## RAZORBACK NOTABLES

>> The Arkansas Razorbacks are coming off a 3-1 win over Texas State in their season opener yesterday night. **Robyn Herron** earned the victory in the circle after striking out five and allowing just one unearned run on three hits during six innings of work. **Bri Ellis**, **Kailey Wyckoff** and **Ella McDowell** all hit solo home runs and Cam Harrison earned her first career save after striking out two and allowing no hits in her one inning pitched.

>> Under head coach Courtney Deifel the Razorbacks are 33-9 in opening-weekend games (since 2016).

>> Arkansas and Lipscomb will be meeting for the just the second time. The lone prior meeting between the programs came on Feb. 9, 2019 in Lake Charles, La.. Arkansas took the matchup 5-0.

>> Arkansas has won two of the last four regular-season SEC titles. The Razorbacks are coming off a 37-18 mark in 2024, which featured their seventh-consecutive NCAA Tournament berth and fifth national seed, all of which have come under head coach Courtney Deifel's guidance.

>> Arkansas returns a combined 266 starts from a year ago, highlighted by **1B Bri Ellis** and **CF Reagan Johnson** who started all 55 contests at their respective positions in 2024. Additionally **LF Raigan Kramer** and **C Kennedy Miller** both made 52 starts respectively a year ago. **P Robyn Herron** led all returning pitchers with 19 starts in 2024.

>> The Razorbacks have been ranked in the Top 25 of the NFCA Coaches poll for a program-best 72 consecutive weeks dating back to the start of the 2020 season. Arkansas is one of eight programs nationally to have appeared in the Top 25 of every NFCA Coaches Poll since the start of the 2020 season joining: Oklahoma, Florida, UCLA, Oklahoma State, Alabama, Florida State and Washington.

>> **Raigan Kramer** is a walk shy of entering the Arkansas All-Time Top 10 in career walks. She has 71 career walks and is coming off consecutive 30+ walk seasons.

>> **Bri Ellis** is one of the top sluggers in the nation entering the 2025 season. Her 49 career home runs are the second-most nationally among all active Division I players trailing only Shaylon Govan of Baylor (50).

**SAN MARCOS, Texas** - Behind six strong innings in the circle from Robyn Herron and solo home runs from Bri Ellis, Kailey Wyckoff and Ella McDowell, the No. 13/14 Arkansas Razorbacks defeated Texas State 3-1 in the season opener on Thursday night at Bobcat Softball Stadium.

Herron got the ball in the opener for the Razorbacks and made the most of it by striking out five and allowing just three hits in six innings of work to earn the win.

Freshman Cam Harrison earned a save in her collegiate debut by striking out two of the four batters she faced while allowing no hits in the bottom of the seventh inning.

Offensively, McDowell led the Razorbacks at the plate with a 2-3 night that included a single to right field in the top fourth inning and a solo home run to left field in the top of the sixth. In addition to the three long balls, Kennedy Miller singled and Alalyia Rijo reached base courtesy of a walk.

## POWER IN THE PORTAL

Since taking over the program in 2016, head coach Courtney Deifel and her coaching staff have had tremendous success in the recruitment of players through the transfer portal.

» Deifel has made 22 transfer portal additions during her time at Arkansas. Six Razorbacks on the 2025 roster arrived in Fayetteville by way of the transfer portal: Reis Beuerlein (2024, Mississippi State), Courtney Day (2025, Texas), Karlie Davison (2025, Utah), Bri Ellis (2024, Auburn), Carlee Ratcliff (2024, Texas) and Kailey Wyckoff (2025, Texas Tech).

Transfers under Courtney Deifel have accounted for:

- » 8 NFCA All-America selections
- » 14 NFCA All-Region honors
- » 12 All-SEC Selections
- » 1 SEC Player of the Year (*KB Sides*)
- » 1 SEC Pitcher of the Year (*Chenise Delce*)

» 11 of the 18 portal additions under Deifel that completed a season at Arkansas, experienced an increase in both wins and winning percentage in their first season as a Hog compared to their last at their previous program.

» 11 of the Razorbacks' 14 transfer position players set single-season career highs in at least one offensive statistical category while eight set single-season career highs in four or more offensive categories.

## BRI BOMBS

Bri Ellis is one of the most heralded sluggers in the nation in 2025.

- » Her 49 career home runs are the second most in a career among all active DI players, trailing only Shaylon Govan of Baylor (50).
- » Ellis hit a solo home run in her first at-bat of the season at Texas State on Feb. 6, 2025.
- » Led Arkansas in slugging percentage (.651), on-base percentage (.444), runs scored (36), home runs (14), RBI (47) and total bases (97) in 2024 while earning first-team SEC and NFCA All-Region honors and being named a Second-Team NFCA All-American.
- » She also posted a career-best .322 batting average and .444 on-base percentage.
- » Ellis became just the sixth Razorback since 2002 to record 10+ home runs, 30+ walks and 40+ RBI in a season in 2024, joining Rylin Hedgecock (2023), Taylor Ellsworth (2022), Braxton Burnside (2021), Nicole Schroeder (2017) and Sandra Smith (2008).
- » Became the first Razorback in program history to win SEC Player of the Week in back-to-back weeks on March 19, 2024.
- » Has homered in four consecutive games twice during her career, accomplishing the feat in 2022 and 2023 while at Auburn.
- » The Houston native hit .345 with runners in scoring position while driving in a team-high 19 runs with two outs. She also drove in a runner on third with less than two outs an astounding 88.9% of the time (8-9) and advanced runners in 55.9% of her at-bats.

## HOME SWEET BOGLE

Bogle Park was the place to be in 2024, as a program-record 97,744 fans walked through the gates. All 10 of Bogle Park's all-time top 10 single-game attendance marks were also set in 2024. Arkansas played in front of home crowds of 3,000+ in 21 of its 27 regular season games at Bogle Park.

- » Arkansas is just one of three programs to rank in the top five in single-season attendance every year since COVID, joining the likes of Alabama and LSU.
- » The Razorbacks have ranked in the top three nationally in total home attendance in back-to-back seasons and have finished in the top five in national total attendance in each of their past five seasons at Bogle Park.
- » On May 4, 2024, Arkansas broke its single-game attendance record, with 3,900 in attendance for game three vs. Ole Miss.
- » In 2024, the Hogs have accumulated the third-highest cumulative attendance across NCAA softball (89,982). Arkansas averaged 3,333 fans per game.
- » Bogle Park hosted the highest attended SEC Softball Tournament in 2023 with 16,937 in the stands May 9-13, shattering Florida's previous record of 13,201 in 2022.
- » Between the 2022 and 2023 campaigns, Bogle Park drew crowds of 3,000+ 16 separate times.



Arkansas' transfer portal class ranked No. 9 in the country, per DI Softball on Aug. 20, 2024, prior to the signing of Texas transfer and 2022 WCWS All-Tournament performer Courtney Day.

» Since its gates opened in 2009, Bogle Park has welcomed 456,428 fans through the turnstiles. Of those 456,428 fans 371,659 (81.42%) have come during head coach Courtney Deifel's tenure (2016-present).

» Bogle Park was recognized by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) as the Netting Professionals/NFCA DI Field of the Year in 2022.

## MILLER TIME

Sophomore catcher Kennedy Miller quickly established herself as one of the best freshmen in the country during the 2024 season.

- » Named a D1 Softball and Softball America Freshman All-American in addition to being named a Top-25 Finalist for the TUCCI/NFCA Freshman of the Year and earning NFCA First-Team All-South Region honors.
- » Miller started 52 games at catcher, batting .331 with 45 hits, eight home runs, five doubles, two triples, nine walks, 36 RBI and 23 runs scored. She finished second on the team in batting average and fourth on the team in home runs while ranking second on the team in multi-hit games (14) and recording eight multi-RBI games.
- » Her eight home runs were the most by an Arkansas freshman since Kacie Hoffman also belted eight in 2022.
- » Defensively, Miller committed only one error behind the plate in 310 chances for a .997 fielding percentage while also throwing out five would-be base stealers
- » Earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors on March 19 after putting up a .545/1.091/.545 slash line across four games and paced the Hogs in hits with six and home runs with two. The Georgetown, Texas, product was flawless behind the plate with 18 putouts, three assists and no errors. Miller recorded her second career multi-home run outing in game two against Auburn, smashing a two-run home run in the first and a solo home run in the fourth.

## THE HEAD HOG

Head coach Courtney Deifel became the program's all-time wins leader in 2023 when Arkansas defeated No. 22 Louisiana 7-6 on Feb. 18. Deifel bested former Razorback head coach Carrie Dever-Boaz's (1997-2004) 244 career wins at helm. Deifel hit 300 career wins at Arkansas following the Hogs' doubleheader sweep of Auburn on March 16.

» Deifel has won 316 games through 10 seasons at the helm in Fayetteville. In the previous nine years before Deifel, Arkansas only won 234 contests. From 2003-2015 (13 seasons), Arkansas had only won 321 games.

» Since Deifel's hiring the Razorbacks' 316 wins rank ninth among all SEC schools during that timespan (OU and Texas not included). In the 10 years prior to Deifel, Arkansas posted 260 wins which ranked 12th among the 13 SEC members.

## PRESEASON PRESENCE

» Senior first baseman Bri Ellis and junior utility star Kailey Wyckoff garnered many preseason honors ahead of the 2025 season.

» Both were named preseason All-SEC in a vote by the league's coaches on Jan. 30. They also were named Preseason Top 100 players by both Softball America and D1Softball.

» Wyckoff earned Preseason Second-Team All-America honors from D1Softball at the utility position.

## THE FRIENDLY CONFINES

» Since 2017, Arkansas is 151-41 (.787) at Bogle Park during the regular season.

» Arkansas is 180-71 (.717) at Bogle Park since Courtney Deifel took over the program in 2016.

## MEUCHEL IS MASTER OF DEFENSE

» Assistant Coach Matt Meuchel joined the Razorbacks' coaching staff prior to the 2017 season and completed his eighth season in Fayetteville in 2024. Meuchel is one of the sport's leaders in analytics and also coordinates the Razorbacks defense. All five of the Hogs' top-five single-season fielding percentages have come under his watch.

» In 2024, Meuchel and assistant coach Danielle Gibson helped guide Arkansas to a program-record .978 fielding percentage which led the SEC and ranked ninth nationally.

## SOOIE SPINNERS

» Arkansas has registered 31 shutouts since the start of the 2023 seasons. The Razorbacks are one of only nine programs to rank in the top 20 nationally in shutouts in 2023 and 2024 joining the likes of Oklahoma, Boston, Oklahoma State, Tennessee, Stanford, Alabama, South Dakota State and Cal State Fullerton.

» Arkansas ranked 19th nationally in shutouts in 2024 with 14 and 17th nationally in 2023 with 17.

» The Razorbacks have posted 11+ shutouts in each of the last four seasons, one of just 16 programs nationally to accomplish the feat.

## BOGLE BOMBERS

The long ball has been a staple in the success of Arkansas Softball during the Courtney Deifel era (2016-present).

» Arkansas has hit 534 home runs since Deifel took over the helm in 2016 which accounts for 49.5% of home runs in program history. In the 10 years prior to Deifel's arrival Arkansas teams belted 437 round trippers.

» The Razorbacks' 522 home runs since 2017 rank second among SEC members during that time span and third among current SEC members trailing only Oklahoma (855) and Georgia (584).

» Six of the Hogs' single-season top-10 home run marks have been accomplished during Deifel's tenure, including the three best in program history (2022: 109, 2021: 95, 2023: 69).

» The Razorbacks' program record 109 home runs in 2022 were the second-most by a team in a single-season in SEC history.

» Arkansas is just 22 home runs away from its 1,100th in program history.

## ROAD HOGS

Since 2020, the Razorbacks have excelled on the road with a record of 57-19 (.750) which is the second-best mark of all current SEC members, trailing only Oklahoma (65-6, .915).

» With Arkansas' road series victory at No. 7 LSU on April 26-28, 2024, the Hogs have won 15 of their last 16 SEC road series which is the best mark among all SEC members during that time span (2021-present).

» From 1997-2020, the program had only won 17 SEC road series. Over the last four seasons, Arkansas has won 15 conference road series to go along with two SEC Titles.

» The Hogs recorded two top-10 ranked SEC road series wins last season and have accounted for three top-10 road series wins in league play over the past three seasons.

» Additionally, Arkansas has posted a 67-27 (.713) record in the Courtney Deifel era (2016-present) in neutral site games.

## ELITE 8

» The Razorbacks have been ranked in the Top 25 of the NFCA Coaches poll for a program-best 72 consecutive weeks dating back to the start of the 2020 season. Arkansas is one of eight programs nationally to have appeared in the Top 25 of every NFCA Coaches Poll since the start of the 2020 season joining: Oklahoma, Florida, UCLA, Oklahoma State, Alabama, Florida State and Washington.



## STACKED SLATE

» Arkansas is scheduled to face 12 teams that advanced to the 2024 NCAA Tournament this season, including seven super regional participants, three College World Series participants and four-time defending national champion Oklahoma.

## RAES

» Reagan Johnson enters her junior season as the all-time program leader in career batting average at .379 while ranking sixth in career on-base percentage (.420), ninth in career triples (5) and 10th in career stolen bases (30).

» Johnson enters the 2025 season as one of six active Division I players with 73+ hits in each of the previous two seasons, joining D'Auna Jennings (Duke), Kendra Falby (Florida), Korbe Otis (Florida), Mia Scott (Texas) and Paige Rocha (SIU-Edwardsville). Of the six players to accomplish the feat, Johnson and Jennings are the only non-seniors entering the 2025 season.

» Johnson is the only Razorback in program history with multiple 70+ hit seasons courtesy of 73 in 2024 and 79 in 2023. In 2024 she became one of four Razorbacks in program history to post an on-base percentage of .426 or better while registering 70+ hits in a season, joining Danielle Gibson (2022), KB Sides (2022) and Hannah McEwen (2019).

» She earned First-Team All-SEC and NFCA First-Team All-South Region in 2024 after batting a team-best .380 with 73 hits, four doubles, one triple, 11 RBI, 35 runs scored and 79 total bases to go along with a team-high 12 stolen bases. She ranked fourth in the SEC and 33rd nationally in hits (73) in addition to ranking fifth among all SEC players in batting average (.380).

» Her sophomore year batting average of .380 and her freshman year average of .378 rank sixth and seventh respectively in the Arkansas single-season record books while her 79 hits as a freshman and 73 hits as a sophomore were the third and fourth-most by a Hog in a single season.

» She batted a team-best .388 (66-170) against right-handed pitchers in 2024 and leads all active Razorbacks with multiple seasons in Fayetteville with an average of .385 (139-361) against right-handers.

» Johnson owns a career batting average of .423 (33-78) with runners in scoring position, posting averages of .438 (14-32) and .413 (19-46) in 2024 and 2023 respectively.

» Johnson is 30-32 in stolen base attempts during her career and is just three stolen bases away from moving into a tie for ninth all-time in program history.

» The Karnes City, Texas product checked in at No. 73 overall and ranked 27th among outfielders in the Softball America Preseason Top 100 Players List on Jan. 6.



## MILESTONE TRACKER

- >> The Razorbacks are 22 home runs away from 1,100 all-time.
- >> Raigan Kramer is a walk away from entering the Arkansas all-time top ten with 71.
- >> Reagan Johnson needs three stolen bases to move into a tie for the ninth most all-time by a Razorback in their collegiate career.
- >> Bri Ellis is one home run shy of 50 for her career. She would become the third Razorback player to reach 50 career home runs joining Linnie Malkin (50), Danielle Gibson (60). Malkin is the only player in program history to hit all 50+ home runs as a Razorback.

## MISS VERSATILITY

- Arkansas continued its multi-year run of major portal additions in the summer of 2024 with the addition of Texas Tech Transfer Kailey Wyckoff.
- >> In her Arkansas debut at Texas State, Wyckoff blasted a solo home run to right field in the top of the sixth inning.
  - >> During her two seasons at Texas Tech Wyckoff appeared all over the field for the Red Raiders with nine or more starts at five different positions. She appeared in 51 games at catcher, 24 games in right field, 12 games in left field, 10 games at designated player and nine games at first base.
  - >> Her career batting average of .400 ranks fourth among all players with multiple seasons of collegiate playing experience at the Power 4 level and 15th nationally among all Division I players.
  - >> Wyckoff has garnered a plethora of preseason recognition from numerous publications. She was named a Top 100 player from both D1 Softball and Softball America. On Jan. 22 she was named a Preseason Second-Team All-American at the utility position from D1 Softball and was ranked as the No. 3 utility player in the D1 Softball position rankings.
  - >> In 2024 she posted a .407 batting average with 12 doubles, seven home runs and a career-high 35 RBI to earn First-Team All-Big 12 honors. She also recorded 15 multi-hit games and a team-best 24-game reached base streak.
  - >> As a true freshman in 2023 she became just the second individual conference award winner in Texas Tech history along with earning Second-Team All-Big 12 recognition. She hit .393 with a .740 slugging percentage thanks to 17 doubles, nine home runs, five triples and 31 RBI. She also posted 14 multi-hit games with 10 multi-RBI games.

## HOGS HAVE A DAY

- Arkansas finalized its 2024 roster with the addition of Texas transfer Courtney Day on Dec. 9, 2024.
- >> Day initially transferred to Ole Miss following the 2023 season but did not play.
  - >> She is the third Razorback to transfer from Texas in program history, joining Taylor Ellsworth (2021) and Carlee Ratcliff (2023), who was Day's roommate at Texas in 2022.
  - >> During her four seasons in Austin (2020-23), Day posted a .317 batting average and .395 on-base percentage with 120 hits, 22 doubles, two triples, 26 home runs, 63 runs scored, 44 walks and 91 RBI through 176 games played. She has registered 23 multi-hit games and 24 multi-RBI games during her collegiate career.
  - >> A native of Pearland, Texas, Day appeared

primarily at first base and designated player during her time at Texas, in addition to pitching. Day owned a 2.45 earned run average and 47 strikeouts in 68.2 innings pitched while with the Longhorns.

## YOUTHFUL RAZORBACKS

- Arkansas has eight true freshman on the roster in 2025 which is tied for the second-most in the Courtney Deifel era, tying the 2017 team and trailing only the 2023 squad which had nine true freshman on the roster.
- >> The freshman class of Payton Burnham, Ava Carter, Cam Harrison, Lexi King, Ella McDowell, Jayden Ramos, Ashtyn Reichardt and Ramsey Walker was ranked as the fifth-best class in the country according to Extra-Inning Softball.

## HOGS OUTHITTING THE OPPOSITION

- Outhitting the opposition has been a major trademark in the Courtney Deifel era (2016-present) for Arkansas.
- >> The Razorbacks hold a 249-25 record when outhitting opponents under Deifel, including a 148-8 mark since 2020.

## ROB CAN SPIN IT

- Robyn Herron enters 2025 looking to build off an impressive sophomore campaign a year ago.
- >> Herron appeared in 29 games while making 19 starts and posting a 12-9 record with a team-best 143 strikeouts in 125.1 innings pitched. Her 1.62 ERA ranked 25th nationally and third among SEC pitchers. She also ranked 40th nationally with five shutouts during the 2024 season while posting three 10+ strikeout games.
  - >> She is one of just seven returning pitchers nationally who ranked in the Top 25 in ERA and Top 40 in shutouts during the 2024 season, joining Nijaree Canady (Texas Tech), Maddia Groff (Omaha), Karlyn Pickens (Tennessee), Kasey Ricard (Boston), Alivia Wilken (North Alabama) and Isabella Smith (Oklahoma).
  - >> Herron became the second pitcher in program history to throw a seven-inning perfect game while striking out a season-high 11 batters on just 86 pitches in a 7-0 win over Illinois State on Feb. 24, 2024, joining Mary Haff as the other Razorback to accomplish the feat
  - >> Her eight 10+ strikeout games are the third-most in program history trailing only Katy Henry (2005-08, 14) and Mary Haff (2018-22, 16).
  - >> Herron ranked in the Top 10 in the Arkansas single-season program record books in 2024 in multiple categories including: opponent batting average against (.171, 2nd), shutouts (5, T-10th) and strikeouts/7 IP (7.99, 5th).

## CLOUD IS CLUTCH

Junior INF Rylee Cloud delivered when called upon in pinch hit situations during the 2024 season.

- >> Cloud batted .300 (3-10) as a pinch hitter in 2024 which was the best average by a Razorback in pinch hit situations since 2022 (Min. of 5 AB).
- >> She collected a hit as a pinch hitter in back-to-back games in 2024 against Omaha and Arizona on Feb. 17.

## BATTLING AT THE PLATE

- >> In hitting coach DJ Gasso's first season in Fayetteville, Arkansas struck out a program-low (COVID season not included) 192 times in 1,408 at-bats during the regular season bettering the previous program record of 204 which was set in 2014 by 12. Additionally, Arkansas had a program record strikeout percentage of 0.1.

## KEEP THE LINE MOVING

- >> Arkansas advanced runners in 50.3% of its at-bats during the 2024 season.
- >> Bri Ellis led all returning Razorbacks advancing a runner in 56% of her at-bats a year ago.
- >> Since 2021, Arkansas has advanced runners in 50.4% (1,737-3,448) of opportunities.

- >> To follow the Razorbacks from Fayetteville to every game/series this season you would travel approximately 10,212.2 miles round trip. The farthest trip on the slate is the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic in Cathedral City, Calif., which is located 1,455.3 miles from Fayetteville.

- >> Arkansas Freshman Payton Burnham, Cam Harrison, Ella McDowell and Ramsey Walker were all selected to the D1 Softball D100 Freshman Watch List (Jan. 8) and were all named to the Softball America Freshman Watch List (Jan. 14)

## THE LEGEND OF JIMMY

- Senior OF Raigan Kramer has one of the more unique nicknames in college softball, since before arriving in Fayetteville, Kramer is known as Jimmy to her teammates and coaches.
- >> "I tried out for a team in 2018 and the coaches didn't know who I was," Kramer said in a 2020 interview. "All they knew was that I was #99. Supposedly, they knew someone who was #99 named Jimmy that they used to play men's fast-pitch with. From then on out that's who I was. It just stuck. I'm almost positive some of the younger girls that were in our organization have no idea that my name is not actually Jimmy."
  - >> The Topeka, Kan., native is one of the most experienced Razorback on the team with 142 games played and 113 career starts in her Arkansas career.
  - >> Kramer is one of the most disciplined hitters in program history and currently enters the 2025 season ranked 11th in program history in career walks with 71. She is one walk shy of moving into 10th all-time in the career walks category of the Arkansas record books.
  - >> She is one of 10 active players nationally entering the 2025 season having registered 32+ walks in each of the previous two seasons.
  - >> Kramer joins Devon Wallace (2011-2014) as the only player to draw 30 or more walks in back-to-back seasons with 32 walks in 2024 and 39 walks in 2023.

### KATY CONNECTION

>> Kailey Wyckoff, Cam Harrison and Ashtyn Reichardt all prepped at Katy High School in Katy, Texas. It marks the first time since 2010 that the Razorbacks have had three players on the roster that all attended the same high school. The only other trio to all attended the same high school and play together at Arkansas was Tori Mort, Brit-tany Robison and Jessica Robison who all attend-ed Owasso High School in Owasso, Okla.

### RAZORBACKS REPRESENTING THE USA

Arkansas freshmen Ella McDowell and Cam Harrison helped guide the U.S. U-18 Women's National Team (WNT) to a first-place finish in the World Baseball Softball Confederation (WBSC) U-18 World Cup Group C Stage Event as team USA posted a perfect 6-0 record on Aug. 29-Sept. 2, 2024 in their final action as U-18 team members.

>> McDowell was named the most outstanding player of the event after posting an impressive .733 batting average and .750 on-base percentage with 11 hits, two doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, and a walk. The Richmond, Texas native also posted a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage with two putouts and eight assists while playing third base. McDowell led all players in the event in five statistical categories, including batting average (.733), home runs (2), on-base percentage (.750), slugging percentage (1.267) and on-base plus slugging percentage (2.017).

>> Harrison was dominant in her two outings in the circle, posting a 1.00 earned run average with four strikeouts and three hits allowed in seven innings pitched. She picked up a six-inning complete-game victory in a 9-1 win over Canada on Aug. 30., striking out two and allowing just three hits. The Katy, Texas, product followed up her complete game with a 1-2-3 inning of relief that featured two strikeouts in a 7-0 win over the Philippines on Sept. 1.

### KEEP 'EM IN THE YARD

>> Arkansas has limited opponents to no home runs in 290 games during the Courtney Deifel era (2016-present) which accounts for 60.2% of all games during Deifel's tenure. In the 290 games in which Arkansas has not allowed a home run they have posted a record of 226-65 (.777).

### NO FREE PASSES

>> Arkansas is 135-40 since 2001 when its pitching staff issues no walks in a game.

>> The Razorbacks are 80-17 when issuing no walks under head coach Courtney Deifel (2016-present).

>> Arkansas is currently on a 10-game winning streak when issuing zero walks dating back to April 6, 2023. It is the second-longest winning streak when accomplishing the feat in program

history. The program record 13-game winning streak was accomplished from 2012-14.

>> In the past 20 years Arkansas has had a pitcher throw 5+ innings in a single game without allowing a walk 25 times. When the feat is accomplished Arkansas owns a record 19-6. Arkansas was 3-0 last year when accomplishing the feat courtesy of a pair of wins from Robyn Herron and a win from Morgan Leinstock.

### 10K WILL PLAY

>> Arkansas is 75-10 all-time when an individual pitcher records 10+ strikeouts in a single game.

>> Under Deifel (2016-present), Arkansas is 35-3 when an individual pitcher registers 10+ strikeouts in a game.

>> Robyn Herron leads all current Razorbacks with eight games of 10+ strikeouts.

### HAVING FUN WITH MULTIPLE HOME RUNS

>> Arkansas is 54-7 all-time when a Razorback player hits multiple home runs in a single game, including a 39-2 mark in the Courtney Deifel era.

>> The Razorbacks are on a 30-game win streak when having a player hit multiple home runs in a single game, dating back to Feb. 20, 2021, when Linnie Malkin started the streak by belting a solo home run and a two-run shot in a 6-4 14-inning win at McNeese. Malkin's two-run homer in the top of the 14th ended up accounting for the winning runs in the victory.

- >> Freshman infielder Ella McDowell wasted no time making her presence known as a Razorback.
- >> In a season-opening 3-1 win at Texas State, McDowell led Arkansas at the plate by going 2-3 with a solo home run in the sixth inning.
- >> Her home run accounted the Razorbacks' 6,600th run in program history.
- >> She became the first Razorback freshman to homer on opening day since Rylin Hedgecock accomplished the feat on Feb. 7, 2020 during a 10-0 win over UTEP in Las Cruces, New Mexico.

## RAMBO READY FOR IMPACT

- Nicknamed Rambo, Freshman Ramsey Walker arrived in Fayetteville as one of the top prep sluggers in the country.
- >> Walker prepped at Calvary Baptist Academy in Shreveport, La., where she led the Lady Cavaliers to four-straight 2A State Championships and was named Louisiana State Player of the Year in 2022 and 2024.
  - >> Her 44 home runs she hit as a senior and a junior were the most nationally in that timespan according to MaxPreps.
  - >> In 2024, Walker was named a MaxPreps All-American after batting .575 with 23 home runs, 68 RBI and 41 extra-base hits as a senior. Her 23 home runs ranked fifth nationally.
  - >> As a junior in 2023, she batted .500 with 21 round trippers, 55 RBI, 17 doubles and two triples. Her 21 home runs ranked 25th nationally.

## EIGHT IS GREAT

- >> Arkansas is 197-3 when scoring eight or more runs since 2002, including a 131-1 mark during the Courtney Deifel era (2016-present).

- >> 1B Bri Ellis and OF Raigan Kramer became the seventh pair of Arkansas teammates in the past 20 years to register 30+ walks in the same season in 2024.

- >> Arkansas has posted a 180-20 overall record when registering 10 or more hits in a single game since 2006, including a 107-11 mark under Courtney Deifel.
- >> The Razorbacks posted a 9-1 record in 2024 when registering 10+ hits and have won 60 of their past 63 contests when accomplishing the feat since 2020.

- >> Freshman Cam Harrison picked up her first career save in her Razorback debut in the season opener at Texas State (Feb. 6).

# COURTNEY DEIFEL

## HEAD COACH

**Career: 342-192 (10 Seasons)**

**Arkansas: 315-165 (9 Seasons)**

Courtney Deifel became the fourth head coach in program history when she was hired on June 11, 2015, and recently completed her ninth season at Arkansas in 2024. In her nine seasons in Fayetteville, she has orchestrated the Razorbacks' return to postseason play and guided the program to two SEC regular season championships, one SEC Tournament crown and seven NCAA Tournament appearances, which includes seven consecutive berths from 2017-24. The Hogs have qualified for the national tournament every year it has been held since 2017. Deifel led the program to its first NCAA Tournament Super Regional appearances in 2018, 2021 and 2022. Since her first season in 2016, the Razorbacks have been ranked 99 times in the NFCA Coaches' Poll after previously being ranked only once in program history. 13 of the program's 14 NFCA All-American awards and 78 Easton/NFCA All-America Scholar-Athlete accolades have been accumulated under Deifel since 2016. Deifel - the program's all-time wins leader - enters the 2025 season with 315 career wins at Arkansas. Deifel has logged four 40-win seasons while at Arkansas, including three consecutive 40-win seasons from 2021-23. Prior to her arrival in Fayetteville, Arkansas recorded only two 40-win seasons across 19 years. Heading into her 10th season at helm in 2025, Arkansas has won two of the last three SEC regular season crowns.

In 2024, Deifel led the Razorbacks to a 37-18 mark (14-10 SEC), and a No. 12 national seed in the NCAA tournament, the fifth in program history, all of which have come under Deifel's watch. The NCAA tournament appearance was a program record seventh-straight, dating back to the 2017 season. Deifel won her 300th career game with a 5-1 win at Auburn on March 16, 2024, completing a doubleheader sweep over the Tigers. Under Deifel's guidance, first baseman Bri Ellis (Second Team) and right-handed pitcher Morgan Leinstock (Third Team) earned NFCA All-America honors. Leinstock posted a 2.14 ERA and a 13-6 record while striking out 137 batters in 140.2 innings pitched. Deifel's and the Razorbacks' success in the transfer portal continued into 2024 as Ellis led the team with 14 home runs, 47 RBI, 97 total bases and a .651 slugging percentage while posting a .322 batting average with 48 hits after transferring from Auburn. Freshman Kennedy Miller earned Freshman All-America honors from DI Softball and was a Finalist for the TUCCI/NFCA Freshman of the Year award after breaking onto the scene by hitting .331 with eight home runs and 36 RBI. Behind the plate, Miller posted a .997 fielding percentage while throwing out five would-be base stealers. Ellis and Leinstock received All-SEC selections along with center fielder Reagan Johnson and second baseman Cylie Halvorson. Additionally Ellis and third baseman Hannah Gammill were named to the SEC All-Defensive Team.

In the 2023 campaign, Deifel led Arkansas to another highly successful season and the program's sixth consecutive NCAA appearance - the longest streak in program history. Finishing 40-19 (14-10 SEC), Arkansas claimed its third straight 40-win season and a top-four SEC finish. Earning the No. 11 national seed in the NCAA Tournament, all four of the program's national seeds have been accumulated under Deifel. In Arkansas' 7-6 win vs. No. 22 Louisiana on Feb. 18, Deifel became the

program's all-time wins leader after surpassing Carrie Dever-Boaz's (1997-2004) 244 wins at helm. Under Deifel's leadership, two Razorbacks received NFCA All-America recognition in 2023 - Rylin Hedgecock (NFCA First-Team All-America) and Chenise Delce (NFCA Second-Team All-America). Delce became the program's first two-time NFCA All-American pitcher after collecting the honor in 2022. Six Hogs claimed NFCA All-Region status - Chenise Delce, Cylie Halvorson, Reagan Johnson and Rylin Hedgecock were named to the All-South Region First Team, Raigan Kramer was tabbed to the second team and Lauren Camenzind was selected to the third team. Delce had another breakout season in the circle, posting a 21-11 record and 2.02 ERA with 193 strikeouts, 17 complete games, six solo shutouts and four saves while limiting opponents to a .200 batting average. The 2022 SEC Pitcher of the Year, Delce picked up where she left off in 2023. The Oklahoma City product charted the fourth-most strikeouts (193) and saves by an SEC pitcher this year. She also filed the third-most wins by a league pitcher. Illustrating why she's a force in the circle, 11 of her victories came against ranked competition. True freshman Reagan Johnson excelled at the plate and in center field, earning a spot on DI Softball's Freshman All-America team and being honored as a Top 10 Finalist for NFCA/TUCCI's National Freshman of the Year award. Johnson peppered the third-most hits (79) in single-season program history. She also boasted the sixth-highest batting average (.378) along with tying for the seventh-most stolen bases (18) and 10th-most runs scored (47) in single-season program history. Johnson also paced Arkansas with 24 multi-hit outings this season. The Karnes City, Texas, native ranked second in the SEC and eighth nationally in hits. Johnson also shined in center field and compiled a .968 fielding percentage with 86 putouts and four assists on 93 total chances.

In 2022, Deifel guided the Razorbacks to their most successful season in school history, collecting back-to-back SEC regular season titles, headlined by the program's first outright regular season crown, and the program's first SEC Tournament championship after blanking Missouri, 4-0, in Gainesville, Fla., on May 13. Arkansas concluded the season with the most single-season wins in program history and a 48-11 record, marking a program-record .814 win percentage. Arkansas finished SEC play with a 19-5 record, producing the second consecutive 19-win conference season for the Hogs. Against Missouri State on March 3, Deifel became just the second head coach in program history to reach 200 career wins. The Hogs made their 11th NCAA Tournament appearance, earning the program's highest overall seed (No. 4) and hosted their second straight Super Regional. The Razorbacks hosted the highest attended Regional and Super Regional in the NCAA in 2022. The Razorbacks tabbed an SEC-best 12 all-conference honors and a school-record five NFCA All-American nods to round out yet another enormous postseason awards haul. Arkansas became the first SEC program since 2006 to have four first team all-Americans. Danielle Gibson (first team) became the program's first two-time NFCA All-American while KB Sides (first team), Linnie Malkin (first team), Hannah Gammill (first team) and Chenise Delce (second team) earned their first All-American honors. For the first time in program history, all

eight NFCA All-Region nominees secured spots on All-South Region teams. Deifel was named SEC Coach of the Year for the second straight season while KB Sides became the program's its first-ever SEC Player of the Year honor and Chenise Delce earned the Hogs' second consecutive SEC Pitcher of the Year accolade after Mary Haff collected the award in 2021. Arkansas tabbed a league-best 12 all-conference honors and eight NFCA All-Region distinctions to round out an enormous postseason awards haul. The 2022 coaching staff was named the NFCA's South Region Staff of the Year for the second straight season.

Deifel, the SEC Coach of the Year, directed the most successful year in program history in 2021 by claiming the school's first SEC regular season title and hosting NCAA Tournament Super Regionals for the first time. The team finished 43-11 (19-5 SEC), producing a then-school record .796 win percentage. The Hogs earned a No. 6 national ranking, the highest in program history, and captured the No. 6 national seed in the NCAA Tournament. Arkansas began conference play winning 12 straight games, notching the fifth-best league-only start in SEC history. A 19-game winning streak in non-conference action also set a school record. The Razorbacks received many postseason superlatives as infielders Braxton Burnside and Danielle Gibson, and pitcher Mary Haff were named NFCA All-Americans. Haff also took home the school's first SEC Pitcher of the Year award. Offensively, the Razorbacks shattered the school's single-season home run record, mashing 95 long balls with Burnside setting the individual single-season program mark hitting 25. Deifel's 216 wins in Fayetteville rank second among all coaches in program history. The NFCA named the 2021 coaching staff the South Region's Staff of the Year.

Deifel guided the Razorbacks to a 19-6 (1-2 SEC) record in the COVID-19 shortened 2020 campaign. In the only league series of the season, the Razorbacks earned a 1-0 conference-opening victory, their first road win over Alabama since 2000. Arkansas remained in the national polls throughout the year and climbed from a pre-season No. 24 ranking to the No. 19 slot in the final release of the NFCA Coaches' Poll. Junior catcher Kayla Green was honored with SEC Player of the Week recognition for the first time in her career and freshman pitcher Jenna Bloom emerged as one of the rising stars in the league, leading all freshmen in the nation striking out 10.9 hitters per seven innings.

Deifel led the Razorbacks to their third consecutive post-season appearance in 2019, earning an at-large bid to the Stillwater Regional. The Hogs finished the season 38-20 and 12-12 in SEC play. It marks the first time since 1999-00 that the Razorbacks finished the season .500 or better in conference play in back-to-back seasons. The Razorbacks garnered their highest in-season ranking during weeks one and two, coming in at 12th and 11th in the NFCA and ESPN polls respectively.

Arkansas saw two players named to the All-SEC teams, pitcher Autumn Storms was named second team and outfielder Hannah McEwen garnered first-team recognition. McEwen's first-team selection was the first for Arkansas since 2012 and only the second in program history. In year four under Coach Deifel, the Razorbacks also earned two SEC Player of the Week awards, three SEC Pitcher of the Week awards, and one USA Softball Co-Player of the Week. A record five Razorbacks were named to the NFCA All-Region teams, with Storms garnering the first, first-team selection of her career. Storms went on to be named NFCA Second Team All-American as a pitcher, the first Razorback since 2010.

Year four with Coach Deifel and the Razorback staff saw growth in all aspects as the game, including a team .288 batting average, which ranks second-highest in program record book. In fact, four of the top seven team batting averages in program history come from the Deifel era.

In the 2018 campaign, Arkansas wrapped up the year with a 42-17 (12-12 SEC) record, the third most wins in program history; and the most victories since 2000. The team earned a national seed (13) in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history and went 3-0 defeating DePaul and Wichita State twice to earn the Fayetteville Regional Championship on its home field. The Hogs made their first ever NCAA Super Regional appearance but fell to eventual national semifinalist, Oklahoma, in Norman. Arkansas finished 17th in the final NCAA RPI report and the coaching staff earned 2018 NFCA Division I South Region Staff of the Year.

Just two seasons removed from a one-win conference tally, Deifel guided the Razorbacks to a 12-12 mark in SEC play. As the No. 7 seed at SEC Tournament, the program made its first semifinal appearance since 2001. The Razorbacks finished the season with a 27-2 record on their home field, establishing a new program record for home wins in a single season. Part of Arkansas' home triumphs included the program's first three-game sweep of a ranked team (No. 20 Mississippi State) and its first-ever series win over Alabama.

Deifel piloted the 2017 Razorbacks to a 31-24 record and the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2013. The Razorbacks improved their win total by 17 games from the previous season, marking the largest increase in the country among Power 5 programs. Arkansas also tallied seven wins in SEC play, equaling the combined total from the previous three seasons. In recognition of the team's performance, Deifel was named the 2017 DISOftballNews Coach of the Year.

From year one to two under Deifel, Arkansas' pitching staff

lowered its combined ERA by more than four runs (6.98 to 2.82) and added more than 20 points to its batting average (.260 to .284). The Razorbacks also led the SEC and tied for 17th in the NCAA with 59 home runs. During the year, Arkansas earned its first national ranking since 2013 when it was slotted at No. 24 in the March 7 release ESPN/USA Softball poll.

Individually, Deifel saw two Razorbacks earn NFCA All-South Region accolades with Nicole Schroeder and Autumn Storms earning second-team and third-team honors, respectively. Storms was also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team while A.J. Belans was voted to the All-SEC Second Team. Schroeder went on to be drafted by the Akron Racers as the program's second NPF selection.

Deifel's first win over a ranked team at Arkansas came during the 2016 season when the Razorbacks knocked off No. 23 Nebraska, 11-10, during the Easton Tournament in Fullerton, Calif.; the team added five ranked wins in 2017. The 2016 campaign also saw newcomer Ashley Diaz make an immediate impact as a member of the NFCA All-South Region Second Team and garnered NFCA National Freshman of the Year Top 25 Watch List recognition.

During her playing and coaching careers prior to coming to Arkansas, Deifel advanced to 11 NCAA Tournaments including a four-year run to the Women's College World Series (WCWS) as an All-American catcher at California that was highlighted by winning the 2002 national title. The Bears also finished second (2003), fifth (2001) and seventh (2000) at the WCWS over her four-year run. Her postseason successes also featured a pair of Super Regionals as a graduate assistant at Oklahoma and five NCAA Regionals as an assistant at Maryland and Louisville.

As a first-year head coach, Deifel ushered in a culture of change for Maryland in 2015. Along with the program's 16-game improvement from the previous season, the Terrapins' offense show tremendous growth. Maryland finished 27th in the NCAA with 6.28 runs per game behind 339 runs scored, up more than 150 runs from 2014. Deifel also led her team to a .309 batting average, a 40-point jump from 2014 which also ranked 57th in the NCAA.

Individually, Deifel guided three players to all-conference accolades and a pair of NFCA all-region honors. Lindsey Schmeister was an All-Big Ten first team performer while Shannon Bustillos and Erin Pronobis landed on the All-Big Ten second team. Pronobis and Corey Schwartz were also named to the NFCA All-Midwest Region Third Team. Under Deifel's watch, the trio helped Maryland to single-season school records in doubles, home runs, RBI and walks.

Prior to taking the head job at Maryland, Deifel spent four seasons as an assistant coach at Louisville in which she helped the Cardinals to four NCAA appearances, the 2014 American Athletic Conference Tournament title and an overall record of 176-60 (.746). Louisville averaged 44 wins in that time with a program-record 55 wins in 2012. Her student-athletes at Lou-

isville racked up four NFCA All-America certificates and 29 all-conference selections.

She also spent two seasons as a graduate assistant at Oklahoma where she was a member of a staff that guided the 2008 Sooners to a 47-14 record and a Super Regional appearance.

As a player, Deifel was the starting catcher for California from 2000-03 and led the Golden Bears to four Women's College World Series appearances including a national championship run in 2002 and national runner-up showing in 2003. She appeared in 285 games missing just three behind the plate over her four seasons. As a four-year starter behind the plate, she was a 2003 All-American, two-time All-Pac 10 selection and caught seven no-hitters. She is still the program's career leader with 1,969 putouts.

Aside from her accomplishments in collegiate softball, Deifel had a successful professional career following her days at Cal. In 2004, she helped the NY/NJ Juggernaut to the National Professional Fastpitch (NPF) league title. Deifel also spent three years with LeoPalace21 in Japan that resulted in a runner-up showing and a pair of third-place finishes.

She graduated from California in 2003 with a bachelor of arts in American Business and Globalism and American Studies. Deifel earned her master's of arts in Human Relations from Oklahoma in 2008.

Deifel's sister, Amanda Scott, is currently the head softball coach at Missouri-St. Louis and won a Women's College World Series title at Fresno State in 1998.

Deifel and her husband Joe are the parents of two sons, Trip and Walt. The family resides in Fayetteville.
