GAME NOTES

- » WR Andrew Armstrong and Isaac TeSlaa both extended their games with a reception streak. Armstrong has now caught a pass in 29 straight games, while TeSlaa has recorded a reception in 27 consecutive games. Additionally, Armstrong has registered multiple receptions in 24 straight games.
- » The Razorbacks' 648 yards of total offense were the 10th-most in a single game in program history.
- » For the second consecutive game, Arkansas got on the board first courtesy of a Ja'Quinden Jackson touchdown run. Jackson found the endzone for the third time this season on a five-yard rush to cap a six-play 45-yard scoring drive that took 2:54 off the game clock.
- » RB Ja'Quinden Jackson registered his second consecutive multi-rushing touchdown game courtesy of three touchdowns in the contest. It marked Jackson's fifth career multi-rushing touchdown game. Jackson became the first Razorback to rush for multiple touchdowns in consecutive games since Alex Collins did so in 2014 against Nicholls and Texas Tech.
- » RB Ja'Quinden Jackson became the first Razorback player to rush for 100-plus yards in each of the first two games of a season since RB Raheim Sanders did so in each of the first two games of the 2022 season. With 149 yards rushing, three rushing touchdowns and one catch for 13 yards, Jackson became the just the fourth Razorback since 1997 with 135+ rushing yards, 3+ rushing TD, 1+ receptions, 10+ receiving yards in a single game.
- » By keeping Oklahoma State off the board in the first quarter, Arkansas opened the season with five consecutive shutout quarters for the first time since 2000 when they shut out Missouri State in the season opener and kept Boise State off the scoreboard in the first quarter the following week.
- » DB Jaheim Singletary recorded his first career interception and the Razorbacks' first interception of the season when he picked off OSU quarterback Alan Bowman's pass with 1:38 on the clock in the second quarter.
- » Since 2020 (Sam Pittman's first year as head coach), the Hogs have totaled 48 interceptions in 50 games.
- » WR Andrew Armstrong is the second Razorback player in program history to log a 100-yard receiving game against Oklahoma State. WR Bobby Duckworth had four catches for 101 yards and one touchdown in Arkansas' 33-20 win over Oklahoma State in 1980.
- » WR Andrew Armstrong finished with a career-high 10 catches for 164 yards, marking the second time in his Razorback career he eclipsed the 100-yard mark. He became the first Arkansas pass catcher with 9+ receptions and 130+ receiving yards in a game since WR Treyton Burks accomplished the feat twice in 2020
- » Taylen Green completed 26-45 passes for a career-high 416 yards and one touchdown. It was the second 300+ yard passing game in his career. Green also became the first Arkansas quarterback to pass for 300+ yards against Oklahoma State.
- » Oklahoma State won the first meeting between the two programs since 1980 and their first matchup in Stillwater since 1978. Arkansas leads the all-time series, 30-16-1.

ARKANSAS QUOTES

Sam Pittman, Arkansas Head Coach

Opening Statement:

Congratulations to Oklahoma State. They found a way to win and are well coached... Obviously we are disappointed because the statistics were way in our favor. I thought our defense played three quarters of great football. They wore out a little bit. Offensively, we made too many mistakes. We put the ball on the ground and threw a pick-six. We went through a spell in the third quarter where we were moving the football, but the snap was low, or we could not catch it two to three times. I will have to see it on tape. We had a chance to go up 11 but were unfortunately unable to make the field goal. Oklahoma State came back and beat us. We have to take care of the ball. I liked the intensity that we played with. It came down to us turning the ball over too many times. Congratulations to them. We have a good football team and have to correct these mistakes moving forward.

On his message to the team:

We made too many mistakes. We played extremely hard. I was proud of our defense. That is a good offensive team and for three quarters we held them to six points defensively. I talked about the turnovers. It is one loss, it is not an SEC loss and we will learn from it and reflect and come back. We have a really good football team we just can't win games turning the ball over.

On Andrew Armstrong:

Our chemistry did not fall off and credit that is a credit to him. He has been in the training room, Monday through Sunday. Every day he has been working, he looked really good out there on the field. Dealing with the injury, there is a lot of mental toughness that goes with that... He knows his frame. He knows what he is good at and the versatility he has. Whether it is a deep ball or intermediate, I know if I put it in his range, he will catch it. That is what a quarterback loves in a receiver.

On Oklahoma State blitzing:

It is tough, but I have to do a better job of getting the ball out. Coach (Bobby) Petrino talked to me about getting my hips up and fading more, so that is something we are going to work on in practice.

On coming out strong defensively:

We know we had to jump on them in the first half. We went into halftime saying to ourselves that we had to finish it out because we had a lot of games last year where we lost by three-to-six points. It is in our mind, it is just in games like this, we have to work more on closing out and finishing.

On the game plan against Oklahoma State Running Back Ollie Gordon:

We knew we had to stop the run and make their offense scramble. At the end of the day, that was only so much, and we still lost.
