LEADING OFF

- The 2025 season is the 52nd season for the Carolina Softball team.
- This week in the NCAA RPI the Gamecocks are No. 1.
- South Carolina remained in the top-11 of all four polls this week.
- The Gamecocks moved up to No. 6 in the Softball America poll. They remained No. 6 in the D1Softball and No. 10 in the NFCA/USA Today polls, and dropped to No. 11 in the ESPN/USA Softball poll.
- For the first time in program history every game will be televised on the ESPN family of networks and digital platforms.
- South Carolina and Georgia are the only two Division I programs to have every game broadcast this season.
- With the win over Ole Miss, the Gamecocks reached 30 wins for the 31st time in program history.
- With the win over Youngstown State, the Gamecocks tied the program record from 1976 for most consecutive wins to start a season.
- With the series win over #19 Ole Miss, the Gamecocks now have five series wins over top-20 opponents.
- They also have four series wins over top-15 opponents.
- Carolina shutout Clemson for the first time in the series history and ending their program record streak of 54 consecutive games scoring a run.
- Brooke Blankenship ranks 2nd in the nation in sacrifice flies.
- Her six sac flies are tied for 4th in a single season in program history.
- Quincee Lilio leads the team with 14 multi-hit games on the season.
- Lilio is 14th in the nation in walks per game and 27th in on-base percentage.
- Arianna Rodi leads the nation in walks per game.
- She has reached base in 30 straight games.
- She collected her 100th career RBI on her three-run home run against Clemson.
- Rodi hit a home run in five straight games (Feb. 25 - Mar. 5), which it tied for the 14th longest streak in NCAA Division I history.
- Her 11 home runs on the season already rank tied for 6th in program history.
- Karley Shelton ranks 7th in doubles and 14th in doubles per game.
- Nealy Lamb ranks 24th in the nation in strikeouts per game and 30th in hits allowed per game.
- Sam Gress ranks 27th nationally in saves.

Ashley Chastain Woodard was named the 11th head coach on June 11, 2024.

She returned to South Carolina after serving as head coach for the Charlotte 49ers for five seasons, where she led her teams to a 154-96 overall record (61.6 percent), a 65-32 conference mark (67.0 percent) and two NCAA post-season berths.

In 2024, Charlotte had a 39-18 overall mark, a 21-6 record in the American Athletic Conference and the program's first conference tournament championship, advancing to the NCAA Regionals for the second year in a row. The 49ers reached as high as 15th in the NCAA RPI.

In 2023, she led the Niners to 35 wins and the program's first-ever outright regular season conference championship. The 49ers also earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history. Charlotte won two games at the Durham Regional and made an appearance in the regional final. The Niners had four players named First Team All-Conference USA in addition to Newcomer of the Year Award. She led them to three wins over ranked opponents, beating #10 Georgia, #11 Virginia Tech, and #23 Arizona State, with all three wins coming on the road.

In 2022, the Niners finished with a 35-23 record, and their first-ever national ranking in school history. She guided Charlotte to its biggest win in school history when they beat #6 Virginia Tech 5-2 on March 2. She was critical in the development of Bailey Vannoy, who won back-to-back C-USA Player of the Year honors and was named an NFCA Second Team All-American in 2022. Four total Niners collected All-Conference honors, while two Charlotte players threw no-hitters on the season.

Led the 2021 squad to their most successful season since 2010 with a 31-19 record. They claimed the C-USA East Division title for the first time in program history. Vannoy was named C-USA Player of the Year, the first in program history. Five Niners collected All-Conference accolades, the most since 2006.

In her first season as head coach, the Charlotte softball team ended the season above .500, 14-13, before COVID-19 ended the season. She picked up her first win as a head coach after defeating Appalachian State 9-5 on Feb. 8.

She previously spent two seasons at Ole Miss, helping the team advance to the NCAA Super Regionals in 2019 with a 41-20 record, with a 2.29 team ERA. She was named the 2019 Softball America Pitching Coach of the Year. In 2018 Ole Miss advanced to the NCAA Regionals. The Rebels posted 24 shutouts over her two seasons. In 2019, the Rebels had the fifth-lowest ERA and third-most strikeouts in the SEC. Her staff included Molly Jacobsen, who earned Second Team All-SEC and Second Team NFCA All-South Region honors. In 2018, Kaitlin Lee, became the second Rebel ever selected in the NPF Draft.

She was an assistant pitching coach for one season at Michigan State, helping the Spartans to a 34-24 overall record and a run to the Big Ten Tournament semifinals and the National Invitational Softball Championships. The Michigan State pitching staff lowered its team ERA by nearly a run and a half from the previous season.

In three seasons as the pitching coach for the College of Charleston, she helped the Cougars to a 99-68 record. She produced four All-Conference players and three NFCA All-Region stars in her three years.

She pitched for three seasons for the Gamecocks and finished 11th in career relief appearances for the Gamecocks. She led the team in starts, innings pitched, and ERA during her junior season. She was a three-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll. She served as a graduate assistant coach for South Carolina following her playing career. In 2012-13 she served as the pitching coach for the German National Team.

A 2011 graduate of South Carolina with a bachelor's degree in history, she earned her master's degree in secondary education from Carolina in 2012. Her husband Robert is the head baseball coach at Charlotte.

## THIS IS CAROLINA - TRADITION LIVES HERE

- South Carolina has made 24 trips to the NCAA postseason, a number that started in 1982. The Gamecocks have reached two super regionals and three WCWS. In conference play, Carolina owns two SEC Championships.
- The Gamecocks also made five AIAW College World Series appearances prior to the NCAA sanctioning softball as an NCAA sport in 1982.
- They have made the tournament nine of the last 11 seasons.
- Carolina in the postseason season holds a 48-50 record all-time.
- Fans and opponents have become accustomed to seeing the Gamecocks play on Sunday in the postseason. Carolina reached the regional final four-straight years (2016-19) and again in 2023 and 2024. The Gamecocks are 3-5 in those past eight Sunday games.
- Since 1982, the Gamecocks are 3-14 against host schools. On the flip side, South Carolina is 18-11 at home in the postseason.

## THE GAMECOCKS

- Carolina comes into the 2025 season looking to fight back after advancing to the Durham Regional Final, before falling to eventual WCWS participant Duke.
- The 2025 squad will look to build on that momentum, as they'll have just nine underclassmen (three sophomores and six freshmen).
- The Gamecocks welcome six freshmen to the program (Shae Anderson, Mya Flindt, Olivia Kotowski, Chloe Lackey, Nia McKnight, Audrey Wilson).
- Carolina will have four left-handed batters available in the lineup. It had seven in 2024, 2023 and 2022, nine in 2021, five in 2020, seven in 2019, eight in 2017 and six in 2016. Of the seven left-handed batters, only Carlie Henderson is listed as a slap hitter.
- Five South Carolina and five Georgia natives help make up the Gamecock roster. They're the most from any single state.

## THAT'S...INTERESTING!

- South Carolina will have at least one student-athlete from the state of California for the 31st-consecutive year dating back to 1994. The Gamecocks have freshmen and California natives Shae Anderson and Mya Flindt, and recent 2026 signee Dakota Potter, ensuring the tradition continues for years to come.
- Quincee Lilio is the first player in program history to wear No. 43.
- Lilio is a cousin of former Gamecocks Hannah (2020-22) and Alyssa Kumi-yama (2018-21)
- Mya Flindt is the second player in program history to wear No. 31 (Karsen Ochs 2020-23)
- Karley Shelton (33) wears the same number as head coach Ashley Chastain Woodard did as a player at Carolina.
- Carlie Henderson isn't the first in her family to achieve at a high level in sports. Her grandpa, Billy Shaw, played football at Georgia Tech and went on to play offensive line for nine years with the Buffalo Bills before being inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1999. Her father, Chip, played baseball at Shorter University and has been the baseball head coach at Calhoun High School for 26 years. He's won more than 600 games with three state titles (and had eight players drafted into MLB).
- Karley Shelton is the fifth member of her immediate family to play softball or baseball in college. She joins her father and mother who both played at Charlotte, her older brother Colby is at Florida, and older sister Kiley is at Florida Atlantic.
- Arianna Rodi doesn't just fly in her softball cleats, she can also fly on ice skates. Rodi was a dual-sport athlete in high school, winning three state championships in ice hockey as a defenseman. Her father, brother, and sister all played hockey, but Ari decided to forge her own path on the softball diamond.
- Associate head coach Katie Browder (Rietkovich) isn't the first Gamecock in her family. Browder's South Carolina roots run deep, as her father and sister have also donned the garnet and black. Her dad Ty Rietkovich played tight end for the Gamecocks from 1980-83 and worked on the football staff from 1984-86. Her sister Caroline (Rietkovich) Coleman was a cheerleader and is currently on Shane Beamer's staff as the coordinator of football operations.



## COMING THROUGH THE PORTAL

- The Gamecocks hit the transfer portal in the offseason, bringing in nine players that played the 2024 season at the Division I level.
- Six of them played under coach Chastain at Charlotte (Kadie Becker, Ella Chancey, Sam Gress, Abigail Knight, Arianna Rodi, Lexi Winters).
- Chancey, Rodi and Winters were named to the All-AAC First Team, while Gress was named to the Second Team.
- Nealy Lamb (Charleston Southern), Quincee Lilio (Oklahoma), and Emily Vinson (Longwood) also joined this season.
- Lexi Winters was named the 2024 AAC Defensive Player of the Year and the Conference USA All-Freshman Team in 2023. She batted .230 with five home runs and 21 RBIs.
- Rodi led the 49ers at the plate, batting .353 with 22 home runs, 55 RBIs, and 37 walks, en route to being named Softball America First Team All-American and NFCA First Team All-Region. She ranked fifth nationally in homers, 23rd total bases (134), and 27th in slugging (.788). She was listed as the No. 86 overall player entering the 2025 season by D1Softball. They also had her as the No. 7 first baseman.
- Chancey was named to the preseason Softball America Top 10 Third Baseman (#10) and proceeded to bat .316 with six home runs and 38 RBIs and led the team with four triples, while stealing eight bases.
- Knight was third on the team with a .309 batting average and was second with 25 walks and 12 doubles. She was named to the NFCA Third Team All-Region and the AAC All-Tournament Team.
- Gress led Charlotte with 14 victories and three saves in the circle, posting a 2.57 ERA with 92 strikeouts in 122 1-3 innings. She was named to the NFCA Second Team All-Region and the First team in 2023 while being named the 2023 Conference USA Newcomer of the Year. She was listed as the No. 30 pitcher entering the 2025 season by D1Softball.
- Becker was 1-1 with a 4.02 ERA in 15 2-3 innings in the circle. She was named to the AAC All-Academic Team.
- Vinson played three years at Longwood where she was earned the NFCA's Rawlings Gold Glove Award in 2023. Last year, she led the team with nine stolen bases and was third with 25 RBIs and six doubles, while batting .269.
- Lamb joins Carolina after being the first player in the history of the Big South to be named Big South All-Freshman, Freshman of the Year, Pitcher of the Year and First-Team All-Conference in the same season. She led the Big South Conference with a 1.78 ERA and tied for the lead in saves (4), while being second with five shutouts on the season. On the year, she was 12-9 with 10 complete games over 137 2-3 innings, striking out 130 while only walking 53. She held opponents to a program record .176 batting average.
- Lilio comes to the Gamecocks after winning three National Championships with Oklahoma. Last season she played in 41 games and made 47 appearances in 2022. She is a career .211 hitter with 14 RBIs and 22 runs scored. Coming out of high school she was the No. 5 player in the class by Extra Inning Softball and No. 13 by Softball America.

## IT'S GOOD TO BE HOME

- It's technically the fifth time in the last six seasons, and the second straight, they have opened the year at home, however the 2022 tournament was cancelled due to weather. For the fifth straight season, South Carolina will play over 30 home games.
- Carolina will host 37 home contests, including the Gamecock Invitational, Garnet & Black Invitational, and Carolina Classic.
- Outside of tournaments they will also host a three-game series against Texas Tech, along with mid-week games against: North Carolina, Youngstown State, Coastal Carolina, Clemson, Wofford, Charleston Southern, Winthrop and Furman.
- They will play just five true non-conference road games, three of which come during a weekend series at Duke. The schedule also includes 12 road SEC games.

### FROM ICE TO THE DIAMOND

South Carolina Softball's Arianna Rodi swings a big stick. Fortunately for the Gamecocks, she is still swinging a bat instead of a hockey stick.

The junior first baseman, who transferred from Charlotte last summer, was a three-time high school state champion hockey player in Rhode Island and also won a state championship in softball. Giving up one sport to pursue the other wasn't an easy decision.

"What I liked about hockey is that everyone in my family played it," said Rodi, who started playing both sports when she was four years old. "My brother, my sister, and my dad played it. Hockey was something in my family that got us all involved. I just liked the drastic difference between softball and hockey. It was a nice break in the wintertime to go to the ice rink and work out some different muscles in my body. The balance between softball and hockey was really beneficial for me. I still watch it on TV sometimes and think, 'Wow, I used to play that!'"

Rodi noted that playing different sports prevented burnout.

"What helped me most was mentality-wise," Rodi said. "Hockey is such a draining sport. You're continuously moving and it's a lot more physical. That toughness has helped as I moved over to just softball."

When she decided to drop the hockey gloves, not for a fight of course, and keep the softball glove, she looked for warm weather, beginning her career at Charlotte.

"I wanted to be in a place where I wasn't limited by external factors," Rodi said. "There was a time where I started getting some interest to play college hockey, but I always knew that softball was my sport."

Rodi was a defenseman in hockey, and while she's a solid defensive first baseman in softball, it's her offensive numbers that jump out. She earned first team All-American and All-Conference honors last year, hitting .353 with 22 HR, which ranked fifth nationally, and 55 RBI.

"After my freshman year and my welcome to the big-league moments, I figured I needed to be more consistent with defense and getting on base," Rodi said. "The biggest shift was learning to be consistent in all aspects of the game and that every at bat matters."

When Ashley Chastain Woodard was hired away from Charlotte to become South Carolina's new head coach last spring, Rodi knew she wanted to follow her to Columbia.

## NCAA ACTIVE CAREER LEADERS

Four players are among the active career leaders in various categories.

## NEW COACHES IN THE DUGOUT

- Ashley Chastain Woodard won't be the only new face in the dugout for the Gamecocks this season. She brought over several members of the coaching staff from Charlotte, in addition to a new pitching coach.
- Associate head coach Katie (Rietkovich) Browder has spent the last 10 years in the college coaching and has SEC ties throughout her career. She is the offensive coordinator and works with the infielders. She spent the 2024 season on Chastain's staff at Charlotte, while also making stops at Ole Miss (2016-18, 2021-23), Minnesota (2019-20), and Savannah State (2015). She played at Georgia from 2010-11, where she was a part of its run to a third-place finish at the 2010 Women's College World Series.
- Browder's South Carolina roots run deep, as her father and sister have also donned the garnet and black. Ty Rietkovich played tight end for the Gamecocks from 1980-83 and worked on the football staff from 1984-86. Her sister Caroline (Rietkovich) Coleman was a cheerleader and is currently on Shane Beamer's staff as the coordinator of football operations.
- Jody Davidson spent five years on staff as Charlotte, three as an assistant coach and two years as a volunteer assistant coach. He primarily works with the outfielders. His coaching was key in Bailey Vannoy being named a two-time Conference USA Player of the Year and an NFCA Second Team All-American. In 2024, he guided outfielder Abigail Knight earn NFCA All-Region Third Team honors.
- Davidson is no stranger to SEC as he was the director of softball operations at Ole Miss for four years (2016-19) and a manager for two years (2014-15). At Ole Miss, Davidson oversaw all the administrative and video coordination operations for the Rebels, where he worked alongside Chastain. He was with the Rebels for a pair of NCAA Super Regionals (2017 and 2019) and their 2017 SEC Tournament Championship.
- Zack Parsons serves as the pitching coach. He most recently was on the coaching staff at Murray State, starting as a graduate assistant in the fall of 2020 before being promoted to assistant coach in 2022. Under Parsons, the Murray State pitching staff reached unprecedented heights. Over the last four seasons, Racer pitchers recorded the four lowest ERA's in program history. The team set multiple program records during the 2022 season, most notably a program record 1.46 ERA, which also ranked second in Division I that season. MSU also posted a program-best .194 opponent batting average, 1.22 walks per seven innings, and strikeouts per seven innings with 6.37. Parsons was instrumental in Hannah James being named the Ohio Valley Conference Pitcher of the Year in 2022. Under his coaching, James would go on to earn National Fastpitch Coaches Association First Team All-Region honors in 2023, in addition to All-Missouri Valley Conference First Team and MVC All-Tournament Team honors. She was also named to the NFCA All-Region Second Team in 2022.
- Prior to MSU, Parsons began his collegiate coaching journey at Asbury University where he was named the interim head coach for the 2019 season before having the interim tag removed for the 2020 season. Before Asbury, he was an assistant coach in 2018 at East Jessamine High School in Nicholasville, Kentucky, where he helped the Lady Jaguars finish as the 12th Region runner-up and the 46th District champions with a 28-3 record. He also has an extensive background in travel softball, coaching for the Fury Fastpitch Bray under the Connect Sports/Fury Fastpitch organization.
- Cassidy Krupit was named the softball director of player development and analytics. Krupit is a former Gamecock who spent the 2024 season on head coach Ashley Chastain's staff at Charlotte as a graduate assistant. Krupit played for the Gamecocks from 2020-2022 after transferring from Baylor. She graduated in May of 2022 Magna Cum Laude with her bachelor's degree in sport and entertainment management. She transferred to Charlotte for the 2023 season as a graduate student and earned First Team All-Conference USA and NFCA First Team All-Region honors. She earned her master's degree in interdisciplinary studies from Charlotte in May.





## IF YOU BUILD IT, THEY WILL COME

- South Carolina is 268-107 (.715) at Carolina Softball Stadium since being built in 2013. That includes a 4-1 record at home while hosting an NCAA regional at Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field.
- Prior to 2021, South Carolina had not lost double digit games at home in seven years and has won 20 or more eight of the past nine seasons.
- Since 2016, South Carolina has consistently ranked among the nation's leaders in attendance. Since that time, excluding the 2021 COVID season that limited attendance, they have never finished lower than 15th in average or cumulative attendance.
- In 2024, Carolina ranked 7th in the nation in total attendance and 14th in average attendance. They were 9th and 11th in 2023, 7th and 13th in 2022, 7th and 11th in 2020, 10th and 13th in 2019, 11th and 13th in 2018, 10th and 11th in 2017, 12th and 15th in 2016.

## NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS IS NOTHING NEW FOR SC

- South Carolina is 295-74 (.800) over the past nine years in games outside the SEC. Notable wins include Clemson, Duke, Texas Tech, Boston U, Utah, Texas, Penn State, Houston, Arizona State, North Carolina, Florida State, California, Virginia Tech, USF, Long Beach State, Hofstra, Liberty, and UCF.
- Carolina will play 33 non-conference games in 2025, 28 of which will be played at Carolina Softball Stadium.

## CAROLINA HOSTS TOURNAMENTS... AND WINS A LOT

- Carolina is an amazing 48-6 over the past seven seasons in the Gamecock Invitational. The 2021 tournament was canceled due to weather.
- The Gamecock pitching staff has shined in the tournaments. In the games during that span, Carolina pitching staffs have allowed three or more runs 15 times. On the flip side, 16 games have ended as shutouts.
- Including the Carolina Classic and Black & Garnet Challenge, the Gamecocks are 94-9 in their past 95 home tournament games.

## GAMECOCKS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- South Carolina is 182-404-1 (.311) against opponents ranked in the NFCA top 25 since 1995.
- Broken down by site, the Gamecocks are 88-141 (.384) at home, 48-188 (.203) on the road and 47-74-1 (.389) in neutral-site outings.
- In 2025 the Gamecocks are 11-7 against ranked opponents.
- In 2024, the Gamecocks went 9-20 against ranked opponents. They earned victories over #21 Kentucky (twice), #10 Florida, #17 Arkansas, #16 Mississippi State (twice), #11 Clemson, #24 Boston U and #13 Utah.

## SOUTH CAROLINA HISTORICAL RECORD

- South Carolina has played 2,675 games in its softball history, going 1,724-944-7 (.646) in its 52 years of history.
- Carolina has posted 30 or more wins in 10 of the past 12 full seasons.
- Carolina has protected home well, also, with 17 or more victories coming in friendly confines each of the past 11 full years.

## CAROLINA RUNS THIS STATE

- Since 2011 Carolina owns an 93-14 mark against other Palmetto State schools.
- That mark includes a 31-game winning streak that stretched over five seasons before Coastal Carolina snapped the streak in 2017.
- South Carolina went 7-2 last season against in-state foes.

## WHAT WILL THEY WEAR TODAY?

- South Carolina has worn more than 30 different uniform combinations during the past several years based solely on jersey, pants and socks/stirrups.
- Talking just jersey, pants and socks/stirrups the Gamecocks have **245** different combinations they could use this season!
- When you add in visors and belts, Carolina has **2,205** different looks at its disposal. With those two accessories thrown into the equation, South Carolina could go more than **40** seasons without wearing the exact same look!!

## STANDIN' IN THE HALL OF FAME

- Former All-American Dana Fulmer was inducted into the South Carolina athletics Hall of Fame in the fall of 2024.
- Fulmer was a four-time NFCA All-Region selection, three times on the first team and once on the second team.
- The catcher/outfielder earned NFCA second-team All-America honors in her senior season.
- On the school career records list, she owns the school record for most games played (286) and RBIs (199), second in at-bats, hits and batting average, third in triples, and fifth in runs.
- She is one of 12 players in program history with 100 runs and 100 RBIs.
- Her 36 career triples are tied for fourth all-time in NCAA Division I history
- Holds the No. 1 and 2 spots for RBIs in a season
- Led the NCAA in 1992 with 61 RBIs
- She becomes the ninth person from the softball program to be inducted into the Hall of Fame, which includes her former coach Joyce Compton. She is joined by players Kim Pietro, Trinity Johnson, Darlene Lowery, Megan Matthews, Tricia Popowski, Karen Sanchelli, and Tiffany Tootle.

## SOME OF THE GREATS THAT HAVE COME THROUGH

- **Trinity Johnson:** 2004 Carolina Hall of Fame inductee, three-time All-American, 1996-97 Honda Award for Softball Player of the Year (the first Honda award winner for any sport at Carolina). She recently became the first Gamecock in program history to have her jersey retired. (Jersey was retired in 2019).
- **Tiffany Tootle:** Three-time All-American, Led the nation in hits and runs in 1992 and 1993, one of four three-time All-Americans in school history. Was inducted into the UofSC Hall of Fame in 2006 and was the second to receive the honor.
- **Dr. Megan Matthews Buning:** 1999 NFCA All-American, led the nation in saves in 2000, two All-SEC nods and the 2000 SEC Tournament MVP award.
- **Darleen Lowery:** was a 2014 UofSC Hall of Fame inductee after a career in which she was named a two-time All-American. Notably led the nation with 9.49 strikeouts per seven innings in 1987.

## WOMEN AT SOUTH CAROLINA: THEY RUN THINGS, Y'ALL

- South Carolina athletics has had plenty of high points to talk about with women's sports since 2012. Since that time, women's teams have posted over 160 All-Americans, over 230 All-Conference selections, more than 30 different national honors, 10 national championships, 14 Conference Championships, eight conference tournament championships, finished the season ranked 52 different times and reached the postseason 65 times (11 teams).
- The past six years have been equally impressive with 103 All-Americans, 167 All-Conference selections, 21 national awards, six national championships, 13 conference championships, six conference tournament championships, finished ranked 42 times and reached the postseason 49 times.

## THE BRAND

- Since 1892, the colors garnet and black have been associated with the University of South Carolina's athletics teams. Carolina has a pair of primary logos you'll see in use with the softball program (the Block C and SC Logo).
- South Carolina softball represents the brand with garnet, black and white options for jerseys, pants and socks/stirrups.
- Carolina or Gamecocks can be found across the front of each jersey with the SEC patch on the right and Under Armour logo on the left.
- Starting with the 2007 football season, Carolina partnered with Under Armour, Inc., as the official outfitter of the University's athletics department. South Carolina was previously with Russell Athletics.
- South Carolina and Auburn are the only SEC schools wearing Under Armour apparel.
