NEED-TO-KNOWS

RARE HOME STAND: The Aggies close out a minihome stand against ARK on Saturday, marking the first time the team has played back-to-back home games in the same week since early November.

SEEKING #20: A win over Arkansas would be No. 20 for the Aggies. It would mark the fourth straight season with 20+ wins under Buzz Williams, who would become the second Aggie head coach to post four consecutive 20-win seasons (Mark Turgeon, 2007-11).

SHOOTERS SHOOT: The Aggies average 6.7 more shots/game than their opponents in SEC play, which ranks No. 2 among league schools.

Texas A&M averages 59.8 FGA per SEC game, while limiting its league opponents to just 53.1 FGA/G, which is the lowest average in the conference.

UNCOMMON AGGIES: According to research by Will Warren/Stats By Will, the Aggies have won 32 times in 65 games when being out-shot by its opponent over the past four seasons. Only the College of Charleston has a better winning % (min. 50 games).

In 2024-25, the Aggies are 5-3 when losing the FG% battle, including wins over NET top 10 teams Purdue (.440-.453) and Texas Tech (.373-.451).

CHAIRMEN OF THE BOARDS: Texas A&M ranks No. 1 nationally in offensive rebounds (16.3), No. 7 in total rebounds (41.3) and No. 6 in rebound margin (9.6).

ONCE A WEAKNESS: The Aggies are averaging 25.4 defensive rebounds over their last seven games, which is fifth-best in the SEC. Through the first four games of the SEC schedule, the M&W averaged just 21.8 defensive boards (13th among SEC schools).

SUM OF PARTS: The Aggies are one of three SEC teams averaging more than 40.0 rebounds/G for the full season (No. 3 with 41.3/G), and are doing it without a single individual ranked among the league's top 20.

Among all D1 teams averaging 40+ rebounds/G, Texas A&M and Tennessee State are only schools without a player averaging 6.0+ rebounds/G. Solomon Washington is the Aggies' top rebounder at 5.6/G (tNo. 407 nationally <-not a typo).

PAYNE GAIN: Since Minnesota transfer Pharrell Payne re-entered the starting lineup, the Aggies are 4-0, and he's averaging 11.0 points and 5.5 rebounds in 25:20 minutes/game. He's also drawn 14 fouls in that span.

DOMINICAN STOCKTON?: After delivering a careerhigh six assists vs. Georgia (2/11), press row observers were considering shifting Andersson Garcia's moniker of "Dominican Rodman" to "Dominican Stockton" as a reference to NBA assists leader John Stockton.

HOME STAND FOR AGGIES

The Texas A&M men's basketball team (18-5 overall/7-3 vs. SEC) opens a two-game home stand with 8 p.m. matchup against the Georgia Bulldogs on Tuesday at Reed Arena.

- All 14 meetings between the Aggies and Bulldogs have come as members of the SEC with the M&W holding a 9-5 series advantage.
- Since losing the first four meetings, the Aggies have won nine of the last 10 bouts, including five in a row.
- Under Buzz Williams, the Aggies are 5-1 with five straight victories.
- Texas A&M holds a 5-2 lead in games at Reed Arena, with five straight wins.

- 354 of 355 D1 teams in the Opta StatsPass database average more than 21.0 FGM/G. Texas A&M has held nine opponents to 20 or fewer FGM. Opponents average 21.6 FGM vs. the Aggies.
- Texas A&M has held eight opponents, including three SEC foes, to 60 or fewer points.

TREND BULLETS

- Five of Texas A&M's game results have been decided by three points or less (3-2 record) and 13 games have been within one-possession after the under 4:00 media timeout (9-4).
 (Tight games history on pg. 4)
- Over his past five games, Wade Taylor IV has hit 45.0% of his 3-point attempts (18-40). He matched his career high of seven (7-10) at South Carolina (2/1) while raising his season high for points to 25, and he hit the clutch game-winner at No. 15 Missouri (2/8) in that span.
- Taylor has reached double-digit points in 19 of 20 games in 2024-25. The Aggies are 17-3 with Taylor in the lineup (he missed four games due to injury)
- .• Along with 11.3 points, **Henry Coleman III** is averaging a team-high 9.0 rebounds, 1.8 steals and 29.9 minutes per game over the Aggies' last four games (all wins).
- Texas A&M pounds the offensive glass for a NCAA-best 16.3 offensive rebounds/G, which is 1.3/G more than any other D1 school and 1.9/G more than any other major conference team (St. John's, 14.4).
- The Aggies' ability to gather offensive rebounds allows them to average 6.7 FGA/G than its opponents in SEC play (up from +4.3 in nonconference games).
- Texas A&M hoops has rallied from a 15-point or more deficit to at least a tie six times in the past two seasons, including twice already in 2024-25. (Comeback history on page 7)
- Texas A&M is averaging 18.8-26.0 FT-FTA (72.1%) over the past four games. The Aggies have earned 32 more FTA and made 18 more than their opponents in that span.

EIGHT IS GREAT

The Aggies' No. 8 ranking in the latest AP Top 25 is the highest of the Buzz Williams era and the highest for the program since Dec. 25, 2017. The previous high ranking under Williams was No. 10 (1/6, 2/3) earlier this year.

- For the full season, Texas A&M averages just 1.7 free throw MAKES fewer than its opponents' free throw ATTEMPTS per game (16.8 FTM to 18.5 FTA).
- Texas A&M has earned 40+ rebounds in 15 games, while just allowing 40+ opponent rebounds just three times.
- In a bit of an oddity, the Aggies shoot better from beyond the arc away from Reed Arena (33.0% in 12 road/neutral games) compared to 29.2% in 12 home games. Even weirder, the Aggies make 34.9% from deep in true road games.
- The Aggies are 14-1 when hitting least 65% of their FTA and 5-4 when connecting on less than 65%. Similarly, the Aggies are 14-3 when they earn 20 or more FTA.

RANKED WINS RECORD

The Aggies logged their program-record sixth win over an AP Top 25 opponent with the 67-64 win over No. 15 Missouri (2/8), breaking the old record of five by Shelby Metcalf's 1978-79 team that tallied ranked victories over No. 10 Indiana, No. 15 UNLV, No. 19 San Francisco, No. 11 Kentucky and No. 11 Arkansas.

- The Aggies' six ranked wins are tied for thirdmost among all D1 schools (All SEC schools actually).
- The M&W has logged five AP Top 25 wins away from Reed Arena, including three in true road games.
- Texas A&M has posted six AP Top 25 victories in true road games in the Buzz Williams era (since 2019-20), which matches A&M's number of ranked road wins in the 40 seasons before his arrival.

300 ON HORIZON

Graduate G Wade Taylor IV's next point will be his 300th of the season. He will become the fourth player in A&M history with four seasons of 300+ points, joining TAMU Athletics Hall of Famers Bernard King, Vernon Smith and Joseph Jones.

PAYNE'S IMPACT

Minnesota transfer Pharrel Payne has emerged as the Aggies' No. 3 scorer at 9.3 points per game, while hitting on a team-best 65.3% of his shots.

- He is the SEC's most accurate shooter for the full season (min. 100 FGA) and in SEC play at 67.7% (min. 60 FGA).
- Payne has drawn a team-high 49 fouls in SEC play or 4.5 per game.
- According to KenPom, Payne's "fouls drawn/40" average for the season is 6.6, which ranks No. 29 nationally and No. 2 in the SEC.
- Payne ranks tNo. 5 in FTA (62) and tNo. 10 in FTM (40) in SEC games.

ONE OF A KIND

Fourth-year player Wade Taylor IV is the only active D1 player with at least 1,500 points (actually has 1,887), 400 assists (455), 200 steals (203) and 250 3-pointers (273) since his first collegiate season in 2021-22.

- Adding in Covid seniors, Taylor is joined by Alabama's Mark Sears, who has achieved the same milestone plateaus dating back to his first season at Ohio in 2020-21.
- Taylor is the only 1,800/400/200/250 player in SEC history, according to sports-reference.com.
 If the points threshold is lowered to 1,500, Taylor is joined by Tennessee's Santiago Vescovi.

Graduate forward Henry Coleman III has made a career of finding ways to fill the box score.

 Coleman is one of four active players with 1,200+ points, 300+ offensive rebounds, 775+ rebounds and 125+ steals for his career.

SMU transfer Zhuric Phelps is one of three SEC players averaging 14.0+ points, 4.0+ rebounds, 2.5 assists and 1.5 steals per game for the full season.

- Additionally, Phelps has joined exclusive group of D1 players with 1,400+ points, 400+ rebounds, 250+ assists and 200 steals. A fourth-year senior, Phelps joins six other Covid 5th year players to reach the numbers Mark Sears, Alabama; Dayvion McKnight, Xavier; Kadary Richmond, St. John's; Ace Baldwin Jr., Penn State, Nendah Tarke, Towson; and Posh Alexander, Dayton. Only Phelps, McKnight and Richmond have reached the milestone since 2021-22.
- In league games only, Phelps ranks No. 8 in scoring (16.3) and he's the No. 2 rebounding guard with 5.5 boards/G. The 6-foot-4 Phelps and Oweh (also 6-4) are the top rebounders among SEC players under 6-foot-7.
- He has reached double-digit points in a 18 of 23 games as an Aggie. He has 4+ rebounds in 18 games, including a season-high 10 vs. ACU (12/28).
- Phelps has scored a point/minute twice this season - 18 points in 18 minutes in his A&M debut vs. ETAMU and 34 in 33 vs. OU.
- A 2024 NABC All-District 24 selection, Phelps was one of three AAC players to post more than 450 points, 80 assists and 60 steals at SMU in 2023-24.
- A decorated high school player, Phelps was the first player in Texas to be named Mr. Basketball, win a State Championship and be State Tournament MVP since 2008.

DEPTH PAYING OFF

Texas A&M's bench has been instrumental to the team's overall success with a 46.9 FG% and an average of 28.2 points/game from its reserves.

- The Aggies have demonstrated uncommon depth: 11 players average at least 10 minutes, including five players with at least 20:00/G. Also, 10 players average at least 4.0 points/G and seven Aggies average 3.0+ rebounds/G.
- Texas A&M ranks No. 19 in KenPom's bench minutes category at 41.1% (D1 average: 31.5%).
- Despite multiple players missing games due to injury, no Aggie averages more than 30:00/G for the full season or SEC season.
- **Zhuric Phelps** leads the Aggies with 645 minutes, which ranks No. 34 in the SEC.

ON THE DEFENSE

The return of Wade Taylor IV has coincided with the Aggies' return to the top 10 (current No. 6) of KenPom's defensive efficiency rating after falling to a season-low No. 12 after the Kentucky game (1/14).

- Texas A&M is one of four SEC schools limiting its opponents to less than 40.0 FG% (39.5%).
- Texas A&M allows opponents to make just 21.6 field goals per game for the full season, which is No. 2 in the SEC behind Tennessee's 20.7/G.
- The season-high FGs for an opponent is 28 by Rutgers (11/30). No opponent has made more than 25 FGs vs. the Aggies since Alabama had 27 on 1/11.
- Only seven opponents have managed higher that 45% shooting vs. the Aggies.
- Texas A&M is limiting opponents to 39.5% shooting, which is lowest since Billy Gillispie's final Aggies' squad held opponents to 37.5% from the field in 2006-07.

CULTURE OF CONTINUITY

Under head coach Buzz Williams, the Texas A&M basketball program is an outlier in the collegiate landscape where roster movement among players and coaches is common.

- Among the 12 players that saw action in 2023-24, only one player that didn't finish his eligibility isn't back in 2024-25.
- Texas A&M's coaching staff has remained unchanged except for internal promotions for the past three seasons.
- Buzz Williams' staff has a combined 107 years together, led by associate head coach Devin Johnson's 14 seasons on Team Bus #1. Others with double-digit years of service with Williams are: Lyle Wolf (13), Dale Layer (12) and Josh Chambers (10).

RIM PROTECTION = DEFENSE

The addition of 6-foot-9 shot-swatter Pharrell Payne and the continued development active 6-foot-7 defenders Solomon Washington and Andersson Garcia have led to the best rim protection of the Buzz Williams era.

BUSINESS AS USUAL

For the second straight year, Texas A&M leads D1 with an average of 16.3 offensive rebounds/G.

- Texas A&M has pulled down nine or more offensive caroms in every game and earned an offensive rebound advantage in 19 of 24 games.
- The M&W averages 6.4 more offensive rebounds per game than its opponents (full season).
- The Aggies average at 2.0 or more offensive rebounds/G than 349 of 355 D1 teams.
- The Aggies have hit the 20-offensive rebound plateau six times, including a season-high 29 vs. Southern (11/20).
- Models of consistency, the Aggie glass eaters have pulled down double-digit offensive rebounds in 60 of their last 62 games dating back to the regular season finale vs. Alabama in 2023.

"BIG D" GUARD TRIO

The addition of Zhuric Phelps has given the Aggies a trio of senior guards hailing from the Dallas area - Phelps (Duncanville HS), Manny Obaseki (John Paul II HS in Plano) and Wade Taylor IV (Lancaster HS).

- Phelps joined the Aggies after three seasons at SMU, where scored 1,000+ points.
- Obaseki and Taylor were members of Texas A&M's early signing class in November of 2020.
- At the 1/17 media availability, Solomon Washington opined about players from Dallas: "I don't know if this is something with guys from Dallas but they are born to score the ball."

TRANSFER IMPACT

The Aggies added a trio of transfers in the offseason and all three have impacted the lineup.

- Minnesota tranfer Pharrel Payne has developed into one of the SEC's top post scorers, while SMU transfer Zhuric Phelps has emerged as one of the league's top scorers.
- Payne is the team's top shot blocker (1.2), while Phelps leads in points and steals.
- Nebraska transfer C.J. Wilcher is one of first reserves off the bench and leads the team in 3-point accuracy (39.4%).

SCHOLARSHIP FOR J-LEE

Sophomore defensive specialist Jaelyn Lee was put on scholarship for the spring semester by head coach Buzz Williams on Jan. 17.

- "Today is a special day and we're going to celebrate it the right way. This is J-Lee's sixth semester of college, and he receives a full scholarship this spring," Williams said in a video released on @teamcoachbuzz.
- A multi-sport athlete from tiny Paris, Texas (population: 24,171) in northeast Texas, Lee has developed into a gifted defender and been a stalwart of the Aggies' "Blue Team" since arriving on campus in 2022. The "Blue Team" is the Aggies' scout team and works hard to give the team a good "look" as it prepares for its next opponent.

 from the Disney/Pixar movie Toy Story by

dropping to the ground like a lifeless toy when he draws a charge in the lane.

- According to a feature in HoopsHQ by Chris Dortch, Garcia shot a minimum of 500 3-pointers and up to 2,000 per day last summer. Over one particularily prolific month, Garcia hoisted 22,000 shots from beyond the arc.
- Since Aggie women's hoops coach Joni Taylor orchestrates an annual "Bike Build" campaign for local youths, there are often youth-sized bikes around Reed Arena. Occasionally, the lanky Garcia makes his entrance to practice or shootaround on a ridiculously tiny bike.

MANNY IN MARCH

Manny Obaseki's addition to the starting lineup on March 2, 2024 proved to be a boon to the Aggies' fortunes as they rolled five straight wins, including four away from Reed Arena, to solidify their place in the NCAA Tournament field.

- In fact, Obaseki's addition may have saved the Aggies' season since the team was mired in a five-game losing streak before he re-joined the starting lineup.
- His start on 3/2 marked his first return to the starting lineup since the NIT Championship game in 2022 -- a span of 63 games.
- Prior to 3/2, Obaseki had seen 20 or more minutes of action just three times and only once during SEC player (20 minutes vs. Tennessee).
- Averaged 16.5 points and hit 54.5% of his 3-point tries while starting the final eight games of the season

AGGIES NEVER QUIT

Under Buzz Williams, Texas A&M hoops has rallied from a 15-point or more deficit to at least a tie six times in the past two seasons, including twice already in 2024-25.

- The Aggies rallied from an 18-point hole on the road against No. 17 Oklahoma for an 80-78 win on 1/8 and from a 16-point deficit vs. Southern for a 71-54 win.
- The Aggies orchestrated the largest comeback for a win in school history last season when the Aggies rallied from 21 points down to beat lowa State, 73-69, in the ESPN Event Invitational.
- The Aggies rallied from a 21-point deficit against then No. 4 Houston on 12/16/23 to tie the game at 63-63 at the 1:30 mark, but the Cougars prevailed 70-66 at the Toyota Center in the Halal Guys Showcase.
- On the road against Arkansas on 1/16/2024, the Aggies found themselves in a 20-point hole with just over 6:00 remaining in the first half. Behind Wade Taylor IV's career-high 41 points, the Aggies rallied to take a one-point lead with :07 remaining but UA's Tramon Mark responded with a game-winner at the buzzer.
- Against No. 18 South Carolina, the Aggies used a 17-2 run to erase a 13-point deficit and take the lead with less than nine minutes remaining.
- The Aggies trailed Houston by as many as 13 points, and by 10 with 1:24 remaining, in their second round matchup in the 2024 NCAA Tournament, but rallied to force overtime on Andersson Garcia's buzzer-beating 3-pointer.

WILLIAMS VS. AP TOP 25

Head coach Buzz Williams has compiled a 17-20 record against AP Top 25 opponents in his six seasons at Texas A&M. Since March of 2022, Williams' Aggies are 16-11 vs. ranked opponents, which ranks No. 7 among all D1 teams in wins in that time span.

- Texas A&M's six ranked wins in 2024-25 are the the most in a single season in school history, supplanting the five by 1978-79 squad.
- The win over No. 15 Missouri (2/8) was the Aggies' sixth road win over a ranked opponent in the Buzz Williams era, which matches Texas A&M's number of ranked road wins in the 40 seasons before his arrival. The win also matched the highest-ranked road victory for the Aggies under Buzz (79-63 over No. 15 Auburn in 2023).
- Williams' 17 wins vs. AP Top 25 are already a school record, supplanting the 11 ranked victorires by Shelby Metcalf from 1963-90.
- With four AP top 6 wins, Williams is the only head coach in A&M history with more than two.
- The Aggies' win over No. 11 Purdue (Indianapolis) was the program's highest ranked regular season non-conference win since 2017.

GAMEDAY VIBES

 During gameday shoot-arounds, the Aggies traditionally vibe to The Commodores
 Pandora station on the team Turtlebox (founded by an Aggie) bluetooth speaker.

BIRTHDAY SHENANIGANS

 On player or staff member's birthdays, Williams honors the occasion with an emoji-filled tweet that always includes a wrong number of birthdays for the celebrator.

GETTING 'THE JUICE'

Prior to practices, the team draws into
a huddle at midcourt and Buzz Williams
distributes "The Juice" to the team, which
is actually simply hand sanitizer. Williams
has been distributing "The Juice" prior to
practices since his days at Marquette to
ward off the spread of germs in the winter
months.

TURKEYS AND SOCKS

- In Aggie Basketball vernacular, a "turkey" is when an opponent is held scoreless on three straight possessions. When the team has posted consecutive stops, the Aggie bench calls out "turkey, turkey" to implore the five on the floor to get another stop.
- Taking charges on defense is valued by Aggie Basketball, and the team rewards a charge taken by presenting a pair of socks to the charge taker from the special socks treasure chest.

CULTURE WALL

 After road game shoot-arounds, everyone on the trip gets on the court for a fun photo. If the Aggies win, the photo is posted on Williams' X and Instagram (@ teamcoachbuzz) and added to the "Culture Wall" in the locker room.

PROFESSOR BUZZ

 Always seeking to connect to young people, Williams co-taught a sport management class at Texas A&M last fall, after guest lecturing for a leadership education class the past two fall semesters. Williams also taught similar classes at Virginia Tech.

#GETBETTER EXPLAINED

#getBETTER is the mantra for Buzz Williams and his teams. It refers to "the continual improvement in all facets of life. Always finding something to work on, to make progress on. Never being satisfied. Always looking for ways to grow."



READING IS FUN

Buzz Williams is a voracious reader, generally completing 4-5 books every month. On Jan. 2, 2025, he tweeted from @TeamCoachBuzz his "2024 Reads" with a list of the 53 books he consumed in 2024. For the last 12 years, Williams has selected and gifted a book to every player, staff member and their family on the initial road trip of the season. Describing his commitment to reading, Williams said, "Who you are today and who you will be five years from today are the people you meet and the books that you read. Regardless of the genre of book that you read, they say it's worth five years of experience." (Source: @ AggieMBK/Dec. 16, 2023)

QUOTE SHIRTS

During the course of a season, Williams distributes 12 "Quote Shirts" to his players and staff that carry a life lesson or story behind its design for which the people within the men's basketball family can relate.

BEING THANKFUL

A staple of every road trip are the Aggies'
 Thank You letters. Each coach/player/staff
 member on the trip writes a Thank You letter to someone in their life at the first team meal of the roadie.

BUZZ'S BUNCH

"Buzz's Bunch" connects young people with special needs to the game of basketball with an invitation to a game in the fall and a summer clinic. Originally founded during William's time in Milwaukee, Wisconsin at Marquette, Buzz's Bunch continued during his time in Blacksburg, Virginia at Virginia Tech and now at Texas A&M. Every player, coach and staff member has been lucky to develop a relationship, learn and grown from these children as Buzz's Bunch has grown to more than 500 members spanning all three cities.

SHOOTING WITH BUZZ

"Shooting with Buzz" is a staple of the Aggies' practice regimen. As described by the Bryan-College Station Eagle: "Each player must move their way through 18 shooting spots - some straight catch and shoot and some off of movement - and make 7 of 10 shots. The clock starts after the player's first make and stops once the whole circuit is done. Managers rebound the shots and pass a ball to Williams, who stands near the player, handing the ball off for each shot. On the sideline, a manager stands in front of a giant white board, keeping tallies of the players score at each position. On the other side, a record book of times it took to complete the course are logged.

"I wanted to try to figure out a way, coming off of COVID and all the protocols and having, in essence, a completely revamped roster — how could I find some time working, while at the same time not screaming, while, in an unspoken way, they know I'm trying to invest in their life and in their game."




- Buzz Williams is in his sixth season as the head coach at Texas A&M and his 18th year as a collegiate head coach.
- Prior to being named head coach of the Aggies on April 3, 2019, Williams served as head coach at Virginia Tech (5 years, 2014-19), Marquette (6 years, 2008-14) and New Orleans (1 year, 2006-07).
- In addition to his head coaching stints, Williams served on staffs at Marquette (2007-08), Texas A&M (2004-06), Colorado State (2000-04), Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M-Kingsville (1998-99) and UTA (1994-98).
- Williams is one of a handful of Div. I head coaches to take three different programs to the "Big Dance." He's coached in 21 NCAA Tournament games and produced 11 victories, which rank No. 22 in both categories among active Div. I head coaches. For his age (52) and his number of years as a head coach (17), Williams is the active leader in total victories and ranks No. 2 in NCAA Tournament games and NCAA Tournament victories.

He received the nickname "Buzz" while working as an energetic student assistant for longtime Navarro Junior College coach and mentor Lewis Orr. Williams was inducted into the Navarro College Bulldog Hall of Fame in 2021 as the school honored Williams' climb from "floor maintenance manager" to head coach.



This is Williams' second stint at Texas A&M - he also served as assistant coach/recruiting coordinator on Billy Gillispie's first staff at Texas A&M from 2004-06.

Williams is one of the few NCAA Div. head coaches that did not play college basketball. Instead, he was a student/graduate assistant at Navarro JC and Oklahoma City University.



Williams was named the Associated Press SEC Coach of the Year in 2019-20 and again in 2022-23.

He has 10 NCAA Tournament appearances in 17 postseason opportunities as a head coach, including four career Sweet 16 appearances (3 at Marquette, 1 at Virginia Tech) and one Elite Eight appearance (2013 Marquette)

Williams has won 20-or-more games in 12 of his 17 seasons as a head coach and averages 20+ wins per season for his career. Williams' teams have suffered just two losing conference records.

His 52 combined wins in 2021-22 and 2022-23 were a program record for consecutive season victories, and the 73 wins over the past three seasons were the third-best three-year total in school history. The 73 wins were the fourth-most victories by an SEC program over the past three seasons.




