RAZORBACK NOTABLES

>> The Arkansas Razorbacks are 44-13 and coming off a 4-0 win over Ole Miss yesterday to set up a winner-take-all Super Regional finale. Arkansas is making its fourth Super Regional appearance in program history. The Hogs previously appeared in 2018, 2021 and 2022 and are seeking their first WCWS berth in program history.

>> Arkansas earned its highest ranking in program history by checking in at No. 1 in the Softball America Poll on May 5, topping its previous program best of No. 2 which was set the week prior.

>> Shortstop **Atalyia Rijo** is batting .555 (10-18) with a solo HR, three RBI and a walk during the Hogs' NCAA games. Rijo had back-to-back 4-4 performances in wins over Oklahoma State, becoming the first player in program history to have back-to-back four-hit games. Rijo is batting .325 with 50 hits, 10 doubles, two triples, 6 HR and 37 RBI while posting a .395 OBP this season.

>>Junior left-hander **Robyn Herron** is 18-6 this season with a 2.69 ERA and 157 strikeouts in 140.2 innings pitched while limiting opposing hitters to a .194 batting average. She earned her 18th win of the season courtesy of a complete-game shutout vs. Oklahoma State in which she struck out two and allowed just three hits (May 18). She was recently named a Second-Team All-American by Softball America.

>> Freshman Payton Burnham is 16-2 this season with a team-best 2.40 ERA and 90 strikeouts in 113.2 innings pitched while limiting opposing hitters to a .216 batting average. The Eugene, Ore., product threw her second complete-game shutout of the season while striking out 8 and allowing three hits in a win over Ole Miss. Her 16 wins this season are the most by a Razorback freshman pitcher since Mary Haff's 29 wins in 2017. She earned Freshman All-America honors from Softball America (May 20).

>> 2025 Softball America and SEC Player of the Year Bri Ellis leads the country in slugging percentage (1.098) and OBP (.637). Ellis is batting .444 with a program-record 26 HR, 72 RBI, 65 walks, and just 15 strikeouts while posting a .637 OBP. Entering the weekend, her 1.788 OPS is on pace to be the highest single-season mark nationally by a DI player since the stat was first tracked in 2016. Jocelyn Alo of Oklahoma holds the single-season record of 1.759, which was set in 2022. Ellis is a Top 3 Finalist for the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Award. She was recently drafted as the No. 2 Overall pick by the Volts in the 2025 AUSL College Draft. Ellis was the first position player selected.

>> Bri Ellis is having one of the most impressive seasons at the plate in softball or baseball history. Ellis is walking and homering at an absurd rate this season. Through 57 games, Ellis has homered once every 5.11 at-bats while walking once every 3.26 plate appearances. Both numbers are better than Barry Bonds' 2001 season, which is widely regarded as one of the most impressive seasons in baseball history. Bonds homered once every 6.52 at-bats and walked once every 3.75 plate appearances.

>> Arkansas' **Bri Ellis** (SEC POY, First-Team All-SEC, SEC All-Defensive Team), **Robyn Herron** (Second Team), **Reagan Johnson** (Second Team) and **Ella McDowell** (Second Team) all earned All-SEC accolades this season.

>> The Razorbacks have been ranked in the Top 25 of the NFCA Coaches poll for a program-best 86 consecutive weeks dating back to the start of the 2020 season. Arkansas is one of six programs nationally to have appeared in the Top 25 of every NFCA Coaches Poll since the start of the 2020 season, joining Oklahoma, Florida, UCLA, Oklahoma State and Florida State.

A HISTORIC START

>>> Bri Ellis has gotten off to the hottest start in program history and one of the hottest starts in modern NCAA history at the plate. Through 52 games she holds program records HR (26), OBP (.637), total bases (145), runs (67) and slugging percentage (1.098).

>>> Entering the weekend her 1.788 OPS is on pace to be the best in a single season nationally since the statistic was tracked in 2016.

>>> She was one of only two DI players to lead the nation in slugging percentage, homers and on-base percentage through March 19 of a season since 2012. The only other player to accomplish the feat was Louisiana-Lafayette catcher Lexie Elkins in 2016.

>>> Through March 2 of this season her 686 on-base percentage at the time

Through March 2 of this season, her .686 on-base percentage at the time was the second-highest of any NCAA DI player through that date since 2012, trailing only Sydney McKinney of Wichita State, who posted a .741 OBP through that date in 2023.

» Through the first 10 games of the season, Ellis was the only player nationally to have equal or more RBI than at-bats through the first 10 games of the season since at least 2015 (min of 20 AB).

> In addition to hitting a league-leading 26 home runs and driving in 72 runs, Ellis has been exceptionally good when it comes to getting on base and making contact while playing in the nation's toughest league.

> The senior slugger has reached base in 53 of the Razorbacks' 57 games this season and has registered at least one base hit in 38 games while only striking out a total of 15 times this season.

> Ellis has walked in 38 games this season, while drawing multiple walks in 20 games. Ellis has been intentionally walked three times in a game twice this season against Illinois (March 1) and No 2. Florida (April 6).

> She has posted 17-game reached base streaks in back-to-back seasons, becoming just the second player in program history to accomplish the feat

becoming just the second player in program history to accomplish the feat, joining Devon Wallace, who accomplished the feat from 2013-14 (31, 29). >> The longest the right-handed slugger has gone this season without hom-

ering is just five games.

>> She posted a career-best 26-game reached-base streak which was the fifth-longest streak in program history.

AND SHE'S GOT A GLOVE

» Ellis does more than just rake. She is one of the nation's best first baseman with a career fielding percentage of .989. She was an All-SEC Defensive Team selection at first base in 2024 and 2025 and has posted fielding percentages of .986+ during all four seasons of her collegiate career while committing no more than four errors in an individual season.

BRI'S OPS IS BETTER THAN THE REST

>> Entering the weekend, Arkansas first baseman Bri Ellis currently owns a 1.788 On-Base Plus Slugging Percentage (OPS) which leads the country and is on pace to be the best single-season mark since the statistic was first tracked in 2016. Additionally, entering the week her 1.142 slugging percentage is also the highest of anyone this season, leading the next closest in that period by 161 percentage points (Taylor Minnick, Indiana).

>> Only 24 players since 2016 have registered an OPS above 1.500 throughout the entirety of a single season. Of those players, only six SEC players have accomplished the feat, while 12 Power Five (Pac 12 Included) players in total have accomplished the feat.

>> This season, nine players have an OPS above 1.500 through May 22. Nobody posted a 1.500+ OPS nationally last season.

>> Of the four USA Softball National Player of the Year Award winners who batted and won the award since 2016, only Jocelyn Alo of Oklahoma (2021, 2022) registered a single-season OPS of above 1.500. Valerie Cagle (2023, Clemson), and Sierra Romero (2016, Michigan) won the award despite recording an OPS lower than 1.500. Alo, Skylar Wallace (2023, Florida), and Abbey Cheek (2019, Kentucky) are the only three NFCA Player of the Year Award winners to post a 1.500+ OPS since the award's inception in 2016.

>> The 24 players that have previously accomplished a 1.500+ OPS in a single season have combined for four National Player of the Year Awards 18 NFCA All-America selections (13 First-Team, 4 Second-Team, 1 Third-Team), 24 NFCA All-Region selections, (22 First-Team, 2 Second-Team), 26 First-Team All-Conference selections and 16 Conference Player of the Year Award winners.

>> Arkansas first baseman **Bri Ellis** finished the regular season batting .487 with 25 home runs this season. She ranked second nationally in home runs and third nationally in batting average at the conclusion of the regular season.

>> Only five players in NCAA history (Since 1982) have finished a regular season batting above .480 while also hitting 20+ home runs. All of the five players who had previously accomplished the feat were named Conference Player of the Year in their respective conferences, while four of five were named NFCA First-Team All-America and NFCA First-Team All-Region. Stacey Nuveman (UCLA, 2002) and Jocelyn Alo (Oklahoma, 2022) were both named USA Softball National Player of the Year, while Jen Yee (Georgia Tech, 2010) and Megan Langenfeld (2010) were top-three finalists for the award.

>> Arkansas first baseman **Bri Ellis** had the best offensive numbers through the regular season compared to all USA Collegiate Softball Player of the Year Winners who were position players in the past decade.

>> Ellis leads two-time winner Jocelyn Alo (Oklahoma, 2022, 2021) and 2016 winner Sierra Romero (Michigan) in batting average (.487), walks (56), on-base percentage (.659), slugging percentage (1.221) and OPS (1.881).

» Ellis is walking and homering at an absurd rate this season. Through the regular season, Ellis has homered once every 4.88 at-bats while walking once every 3.21 plate appearances. Both numbers are better than Barry Bonds' 2001 season, which is regarded as one of the most impressive seasons in baseball history.

WHY NOT BOTH?

>> Ellis finished the regular season ranked in the Top 2 nationally in home runs per game (2nd, 0.51) and walks per game (2nd, 1.20).

>> The last Division I player to finish the regular season ranked in the Top 2 nationally in both categories was Jen Yee in 2010, who finished second in HR per game (0.47) and first in walks per game (1.42).

FEARED BY MANY

>> Opposing teams have elected to pitch around Bri Ellis at all costs this season.

>> In a series against No. 10 LSU (May 3-5), Ellis was walked four times in both of the Razorbacks wins while garnering 10 walks on the weekend. Ellis also walked four times in a win over Oklahoma State (May 19).

>> It marked the first four-walk game for an Arkansas player since 2021 when Braxton Burnside accomplished the feat on April 3, 2021, in a win over Auburn.

» Ellis (2) joins Devon Wallace (3) as the only Razorbacks in program history to have multiple 4+ walk games.

PLAYING THE BEST

» Ellis' historic season has occurred in the nation's toughest league and her numbers playing the best of the best have been eye-popping.

» During the Razorbacks' 22 games against Top 25 RPI opponents in the regular season, Ellis batted .429 with 24 hits, two doubles, 11 home runs, 27 RBI, 59 total bases and 26 walks while posting a 1.054 slugging percentage, .636 OBP and a 1.690 OPS.

» Ellis has homered off of eight all-conference (2024) pitchers this season.

A MASSIVE IMPACT

» Arkansas is 31-5 when Bri Ellis hits a home run since she arrived on campus prior to the 2024 season. Arkansas is 17-5 when Ellis homers this season and was 13-0 in 2024 when she homered.

» In her collegiate career, Ellis' teams have a combined record of 59-9 when she homers.

POWER IN THE PORTAL

Since taking over the program in 2016, head coach Courtney Deifel and her coaching staff have had tremendous success in the recruitment of players through the transfer portal.

» Deifel has made 22 transfer portal additions during her time at Arkansas. Six Razorbacks on the 2025 roster arrived in Fayetteville by way of the transfer portal: Reis Beuerlein (2024, Mississippi State), Courtney Day (2025, Texas), Karlie Davison (2025, Utah), Bri Ellis (2024, Auburn), Carlee Ratcliff (2024, Texas) and Kailey Wyckoff (2025, Texas Tech).

Transfers under Courtney Deifel have accounted for:

- >> 14 NFCA All-Region honors
- » 13 All-SEC Selections
- >> 2 SEC Players of the Year (KB Sides, Bri Ellis)
- >> 1 SEC Pitcher of the Year (Chenise Delce)
- >> Entering this season, 11 of the 18 portal additions under Deifel that completed a season at Arkansas experienced an increase in both wins and winning percentage in their first season as a Hog compared to their last at their previous program.
- >> 11 of the Razorbacks' 14 transfer position players set single-season career highs in at least one offensive statistical category, while eight set single-season career highs in four or more offensive categories.

- BRI BOMBS
 Bri Ellis is one of the most heralded sluggers in the nation in 2025. She is batting .444 with 26 home runs, 72 RBI, 146 total bases, 67 runs and 66 walks while posting a 1.098 slugging percentage and a .637 OBP. Her 74 career home runs are the most among all active D1 players.
- >> She made history with her 26th homer, a walk-off grand slam in a 5-1 win over Georgia to set a single-season program record for homers and RBI (72).
- >> Ellis crushed her record-tying 25th HR in a 12-9 win over LSU (May 1).
- >> She belted her 23rd and 24th homers of the season to post her sixth career multi-HR game in a win over Texas A&M (April 26).
- >> Ellis smashed her 21st HR of the season in a win at UCA, setting a new single-season career high (April 15).
- >> Ellis smashed her 19th round-tripper this season with a three-run shot in the first inning of a series-opening win at No. 2 Florida (April 4).
- >> Ellis blasted a two-run homer in the series finale at Tennessee (March 25).
- >> She hit a three-run homer in the third inning of a win vs. UCA (March 18)
- >> Ellis batted .500 in a three-game series vs. No. 1 Oklahoma, highlighted by a 3-4 series finale that featured two HR and four RBI.
- » Ellis hit .500 during a three-game series at Ole Miss while collecting four hits, four runs scored, two homers, seven RBI and three walks. She tied a career-high with five RBI in a 20-3 series finale win (March 9).
- » During the Wooo Pig Classic, Ellis hit .500 and posted a .778 on-base percentage, reaching base 14 times while only registering eight official atbats. Ellis hit two home runs while drawing nine walks, five of which came intentionally (Feb. 28-March 2).
- >> She batted .538 with two home runs, four RBI and seven hits during the Hogs' 4-1 weekend at the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic (Feb. 20-22).
- >> Ellis had a career weekend during the Razorbacks' 5-0 showing at the LA Tech Classic (Feb. 14-16). The senior first baseman batted .667 with eight hits, three doubles, four home runs, 15 RBI, seven runs scored and five walks while posting a 1.917 slugging percentage and .722 on-base percentage.
- >> In a 12-4 (6 inn.) win over Southern Miss, the right-handed slugger drove in a career-high five runs courtesy of a three-run home run and a two-run home run. The two-homer performance marked her fourth career multi-home run game and was her first as a Razorback.
- >> She was named SEC Player of the Week (Feb. 17) and National Player of the Week by D1 Softball.
- >> In a 12-4 (6 inn.) win over Southern Miss, the right-handed slugger drove in a career-high five runs courtesy of a three-run home run and a two-run home run.
- >> In a 2-1 win over San Diego, Ellis had a bases-loaded walk-off RBI single to deep right-centerfield. She also hit a two-run home run in a 9-1 (6 inn.) win over Bradley earlier in the day (Feb. 8).



Arkansas' transfer portal class ranked No. 9 in the country, per D1Softball on Aug. 20, 2024, prior to the signing of Texas transfer and 2022 WCWS All-Tournament performer Courtney Day.

- >> Ellis blasted a solo home run in her first at-bat of the season at Texas State on Feb. 6, 2025 and then followed it up the next day with a two-run blast in the record-breaking 23-0 win over Lipscomb (Feb. 7).
- >> She was a first-team SEC and NFCA All-Region honors and being named a Second-Team NFCA All-American in 2024.

HOME SWEET BOGLE

Bogle Park was the place to be in 2024, as a program-record 97,744 fans walked through the gates. All 10 of Bogle Park's all-time top 10 single-game attendance marks were also set in 2024. Arkansas played in front of home crowds of 3,000+ in 21 of its 27 regular season games at Bogle Park.

- >> Arkansas had 3.128 fans at its series opener against Oklahoma (March 16).
- » Arkansas is just one of three programs to rank in the top five in single-season attendance every year since COVID, joining the likes of Alabama and LSU.
- >> The Razorbacks have ranked in the top three nationally in total home attendance in back-to-back seasons and have finished in the top five in national total attendance in each of their past five seasons at Bogle Park.
- >> On May 4, 2024, Arkansas broke its single-game attendance record, with 3,937 in attendance for game three vs. Ole Miss.
- » In 2024, the Hogs have accumulated the third-highest cumulative attendance across NCAA softball (89,982). Arkansas averaged 3,333 fans per game.
- >> Bogle Park hosted the highest-attended SEC Softball Tournament in 2023 with 16,937 in the stands May 9-13, shattering Florida's previous record of
- >> Between the 2022 and 2023 campaigns, Bogle Park drew crowds of 3,000+ 16 separate times.
- » Since its gates opened in 2009, Bogle Park has welcomed 518,548 fans through the turnstiles. Of those 518,548 fans, 430,802 (83.07%) came during head coach Courtney Deifel's tenure (2016-present).
- >> Bogle Park was recognized by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) as the Netting Professionals/NFCA DI Field of the Year in 2022.

RAZORBACKS KNOW RPI

Arkansas finished the regular season ranked No. 7 in RPI. Assistant Coach Matt Meuchel plays a big role in the Hogs' schedule building each season.

>> Arkansas has finished in the Top 20 in every single RPI since 2021.

THE HEAD HOG

Head coach Courtney Deifel is the program's all-time wins leader.

>> Deifel has won 359 games through 10 seasons at the helm in Fayetteville. In the previous 10 years before Deifel, Arkansas only won 251 contests.

PRESEASON PRESENCE

- » Senior first baseman Bri Ellis and junior utility star Kailey Wyckoff garnered many preseason honors ahead of the 2025 season.
- » Both were named preseason All-SEC in a vote by the league's coaches on Jan. 30. They also were named Preseason Top 100 players by both Softball America and D1Softball.
- » Wyckoff earned Preseason Second-Team All-America honors from D1Softball at the utility position.

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES

- >> Since 2017, Arkansas is 164-45 (.785) at Bogle Park during the regular season.
- >> Arkansas is 197-77 (.719) at Bogle Park since Courtney Deifel took over the program in 2016.

MEUCHEL IS MASTER OF DEFENSE

- » Assistant Coach Matt Meuchel joined the Razorbacks' coaching staff prior to the 2017 season and completed his eighth season in Fayetteville in 2024. Meuchel is one of the sport's leaders in analytics and also coordinates the Razorbacks defense. All five of the Hogs' top-five single-season fielding percentages have come under his watch.
- » Arkansas has posted a program-record .984 fielding percentage this season with 23 errors in 1,445 chances through 57 games. The Hogs' .984 fielding percentage ranks first in the country entering the week. Arkansas has not committed errors in 37 of its 57 games this season.
- » In 2024, Meuchel and assistant coach Danielle Gibson helped guide Arkansas to a program-record .978 fielding percentage, which led the SEC and ranked ninth nationally.

SOOIE SPINNERS

- >> The Razorbacks own a 2.96 ERA this season while striking out 333 batters and limiting opponents to a .216 batting average in 350.1 innings pitched.
- » Arkansas has registered 46 shutouts since the start of the 2023 season. The Razorbacks are one of only nine programs to rank in the top 20 nationally in shutouts in 2023 and 2024, joining the likes of Oklahoma, Boston, Oklahoma State, Tennessee, Stanford, Alabama, South Dakota State and Cal State Fullerton.
- » Arkansas entered the week ranked 17th nationally with 14 shutouts this season and ranked 19th nationally in shutouts in 2024 with 14 and 17th nationally in 2023 with 17.
- >> The Razorbacks have posted 11+ shutouts in each of the last five seasons, one of just 16 programs nationally to accomplish the feat.

BOGLE BOMBERS


The long ball has been a staple in the success of Arkansas Softball during the Courtney Deifel era (2016-present).

- » Arkansas has hit 605 home runs since Deifel took over the helm in 2016, which accounts for 52.7% of home runs in program history. In the 10 years prior to Deifel's arrival, Arkansas teams belted 437 round-trippers.
- » Entering the weekend, the Razorbacks' 589 home runs since 2017 rank second among SEC members during that time span and third among current SEC members, trailing only Oklahoma (962) and Georgia (633).
- » Seven of the Hogs' single-season top-10 home run marks have been accomplished during Deifel's tenure, including the three best in program history (2022: 109, 2021: 95, 2025: 70).
- » The Razorbacks' program record of 109 home runs in 2022 was the second-most by a team in a single season in SEC history at the time.

ROAD HOGS

Since 2020, the Razorbacks have excelled on the road with a record of 67-24 (.736), which is the second-best mark of all current SEC members, trailing only Oklahoma (78-7, .929).

- >> On April 6, Arkansas earned its highest-ranked series win in program history with a 9-5 triumph at No. 2 Florida. Arkansas later matched that with a series win at No. 1/2 Texas A&M (ESPN Poll) on April 25-27. On March 23, the Hogs became the first SEC team to win a series at Tennessee since they accomplished the feat on March 18-20, 2022. The series win snapped an 11-series home winning streak Tennessee owned which was a league-best.
- » With Arkansas' road series victory at No. 1/2 Texas A&M on April 25-27, 2025, the Hogs have won 18 of their last 20 SEC road series, which is the best mark among all SEC members during that time span (2021-present).
- >> From 1997-2020, the program had only won 17 SEC road series.
- >> The Hogs recorded two top-10 ranked SEC road series wins last season and have accounted for seven top-10 road series wins in league play over the past four seasons.
- >> Additionally, Arkansas has posted a 80-29 (.741) record in the Courtney Deifel era



(2016-present) in neutral site games.

AMONG THE ELITE

>> The Razorbacks have been ranked in the Top 25 of the NFCA Coaches poll for a program-best 86 consecutive weeks dating back to the start of the 2020 season. Arkansas is one of six programs nationally to have appeared in the Top 25 of every NFCA Coaches Poll since the start of the 2020 season, joining Oklahoma, Florida, UCLA, Oklahoma State and Florida State.

RAE\$

- » Reagan Johnson is the all-time program leader in career batting average at .370 while ranking fourth in career on-base percentage (.424), eighth in career triples (6) and fifth in career stolen bases (50).
- >> She became the 11th player in program history to register 200 hits on April 11 in a 10-2 win over No. 10 South Carolina.
- » Johnson is two hits away from becoming just one of three active Division I players, with 73+ hits in each of the previous three seasons, joining, Kendra Falby (Florida), and Mia Scott (Texas).
- » Johnson is the only Razorback in program history with multiple 70+ hit seasons with 70 in 2025 73 in 2024 and 79 in 2023. In 2024, she became one of four Razorbacks in program history to post an on-base percentage of .426 or better while registering 70+ hits in a season, joining Danielle Gibson (2022), KB Sides (2022) and Hannah McEwen (2019).
- » She earned First-Team All-SEC and NFCA First-Team All-South Region in 2024 after batting a team-best .380 with 73 hits, four doubles, one triple, 11 RBI, 35 runs scored and 79 total bases to go along with a team-high 12 stolen bases. She ranked fourth in the SEC and 33rd nationally in hits (73) in addition to ranking fifth among all SEC players in batting average (.380).
- » Her sophomore year batting average of .380 and her freshman year average of .378 rank sixth and seventh, respectively in the Arkansas single-season record books while her 79 hits as a freshman and 73 hits as a sophomore were the third and fourth-most by a Hog in a single season.
- » She batted a team-best .388 (66-170) against right-handed pitchers in 2024.
- » Johnson is 50-54 in stolen base attempts during her career which is good for fifth all-time in program history.
- » The Karnes City, Texas product checked in at No. 73 overall and ranked 27th among outfielders in the Softball America Preseason Top 100 Players List on Jan. 6.

MILESTONE TRACKER

- » Bri Ellis is a run away from breaking the program single-season runs record.
- » Reagan Johnson needs four more stolen bases to move into a tie for the fourth most all-time by a Razorback in their collegiate career.
- » Bri Ellis needs a HR to break single-season SEC HR record.

RUN-RULING RAZORBACKS

- » Arkansas has defeated opponents with ease in many games this season.
- » The Razorbacks set a program record with their 17th run-rule victory of the season during a 10-2 (5 inn.) win vs. Kentucky on March 29.
- » Arkansas has more run-rule wins (23) than seven-inning wins (21) this season.

THE BASH SISTERS

- »UTL Courtney Day (66) and 1B Bri Ellis (72) have combined for more RBI (138) than 27 Division I programs this season, as of May 22.
- » Ellis and Day entered the weekend ranked in the Top 15 nationally in RBI per game with marks of 1.31 (9) and 1.27 (12).
- » The duo is just the second pair of Arkansas teammates to drive in over 60 runs in a season in program history, joining Linnie Malkin (68) and Danielle Gibson (70) in 2022.
- » Day (2R HR) and Ellis (solo HR) both homered in a 10-2 win over Kentucky (March 28)
- » In a 10-7 series finale loss to No. 1 Oklahoma, Ellis homered twice and Day hit a three-run homer. (March 16).

PB12 IN GOOD COMPANY

- Freshman Pitcher Payton Burnham has wasted no time frustrating opposing hitters, beginning her Arkansas career with a 16-2 record, 90 strikeouts and three saves in 113.2 innings pitched while limiting opposing hitters to a .216 batting average and posting a team-best 2.40 ERA.
- » Burnham threw a complete-game shutout while striking out seven and allowing just three hits and a walk in a 4-0 win over 0le Miss (May 24), becoming just the third Arkansas freshman since 2010 to throw multiple seven-inn. complete game shutouts, joining Robyn Herron (2, 2023) and Mary Haff (8, 2018).
- » She earned her second win of the regional against Oklahoma State (May 17) by throwing four shutout innings in which she allowed just two hits and a walk.
- » Burnham became the first Razorback in program history to throw a no-hitter in an NCAA Tournament game in a 10-0 win over Saint Louis (May 16). The freshman struck out six and allowed just one walk and a hit batter in her five innings of work. It marked the third no-hitter by a Razorback this season and the 17th in program history.
- » Her 15 wins this season are the most by a Razorback freshman since Mary Haff's 29 in 2017.
- » She tossed a complete-game shutout against LSU on her 19th birthday by striking out six and allowing just four hits and two walks in a 6-0 win over LSU (May 3). She became just the ninth Razorback freshman to throw a seven-inning complete game shutout since 2002.
- » Burnham pitched 6.2 innings while striking out two and allowing three earned runs to earn her

- 11th win of the season at Texas A&M on April 26. Her mother, Kendall, was an NFCA All-American at Texas A&M in the mid 1990s.
- » Burnham became just the fifth Arkansas freshman since 2000 to win 10 games in a season after throwing six shutout innings and striking out a career-high nine batters in a 7-0 win at UCA (April 15).
- » She earned her second save of the season, recording the final out of a 9-5 win at No. 2 Florida (April 6).
- » Burnham earned her eighth win of the season on March 30 against Kentucky by throwing 3.0 shutout innings with a strikeout and just two hits allowed.
- » She fanned 4 and allowed 3 runs on 6 hits in 4.1 innings in her seventh win of the season vs. Kentucky (March 28).
- » She threw 6.1 shutout innings during her sixth victory of the season in a 9-0 win at Tennessee. She became the first Razorback freshman to throw 6+ shutout innings since Robyn Herron accomplished the feat in a 7-0 victory over Indiana at the TaxAct Clearwater Invitational on Feb. 18, 2023. Burnham became the eighth Razorback freshman pitcher to throw 6+ shutout innings and allow three or fewer hits since 2002. As a result of her efforts, she earned SEC Freshman of the Week Honors on March 25. She became just the fifth Arkansas pitcher to do so.
- » She was the first Razorback freshman to start her career 4-0 in the circle since Autumn Storms did so in 2017.
- » She became the first freshman pitcher to record a win in her first two pitching appearances since Mary Haff in 2018 with wins over Bradley and San Diego(Feb. 7-8).
- » Burnham struck out eight batters while allowing just one run on three hits and one walk during her 6.1 innings pitched in a 3-1 win over Bradley (Feb. 7).
- » She became just the 11th freshman Arkansas pitcher to post 8+ strikeouts in a game after fanning eight batters against Bradley (Feb. 7).

MISS VERSATILITY

- Arkansas continued its multi-year run of major portal additions in the summer of 2024 with the addition of Texas Tech Transfer Kailey Wyckoff.
- » Wyckoff is batting .330 this season with 60 hits, 15 doubles, seven home runs and 53 RBI while posting a .417 OPB. She has reached base in 49 of the Hogs' 57 games this season.
- » She blasted a three-run HR in the opening game of the Hogs' Super Regional vs. Ole Miss (May 23).
- » She tied a career-high with three hits in the win while setting a single-game career-high with five RBI. Her three hits and five RBI tied an Arkansas NCAA Tournament program record. 10 others have registered three or more hits while Danielle Gibson is the only other player in program history to drive in five runs in a game, accomplishing the feat on May 20, 2022, in an 11-0 run-rule win over Princeton.
- » The Katy, Texas product went 3-4 with a 3-run HR in a 8-6 loss to Oklahoma (May 9)
- » Wyckoff smashed her fifth HR of the season in a 12-9 win over LSU (May 1)
- » She tied a season-high with three hits in a 7-0 win at Central Arkansas (April 15).
- » Wyckoff hit a solo homer in the first inning of a win over Central Arkansas (March 18).
- » She went 2-3 with a double and three runs

- scored against No. 1 Oklahoma (March 16).
- » The Katy, Texas native hit a walk-off two-run homer in a run-rule win over lowa during the opening game of the Wooo Pig Classic (Feb. 28).
- » Down to her final strike of the game, Wyckoff kept Arkansas alive in a 2-1 walk-off win over San Diego by singling up the middle on the ninth pitch of her at-bat to drive in Raigan Kramer from second before Arkansas won the game two batters later courtesy of a Bri Ellis SAC fly (Feb. 8).
- » In her Arkansas debut, at Texas State, Wyckoff blasted a solo home run to right field in the top of the sixth inning. (Feb. 6)
- » During her two seasons at Texas Tech, Wyckoff appeared all over the field for the Red Raiders, with nine or more starts at five different positions. She appeared in 51 games at catcher, 24 games in right field, 12 games in left field, 10 games at designated player and nine games at first base.
- » Entering 2025, her career batting average of .400 ranked fourth among all players with multiple seasons of collegiate playing experience at the Power 4 level and 15th nationally among all Division I players.
- » She was named a Top 100 player from both D1 Softball and Softball America. On Jan. 22 she was named a Preseason Second-Team All-American at the utility position from D1 Softball and was ranked as the No. 3 utility player in the D1 Softball position rankings.
- » In 2024 she posted a .407 batting average with 12 doubles, seven home runs and a career-high 35 RBI to earn First-Team All-Big 12 honors. She also recorded 15 multi-hit games and a teambest 24-game reached base streak.
- » As a true freshman in 2023 she became just the second individual conference award winner in Texas Tech history along with earning Second-Team All-Big 12 recognition.

HOGS HAVE A DAY

- Arkansas finalized its 2024 roster with the addition of Texas transfer Courtney Day on Dec. 9, 2024. Day has made a statement in her return to college softball after sitting out the 2024 season after transferring from Texas. Day is batting .329 with 16 home runs, 46 hits, 36 runs scored and 66 RBI while drawing 36 walks and posting a .771 slugging % and a .476 OBP.
- » Day went 2-3 with a an RBI, two runs scored and two walks against Ole Miss (May 23).
- » She went 2-5 with two RBI courtesy of a double and a walk-off single in a win over Oklahoma State (May 17).
- » Day is currently on a career-best 19-game reached-based streak
- » Pearland, Texas product hit her 16th homer of the season in a win over Georgia (May 7).
- » She smashed her 15th homer of the year during a 12-9 win over LSU (May 1).
- » Day hit her 14th homer of the season in a 7-5 win at Texas A&M (April 25).
- » She set a single-season career high with her 13th homer, a three-run shot in a 14-1 win at Colorado State (April 18).
- » Day drove in three runs in a win at UCA with a SAC fly and a bases-clearing double (April 15).
- » She hit a two-run HR on her senior day in a win over Kentucky (March 29).
- » The senior hit a two-run homer off Karlyn Pickens in the Hogs' 6-3 win at Tennessee

(March 22) before homering the next day.

>> Day hit a three-run homer in the series finale against Oklahoma (March 16).

>> During the Wooo Pig Classic (Feb. 28-March 2) she drove in 15 runs while posting a .615 batting average, 1.462 slugging percentage and .667 OBP with eight hits, three doubles, two homers, a triple, four walks and five runs scored.

» Day drove in a career-high six runs while hitting a grand slam in a 12-4 win over Illinois (Feb. 28). She became the first Hog to drive in 6+ runs in a game since Rylin Hedgecock drive in seven in a win over Kentucky on April 22, 2023.

» Day smashed her fourth home run of the season courtesy of a three-run shot in the third innings of a win over ULM (Feb. 14). Later in the day, she doubled and drove in a run during a 9-1 win over LA Tech (Feb. 9).

>> During a 9-1 win over Bradley (Feb. 8), Day went 2-4 and hit a pair of two-run home runs to register her fourth career multi-HR games and the 62nd in program history. Day registered her first multi-HR game as a Hog in just her third game at Arkansas. She was the fastest Razorback newcomer to record a multi-HR game in program history (freshman and transfers included).

>> Day blasted a two-run home run to right field in the top of the fifth inning during a 23-0 win over Lipscomb (Feb. 7). It was her first home run as a Razorback and her first home run in 684 days since she hit a two-run home run on March 26, 2023 while at Texas.

>> Day initially transferred to Ole Miss following the 2023 season but did not play.

>> She is the third Razorback to transfer from Texas in program history, joining Taylor Ellsworth (2021) and Carlee Ratcliff (2023), who was Day's roommate at Texas in 2022.

» During her four seasons in Austin (2020-23), Day posted a .317 batting average and .395 on-base percentage with 120 hits, 22 doubles, two triples, 26 home runs, 63 runs scored, 44 walks and 91 RBI through 176 games played. She has registered 30 multi-hit games and 36 multi-RBI games during her collegiate career.

» Day owned a 2.45 earned run average and 47 strikeouts in 68.2 innings pitched while with the Longhorns.

WELCOME BACK TO THE CIRCLE COURTNEY

» Courtney Day made her first pitching appearance since June 9, 2022 (997 days) on March 2 during the fifth inning of a 13-2 victory over Missouri State. Day pitched a scoreless inning, allowing just one hit in addition to registering an inning-ending strikeout.

>> The 997 days between pitching appearances was the second-longest duration between appearances nationally this season, trailing only Tatum Clopton of LSU, who had a streak of 1,057 days before making an appearance on Feb. 8.

YOUNG HOGS GRABBING HONORS

» Arkansas took three straight SEC Freshman of the Week honors (March 25-April 8). Ella McDowell became the first player in program history to earn consecutive Freshman of the Week laurels (April 1, April 8) The Razorbacks earned backto-back SEC Freshman of the Week honors for the first time ever courtesy of Payton Burnham (March 25) and Ella McDowell (April 1) earning the distinction in consecutive weeks.

HOGS OUTHITTING THE OPPOSITION

Outhitting the opposition has been a major trademark in the Courtney Deifel era (2016-present) for Arkansas.The Razorbacks hold a 290-27 record when outhitting opponents under Deifel, including a 184-9 mark since 2020.

REIS REWRITING HISTORY

>> Arkansas right-hander Reis Beuerlein made history when she threw a five-inning perfect game on April 18 against Colorado State. She struck out two of her 15 batters faced while only throwing 46 pitches. Beuerlein became the third Razorback in program history to pitch a perfect game joining Robyn Herron (2024) and Mary Haff

» She threw 5.1 no-hit innings with 6 strikeouts in relief during the series finale at Tennessee (March 24).

>> She became just the fourth Razorback to pitch 5.1+ innings without allowing a hit in relief since 2001, joining Morgan Leinstock (6.0 vs. Long Beach State, 2024), Robyn Herron (5.2 vs. Drake, 2023) and Chelsea Cohen (6.0 at Missouri State,

>> Beuerlein allowed just one hit (solo HR) in 10.1 innings pitched while posting a 0.68 ERA with 10 strikeouts during the week of March 24-30.

>> Her second cousin, Steve Beuerlein played in the NFL as a QB from 1987-2003 and led the league in passing in 1999.

ROB CAN SPIN IT

Robyn Herron owns a 18-6 record with three saves, a 2.69 ERA and a team-best 157 strikeouts in 140.2 innings pitched in 2025 while limiting opposing hitters to a .194 batting average.

>> She recorded her 11th career complete-game shutout against Oklahoma State (May 18), striking out two while allowing just three hits and two walks in six innings of work.

>> Herron threw a complete game while striking out nine and allowing just one unearned run on six hits in a win over Tennessee (May 8) to earn her 17th win of the season.

» She earned her 16th win of the season by retiring 9 of her 10 batters faced in a 5-1 win over Georgia.

>> Herron earned her 15th win of the season after striking out four and allowing two earned runs on three hits and three walks in a 7-5 win at Texas A&M (April 25).

» She went the distance in both of Arkansas' wins against South Carolina (April 11-13) while posting a 2.86 ERA with 18 strikeout's in 14.2 innings pitched.

>> She earned her 11th win of the season by throwing a complete game in a 4-1 win at No. 2 Florida, allowing just one run on four hits and two walks while striking out four (April 4).

» Herron improved to 10-3 by pitching four innings in which she struck out five and allowed two runs on seven hits against Kentucky (March

» She earned her first career save vs. Kentucky by throwing 2.1 shutout innings with 2 K and one hit allowed (March 28).

>> Herron tied a program single-game record with 16 strikeouts during an eight-inning complete-game win over Tennessee in her last start on March 22. She allowed just four hits in the win.

» On Feb. 20, Herron spun a complete-game one-hit shutout against Cal State Fullerton, while carrying a no-hitter to the fifth and final inning.

» On Feb. 17, Herron threw the 12th no-hitter in program history in a 10-0 (5 inn.) win over ULM. She struck out a season-high 11 batters during her no-hit performance against ULM to improve to 3-0 on the season. The southpaw struck out the side to open and end the game. Only three ULM batters reached base during the contest, two by way of walks in the second and fourth inning, respectively, in addition to a dropped third strike with two outs in the fourth.

» Herron appeared in 29 games while making 19 starts and posting a 12-9 record with a team-best 143 strikeouts in 125.1 innings pitched. Her 1.62 ERA ranked 25th nationally and third among SEC pitchers. She also ranked 40th nationally with five shutouts during the 2024 season while posting three 10+ strikeout games.

» She is one of just seven returning pitchers nationally who ranked in the Top 25 in ERA and Top 40 in shutouts during the 2024 season, joining Nijaree Canady (Texas Tech), Maddia Groff (Omaha), Karlyn Pickens (Tennessee), Kasey Ricard (Boston), Alivia Wilken (North Alabama) and Isabella Smith (Oklahoma).

>> Herron became the second pitcher in program history to throw a seven-inning perfect game while striking out a season-high 11 batters on just 86 pitches in a 7-0 win over Illinois State on Feb. 24, 2024, joining Mary Haff as the other Razorback to accomplish the feat.

>> She joins Mary Haff (3) as the only Razorback pitcher to toss multiple no-hitters under Deifel.

>> Her 10 10+ strikeout games are the third-most in program history, trailing only Katy Henry (2005-08, 14) and Mary Haff (2018-22, 16).

RAKING AT THE PLATE

>> Entering this week, Arkansas ranks among the nation's leaders in numerous categories, including hit-by-pitch (9th, 55), runs per game (7th, 7.65), SAC flies (4th, 29), on-base percentage (6th, .443), RBI per game (11th, 7.04), walks (4th, 272) and slugging percentage (18th, .550).

>> This year's Arkansas team already ranks among the best in program history in batting average (2nd, .323), doubles (1st, 90), slugging % (2nd, .544), on-base % (1st, .442), runs (1st, .432), sacrifice flies (1st, .29), RBI (1st, .395), total bases (2nd, .819), walks (1st, .285) and HR (3rd, .74).

>> Arkansas owns a .443 on-base percentage. One Arkansas starter has an OBP of .600+ while six starters own an on-base percentage of .400+.

>> In hitting coach DJ Gasso's first season in Fayetteville, Arkansas struck out a program-low (COVID season not included) 192 times in 1,408 at-bats during the regular season, bettering the previous program record of 204, which was set in 2014 by 12.

THE LEGEND OF JIMMY

Senior OF Raigan Kramer has one of the more unique nicknames in college softball, since before arriving in Fayetteville, Kramer is known as

Jimmy to her teammates and coaches.

>> "I tried out for a team in 2018 and the coaches didn't know who I was," Kramer said in a 2020 interview. "All they knew was that I was #99. Supposedly, they knew someone who was #99 named Jimmy that they used to play men's fast-pitch with. From then on out that's who I was. It just stuck. I'm almost positive some of the younger girls that were in our organization have no idea that my name is not actually Jimmy.'

She became just the fifth player in program history to register 100+ walks in a career during a 2-1 series finale win over Kentucky (March 30).

>> She is batting .303 with 44 hits, 54 runs scored, seven doubles, two home runs, 26 RBI and 51 walks in addition to posting a .488 onbase percentage.

>> Kramer blasted a grand slam in a 6-1 win over Tennessee on May 8. The grand slam was the second of her career and the first allowed in Karlyn Pickens' college career.

>> Her 51 walks are the fifth-most in program history, trailing only Bri Ellis (50) and Devon Wallace who drew 51+ in three of her four seasons while at Arkansas (2012-15).

>> She drew a career-high four walks in a 9-0 win at Tennessee (March 23).

>> Kramer is one of the most disciplined hitters in program history and is currently ranked 2nd in

program history in career walks with 115.

» She is one of 10 active players nationally entering the 2025 season, having registered 32+walks in each of the previous two seasons.

>> Kramer and Devon Wallace (2011-2014) are the only players with 30+ walks in three consecutive seasons in program history.

UTES TO HOGS

>> Arkansas assistant DJ Gasso, second baseman Karlie Davison and GA Mariah Lopez all helped lead Utah to a College World Series appearance in 2022 while at Utah.

DISCIPLINED DUO

>> 1B Bri Ellis and OF Raigan Kramer became the seventh pair of Arkansas teammates in the past 20 years to register 30+ walks in the same season in 2024 before doing so in 2025.

>> Ellis (66) and Kramer (51) are the team leaders in walks for Arkansas this season.

HITTIN' HOGS

» Arkansas has posted a 196-21 overall record when registering 12+ hits in a single game since 2006, including á 120-12 mark undér Cóurtney De-

>> The Razorbacks are 17-1 this season and posted a 9-1 record in 2024 when registering 10+ hits and have won 70 of their past 75 contests when accomplishing the feat since 2020.

ROB 5+ = GOOD NEWS FOR THE HOGS

>> Arkansas is 28-6 (.824) when Robyn Herron goes 5+ innings in her collegiate career.

ROOMIES REUNITED

» Courtney Day and Carlee Ratcliff are no strangers as both played together at Texas from 2021-22 and were roommates together during the 2022 season.

>> Ratcliff, who enters her second season as a Razorback, was the one who initially reached out to the Arkansas coaching staff with the news that Day had entered the portal.

RAZORBACKS REPRESENTING THE USA

Arkansas freshmen Ella McDowell and Cam Harrison helped guide the U.S. U-18 Women's National Team (WNT) to a first-place finish in the World Baseball Softball Confederation (WBSC) U-18 World Cup Group C Stage Event as team USA posted a perfect 6-0 record on Aug. 29-Sept. 2, 2024 in their final action as U-18 team members.

>> McDowell was named the most outstanding player of the event after posting an impressive .733 batting average and .750 on-base percentage with 11 hits, two doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, and a walk. The Richmond, Texas native also posted a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage with two putouts and eight assists while playing third base. McDowell led all players in the event in five statistical categories, including batting average (.733), home runs (2), on-base percentage (.750), slugging percentage (1.267) and onbase plus slugging percentage (2.017).

>> Harrison was dominant in her two outings in the circle, posting a 1.00 earned run average with four strikeouts and three hits allowed in seven innings pitched. She picked up a six-inning complete-game victory in a 9-1 win over Canada on Aug. 30., striking out two and allowing just three hits. The Katy, Texas, product followed up her complete game with a 1-2-3 inning of relief that featured two strikeouts in a 7-0 win over the Philippines on Sept. 1.

NO FREE PASSES

>> Arkansas is 141-41 since 2001, when its pitching staff issues no walks in a game.

» The Razorbacks are 86-18 when issuing no walks under head coach Courtney Deifel (2016-present).

>> Arkansas has won 15 of its last 16 when issuing zero walks dating back to April 6, 2023.

>> In the past 20 years, Arkansas has had a pitcher throw 5+ innings in a single game without allowing a walk 26 times. When the feat is accomplished, Arkansas owns a record 20-6. Arkansas was 3-0 last year when accomplishing the feat courtesy of a pair of wins from Robyn Herron and a win from Morgan Leinstock.

» Arkansas is 175-47 when not committing an error under Courtney Deifel.

» The freshman class of Payton Burnham, Ava Carter, Cam Harrison, Lexi King, Ella McDowell, Jayden Ramos, Ashtyn Reichardt and Ramsey Walker was ranked as the fifth-best class in the country according to Extra-Inning Softball.

CALLING ON CAM

» Harrison threw 4.0 scoreless innings, allowing just one hit and two walks vs. Ole Miss (May 23).

- » In a series finale win over No. 2 Florida, Harrison was magnificent in relief after inheriting a tough situation with no outs and the bases loaded in the bottom of the first inning. Following a grand slam from Florida's Reagan Walsh, Harrison buckled down and allowed just one run on five hits and four walks while striking out five in 6.1 innings to record her fourth win of the season to improve to 4-1. Payton Burnham also earned a save after entering the game with two on and two outs in the bottom of the seventh and issuing a lineout for the game's final out.
- » In a win over Central Arkansas, Harrison threw 2.1 innings of one-hit relief with two strikeouts to earn a save (March 18).
- » Harrison threw three scoreless innings in relief at Ole Miss (March 8).
- >> The Brookshire, Texas, product became the 12th Arkansas freshman in the last 20 years to strike out eight or more batters in a game during her first collegiate start. She fanned eight while allowing just one run on two hits and a walk in five innings of work against San Diego (Feb. 8).
- » A day after her first save, Harrison inherited a bases-loaded situation with only one out and the potential winning run at the plate and collected a save in a 3-1 victory over Bradley (Feb. 7).
- » Harrison picked up her first career save in her Razorback debut in the season opener at Texas State (Feb. 6).

KATY CONNECTION

» Kailey Wyckoff, Cam Harrison and Ashtyn Reichardt all prepped at Katy High School in Katy, Texas. It marks the first time since 2010 that the Razorbacks have had three players on the roster hat all attended the same high school. The only other trio to all attended the same high school and play together at Arkansas was Tori Mort, Brittany Robison and Jessica Robison, who all attended Owasso High School in Owasso, Okla.

EIGHT IS GREAT

» Arkansas is 223-3 when scoring eight or more runs since 2002, including a 156-1 mark during the Courtney Deifel era (2016-present).

» The Razorbacks are on a 94-game winning streak when scoring 8+ runs. The last loss the Razorbacks had when accomplishing the feat was a 12-11 loss to Oklahoma State on Feb. 11, 2021, during the season opener at the Best on the Bayou Classic in Monroe, La.

PUTTING UP RUNS

» The Hogs' 20 runs in a 20-3 series-finale win over Ole Miss (March 9), were tied for the second-most in program history and were the most in a single game against a conference opponent and ranked opponent in program history.

MAKING THE MOST OF IT

- » Freshman Ashtyn Reichardt medically redshirted this season due to tearing her ACL in the summer prior to her enrollment this fall.
- » Reichardt still makes her precense known on gamedays as the Razorbacks' first base coach. She is believed to be the only player that serves as the first base in the country.

MCDOWELL WOWS

- » Freshman infielder Ella McDowell has wasted no time making her presence known as a Razorback. She is batting .356 this season with 63 hits, seven home runs, 10 doubles, a triple, 53 RBI, 39 runs scored and 20 walks.
- >> McDowell went 3-4 with a double, two RBI and two runs scored in a 12-0 Regional final win over Oklahoma State (May 18).
- >> She smashed a game-tying doulbe in the seventh inning of a 6-5 (8 inn.) win over Oklahoma State (May 17).
- » McDowell blasted a three-run shot in a 7-5 series opening with at Texas A&M (April 25).
- >> She drove in a career-high five RBI during 2-4 game with a three-run double during a series-opening win over No. 10 South Carolina on April 11.
- » McDowell was named D1 Softball National Player of the Week and SEC Freshman of the Week after batting .706 during the week with 12 hits, three doubles, a home run, eight RBI and four runs scored in addition to a walk. She posted a .722 on-base percentage and 1.059 on-base percentage while registering multiple hits in all four of the Razorbacks' games to increase her hitting streak to six games while improving her batting average by 56 percentage points. During the second game at No. 2 Florida, McDowell went 4-5 with four RBI, three of which came on a three-run homer in the top of the third inning. Her four hits were a single-game career high and marked the first four-hit game by a Razorback this season, while her four RBI tied a single-game career high.
- » She hit a game-winning solo HR in a 2-1 series-finale win over Kentucky (March 30) to earn SEC Freshman of the Week honors.
- >> McDowell went 2-4 with 2 RBI in a loss to No. 1 Oklahoma (March 15).
- » She went 2-3 with four RBI in a 20-3 thumping of Ole Miss (March 9).
- » McDowell blasted a two-run home run in a win over Missouri State on March 2.
- » In a 12-4 win over Southern Miss, she went 2-4 with a HR, a 2B and two runs scored (Feb. 15).
- » In a season-opening 3-1 win at Texas State, McDowell led Arkansas at the plate by going 2-3 with a solo home run in the sixth inning (Feb. 6)
- » She became the first Razorback freshman to homer on opening day since Rylin Hedgecock accomplished the feat on Feb. 7, 2020 during a 10-0 win over UTEP in Las Cruces, New Mexico.

AMERICA'S BEST

» Bri Ellis was named Softball America Player of the Year on May 20 as four Razorbacks earned All-America honors. Ellis became the first player in program history to be named a national player of the year by a major publication.

» Ellis (first-team), Robyn Herron (second-team), Payton Burnham (freshman) and Ella McDowell (freshman) were Razorbacks to earn All-America honors from Softball America.

COACH OF COACHES

» Arkansas head coach Courtney Deifel has tutored 16 coaches or players that have gone on to become head coaches or earned positions at the collegiate level which is the second-most nationally trailing only Patty Gasso of Oklahoma according to D1 Softball.

» Deifel served as a graduate assistant under Gasso from 2008-09 at Oklahoma.

ROCKY TOPPED

» By winning the first two games of their series on March 22-23, the Razorbacks became the first team to win an SEC series in Knoxville since they accomplished the feat previously on March 18-20, 2022, when they took the first two games of the three-game set. Tennessee entered the series having won 17 of their last 18 league series, including 11 straight at home.

WOOO SWEEP SOOIE

>> With a sweep of Kentucky (March 28-30) the Hogs earned their first SEC Sweep since March 31-April 2, 2023, when Arkansas swept Mississippi State in Starkville, Miss. It was the first sweep at Bogle Park for the Hogs since April 29-May 1, 2022, when they took all three games against South Carolina.

BRI BE BREAKING RECORDS

» On May 7, Bri Ellis broke the Arkansas single-season HR record and RBI record by hitting a walk-off grand slam in a 5-1 victory over Georgia during the first round of SEC play. The grand slam was her 26th HR of the season and also tied the single-season SEC HR record.

» Ellis made history when she hit a three-run homer in the third inning of the Razorbacks' 20-3 thumping of Ole Miss on March 9. The three-run shot was her 61st career home run, passing Danielle Gibson-Whorton (60) for the most in an entire career by any Arkansas player in program history when including home runs at their previous institutions prior to transferring.

COACH COURTNEY... COURTNEY DAY

» Courtney Deifel is not the only Courtney with head coaching experience when it comes to the 2025 Razorbacks. UTL Courtney Day spent the 2024 softball season serving as the head softball coach at Tarkington High School in Cleveland, Texas, where she also taught math during her break away from college softball.

» Day led the Longhorns to a 15-13-1 mark, according to MaxPreps and an appearance in the Texas 4A State Playoffs. The 15-13-1 record was tied for the best by a Tarkington team since at least 2006.

>> "Coaching quizzed me," Day said of the experience in a March 2025 article with D1 Softball. "How much did I remember from the game now that I was having to coach it? I had to sit down and think of strategies - as a player, it just came naturally. Now I had to think about it and, as a coach, try to teach what I know to 20 or 40 different girls."

» The first win came against UCLA on Feb. 18, 2011. A year later, the Hogs topped Cal 3-2 in the opening game of NCAA Regional play on May 18, 2012 (NFCA Poll).

>> Arkansas defeated No. 1 Texas A&M 7-5 on April 25, marking the first win over a No. 1 opponent under head coach Courtney Deifel.

» The Razorbacks followed with a series win at No. 1/2 Texas A&M on April 25-27 by taking the first two games against the Aggies, 7-5 and 7-4. It was the highest ranked series win and only series win against a No. 1 opponent in the NFCA Poll in pogram history.

STREAK SNAPPERS

» Arkansas snapped Oklahoma State's 16-game regional round win streak with a pair of wins in last week's regional. The Cowgirls' 16-game regional win streak was the longest active streak in the country entering the weekend.

» In Sunday's Regional Championship, Arkansas handed Oklahoma State a 12-0 defeat which was the Cowgirls' largest in their entire NCAA and AIAW Postseason history which spans 190 games dating back to 1978.

RIJO, ROJO, CALIENTE

» Atalyia Rijo set the Arkansas program record for hits in an NCAA Tournament game with four in a 6-5 win over Oklahoma State (May 18). She started the Hogs comeback by smashing a solo homer in the sixth inning and singled before scoring the game's winning run in the eighth.

- » Rijo tied her own record a day later with another 4-4 performance in Sunday's 12-0 Regional Final win with four singles, an RBI and two runs scored. She became the first player in program history to register consecutive four hit games.
- » She batted .900 (9-10) with a solo HR, three RBI and a walk during the Hogs' regional last weekend.

COURTNEY DEIFEL

HEAD COACH
Career: 386-205 (11 Seasons)

Arkansas: 359-178 (10 Seasons)

Courtney Deifel became the fourth head coach in program | history when she was hired on June 11, 2015, and recently completed her ninth season at Arkansas in 2024. In her nine seasons in Fayetteville, she has orchestrated the Razorbacks' return to postseason play and guided the program to two SEC regular season championships, one SEC Tournament crown and seven NCAA Tournament appearances, which includes seven consecutive berths from 2017-24. The Hogs have qualified for the national tournament every year it has been held since 2017. Deifel led the program to its first NCAA Tournament Super Regional appearances in 2018, 2021 and 2022, Since her first season in 2016, the Razorbacks have been ranked 99 times in the NFCA Coaches' Poll after previously being ranked only once in program history. 13 of the program's 14 NFCA All-American awards and 78 Easton/NFCA All-America Scholar-Athlete accolades have been accumulated under Deifel since 2016. Deifel - the program's all-time wins leader - enters the 2025 season with 315 career wins at Arkansas. Deifel has logged four 40-win seasons while at Arkansas, including three consecutive 40-win seasons from 2021-23. Prior to her arrival

in Fayetteville, Arkansas recorded only two 40-win seasons

across 19 years. Heading into her 10th season at helm in 2025,

Arkansas has won two of the last three SEC regular season

crowns

In 2024, Deifel led the Razorbacks to a 37-18 mark (14-10 SEC). and a No. 12 national seed in the NCAA tournament, the fifth in program history, all of which have come under Deifel's watch. The NCAA tournament appearance was a program record seventh-straight, dating back to the 2017 season. Deifel won her 300th career game with a 5-1 win at Auburn on March 16, 2024, completing a doubleheader sweep over the Tigers. Under Deifel's guidance, first baseman Bri Ellis (Second Team) and right-handed pitcher Morgan Leinstock (Third Team) earned NFCA All-America honors. Leinstock posted a 2.14 ERA and a 13-6 record while striking out 137 batters in 140.2 innings pitched. Deifel's and the Razorbacks' success in the transfer portal continued into 2024 as Ellis led the team with 14 home runs, 47 RBI, 97 total bases and a .651 slugging percentage while posting a .322 batting average with 48 hits after transferring from Auburn. Freshman Kennedy Miller earned Freshman All-America honors from DI Softball and was a Finalist for the TUCCI/NFCA Freshman of the Year award after breaking onto the scene by hitting .331 with eight home runs and 36 RBI, Behind the plate. Miller posted a .997 fielding percentage while throwing out five would-be base stealers. Ellis and Leinstock received All-SEC selections along with center fielder Reagan Johnson and second baseman Cylie Halvorson. Additionally Ellis and third baseman Hannah Gammill were named to the SEC All-Defensive Team.

In the 2023 campaign, Deifel led Arkansas to another highly successful season and the program's sixth consecutive NCAA appearance - the longest streak in program history. Finishing 40-19 (14-10 SEC), Arkansas claimed its third straight 40-win season and a top-four SEC finish. Earning the No. 11 national seed in the NCAA Tournament, all four of the program's national seeds have been accumulated under Deifel. In Arkansas' 7-6 win vs. No. 22 Louisiana on Feb. 18. Deifel became the

program's all-time wins leader after surpassing Carrie Dever-Boaz's (1997-2004) 244 wins at helm. Under Deifel's leadership, two Razorbacks received NFCA All-America recognition in 2023 - Rylin Hedgecock (NFCA First-Team All-America) and Chenise Delce (NFCA Second-Team All-America). Delce became the program's first two-time NFCA All-American pitcher after collecting the honor in 2022. Six Hogs claimed NFCA All-Region status - Chenise Delce, Cylie Halvorson, Reagan Johnson and Rylin Hedgecock were named to the All-South Region First Team, Raigan Kramer was tabbed to the second team and Lauren Camenzind was selected to the third team. Delce had another breakout season in the circle, posting a 21-11 record and 2.02 ERA with 193 strikeouts, 17 complete games, six solo shutouts and four saves while limiting opponents to a .200 batting average. The 2022 SEC Pitcher of the Year, Delce picked up where she left off in 2023. The Oklahoma City product charted the fourth-most strikeouts (193) and saves by an SEC pitcher this year. She also filed the third-most wins by a league pitcher. Illustrating why she's a force in the circle, 11 of her victories came against ranked competition. True freshman Reagan Johnson excelled at the plate and in center field. earning a spot on D1Softball's Freshman All-America team and being honored as a Top 10 Finalist for NFCA/TUCCI's National Freshman of the Year award. Johnson peppered the thirdmost hits (79) in single-season program history. She also boasted the sixth-highest batting average (.378) along with tying for the seventh-most stolen bases (18) and 10th-most runs scored (47) in single-season program history. Johnson also paced Arkansas with 24 multi-hit outings this season. The Karnes City, Texas, native ranked second in the SEC and eighth nationally in hits. Johnson also shined in center field and compiled a .968 fielding percentage with 86 putouts and four assists on 93 total chances.

In 2022, Deifel guided the Razorbacks to their most successful season in school history, collecting back-to-back SEC regular season titles, headlined by the program's first outright regular season crown, and the program's first SEC Tournament championship after blanking Missouri, 4-0, in Gainesville, Fla., on May 13. Arkansas concluded the season with the most single-season wins in program history and a 48-11 record, marking a program-record .814 win percentage. Arkansas finished SEC play with a 19-5 record, producing the second consecutive 19-win conference season for the Hogs. Against Missouri State on March 3. Deifel became just the second head coach in program history to reach 200 career wins. The Hogs made their 11th NCAA Tournament appearance, earning the program's highest overall seed (No. 4) and hosted their second straight Super Regional. The Razorbacks hosted the highest attended Regional and Super Regional in the NCAA in 2022. The Razorbacks tabbed an SEC-best 12 all-conference honors and a school-record five NFCA All-American nods to round out yet another enormous postseason awards haul. Arkansas became the first SEC program since 2006 to have four first team all-Americans. Danielle Gibson (first team) became the program's first two-time NFCA All-American while KB Sides (first team), Linnie Malkin (first team), Hannah Gammill (first team) and Chenise Delce (second team) earned their first All-American honors. For the first time in program history, all

eight NFCA All-Region nominees secured spots on All-South Region teams. Deifel was named SEC Coach of the Year for the second straight season while KB Sides became the program's its first-ever SEC Player of the Year honor and Chenise Delce earned the Hogs' second consecutive SEC Pitcher of the Year accolade after Mary Haff collected the award in 2021. Arkansas tabbed a league-best 12 all-conference honors and eight NFCA All-Region distinctions to round out an enormous postseason awards haul. The 2022 coaching staff was named the NFCA's South Region Staff of the Year for the second straight season.

Deifel, the SEC Coach of the Year, directed the most successful year in program history in 2021 by claiming the school's first SEC regular season title and hosting NCAA Tournament Super Regionals for the first time. The team finished 43-11 (19-5 SEC), producing a then-school record .796 win percentage. The Hogs earned a No. 6 national ranking, the highest in program history, and captured the No. 6 national seed in the NCAA Tournament. Arkansas began conference play winning 12 straight games, notching the fifth-best league-only start in SEC history. A 19-game winning streak in non-conference action also set a school record. The Razorbacks received many postseason superlatives as infielders Braxton Burnside and Danielle Gibson, and pitcher Mary Haff were named NFCA All-Americans. Haff also took home the school's first SEC Pitcher of the Year award. Offensively, the Razorbacks shattered the school's single-season home run record, mashing 95 long balls with Burnside setting the individual single-season program mark hitting 25. Deifel's 216 wins in Fayetteville rank second among all coaches in program history. The NFCA named the 2021 coaching staff the South Region's Staff of

Deifel guided the Razorbacks to a 19-6 (1-2 SEC) record in the COVID-19 shortened 2020 campaign. In the only league series of the season, the Razorbacks earned a 1-0 conference-opening victory, their first road win over Alabama since 2000. Arkansas remained in the national polls throughout the year and climbed from a preseason No. 24 ranking to the No. 19 slot in the final release of the NFCA Coaches' Poll. Junior catcher Kayla Green was honored with SEC Player of the Week recognition for the first time in her career and freshman pitcher Jenna Bloom emerged as one of the rising stars in the league, leading all freshmen in the nation striking out 10.9 hitters per seven innings.

Deifel led the Razorbacks to their third consecutive postseason appearance in 2019, earning an at-large bid to the Stillwater Regional. The Hogs finished the season 38-20 and 12-12 in SEC play. It marks the first time since 1999-00 that the Razorbacks finished the season .500 or better in conference play in back-to-back seasons. The Razorbacks garnered their highest in-season ranking during weeks one and two, coming in at 12th and 11th in the NFCA and ESPN polls respectively.

Arkansas saw two players named to the All-SEC teams, pitcher Autumn Storms was named second team and outfielder Hannah McEwen garnered first-team recognition. McEwen's first-team selection was the first for Arkansas since 2012 and only the second in program history. In year four under Coach Deifel, the Razorbacks also earned two SEC Player of the Week awards, three SEC Pitcher of the Week awards, and one USA Softball Co-Player of the Week. A record five Razorbacks were named to the NFCA All-Region teams, with Storms garnering the first, first-team selection of her career. Storms went on to be named NFCA Second Team All-American as a pitcher, the first Razorback since 2010.

Year four with Coach Deifel and the Razorback staff saw growth in all aspects as the game, including a team .288 batting average, which ranks second-highest in program record book. In fact, four of the top seven team batting averages in program history come from the Deifel era.

In the 2018 campaign, Arkansas wrapped up the year with a 42-17 (12-12 SEC) record, the third most wins in program history; and the most victories since 2000. The team earned a national seed (13) in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history and went 3-0 defeating DePaul and Wichita State twice to earn the Fayetteville Regional Championship on its home field. The Hogs made their first ever NCAA Super Regional appearance but fell to eventual national semifinalist, Oklahoma, in Norman. Arkansas finished 17th in the final NCAA RPI report and the coaching staff earned 2018 NFCA Division I South Region Staff of the Year.

Just two seasons removed from a one-win conference tally, Deifel guided the Razorbacks to a 12-12 mark in SEC play. As the No. 7 seed at SEC Tournament, the program made its first semifinal appearance since 2001. The Razorbacks finished the season with a 27-2 record on their home field, establishing a new program record for home wins in a single season. Part of Arkansas' home triumphs included the program's first three-game sweep of a ranked team (No. 20 Mississippi State) and its first-ever series win over Alabama.

Deifel piloted the 2017 Razorbacks to a 31-24 record and the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2013. The Razorbacks improved their win total by 17 games from the previous season, marking the largest increase in the country among Power 5 programs. Arkansas also tallied seven wins in SEC play, equaling the combined total from the previous three seasons. In recognition of the team's performance, Deifel was named the 2017 DISoftballNews Coach of the Year.

From year one to two under Deifel, Arkansas' pitching staff

lowered its combined ERA by more than four runs (6.98 to 2.82) and added more than 20 points to its batting average (.260 to .284). The Razorbacks also led the SEC and tied for 17th in the NCAA with 59 home runs. During the year, Arkansas earned its first national ranking since 2013 when it was slotted at No. 24 in the March 7 release ESPN/USA Softball poll.

Individually, Deifel saw two Razorbacks earn NFCA All-South Region accolades with Nicole Schroeder and Autumn Storms earning second-team and third-team honors, respectively. Storms was also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team while A.J. Belans was voted to the All-SEC Second Team. Schroeder went on to be drafted by the Akron Racers as the program's second NPF selection.

Deifel's first win over a ranked team at Arkansas came during the 2016 season when the Razorbacks knocked off No. 23 Nebraska, 11-10, during the Easton Tournament in Fullerton, Calif.; the team added five ranked wins in 2017. The 2016 campaign also saw newcomer Ashley Diaz make an immediate impact as a member of the NFCA All-South Region Second Team and garnered NFCA National Freshman of the Year Top 25 Watch List recognition.

During her playing and coaching careers prior to coming to Arkansas, Deifel advanced to 11 NCAA Tournaments including a four-year run to the Women's College World Series (WCWS) as an All-American catcher at California that was highlighted by winning the 2002 national title. The Bears also finished second (2003), fifth (2001) and seventh (2000) at the WCWS over her four-year run. Her postseason successes also featured a pair of Super Regionals as a graduate assistant at Oklahoma and five NCAA Regionals as an assistant at Maryland and Louisville

As a first-year head coach, Deifel ushered in a culture of change for Maryland in 2015. Along with the program's 16-game improvement from the previous season, the Terrapins' offense show tremendous growth. Maryland finished 27th in the NCAA with 6.28 runs per game behind 339 runs scored, up more than 150 runs from 2014. Deifel also led her team to a .309 batting average, a 40-point jump from 2014 which also ranked 57th in the NCAA.

Individually, Deifel guided three players to all-conference accolades and a pair of NFCA all-region honors. Lindsey Schmeister was an All-Big Ten first team performer while Shannon Bustillos and Erin Pronobis landed on the All-Big Ten second team. Probonis and Corey Schwartz were also named to the NFCA All-Midwest Region Third Team. Under Deifel's watch, the trio helped Maryland to single-season school records in doubles, home runs, RBI and walks.

Prior to taking the head job at Maryland, Deifel spent four seasons as an assistant coach at Louisville in which she helped the Cardinals to four NCAA appearances, the 2014 American Athletic Conference Tournament title and an overall record of 176-60 (.746). Louisville averaged 44 wins in that time with a program-record 55 wins in 2012. Her student-athletes at Lou-

isville racked up four NFCA All-America certificates and 29 all-conference selections.

She also spent two seasons as a graduate assistant at Oklahoma where she was a member of a staff the guided the 2008 Sooners to a 47-14 record and a Super Regional appearance.

As a player, Deifel was the starting catcher for California from 2000-03 and led the Golden Bears to four Women's College World Series appearances including a national championship run in 2002 and national runner-up showing in 2003. She appeared in 285 games missing just three behind the plate over her four seasons. As a four-year starter behind the plate, she was a 2003 All-American, two-time All-Pac 10 selection and caught seven no-hitters. She is still the program's career leader with 1,969 putouts.

Aside from her accomplishments in collegiate softball, Deifel had a successful professional career following her days at Cal. In 2004, she helped the NY/NJ Juggernaut to the National Professional Fastpitch (NPF) league title. Deifel also spent three years with LeoPalace21 in Japan that resulted in a runner-up showing and a pair of third-place finishes.

She graduated from California in 2003 with a bachelor of arts in American Business and Globalism and American Studies. Deifel earned her master's of arts in Human Relations from Oklahoma in 2008.

Deifel's sister, Amanda Scott, is currently the head softball coach at Missouri-St. Louis and won a Women's College World Series title at Fresno State in 1998.

Deifel and her husband Joe are the parents of two sons, Trip and Walt. The family resides in Fayetteville.
