GAME NOTES

- » Arkansas finishes the regular season with 6-6 record. The Hogs have clinched bowl eligibility for the fourth time in five seasons under head coach Sam Pittman. He is the fifth coach in program history to go to a bowl game in four of his first five seasons at Arkansas, joining Frank Broyles, Lou Holtz, Ken Hatfield and Houston Nutt.
- » The temperature at kickoff for today's game between Arkansas and Missouri was recorded at 29 degrees. Since joining the SEC in 1992, Arkansas has only played in one other game in sub 30 degree weather at kickoff: 2010 Liberty Bowl vs. ECU (29 degrees). It marks the marks the Razorbacks' first game played in snowy conditions since a 31-21 loss to Auburn on Oct. 30, 1993 in Fayetteville.
- » **WR Andrew Armstrong** eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the fifth time this season with nine catches for 128 yards. With 128 receiving yards, WR Andrew Armstrong increased his season total to 1,140 to move into sole possession of second on Arkansas' single-season receiving yards list. With nine catches, WR Andrew Armstrong increased his season total to 78 to become one of only two pass catchers in program history (also WR Cobi Hamilton - 90 receptions in 2012) to record 70-plus receptions in a single season.
- » **WR Andrew Armstrong** has caught a pass in 39 consecutive games and has recorded multiple receptions in 34 straight games since his 2021 season at East Texas A&M. Armstrong extended his streak courtesy of a 10-yard reception at the 13:52 mark in the first quarter.
- » **LB Brad Spence** has registered 1.0 sacks in three consecutive games. He is the 14th Razorback defender to accomplish the feat since 2000 and the second this season joining DL Landon Jackson who registered 1.0+ sacks in four consecutive games.
- » **RB Ja'Quinden Jackson** became the first Razorback to rush for 15 touchdowns in a season since RB Alex Collins rushed for 20 touchdowns in 2015. His 15 rushing touchdowns move him into a tie for sixth with RB Bill Burnett (1968) and RB Madre Hill (1995) on Arkansas' single-season rushing touchdown list.
- » **RB Ja'Quinden Jackson's** now has four multi-rushing touchdowns this season which is the most by an Arkansas ball carrier since Alex Collins logged five multi-rushing touchdown games in 2015. He also rushed for three touchdowns in a single game for the second time this season. Jackson became the first Hog to rush for 3+ touchdowns in multiple games in a season since Collins did so during three games in 2015.
- » The Razorbacks have converted 175 consecutive extra-point kicks dating back to a road game at Missouri on Dec. 5, 2020. K AJ Reed made his final extra point against Missouri, the last of his Arkansas career, in 2020 to start the current streak. K Cam Little went 129 of 129 in his three-year run as the Razorbacks' kicker from 2021-23. The duo of K Kyle Ramsey (23 of 23) and K Matthew Shipley (22 of 22) has combined to go 45 of 45 on PATs in 2024.
- » **DL Cam Ball** logged a career-high seven tackles.

ARKANSAS QUOTES

Sam Pittman, Arkansas Head Coach

Opening Statement:

"We have to give Missouri credit. When you get yourself in that situation, I think it has happened in three or four of our five years when we are either close or have the lead. We took the lead, went right down the field and scored. I was trying to save enough time for us to have a chance to get back and score, but that happened to us and I certainly wish it wouldn't. We tried different things on defense to try and preserve the lead when we went up. Give Brady Cook and his group credit. He did a fantastic job on that drive. We want to tell you that Landon Jackson is back in the locker room and doing well. He has been released, so that was great news. I am disappointed we did not beat Missouri. I am disappointed for our kids and fans. I am not disappointed in the effort. With the two turnovers, it led to two scores, and they had zero. It is hard to beat a Top-25 team that way."

On Missouri having a short field:

"In the first half, our defense was playing so well that if we did not give them a short field. I am not sure what they were gonna do offensively and we did. Those are things you can't do, but we did and we gave them a little bit of life. They figured out the unbalanced formation and started to run the football better on us and we could not stop it. The quarterback draw hurt us two or three times. The Q-counter read hurt us as well and of course, the last one, the QB draw for them to go up five and then the reverse on the two-point conversion to get up seven were daggers."

On turnover margin:

"It is very frustrating. We work ball security every week and put an emphasis on it. That is one of our keys and ways we can win. We knew today, with how the weather was, that whoever turns it over less is gonna win and that is what happened."

On the defense:

"We definitely want to create takeaways, but besides takeaways, I feel like we played some good ball today."

On turnovers:

"It has been a theme throughout the year. The offense needs to do a better job of putting the defense in a position to be successful. In the third quarter, they had a long drive and the defense made an incredible stand to hold them to a field goal and we did not execute the game plan as an offense to give our defense a break. We turned the ball over and gave them a short field. Two of their touchdowns came off of turnovers. Our defense played their tails off. We have to do a better job of putting them in a position to be successful."

On close scores in the series:

"That is going to be the case with the rivalry games. Many people watched the Georgia and Georgia Tech game last night. They were not expecting that outcome but it is going to be close and you have to execute every play. You can look at the fourth quarter and see what happens but it is really the plays in the first, second and third that people don't notice... It is the little things that you have to execute and prepare for and unfortunately we were not able to do that today."
