Don't Give Up, Don't Ever Give Up

- The Jimmy V Classic is an annual game organized by ESPN Events to raise money and awareness for cancer research. It is named after Jim Valvano and features clips from his speech at the 1993 ESPY Awards. The Men's Classic was first held in 1995 while a Women's Classic was added in 2002.
- Since its inception, it has featured four teams in a doubleheader played in a neutral stadium, primarily at Madison Square Garden in downtown New York.

The First & the Familiar

- Michigan is participating in its first Jimmy V Classic.
- Dusty May will participate for a fourth time in the Jimmy V Classic.
 - As a manager, Indiana defeated North Carolina (82-73) in the 1999 Classic.
 - An assistant coach at Florida, the Gators fell to Duke (84-74) at the 2016 event.
 - As Florida Atlantic's head coach, May's Owls fell to Illinois (98-89) in 2023.
 - Now as head coach of Michigan, May takes on Arkansas.

More Familiarity

- Dusty May and Vladislav Goldin will see a familiar face in New York.
- Former Florida Atlantic guard Johnell Davis is using his fifth season via the NCAA's COVID eligibility rule at Arkansas. He has started all nine games for the Razorbacks and is averaging 9.3 points, 4.1 rebounds and 2.1 assists.
- In four years with May and the Owls, Davis played in 128 games (53 starts) scoring 1,431 points (11.2 ppg) with 657 rebounds (5.1 rpg), 234 assists (1.8 apg) and 164 steals (1.3 spg).
- Davis helped FAU to its first-ever Final Four (2023) and a program-record 35 wins (35-4) and the 2024 Conference USA regular season and tournament titles. In 2023 he was the Conference USA Player of the Year and first team selection. He followed in 2024, he was the AAC Co-Player of the Year and first team selection.

The Latest News

- Vladislav Goldin has back-to-back 20-plus point games including a career-best 24 at #11 Wisconsin and 20 against Iowa. He has four double-figure games in his last five and increased his output to 12.0 per game.
- Danny Wolf posted his fourth double-double with 13 points and 14 rebounds against Iowa. He is averaging 12.1 points and 10.0 rebounds per game.
- Tre Donaldson rebounded from zero points at #11 Wisconsin, scoring a career-best 18 points against Iowa. He averages 12.1 per game.
- In his last two games, Roddy Gayle Jr. has shot 50 percent from the field (10-for-20), with 13.0 points per game and 10 rebounds (5.0 rpg) and 10 assists (5.0 apg).
- Donaldson leads U-M with 36 assists (4.0 apg) and Roddy Gayle Jr. has 31 (3.4 apg), but right behind the duo is Danny Wolf, who has 26 (2.9 apg).
- Nimari Burnett leads with 17 long-range baskets and shoots 45.9 percent. He has made two-plus three-pointers in six games with a season-best four against Miami (Ohio).

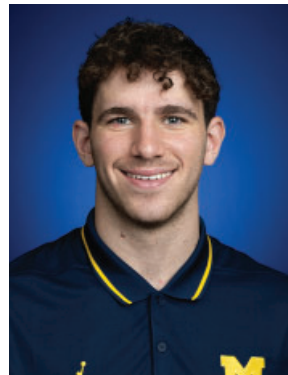

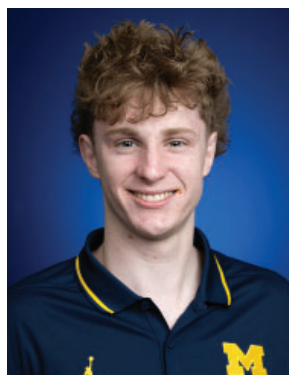

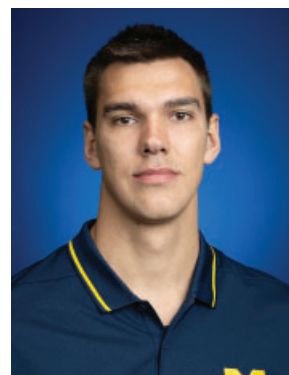

Series with Arkansas

- This will be the first meeting in the series in 12 years.
- Michigan holds a narrow 4-3 lead in the all-time series.
- The Jimmy V Classic marks the fourth neutral site game in the series. First, U-M won at the 1966 Los Angeles Classic (82-72, +10) before falling in the 1994 NCAA Elite Eight (76-68, -8); as the Razorbacks went on to win the 1994 national title. Finally, U-M defeated Arkansas in the 1997 NIT Final Four (77-62, +15) as the Wolverines went on to win the NIT crown.
- In a home-and-home series in 2012, the Maize and Blue won the series last game with an 80-67 (+13) at Crisler Center. U-M built a 10-point halftime lead and maintained it the entire second half. All five Wolverines starters scored in double figures led by Glenn Robinson III's 17. Jordan Morgan recorded a double-double (12 points, 10 rebounds) while Trey Burke had 16 points, four rebounds, and seven assists.

Michigan at the World's Most Famous Arena

- Michigan has a 26-11 record in Madison Square Garden.
- U-M has won 11 straight games over the last 12 years.
- U-M is 13-3 in postseason play in the Garden, reaching the NIT championship weekend, five times -- 1971, 1984, 1997*, 2004, 2006. The Wolverines went on to win three NIT titles in 1984, 1997* (vacated) and 2004.
- In 2018, U-M won four games in four days (for a second straight year) to claim a second straight Big Ten Tournament.

Game Review: Iowa

- After building a 16-point lead early in the first half, Michigan survived an Iowa rally, scoring on its final possession to defeat the Hawkeyes, 85-83.
- The victory was the seventh straight for the Maize and Blue.
- With U-M up three, Danny Wolf's turnover led to a quick Payton Sandfort three-pointer tied the game, 83-83, with 20 seconds left. U-M's Roddy Gayle Jr. drove to the basket on U-M's final play. His layup hit the backboard and was about to roll in before Iowa's Owen Freeman swatted it for a goaltending call. After a review, the call stood and the Hawkeyes' last-second shot by Pryce Sandfort missed securing the win for the Wolverines.
- U-M finished shooting 55.2 percent from the field, despite making four three-pointers.
- Vladislav Goldin paced U-M with his first double-double as a Wolverine (11th career). With a second straight 20-plus point game, Goldin closed with 20 points, 11 rebounds, and a block. Area "50-1" partner, Danny Wolf added a double-double of his own with his 13 points, 14 rebound effort.
- Pacing U-M's floor game, Tre Donaldson had a career-best 18 points with five assists, and four rebounds in a career-best 33 minutes. Gayle had 17 points, four rebounds and five assists.

Who are the Wolverines?

- Michigan wants a fast-paced, transition, and "read-and-react" offense emphasizing long-range shooting with ball screen actions.
- Michigan's depth allows May to run as many as nine or 10 deep in a game.
- Dusty May wants to have ball movement and for the Wolverines to pass up a good shot for a better one.
- The "green light" is on for everyone -- if you miss it, take the next one.
- May, Akeem Miskdeen, and Drew Williamson coordinate U-M's offense.
- Michigan will incorporate two big's on the floor with 7-0 forward Danny Wolf and 7-1 center Vladislav Goldin. U-M's size gets even bigger with 6-10, lefty sharp-shooter Sam Walters playing the perimeter.
- U-M runs an active man-to-man defense incorporating switches on-ball and off-ball screens and on exchanges for all four but the five-man.
- May wants active hands, defensive intensity, and to be as disruptive as possible.
- Mike Boynton Jr., Justin Joyner, and Kyle Church coordinate U-M's defense.
- All five assistants are involved in scouting. Mike Boynton Jr. is not paired with anyone, while Justin Joyner and Drew Williamson are partnered and Kyle Church and Akeem Miskdeen team together.
- May has said he wants his team to "have stars and not a star."
- U-M's core principles include: being reliable, having confidence, having passion, being relational, being responsible, having humility, and willingness to sacrifice.

The New Look Wolverines

- Michigan returns five Wolverines from its 2023-24 squad, including lone starter Nimari Burnett and U-M Sixth-Man Will Tschetter. Jace Howard and walk-on's Ian Burns and Harrison Hochberg also returned for the Maize and Blue.
- Michigan brought in 11 new players: two graduate transfers, four junior transfers, one sophomore transfer, and four freshmen.

Maize and Blue Notables

- Michigan has won seven straight games. U-M last won seven consecutive games to start the Juwan Howard era in 2019-20 jumping from unranked to No. 4 after winning the Battle 4 Atlantis.
- During its current streak, U-M won back-to-back wins over nationally ranked teams -- #22 Xavier (78-53) and #11 Wisconsin (67-64). The last time the Wolverines had back-to-back wins against ranked foes was in the 2022 NCAA postseason -- #24 Colorado State (75-63) and #5 Tennessee (76-68) advancing to the Sweet 16.
- Michigan is starting the backend of a five-of-six road game stretch. Restarting the Big Ten season in January and spending the New Year in Los Angeles, U-M will increase to stretch to seven of 10 games away from Ann Arbor.
- The Maize and Blue returned to Crisler Center for the first time in 16 days against Iowa (Dec. 7). The game with the Hawkeyes was the first of three December home games for the Wolverines - Purdue Fort Wayne (Dec. 22) and the non-conference finale with Western Kentucky (Dec. 30).

Michigan's Area "50-1"

- Many have asked for a nickname for U-M's 7-foot duo -- Danny Wolf and Vladislav Goldin. Thanks to Strength Coach Matt Aldred and Jace Howard, the wait is over as Wolf and Goldin have been dubbed U-M's "Area 50-1"
- Wolf averages 12.1 points, 10.0 rebounds, 2.9 assists, and 1.8 blocks a game.
- Wolf has back-to-back 20-point games against ranked opponents -- #22 Xavier (20 points, 14 rebounds, three assists, two steals) and #11 Wisconsin (20 points, seven rebounds, five assists, five blocks, three steals).
- In his last three games, Wolf is shooting 65.6 percent (21-for-32) from the field and 54.5 percent (6-for-11) from deep. With three 10-plus rebounding games over his last four, he has reached a double-digit average (10.0 rpg).
- Wolf is third on the Wolverines with 26 assists (2.9 apg). He has four games with four-plus assists.
- Goldin averages 12.0 points, 5.4 rebounds, 1.9 blocks. He is shooting 60 percent from the field. He has posted all four double-figure games over the last five games, including back-to-back 20-plus point games.
- Goldin scored a career-best 24 points at #11 Wisconsin. Adding five rebounds, he surpassed 700 career rebounds (714). He has 1,289 career points.
- Following up his game in Madison, Goldin recorded his first U-M double-double (11th career) with 20 points and 11 rebounds against Iowa.
- In U-M's win over #22 Xavier, Goldin attempted and made his first career three-pointer. He had not shot a three-point field goal in 123 games before making his first against the Musketeers.
- Goldin (17) and Wolf (16) combine for 33 of U-M's 47 blocks.

A Series of Michigan Did You Know?

- Michigan begins its 109th season of basketball
- Michigan starts its 58th season playing in Crisler Center.
- The Maize and Blue roster does not have a player under 6-0.
- This season, the Wolverines have played three 6-10 and taller players - 6-10 Sam Walters, 7-0 Danny Wolf, and 7-1 Vladislav Goldin.
- The only time U-M has had three players 6-10 or taller on a team was in 2004 with 6-10 Amadou Ba, 6-11 Chris Hunter, and 6-11 Courtney Sims, however, they did not play all together.
- Vladislav Goldin (7-1) and Danny Wolf (7-0) are the seventh and eighth Wolverines, respectively, to surpass 7-feet in Michigan history. They join: Jon Antonides (7-2; 1981-84); Josh Moore (7-2; 2001-02), Hunter Dickinson (7-1; 2021-23), Jon Teske (7-0; 2017-20); Ben Cronin (7-0; 2009-10) and Eric Riley (7-0; 1990-93).

A Series of Coaching Did You Know?

- Kyle Church and Dusty May have worked together for the past 12 years - Louisiana Tech, Florida, Florida Atlantic, and now Michigan.
- Assistant Mike Boynton Jr. squared off against U-M in the 2017 NCAA Tournament. While coaching under Brad Underwood at Oklahoma State as an assistant, the Cowboys fell to the Wolverines 92-91 in the first round as U-M used free throws to seal the game. After that season, Underwood left for Illinois, and Boynton was named head coach.
- Assistant Drew Williamson does have a slight Michigan tie. In the 2006 NIT Final Four, Williamson squared off with the Wolverines in the semifinal at MSG. He had 10 points, four rebounds, and two assists, but lost, 66-43, to the Maize and Blue.

A Series of Wolverine Did You Know?

- Will Tschetter completed his U-M undergraduate degree in three years (2024, Earth & Environmental Science). He has begun a Master's of Environment and Sustainability in Ecosystem Science and Management.
- Nimari Burnett and Vladislav Goldin were freshmen roommates at Texas Tech (2020-21) before they transferred for their sophomore seasons - Burnett (Alabama) and Goldin (Florida Atlantic). Burnett went on to transfer again to U-M, while Goldin spent three seasons with Dusty May at Florida Atlantic.
- Arriving in the United States in 2019 to attend Putnam Science Academy, Vladislav Goldin returned to Russia in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic and has not returned home in over four years.
- Goldin was a competitive wrestler until age 15. After a growth spurt, Goldin shifted his focus to playing basketball.
- Goldin has his beloved dog, Hank -- a tri-color Berne Doodle. Hank is nicknamed "Hank the Tank" and has his own Instagram: @the_hank_the_tank
- Before heading to Michigan via the portal, Danny Wolf and No. 13 seed Yale upset Tre Donaldson and No. 4 seed Auburn in the 2024 NCAA Tournament first round, 78-76. Wolf had 13 points and five rebounds. Donaldson had five points, six rebounds, and four assists.

- U-M has 15 Big Ten regular season championships
 - Titles: 1921 (tri), 1926 (quad), 1927, 1929 (co), 1948, 1964 (co), 1965, 1966, 1974 (co), 1977, 1985, 1986, 2012 (tri), 2014 and 2021.
- U-M legends Cazzie Russell and Bill Buntin won three straight titles (1964, 1965 & 1966).
 - The duo helped lead the Wolverines to back-to-back Final Four's (1964 & 1965).
- U-M's last Big Ten title was in 2021 (14-3) -- Juwan Howard's first season.
- Behind Big Ten Player of the Year Nik Stauskas, U-M won the 2014 regular season title by three games (15-3). It was the first outright title in 28 years.
- In 2012, U-M won a share of its first Big Ten title in 26 years. In fact, thanks to Ohio State's (William Buford) last second win over Michigan State, the Wolverines were able to claim a share of the title (13-5) along with the Buckeyes and Spartans.

Dusty May

Dusty May was named the David and Meredith Kaplan Men's Basketball Head Coach in March 2024, becoming the 18th coach in the storied history of the Wolverines program.

Before the Maize & Blue was Florida Atlantic

• During his six straight winning seasons at Florida Atlantic (2018-24), Dusty May compiled a program record 126 wins and helped the Owls make a run to the 2023 NCAA Final Four. Additionally, he captured the programs first regular-season and tournament championships while playing in Conference USA in 2023

The Mike White Coaching Tree

• Prior to earning his first head coaching job at Florida Atlantic, May served as an assistant under Mike White for seven years with stints at Florida (2015-18) and Louisiana Tech (2011-15). Before working under White, May was an assistant under Kerry Rupp at Louisiana Tech for two seasons (2009-11).
 • May started his coaching career at Eastern Michigan (2005-06) with Charles Ramsey, before

Coaching Stop: How it Began

• May served as a student manager at Indiana under Bob Knight as an undergraduate (1996-2000). After graduation, May began his coaching career with video and administrative roles with both USC and Indiana before landing his first assistant coaching job at Eastern Michigan (2005-06), under former U-M assistant Charles E. Ramsey.
 • May then headed to Murray State (2006-07) to work under Billy Kennedy before joining Louisiana Tech for two seasons with for IU assistant and head coach Mike Davis at UAB (2007-09).

The 2023 Final Four Run

• In FAU's historic 2022-23 season, May led the Owls to a program-record and DI-leading 35 wins, including a Conference USA and school-record 18 conference wins.
 • Highlighting the season was the Owls' 20-game winning streak (Nov. 14 to Jan. 28), which marked the longest in program history.
 • After securing the first regular-season title (18-2) by two games, the Owls won the conference tournament with a 78-56 win over UAB to earn the program's first-ever bid to the NCAA Tournament.
 • In the NCAA Tournament, May brought the ninth-seeded Owls to the Final Four behind a magical run. Florida Atlantic opened with a thrilling 66-65 win over No. 8-seed Memphis on a last-second buzzer-beater.
 • FAU advanced to the second weekend with a 78-70 win over No. 16 seed Fairleigh Dickinson, who had stunned No. 1 seed Purdue, 63-58.
 • The Owls continued their run with a 62-55 victory over No. 4 seed Tennessee and another down-to-the-wire win (79-76) over No. 3 seed Kansas State at Madison Square Garden to reach the program's first Final Four.
 • In Houston, No. 5 seed San Diego State used a buzzer-beater to end the Owls run with a 72-71 victory.

• Dusty May announced the signing of five-star guard Trey McKenney, four-star forward Oscar Goodman and four-star guard Winters Grady to a Big Ten Athletic Scholarship Agreement for the 2025-26 season

• McKenney is the highest-rated in-state prospect in the 2025 class and a front-runner for Michigan's Mr. Basketball. As a junior, he led Orchard Lake St. Mary's to a 27-1 record, winning the Division 1 State Championship. In the championship game, he had 32 points and grabbed 10 rebounds in a 63-52 win.

• During the season, he averaged 22.8 points, 10.1 rebounds, and 3.3 assists per game, taking home the 2024 Michigan Associated Press Division 1 Basketball Player of the Year award for the second straight year.

• As a sophomore, McKenney averaged 25.5 points and 11.1 rebounds per game, and was the MLive Metro Detroit Player of the Year in addition to the AP's honors.
