- No. 1 Kansas will face No. 16 Arkansas in exhibition play on Friday, Oct. 25, at 8 p.m. CT at Bud Walton Arena in Fayetteville, Arkansas. The contest will be televised on the SEC Network.
- The Kansas at Arkansas contest is part of a series exhibition games sponsored by CareSource in which proceeds from ticket sales will benefit mental health providers and charities within each school's footprint. Kansas will donate proceeds from the game to the Kansas City based Fore The Kids Foundation (forethekidskc.org). Arkansas will donate proceeds from the charity game to Arkansas Children's Hospitals.
- Kansas leads the overall series with Arkansas, 8-6, and the two teams last met in the second round of the 2023 NCAA Tournament in Des Moines, Iowa, with Arkansas claiming a 72-71 win. The 14-game series dates back to 1946 and the Oct. 25 contest will be the first exhibition meeting between the two schools.
- The KU-Arkansas contest will pit Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer coaches Bill Self, who enters his 22nd season at Kansas, and Arkansas first-year coach John Calipari.
- Kansas is No. 1 in the Associated Press poll for the fifth time in poll history with all five in the Bill Self era - 2004-05, 2009-10, 2018-19, 2023-24 and 2024-25.
- Like the preseason Associated Press poll, Kansas men's basketball has been voted No. 1 in the USA TODAY Sports Coaches Poll, released Oct. 23. This is the second-straight season and the fifth time in the coaches' poll that Kansas is No. 1 in the preseason poll with four in the Self era - 1996-97, 2004-05, 2009-10, 2018-19, 2023-24 and 2024-25.

ABOUT KANSAS

Kansas is coming off a 23-11 season where it advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the 33rd time in the last 34 years, a run that started in 1990. KU returns three starters led by Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year Hunter Dickinson, a 2024 Consensus All-America Second Team, All-Big 12 First Team and the Big 12 Newcomer of the Year selection. The center was the only player in the Big 12 to average a double-double (17.9 ppg, 10.9 rpg) last year.

Graduate point guard Dajuan Harris Jr. has been the starter each of the last three seasons and was the 2023 Big 12 Defensive player of the Year. A three-time all-league honoree, Harris has led the league in assist-to-turnover ratio two of the last three seasons and has ranked in the top five in the conference in assists per game each of the last three years. Two-time All-Big 12 selection and the 2023 Big 12 Most Improved player, KJ Adams, Jr. is also back as a returning starter.

Other Kansas returning letterwinners include redshirt-junior forward Zach Clemence and sophomore guard Jamari McDowell. Clemence was a redshirt last season and has played in 44 games during his two seasons at Kansas. McDowell played in 31 games and averaged 7.2 minutes per contest in 2023-24.

Kansas welcomes nine newcomers that include six upperclassmen transfers. Those include redshirt-senior guard Shakeel Moore (Mississippi State), junior guard AJ Storr (Wisconsin), senior guard Zeke Mayo (South Dakota State), junior guard Rylan Griffen (Alabama), junior guard Noah Shelby (Rice) and senior guard David Coit (Northern Illinois). Freshman center Flory Bidunga, a McDonald's All-American last season, and freshman guard Rakease Passmore will both be looked to provide an immediate impact in 2024-25.

KANSAS IN EXHIBITION PLAY

Kansas is 95-11 in exhibition history after going 3-2 in 2023. The 87-81 loss to the Bahamian National Team on Aug. 7, 2023, ended a 35-straight exhibition winning streak for Kansas, a streak that dated back to Oct. 30, 2012. KU has won the last 55 exhibition games in Allen Fieldhouse beginning in 1994. With the 106-71 win versus Puerto Rico Select Team on Aug.

3, 2023, Kansas has scored 100-plus points in 31 exhibition games, including 15 under head coach Bill Self. The Jayhawks are 63-4 in exhibition play in Self's 21 seasons at KU.

KANSAS NO. 1 IN PRESEASON POLLS FOR SECOND STRAIGHT SEASON

For the second-straight season and fifth time in poll history, Kansas men's basketball enters the season ranked No. 1 by the Associated Press (AP), as the AP released its preseason poll Oct. 14. Kansas received 30 of a possible 60 first-place votes from the AP panel.

All five times KU has been No. 1 in the preseason poll have been in the Bill Self era. Besides 2024-25, the Jayhawks were No. 1 entering the 2004-05, 2009-10, 2018-19 and 2023-24 seasons. Kansas was also No. 1 in the first poll of the 1956-57 season, but preseason polls did not begin in 1961-62. This marks the 60th time Kansas has been ranked No. 1 and the last time KU was No. 1 in the AP poll was Nov. 20, 2023, the third poll of last season. KU was ranked in the top 10 of the 2023-24 AP poll all but three weeks.

For the 13th-consecutive year, Kansas men's basketball enters the 2024-25 season ranked seventh or higher. This is also the 15th time in the last 16 seasons that the Jayhawks have entered the season No. 7 or higher by the AP, including 12 times in the top five and seven in the top three. KU was No. 1 in 2009-10, No. 3 in 2016-17, No. 1 in 2018-19, No. 3 in 2019-20, No. 3 in 2021-22, No. 1 in 2023-24 and No. 1 in 2024-25.

Under Bill Self, this is the 19th time that Kansas enters the season ranked seventh or higher in the Associated Press preseason poll. Historically, the No. 1 ranking marks the 27th time since the 1992-93 season that Kansas will enter the season seventh or higher.

Kansas will play 10 games against teams ranked in the preseason Associated Press Top 25, including seven against Big 12 opponents and eight against Top 10 foes. KU will play against No. 4 Houston (twice), No. 5 Iowa State (twice), No. 7 Duke, No. 8 Baylor, No. 9 North Carolina, No. 10 Arizona, No. 15 Creighton and No. 20 Cincinnati.

Like the preseason Associated Press poll, Kansas men's basketball has been voted No. 1 in the USA TODAY Sports Coaches Poll, released Oct. 23.

Kansas received 15 of a possible 32 first-place votes by the coaches and amassed 743 poll votes. Alabama received six first-place votes and was second with 718 points.

This is the second-straight season and the fifth time in the coaches' poll that Kansas is No. 1 in the preseason poll with four in the Self era - 1996-97, 2004-05, 2009-10, 2018-19, 2023-24 and 2024-25.

The No. 1 ranking marked the 11th-straight year Kansas has entered the season No. 5 or higher in the coaches' poll dating back to 2014-15. Additionally, it is the 19th time in the Self era the Jayhawks have been preseason seventh or higher, including each of the last 13 seasons.

Kansas will play 10 games against teams ranked in the preseason USA TODAY Sports Coaches Poll Top 25. KU will play against No. 4 Houston (twice), No. 5 Duke, No. 6 Iowa State (twice), No. 8 Baylor, No. 9 Arizona, No. 10 North Carolina, No. 14 Creighton and No. 20 Cincinnati.

KU PICKED FIRST IN THE COACHES BIG 12 PRESEASON POLL

For the 21st time in the 28-year history of the coaches' men's basketball preseason Big 12 poll, Kansas has been selected as the favorite to win the conference as the league announced preseason awards Oct. 10.

Kansas received nine of a possible 15 first-place votes in the poll as coaches are not allowed to vote for their own team. KU amassed 215 points, edging 2024 Big 12 regular-season champion Houston (211) in the poll. Houston had five first-place votes. Iowa State (194), with one first-place vote, was third in the poll with Baylor fourth and Arizona fifth. Arizona garnered one first-place vote in the poll.

DICKINSON AND HARRIS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12 BY THE COACHES

In a vote by the league coaches, Kansas graduate center Hunter Dickinson is the Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year for the second-consecutive season, becoming the first player in conference history to earn the accolade twice. Dickinson, a unanimous preseason all-conference first team selection, is joined on the Preseason All-Big 12 Team by KU teammate Dajuan Harris Jr., who is on the preseason all-league second team.

Dickinson is a 2024 Consensus All-America Second Team, All-Big 12 First Team and the Big 12 Newcomer of the Year selection. Dickinson was the only player in the Big 12 to average a double-double (17.9 ppg, 10.9 rpg) last year. Harris has been the starter each of the last three seasons and was the 2023 Big 12 Defensive player of the Year. A three-time all-league honoree, Harris has led the league in assist-to-turnover ratio two of the last three seasons and has ranked in the top five in the conference in assists per game each of the last three years.

CELEBRATING 70 YEARS OF ALLEN FIELDHOUSE

Kansas basketball will celebrate the 70th year of Allen Fieldhouse in 2024-25 and the historic structure has had some major improvements that began following the 2023-24 season. The enhancements include a new floor, a new scoreboard with additional scoreboards in the southwest and northeast corners, chairback additions on the west side and improved ADA seating throughout the venue. With the aforementioned, the new capacity for Allen Fieldhouse will be 15,300. Additionally, both the second and third floor concourses will have makeovers allowing patrons more access to pre- and post-game areas, enhancing the experience of being part of the most historic venue in college basketball.

KANSAS TO HOST HOWARD IN MCLENDON CLASSIC

Following a home exhibition contest against Washburn on Tuesday, Oct. 29, Kansas will open the regular season by hosting Howard on Monday, Nov. 4. The Howard game will mark the second annual McLendon Classic as KU begins the season hosting an HBCU opponent. The contest celebrates University of Kansas alum and legendary coach John McLendon and the McLendon Leadership Initiative. Last season, Kansas hosted North Carolina Central.

The Howard contest will feature recognitions and honors throughout the game. Included is Howard Kenny Blackeney, who was the 2023 Coach John McLendon Award recipient and the McLendon Future Leaders Initiative will be recognized with each school's McLendon fellows - Brittany Franklin (Kansas), Trey Quartlebaum (Kansas), Collins Robinson V (Kansas) and Timothy Osei (Howard). Additionally, the Delaware (Lenape) Tribal Chief KillsCrow will be in attendance. McLendon has intersecting identities as a Afro-Indigenous man from the Delaware (Lenape) Tribe.

Kansas will conclude exhibition play when it hosts Washburn on Tuesday, Oct. 29, at 7 p.m. in Allen Fieldhouse. The contest will be televised on ESPN+.

KU leads the all-time series against Washburn 39-3, including an 8-0 record in exhibition games. The last time these teams met was on Dec. 3, 2020 in Lawrence, which resulted in an 89-54 Kansas win.

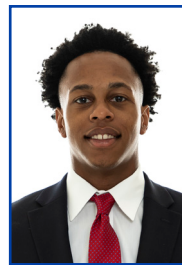

NOTES

- Bill Self was named the eighth coach in Kansas basketball history on April 21, 2003.
- In September 2017, Self was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.
- Self won his 700th career game on Feb. 8, 2020, with KU's 60-46 win at TCU. He became the 31st coach in NCAA Division I to accomplish the feat, the second youngest and the sixth fastest.
- While at Kansas, Self has won two national championships (2008, 2022), 16 regular-season Big 12 Conference titles, including a KU- and NCAA-record-tying 13-straight titles from 2005-17, and eight league tournament titles.
- At Kansas, Self has won 16 regular-season league titles with just 18 losses in Allen Fieldhouse. With KU's win versus Siena (11/18/16), Self became the winningest coach in Allen Fieldhouse, posting his 207th victory in the venue.
- In his first trip to the Final Four in 2008, Self's Kansas team won the title. Self is one of two active coaches in NCAA Division I to have won multiple national titles (Rick Pitino) and one of 16 all-time with multiple titles.
- While at Kansas, he has coached 13 NBA Lottery selections including Andrew Wiggins and Joel Embiid, the No. 1 and No. 3 overall selections in the 2014 NBA Draft. Wiggins was the second-ever Jayhawk to go No. 1 with the other being Danny Manning in 1988.
- Self has guided his teams to 23-win seasons in 24 of the last 26 seasons dating back to 1998-99.
- Self's teams have won 20 regular-season league crowns in the last 25 years. His teams have never finished lower than third in the conference.
- Self's 10 career 30-win seasons are tied for third most in NCAA history - Mike Krzyzewski (16), Roy Williams (12), John Calipari (10); and is tied for No. 1 on the active coaches' list. Nine of his 10 30-win seasons have been at Kansas.
- Self was the head coach for Team USA's U18 team that competed and won gold at the 2018 FIBA Americas Championship held in St. Catharines, Canada, in the summer of 2018.
- Self is one of five coaches in NCAA Division I history to have led three different teams - Tulsa, Illinois and Kansas - to the NCAA Elite Eight, including eight times with KU (2004-07-08-11-12-16-17-22). The other coaches are: Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Rick Pitino and Eddie Sutton.
- A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kansas in 1985-86 under head coach Larry Brown. He then returned to his alma mater as an assistant for seven seasons under coaches Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton. His first head coaching job was at Oral Roberts in 1993-94, then Tulsa (1997-98), Illinois (2000-03) and Kansas (2003-present).
