Tigers entered the week after putting together a perfect 4-0 week over their East Coast Spring Break Trip, claiming victories over Hofstra, George Mason, Fordham, and Villanova.
- Alex Honnold (.632 slugging percentage, .452 on-base percentage) paces the Tigers at the plate (.377, 32 runs, 26 RBI, 16 doubles, 3 homers) and is one of four Tigers batting over .300. Jenna Laird (.376 batting average, 39 runs, 20 RBI) is second on the team while Maddie Gallagher is third (.312 with eight doubles, 24 RBI, 24 runs). Kayley Lenger is also hitting .308 in the nine-hole (20 runs, 20 hits).
- Alex Honnold is first in the SEC (third in the NCAA) with 16 doubles (0.44 doubles/game). Her 45 career doubles rank seventh in Mizzou program history. She also ranks sixth in the SEC for hits (43).
- Jenna Laird has reached base in each of the last 11 games.
- Kara Daly paces Mizzou with five home runs in 2024.
- Alex Honnold has registered a team-best hitting streak of 12 games this season.
- Maddie Gallagher has registered a team-best 15 game reached base

streak.

- Closer Taylor Pannell ranks first in the SEC and is second in the nation with six saves in 2024.
- The one-two punch of Laurin Krings and Cierra Harrison have combined for 18 wins in the circle with 8-6 and 10-1 records, respectively. The duo has also gone the distance in the circle 11 times (seven and four complete games, respectively).
- Mya Dodge is one run away from 100 in her collegiate career.
- Laurin Krings is two wins away from 50 in her career at Mizzou. With 51 wins, she will enter the program's top 10.
- Krings is the 11th Mizzou player to reach 500 career innings pitched, notching the feat at Hofstra.

EAST COAST RECAP

- Missouri completed a perfect 4-0 weekend out East, taking games off Fordham, Hofstra, George Mason, and Villanova (Mar. 26-30).
- Mizzou opened the week with a commanding 20-0 win (five innings) over Fordham.
- The Tigers then clinched a nine-inning thriller, defeating Hofstra 2-1, followed by another victory over George Mason (11-2 in six innings).
- Missouri wrapped its trip with a 7-0 win over Villanova to round out its undefeated weekend.
- With the perfect performance, Mizzou improved to 29-7 (4-5 SEC) on the year.
- Mya Dodge (3-for-3) helped propel Mizzou in its victory over Fordham, recording her first game with two home runs as a Tiger.
- Abby Hay (1-for-1) contributed a career-high four RBI in the contest with her first career double.
- Dodge also added a career-best tying three doubles against George Mason with a season-best matching 3-for-3 performance at the plate.
- In the circle, Cierra Harrison retired 13 straight batters while only giving up one hit in 4.2 innings of work against Fordham.
- Lilly Whitten wrapped the contest for Mizzou, securing the final out in the fifth against Fordham, marking her fifth appearance in 2024.

• Marissa McCann also led the way for the Tigers in their win over Hofstra, chipping in a career-high five strikeouts over five innings of work. McCann allowed just a single run the entire contest.

NOTES

- Laurin Krings started against Hofstra, giving up no runs on three hits over 4.0 innings. She also notched three strikeouts.
- Stefania Abruscato drilled her first career home run in the Tigers victory over Villanova. Abruscato finished 1-for-4 with one run and an RBI.
- Kayley Lenger hit .500 over the week with four runs for second on the team behind Dodge (.583).
- Jenna Laird and Maddie Gallagher both finished the week, batting .385. Laird notched her team-leading 14th multi-hit game in 2024 against Villanova.

<u>DODGE NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE</u> <u>WEEK</u>

- Mya Dodge, a junior outfielder, paced Mizzou over its East Coast Trip, hitting .583 with three doubles, two homers and 11 RBI. Dodge was named the SEC Player of the Week on Tuesday.
- The junior recorded her first multihit game of the season, going 3-for-3 against Fordham, including five RBI (Missouri career-high).
- Dodge also drove in a pair of homers, marking her first game with two home runs as a Tiger. With the offensive performance, Dodge set a season-high three runs scored.
- In Mizzou's win over George Mason, Dodge logged a season-best matching 3-for-3 performance at the plate. She clocked five RBI and three hits, including a career-best tying three doubles.
- With the feat, Dodge became the first Tiger to record three two-baggers in a contest since Brooke Wilmes achieved the accomplishment in 2017.
- After tallying two runs against George Mason, Dodge is just one run away from her 100 career runs.

MCCANN NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK


 Marissa McCann was named the SEC Freshman of the Week for the second-straight week Tuesday.

- McCann notched a 2-0 mark over Mizzou's East Coast Trip this past week. She allowed just one run on three hits over 8.0 innings for an ERA of 0.88. McCann also notched eight strikeouts over the two outings.
- She tied a career-high with five strikeouts over five innings of work against Hofstra. McCann allowed just one run on one hit with a walk in the extra innings victory.
- McCann also picked up the win in the circle against Villanova, improving to 6-1, with three innings of two-hit shutout softball. She notched three strikeouts in her 12th appearance of the campaign.
- McCann has now posted four straight wins, allowing one run on seven hits over 14.2 innings during that span with nine Ks.
- McCann, a freshman from Surprise, Arizona, has made 12 appearances (four starts) in her freshman season, compiling a 6-1 mark with 27 strikeouts and a save over 39.0 innings. She has also compiled a 2.15 ERA.

GALLY

- Maddie Gallagher saw a productive weekend on offense for Missouri, recording a .385 average over the Tigers' four-game trip.
- Gallagher notched her sixth multi-RBI game of the season, after putting up a pair of RBIs against Fordham.
- The senior also finished 1-for-4 at the plate against Hofstra, driving in her 22nd run of the year.
- Gallagher continued her tear against George Mason, posting a single in the second inning to mark her fifth-straight game with an RBI.
- With the 2-for-3 performance, Gallagher notched her fifth multi-hit game of the season (third on Mizzou).
- To wrap the weekend against Villanova, the senior added a run, an RBI, and a walk.
- Gallagher also stole a career-best three bases to help secure the Tigers' win on Saturday.
- She posted a hit in each of the four games in the East Coast.

ANDERSON APPROACHING 200 WINS AT MIZZOU

- Head coach Larissa Anderson added four wins to her resume this past week, officially putting her two wins away from 200 in her career at Mizzou.
- While at the helm of the program the past six seasons, Anderson currently boasts a 198-105 all-time record.
- To commence the 2024 campaign, Anderson recorded her 300th career game in Mizzou's season opener against No. 13/16 Utah on Feb. 9.
- Overall, Anderson has tabbed a 328-178-1 career mark.

DOUBLES QUEEN

- Alex Honnold is officially just four doubles away from surpassing the single-season (19) Mizzou record. She currently ranks tied for fourth with 16.
- This past week, Honnold clocked a double against Villanova, marking her 16th double of the 2024 campaign. The contest also extended her reached-base streak to five games.
- Against Hofstra, Honnold also put up a 1-for-3 performance, including her second triple of the year, to help secure a Missouri victory.
- Honnold currently leads the SEC in doubles this season (third in NCAA). So far, she has recorded 45 career doubles which ranks seventh in Mizzou program history.
- The senior from West Des Moines, lowa, leads Mizzou at the plate so far this season, posting a .377 average, with a career-best 16 doubles, 43 hits, 32 runs, 26 RBI and three home runs. Honnold has recorded a .632 slugging percentage, as well as a .452 on-base percentage so far during 2024.

OUR LEADOFF HITTER

- Jenna Laird hit .385 over Missouri's four-game East Coast trip. On the season, Laird is second on Mizzou with a .376 average so far in 2024.
- The leadoff hitter from East Meadow, New York, paces the Tigers with 12 stolen bases and 39 runs.
- Laird led Mizzou against Fordham, tying a season-high three RBI to go with three runs.
- Laird paced Mizzou in Saturday's victory, going 2-for-3 with a run, an RBI, and a walk against Villanova. This

marked her team-leading 14th multihit game in 2024.

• Laird is currently on a 11-game reached-base streak.

OUR PITCHING STAFF

- The one-two punch of Laurin Krings and Cierra Harrison have combined for 18 wins in the circle with 8-6 and 10-1 records, respectively. The duo has also gone the distance in the circle 11 times (seven and four complete games, respectively).
- Harrison has notched 61 strikeouts in 2024 over 73.1 innings.
- Harrison's 10 wins are a new career best after she notched eight in 2023.
- She posted her first career no-hitter over Texas A&M-Commerce on Feb. 16 in Denton, Texas.
- Harrison has thrown three complete-game shutouts (four complete games). She limited No. 25/25 Auburn to no runs on five hits with nine strikeouts in her 2024 SEC debut on March q
- Krings surpassed 500 career innings pitched against Hofstra, throwing 4.0 innings. She is the 11th Mizzou pitcher in program history to reach the threshold.
- Krings did not allow a hit to the first 12 Auburn batters she faced, recording four strikeouts in that span during the SEC opener on March 8.
 She also notched her 500th strikeout in her career over the victory.
- She paces Mizzou with 76 strikeouts over 88.1 innings.
- Lilly Whitten (4-0), Marissa Mc-Cann (6-1) and Taylor Pannell (1-0, six saves) have also picked up wins for Mizzou in 2024.
- Pannell, a left-hander from Lee's Summit, Missouri, has picked up six saves in the closer role for Mizzou, which paces the SEC and is second in the NCAA.
- Lilly Whitten pitched five strong innings against George Mason, allowing one run on five hits with six strikeouts.
- Her five innings pitched, and six strikeouts are her most since her first start against South Dakota State on Feb. 17 (eight strikeouts over six innings).

2023 RECAP

- Mizzou made its 16th-straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2023.
- The Tigers finished the 2023 season with a 35-26 mark, including a 7-17 in SEC play. With its 2023 record, Missouri has registered 35 wins in four of the last five seasons (2020 COVID-19 shortened season was the only time the Tigers didn't meet the threshold in that span).
- During the 2023 campaign, Missouri totaled 51 home runs, while logging 75 doubles to go with 310 runs as a team.
- On the dirt, Mizzou tallied a .978 fielding percentage. The clip ranks second in program history, after the Tigers' surpassed their previous .976 fielding percentage from 2022.

LOOKING AHEAD

- Mizzou next heads to Des Moines, lowa, to face Drake at Blue Field on April 10. First pitch is set for 4 p.m., CT.
- The Tigers then resume SEC play with a weekend series at home against Florida April 12-14.

A new era in Mizzou Softball began in the Summer of 2018, as Larissa Anderson was named the 10th head coach to lead the tradition-rich Tiger program on Saturday, May 26, 2018.

As Anderson enters year six in Mid-Missouri that new era has already gotten off to a successful start, and her ability to change the culture of the program in such a short time was a big reason why. Anderson has led Mizzou to a 169-97 record over her five seasons and owns a career record of 299-170-1 as a head coach.

In her short time at the helm of the Tigers, Anderson has steered Missouri to 169 victories, one NCAA Super Regional and two regional final appearances. In 2021, Mizzou hosted a regional and super regional for the first time since 2013 and again hosted a regional in 2022.

Anderson finished her first season in the Black & Gold with a 35-25 record, the most wins for the Tigers in a single season since 2016, when they won 42 games. Anderson's squad was also stellar in her first season as part of the always elite Southeastern Conference, as the Tigers' 12 wins during SEC play, which resulted in a tie for fourth place, were the most conference victories for Mizzou since 2016. The season ended with the Tigers' 13th straight regional appearance, as Anderson's Tigers earned a spot in the Los Angeles Regional, where they went 3-2, pushing host No. 2 UCLA to a winner-take-all game seven.

Her biggest test would come during the 2020 season. With Mizzou Softball's postseason ban being upheld three months prior to the season, Anderson's steady leadership guided the Tigers through what would be a turbulent year. Despite the postseason ban, Mizzou lost zero players to transfer, and entered the season with its roster intact.

Mizzou's postseason ban would prove to be only a minor blip in a season that was ultimately canceled after 26 games due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Tigers made the most of those 26 games, finishing with a 19-7 record, and being one of only two teams to be undefeated in SEC play. Mizzou ended the season ranked 25th in the NFCA Coaches' Poll – its first time finishing the season ranked since 2016 – while Cayla Kessinger was named to Softball America's All-America team.

Anderson returned Mizzou Softball to the national stage in 2021. With an experienced roster but a young pitching staff, she led the Tigers to a 42-17 record and a Super Regional appearance. Mizzou hosted an NCAA Regional and Super Regional for the first time since 2013. The 2021 team finished among the program's best statistically in fielding percentage (1st), home runs (1st), RBI (2nd), doubles (T-6th), and runs scored (3rd).

In the postseason, Mizzou pitching led the nation in ERA at 1.37 over six games. Two Tiger pitchers, Jordan Weber and Laurin Krings combined to allow only two hits and no runs over three games at the Columbia Regional. Freshman shortstop Jenna Laird earned SEC Freshman of the Year honors while senior outfielder Brooke Wilmes was recognized as an NFCA Third Team All-American. Anderson led the Tigers to a No. 13 final ranking in the NFCA Coaches' Poll and a No. 14 ranking in the USA Softball poll, the program's highest final rankings since 2015.

Mizzou's memorable 2022 season saw them host an NCAA Regional for the second-consecutive year and made the Southeastern Conference Tournament Championship game for the second time in program history. The Tigers notched a 38-22 mark and went 12-11 during SEC play. Mizzou's pitching staff posted a 2.81 ERA including a 1.00 ERA in the postseason.

In the inaugural year of the Rawlings Gold Glove Award, presented by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association, Jenna Laird and Casidy Chaumont earned the award at shortstop and left field, respectively.

Laird, a 2022 Softball All-SEC Second Team player, finished the year with a .975 fielding percentage, while turning 10 double plays and did not make an error during SEC play.

Chaumont, an All-SEC Defensive Team Selection, has appeared on SportsCenter's Top Ten Plays four times over her career at Mizzou. After beginning her career as an infielder at Louisiana, she converted to the outfield at the start of the 2021 season and finished with a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage. Chaumont has thrown out five runners on the basepaths from left field over her two seasons in the Black and Gold.

Kimberly Wert and Brooke Wilmes were each named First Team All-SEC performers in 2022. Jordan Weber, Jenna Laird, Wert and Wilmes were each tabbed to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association Southeast All-Region team. Weber led the Tigers to the SEC Tournament final with a pair of shutouts against No. 17/20 Auburn and No. 13/10 Tennessee. She became the first Mizzou pitcher to record three wins in a single SEC series when she earned the victory in all three games against Kentucky.

Mizzou is coming off a 2023 season that saw the Tigers reach a 16th straight NCAA Regional, finishing the season with a 35-26 record and going 7-17 against SEC foes. The pitching staff proved efficient yet again, registering a cumulative ERA of 3.33, including a strikeout/walk ratio of 2.66.

Alex Honnold became the 26th All-American in program history (31 total All-American honors) after earning Second-Team honors from the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA).

A Top 25 Finalist for 2023 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year, Honnold led Mizzou and ranked top six in the SEC for on-base percentage (.539), slugging percentage (.779), runs (52), batting average (.396), and triples (three). Her slugging percentage in 2023 ranked fourth all-time in program history. Honnold also earned NFCA Southeast All-Region honors and was named to the All-SEC Second Team.

Jenna Laird joined Honnold in representing the Tigers on the All-SEC Team, her sixth postseason honor at Mizzou and third-straight appearance on the All-SEC Team. The leadoff hitter paced the Tigers in SEC play with a .291 batting average to go with 14 runs, three doubles, five RBI, .371 on-base percentage, and a .329 slugging percentage.

Anderson joined Mizzou after a 17-year run at Hofstra, the final four as the head coach.



In four seasons at Hofstra, Anderson fashioned a 130-73-1 (.640) record with a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances, two Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) titles and four winning seasons. She picked up her 100th career win with the Pride's 7-2 win over Boston University, March 17, 2018, and posted seven career wins over nationally-ranked opponents, including three in 2018—a 1-0 victory over then-No. 13 Florida State on March 2 and a pair at No. 22 James Madison to claim the CAA Tournament crown.

The 2018 campaign was a historic one for Hofstra Softball, as Anderson led the 24th-ranked Pride to a 41-14 record, the CAA Tournament title and the NCAA Columbia Regional. Hofstra earned an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament by defeating CAA regular-season champion and 22nd-ranked James Madison, 7-4, to claim its 12th CAA title in the sport since joining the league in 2002 and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2015.

Anderson's 2018 squad reached the 40-win mark for the 11th time in program history (and first since a school-record 46 wins in 2013), while setting school records for runs scored (334), home runs (70) and RBI (315). Hofstra owned an RPI of 19 against the nation's 29th-toughest schedule in 2018. Hofstra also garnered a league-high eight CAA postseason honors headlined by Sarah Cornell's selection as the CAA Pitcher of the Year—the Pride's 10th such honor all-time and first since 2013, all of which were tutored by Anderson.

In 2017, Hofstra returned to the CAA championship game, as the program registered its 28th-straight winning season (27-23) and earned the No. 2 seed in the CAA Tournament. Anderson picked up her first win over a Top 10 opponent as head coach with a 5-2 victory over No. 10 James Madison. Under Anderson's direction, Cornell was named first-team NFCA All-Northeast Region as a rookie, while also earning a spot on the All-CAA second team and All-Rookie team.

The Pride posted another winning record in her second season (24-22) and had six student-athletes earn CAA postseason honors and two garner NFCA All-Northeast Region recognition.

In her first season as the storied program's head coach in 2015, Anderson led Hofstra to the CAA championship and an NCAA Tournament berth, guiding Hofstra to a 38-14-1 record and a spot in the NCAA Gainesville Regional. Anderson and her assistants were named the NFCA Northeast Region's Coaching Staff of the Year after Hofstra posted a collective 2.05 ERA, smashed 56 home runs and out-scored opponents, 277-129.

Anderson has been part of eight NFCA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year award winners, including seven as an assistant or associate head coach and one as the head coach. In 17 seasons at Hofstra, she helped the Pride to a 610-267-2 (.695) record). Before taking over as head coach from Hall of Famer Bill Edwards, Anderson spent 13 seasons on the Hofstra staff as an assistant, including the last 10 as the associate head coach, helping the program to 10 NCAA Tournament appearances and 10 CAA titles. As associate head coach, she helped Hofstra win 24 NCAA Tournament games and make six appearances in the regional finals.

Under Anderson's guidance, Hofstra hurlers won nine CAA Pitcher of the Year awards in 10 seasons, including four consecutive wins by Olivia Galati from 2010-13 and three from Kayleigh Lotti from 2007-09. Galati was twice named an All-America by the NFCA and was the program's first-ever first-team pick in 2012 after leading Division I with a 0.95 ERA and a 34-7 record. Anderson helped guide Galati to a NCAA-best 40 wins and 22 shutouts in 2013.

A hallmark of the Hofstra Softball program during Anderson's tenure was the Pride's stellar defense. From 2008-13, Hofstra consistently ranked among the nation's elite in fielding percentage as the Pride was among the Top 20 nationally in five of those seasons. Hofstra ranked first in Division I in fielding percentage during the 2011 season and was fourth in 2008 and 2010, and 16th in 2012 and 2013. Her 2018 team currently ranks sixth nationally with an .979 mark.

An active NFCA member, she chaired its Ethics Committee from 2009-13, and currently serves as its Fourth Vice President on the NFCA executive board and as a member of the NFCA Recruiting Committee and the NFCA Hall of Fame Committee. Anderson is currently the Vice President of the Awards Committee. She was elected NFCA President on Oct. 25, 2022, and was one of eight members who were voted to the NFCA's Board of Directors for 2023. Anderson will officially begin her three-year term on January 1, 2023.

Prior to joining the Hofstra staff, Anderson served as an assistant coach for two seasons at LIU Post, where she helped the Pioneers to a combined 75-33 record, including a school-record 42 wins during the 2000 season. She assisted in all facets of the program at LIU Post and was in charge of coaching the pitchers and catchers. Her efforts helped the Pioneers to the 13th-best team earned run average in Division II (1.11) in 2001. She was also part of a C.W. Post staff that received the Northeast Region Division II Coaching Staff of the Year award from the NFCA in 2000.

Anderson spent one season as an assistant coach at Gannon University in 1998, after being named a regional All-American outfielder in 1997. She graduated from Gannon in 1997 with a bachelor's of science degree in therapeutic recreation.

She is married to former Hofstra Baseball Coach Patrick Anderson, who manages the St. Louis Cardinals' Class A affiliate in Peoria, Illinois.


