




#### **Four Returning Starters**

The Razorback men's golf team returns four of its five members from last season's NCAA Championships squad including its top two players. Sophomore Sebastian Cappelen posted one of Arkansas' best single-season stroke averages ever last year and will be joined at the top of the lineup by senior Ethan Tracy. The other Razorbacks returning from last season's NCAA squad include junior Austin Cook and sophomore Will Pearson.

### **Tracy Wins Western**

Senior Ethan Tracy had a fantastic summer which was head-

lined by his improbable victory at the Western Amateur in Glenview, Ill. Ranked No. 130 in the World Amateur ranking entering the event, Tracy finished stroke play in a tie for 11th to advance to the 16-person match play field. Over the next two days, defeated Tracy 25 Derek



### **World Amateur Rankings**

As the Razorbacks gear up for the 2011-12 collegiate season, several Arkansas players rank among the World Amateur Golf Rankings. As of Aug. 14, 2011, Sebastian Cappelen is No. 12, Ethan Tracy is No. 66, Austin Cook is No. 259, Josh Eure is No. 493 and Will Pearson is No. 943.

#### **Summer Recap**

Members of the Razorback men's golf team enjoyed tremendous success last season and that carried over to the summer. Ethan Tracy was the big winner with his championship at the Western Amateur, but he also had another top 30 finish at the Players Amateur. Sebastian Cappelen had a great showing at the prestigious Palmer Cup, winning three of four matches including both singles and placed 18th at the European Team Championship. Austin Cook had four top 20 finishes including a second-place showing at the Arkansas State Golf Association's Stroke Play Championship. Will Pearson tied for eighth and advanced to match play at the WE Cole Cotton States Invitational while

> Josh Eure posted three top 25 finishes in four events. Joe Doramus won the Southern Amateur qualifier in Little Rock to advance to the finals of the event and William Meason placed well in each of three events that he participated. **Tobias** Pettersson rounded out the summer circuit with a fifth-place finish back in his native Sweden and a 22nd-place finish at the Norwegian National Championship.



### **2011-12 Schedule**

Arkansas' 2011-12 schedule has several similarities to last season, but head coach Brad McMakin decided to amp up the competition with a veteran squad returning. Some of the new events on the schedule include The Golfweek Conference Challenge, Windon Memorial Classic and Callaway Collegiate Match Play Championship. Those events are added to an already solid lineup including the Cabo Collegiate, John Hayt Invitational and SEC Championships.

#### One Newcomer

With a veteran team returning for the Razorbacks in 2011-12, it may be difficult for Arkansas' sole newcomer to make an impact. Fortunately for Kolton Crawford, he has the credentials to back up his claim as one of Arkansas' top golfers. The Mansfield, Texas, native had an impressive summer that included a trip to the U.S. Amateur and a top 25 finish at the Texas State Open.

### **Three Returning All-Americans**

Three Razorbacks earned All-America honors to end the 2010-11 season. Sebastian Cappelen was an honorable mention PING All-American as well as third-team *Golfweek* accolades. Austin Cook also earned PING honorable mention notoriety and Ethan Tracy completed the trifecta with honorable mention *Golfweek* honors. The PING awards are presented by the Golf Coaches Association of America.

#### No. 5 All-Time

To say that Sebastian Cappelen had a good freshman year would be a disservice to the year he had. The then-freshman posted the fifth best single stroke average in Arkansas history with his 71.79 average and his mark is also the

best ever by a true freshman. Cappelen improved upon the freshman mark that had been set by All-American Craig Lile during the 1997-98 season when he averaged 72.94.




### MANSFIELD HIGH SCHOOL





# Brad McMakin

Head Coach Sixth Year Oklahoma, 1991

Brad McMakin is beginning his sixth year at the helm of the Arkansas men's golf program and is the 13th head coach in school history.

A highly successful coach prior to joining the Razorbacks, McMakin turned around the Arkansas program in just two years and took the team to new heights in the spring of 2009 when he led the Razorbacks to a runner-up finish at the NCAA Championships. In his five seasons as the head Razorback, McMakin's teams have been to four NCAA Regional

Championships, two NCAA Championships and placed in the top four of the Southeastern Conference Championships twice. Individually, McMakin was named the SEC Coach of the Year in 2009 and was a finalist for the Dave Williams National Coach of the Year award in 2011.

While his teams have shown an ability to rise to the best competition, it is McMakin's ability to recruit and cultivate top notch talent that makes him successful. Since his arrival, Arkansas has been awarded 10 All-SEC selections and seven All-America honors.

Some of his most recent former standouts include David Lingmerth and Andrew Landry, the tandem that paced Arkansas to the 2009 NCAA runner-up finish. Landry, a three-time All-American, completed his eligibility after the 2009 season, less than a month after that momentous occasion, began his professional career on the Nationwide Tour. Lingmerth earned a second All-America honor in 2010 and became the first Arkansas player to play in the prestigious Palmer Cup that summer going 2-2 in the Ryder-Cup style format.

Arkansas' 2008-09 season was certainly one for the record books as it shocked some of best programs in the nation on its way to NCAA runner-up honors. Finishing outside the top five in just one of 13 tournaments that season, the Razorbacks put together an impressive spring that included five straight second-place finishes which included the SEC, NCAA Regional and NCAA Championships. The Hogs defeated Washington (3 & 2), and Georgia (3-1-1) in match play at the national championships before eventually falling on the final hole to Texas A&M. Arkansas' impressive spring earned McMakin SEC Coach of the Year honors making him the first Razorback skipper to take the distinction.

Before his move to Fayetteville, McMakin was the head coach at Lamar University in Beaumont, Texas, where he spent a decade. In 2006, he led the Cardinals to a ninth-place finish at the NCAA Championships and the Cardinals won an NCAA-best seven tournaments in 13 events in 2006, placing two golfers in the top 10 individual finishers at the NCAA Championships.

After arriving at Lamar, McMakin revitalized the program, returning it to the top of the Southland Conference (SLC) and back onto the national scene. In his 10-year stint, Lamar won five SLC titles, made six-consecutive NCAA Central Regional appearances and earned its first trip to the NCAA Championships (2006) in 20 years (1986). In McMakin's final six seasons at Lamar, the Cardinals had three players earn All-America honors, three golfers capture SLC individual medalist honors, 21 all-conference performers, a newcomer of the year, three freshmen of the year and the conference's only four-time player of the year.

A native of Beaumont, Texas, McMakin was named the Eaton/Golf Pride South Central Region Coach of the Year in 2006 after leading his squad to the NCAA Championships and a fifth-place showing at the NCAA Central Regional. The Cardinals captured their 20th Southland Conference championship and placed all five players on the all-conference team. McMakin was tabbed as the SLC Coach of the Year five times (1999, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2006) in his 10-year run at Lamar.

Prior to accepting the head coaching job at Lamar, McMakin spent four years as a professional golfer, competing on several mini tours as well as playing on the Nike and Hooters Tours.

Originally signing with Lamar out of high school, McMakin transferred to Oklahoma when former LU coach Greg Grost accepted the Oklahoma men's golf job. It proved to be a wise move for McMakin as he would help the Sooners win a national championship during the 1989 season. McMakin, a co-captain of that squad, served in the same capacity the following year as Oklahoma finished fifth at the national tournament.

McMakin was also a standout golfer on the Kelly High School golf team. He was a regular in the TCIL state tournament and earned medalist honors four times. While at Kelly, McMakin played for former Lamar coach Charles Rodemacher.

The 40-year old McMakin earned a bachelor degree in communications from Oklahoma in 1991. He and his wife, Tonia, have one son - Matthew (7).



# Barrett Lais

Assistant Coach Second Year Arkansas, 2008

One of the up-and-coming young coaching in college golf, Barrett Lais, is a former Razorback player who rejoined his alma mater prior to the 2010-11 season. A 2008 graduate of the University of Arkansas' Walton College of Business with a degree in marketing, Lais returns to the Ozarks after a two-year stint with the University of Denver where he served as an assistant coach.

In his two seasons with the Pioneers, Lais helped guide the program to 11 top-five tournament finishes as well as an NCAA Regional appearance in 2009. He coached senior Espen Kofstad to the NCAA Championships as an individual. Kolfstad's play earned him PING Division I Honorable Mention All-Region honors. Kofstad and Daniel Wax each earned all-conference recognition and all-region honors in 2009.

"I am really excited to bring Barrett back as an assistant coach," Arkansas head coach Brad McMakin said upon Lais' hire. "Barrett is young and ambitious and brings a knowledge of the Razorback program. He gained a lot of experience in his time at Denver, experience that will help him succeed here. Barrett did an exceptional job recruiting at Denver and signed the No. 1 players from Norway and from Arizona."

Lais' duties at Arkansas include travel, recruiting, course management and player development. The Joplin, Mo., native got right to work after being hired in mid-July, work that is already paying dividends as he looks to add some of the best talent in the country to Arkansas' program.

Along with his prowess as a recruiter, Lais is also a certified golfing machine authorized instructor.

As a player for the Razorbacks, Lais played in 15 tournaments over four years and 45 rounds, averaging 75.60 strokes. He placed 11th at the Gopher Invitational in 2007 and hit a career low round of 68 at the Fighting Irish Gridiron Classic, also in 2007. As a senior in 2007-08 he played in a career high six tournaments and 18 rounds with a

75.00 stroke average. He was named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll four times and was named to several University of Arkansas academic award lists. In addition to the time spent on the course and in the classroom, Lais also participated in the First Tee program and served as a golf camp instructor.

Lais is married to Jessica (LaMar), who also graduated from Arkansas. The couple welcomed the birth of their first child, son Hudson LaMar, on Feb. 13, 2011.

# Dave England Head Athletic Trainer for Men's Basketball and Baseball

Dave England is in his 28th full year and 29th season as a member of the University of Arkansas athletic training staff and works with the men's basketball men's golf and baseball teams among others.

In 2004, he received the District 6
Athletic Trainer Service Award from the
National Athletic Trainers Association. He was honored in 2000 as
the Arkansas Athletic Trainers' Association Trainer of the Year.

England also worked at Arkansas as a student and graduate assistant athletic trainer. He returned to Fayetteville following a stint in the St. Louis Cardinals baseball organization.

A 1980 graduate of Arkansas with a bachelor's of science degree in education, England worked the 1976 Cotton Bowl and 1978 Orange Bowl football games as a student athletic trainer. He was a graduate assistant for Dean Weber in 1980-81 and went with the Hogs to the 1980 Hall of Fame Bowl. He also worked with baseball during those days and went to the 1979 College World Series where the Razorbacks finished second.

He then accepted an offer to work with the Cardinals. After spending some time in the lower levels of the organization, he worked his way up to the position of head trainer for the Cardinals' Double-A team in Little Rock. He returned to Arkansas in January 1984 as an assistant and was promoted to head athletic trainer in 1989.

In working with Razorback basketball, England has been to 16 NCAA tournaments and two NITs. He's made three trips to the Final Four and worked with the 1994 NCAA champions and the 1995 national runner-up. He returned to the College World Series with the baseball Hogs in 1985, 1987 and 2004 while the 2002 club advanced to a Super Regional. While working with football he has been to the Liberty and Cotton bowls twice, and the Orange, Holiday and Hall of Fame bowls.

One of the founding members of the Arkansas Athletic Trainers' Association in 1987, England was inducted into the AATA Hall of Fame in 1999.

He has two daughters, Jennifer, 28, and Alyson, 19. He is married to the former Heather Cullum, who was recently named the Director of Guest Services for the athletic department.

### Phil Pierce Assoc. Media Relations Director

Phil Pierce joined the University of Arkansas Athletic Department in the fall of 1996 and over the past 15 years has been a part of many Razorback sports and memorable moments. Currently he is the media relations contact for the men's basketball and men's golf teams while also overseeing the production of Razorback Game Day, Arkansas' official men's basketball game day program.



Joining the men's athletics department in 1996 as an intern, Pierce worked with four NCAA Championship track and field teams as well as the cross country and golf programs. Hired as an assistant communications director for women's athletics in January of 1998, Pierce worked primarily with the women's cross country/track and soccer programs, but also covered the media relations aspects for the swimming & diving and tennis teams at various points.

Following the blending of the Arkansas athletic departments, Pierce took over the media relations responsibilities for the baseball team and assisted with football. In the fall of 2009, he moved to the men's basketball and golf programs.

During Pierce's 15 years with the Razorbacks he has overseen the media responsibilities of four NCAA Championship track teams, 17 Southeastern Conference cross country and track titles, a College World Series run and was the media coordinator for eight NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships. In addition he helped build Arkansas men's athletics first web site and was a part of nine years of Razorback soccer radio broadcasts.

A 1996 graduate of Baldwin-Wallace (Ohio) College, Pierce received a bachelor's degree in sports management and business administration. While at Baldwin-Wallace he worked in the sports information office for three years and with all of the Yellow Jackets 20 varsity sports. A native of Darien, Conn., Pierce, his wife, Stephanie, and son Matthew, reside in Fayetteville.

### Justin Johnson Academic Counselor

Justin Johnson joined the Razorbacks as a graduate assistant in the academic center in 2006. He was promoted to a full-time position in August 2008. He currently works with the baseball, swimming and diving, men's golf and women's tennis teams. His responsibilities include monitoring academic progress to ensure student-athletes are meeting University, Southeastern Conference, and NCAA requirements, tracking continuing eligibility, and providing registration and advising services.

A 2006 graduate of the University of Arkansas, Johnson holds a bachelor of science in education and earned his master's degree in sports management at Arkansas in 2008.

Johnson served as a manager for the Razorback basketball team under the direction of Stan Heath for two years and has coached at several basketball camps and with AAU programs.

In addition, Johnson interned and worked as a guest services representaive for the Northwest Arkansas Naturals, a AA affiliate of the Kansas City Royals..





















































### 2010-11 Notes

#### **All-Americans**

Three Razorbacks earned a total of four All-America honors in 2010-11. Sebastian Cappelen and Ethan Tracy were named to a pair of *Golfweek* teams with Cappelen claiming third-team and all-freshman team honors and Tracy earning honorable mention accolades. Cappelen was further honored by the Golf Coaches Association of America with Ping! honorable mention All-America honors and was joined by Austin Cook on the team.

#### **NCAA Championships**

The Razorbacks advanced to their 18th NCAA Championship in 2010-11 and came away with a 15th-place finish at Karsten Creek in Stillwater, Okla. Sophomore Austin Cook led the way with a 54-hole score of one-over par to finish 10th individually. His finish was the best by a Razorback since Andrew Dahl tied for 10th in 2003 and his one-over par finish was the best by a Razorback since 1994.

#### **All-Region**

The post-season honors continued for Razorbacks Ethan Tracy and Sebastian Cappelen as the tandem was named Ping! All-Central Region by the Golf Coaches Association of America. Tracy earned his second All-Region honor (2009) while Cappelen took his first.

#### At the Regional

The Razorbacks' fifth-place finish at the Southeast Regional was due in large part to the play of junior Ethan Tracy and sophomore Austin Cook. The tandem finished tied for 12th and 14th, respectively, and posted five rounds at or under par over the three-day event. Despite Arkansas' eight-under par score as a team, it took a clutch putt by Tracy on 18 to secure the fifth-place finish as Missouri got hot and made a run on the final day.

#### **All-Conference**

The Razorbacks had a pair of players named to the All-SEC second-team this season in junior Ethan Tracy and freshman Sebastian Cappelen. The honors are the first for both players and Cappelen added an All-Freshman team honor as well making him the first Razorback to earn both awards in the same season.

#### **Community Service**

Redshirt freshman Joe Doramus was Arkansas' addition to the SEC Community Service Team this spring. Doramus has been a featured player in fund raising tournaments and taught clinics.

#### **Team Ranking**

The Razorbacks were a consensus Top 20 program according to the three major men's golf rankings. The Hogs finished No. 15 in the final *Golf World/*Nike Golf Division I Coaches' Poll, No. 17 in the Golfstat ranking and No. 15 in the *Golfweek/*Sagarin ranking.

#### **Individual Ranking**

Along with its team ranking, *Golf-Week* also compiles individual rankings and it placed two Razorbacks among the top 50 players and four in its top 150. Sebastian Cappelen led the way with a ranking of No. 25 and was followed by Ethan Tracy (49), Jamie Marshall (125), Austin Cook (138), Josh Eure (247) and Will Pearson (416).

#### **Cappelen Wins First Tourney**

Freshman Sebastian Cappelen had two runner-up finishes to his credit prior to the Seminole, but claimed his first medalist honors after tying with two other players for the top spot in Tallahassee at five-under par. Cappelen never took a single stroke above par over the 54-hole tournament.

#### **SEC Player of the Week**

Thanks to his victory at the Seminole Intercollegiate and his play throughout the season, freshman Sebastian Cappelen was named the Southeastern Conference Player of the Week on March 17. The award was Cappelen's first and he became the sixth Razorback to earn the distinction and just the second since 2006.

#### **Palmer Cup**

Freshman Sebastian Cappelen was named to the European Palmer Cup team in late April. He was one of three freshmen to make one of the two eight-team fields and the only first-year player to be named to the European team. Cappelen was the second Razorback to be named to the Palmer Cup.

#### **Three Straight**

Arkansas' streak of three-straight tournament wins matched the longest in school history, a streak that had previously been attained during the 1992-93 season.

#### **Final Day Victory**

The Razorbacks made up a six-stroke deficit on the final day of competition at the John Hayt Invitational and won by two strokes over a loaded field. Sebastian Cappelen posted the Razorbacks' lowest score, but it was the play of Ethan Tracy and Will Pearson who shot a combined 11-under par on the final day that led Arkansas to the team title.

#### **Marshall Wins**

Jamie Marshall's individual victory at the Cabo Collegiate was his first tournament victory of the season and second of his Arkansas career. Marshall opened competition with a two-over par 74, but responded with rounds of three-under par, 69, and four-under par, 68, to take a one-stroke victory. Marshall's other individual title came last season at the Wolverine at Radrick Farms, coincidentally, Arkansas' second tournament of the season, where he fired a final round 65 to take the win.

#### **Williams Award**

Arkansas head coach Brad McMakin was one of 12 finalist for the Dave Williams Award which is presented annually by Eaton Golf Pride to the national coach of the year.



Sebastian Cappelen earned a pair of All-America honors as well as all-conference and all-region accolades as a true freshman.

## **University of Arkansas**



Founded in 1871, The University of Arkansas is the flagship institution of the University of Arkansas System. Located in Fayetteville in Arkansas' northwest corner, the U of A is the state's foremost partner and resource for education and economic development.

The U of A offers 213 baccalaureate, master's, doctoral, professional and specialist degree programs. In keeping with its status as Arkansas' land-grant university, the U of A has a 140-yearold mandate to educate, to conduct basic and applied research, and to extend knowledge and resources to the people of Arkansas and beyond through public engagement and service. The Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching recently classified the U of A as a national research university with a very high level of research activity, based on the number of doctoral degrees awarded, research grants received, and other factors. The U of A is the only Arkansas institution with such a ranking, and is among just 108 institutions in the United States (out of 4,633) to have received that classification.

The U of A has enormous influence over Arkansans' social, cultural, and recreational life, especially the widespread passion for the university's athletics teams, the Arkansas Razorbacks. The U of A's location in northwest Arkansas is viewed as one of the university's strongest attributes. Fayetteville is widely

recognized as one of the best college communities in the U.S. The city's Dickson Street district abuts the U of A campus and features scores of restaurants, shops, and entertainment venues. Northwest Arkansas is a vibrant economic region with a national reputation for its high quality of life.

Three of the U.S.'s largest corporations have their world headquarters in the region: Tyson Foods, J.B. Hunt Transportation, and the world's largest retailer, Walmart Corp. Because of their presence, many other corporations have established primary or secondary headquarters in

## **OLD MAIN**

One of the original buildings on Arkansas' campus, Old Main symbolizes the strong connection to the past and the focus upon the future which come together in the present at the University of Arkansas. Completed in 1875, Old Main stood the test of time until the mid-1980s when age and modern building codes threatened to send it to the wrecking ball as had happened to its sister building at the University of Illinois. A major fund-raising campaign by alumni totally renovated Old Main. Reopening in 1992, the building maintains the feel of a Victorian-era building with high ceilings and elaborate wooden trim. Just below the surface of the period hardwood floors, Old Main is hard-wired to the internet and built to last well into its second century.

Even with renovation, Old Main remained unfinished until 2005. One of the gifts during the Campaign for the Twenty-First Century specified the installation of a clock, originally planned for the blank faces of the south tower.

As mentioned, Old Main was built from shared plans with its counterpart on the Illinois campus, with one important difference. The north tower of Arkansas' Old Main is taller than the south tower. Legend says this was symbolic of the Civil War as the lead engineer was a northern veteran.

## **University of Arkansas**

Northwest Arkansas. Their close proximity to the U of A campus, along with their executives' and employees' active involvement in university life, offers students and faculty exceptional opportunities for research partnerships, internships, and post-graduation employment.

The U of A boasts one of the most unique features and traditions found on any college or university campus: Senior Walk, a nearly three-mile stretch of concrete sidewalks criss-crossing campus into which the names of every U of A graduate is engraved. More than 140,000 names currently appear, grouped alphabetically by year of graduation. Senior Walk epitomizes the university's emphasis on "putting students first," a philosophy captured in its tag line, "the YOU of A."

The U of A features distinctive architecture, including its signature building, Old Main, finished in 1875. As the original administrative facility, the iconic building now houses the J. William Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences. The college is named in honor of former U of A President (and, later, U.S. Senator) J. William Fulbright, who helped create the prestigious international scholarship and fellowship programs that bear his name. The U of A's distinctive Fulbright Peace Fountain, designed by architect Fay Jones, recognizes its namesake's role in promoting peaceful resolution of world conflicts.

Academically, the U of A is organized into ten schools and colleges: the Dale Bumpers College of Agricultural, Food and Life Sciences; the College of Education and Health Professions; the College of Engineering; the J. William Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences; and the Sam M. Walton College of Business. The university also features the Fay Jones School of Architecture, the Graduate School, the Honors College, the School of Law and the Global Campus, which provides academic outreach and programs to more than 15,000 learners a year.

The U of A's total annual operating budget for FY2011 is \$528 million. Tuition and fee revenues make up the largest source of revenues, followed by an annual state appropriation. Almost 77 percent of all fulltime undergraduate students receive some form of financial aid. U of A

undergraduate tuition rates were ranked 38th lowest in the nation among land-grant universities, in keeping with the university's emphasis on keeping itself accessible and affordable. In September 2010, the U of A enrolled a record 21,406 students. The student body consisted of students from all 50 states and more than 100

#### countries. More than 300 student organizations also exist on campus. There are plenty of things to do on- and off-campus. The HPER Center, the university's state-of-the-art recreational facility, offers a great place to climb, swim, run, lift weights, do aerobics and yoga, or play basketball. Cultural and recreational options include attending lectures, readings, and theatrical performances, shopping opportunities, and listening to live music on nearby Dickson Street. In 2009, University Chancellor G. David Gearhart presented a long-range strategic plan that was formally endorsed by the elected leaders of the

faculty, staff, and student body. The plan emphasizes a commitment to "students first," and outlines goals and strategies to ensure that all students receive the resources and support they need to achieve their academic goals. The plan also emphasizes the U of A's commitment to transparency and accountability to the people of Arkansas in its operation.

## SENIOR WALK

The University of Arkansas is proud to be the last university in the nation maintaining what once was a common tradition of etching its graduates' names into the campus sidewalks. The 100,000th graduate's name went down in cement during the 1990s. The names on Senior Walk stretch over three miles of campus sidewalks.

The story of Senior Walk is a perfect example of how the University of Arkansas brings its commitment to the past together with innovations for the future. When the costs involved in hand-etching names into concrete forced numerous other universities to give up, the University of Arkansas turned to its physical plant and engineering school grads to create a oneof-a-kind computerized sandblasting machine -- the SandHog. Each summer, the SandHog roars across the front lawn of Old Main, etching the names of graduates into sidewalks.





## **University Administration**

# DR. G. DAVID GEARHART

Dr. G. David Gearhart became the chancellor of the University of Arkansas on July 1, 2008, following 10 years of service to the university as vice chancellor for university advancement. Previously he was senior vice president of Penn State University, during which time he was named a Fulbright Scholar, studying at Oxford University in Oxford, England.

His Bachelor of Arts degree is from Westminster College in Missouri. Both his law degree and his doctor of education degree are from the University of Arkansas. He is a native of Fayetteville.

Prior to being appointed chancellor, Dr. Gearhart oversaw the Campaign for the Twenty-First Century, the most successful capital campaign in Arkansas history, which raised more than \$1 billion for academic programs.

As chancellor, Dr. Gearhart instituted the first tuition freeze in 24 years and implemented a \$220 million campus



building renovation and refurbishment plan, as well as a campus-wide energy savings plan. He has also undertaken a renewed emphasis on the arts on campus, including the establishment of the "All Steinway Campus."

Dr. Gearhart has additionally implemented a major cost savings program that has already resulted in over \$29.4 million in cost reduction and savings to the flagship campus. Campus enrollment has also grown by nearly 4,000 students in the past three years to almost 22,000 students. At the same time, diversity in the student body has increased significantly.

He and his wife of more than 35 years, Jane, have two children and two grandchildren.

## DR. SHARON HUNTE FACULTY ATHLETIC REPRESENTATIVE

Chancellor G. David Gearhart appointed Dr. Sharon Hunt to be the faculty athletics representative (FAR) for the University of Arkansas in August 2010.

Dr. Hunt is the first woman and non-lawyer to hold the post. Dr. Hunt has been on the University of Arkansas faculty for 21 years and has served as head of the recently renamed Department of Health, Human Performance and Recreation in the College of Education and Health Professions for that entire time except for the 2000-01 academic year, when she served as interim dean of the college. On June 30, 2011 Dr. Hunt stepped down as Department Head and returned to the faculty at the rank of Professor giving her more time to devote to the FAR position.

A high school athlete, Hunt's involvement with collegiate athletics dates back to her own college days at the University of Arkansas when she played extramural sports with the women's basketball and tennis teams prior to the enactment of Title IX.

After receiving her bachelor's and master's degrees in physical education from the university, she went on to earn a doctor of education degree from the University of Georgia, where she taught a variety of sportactivity courses as a graduate assistant. Upon the completion of her doctoral degree, she joined the faculty of

the University of Kentucky for 13 years, where she taught both undergraduate and graduate courses and served as the graduate coordinator for the Department of Health,

Physical Education and Recreation. In 1990, she and her family returned to Fayetteville.

The FAR's responsibilities lie in three broad areas: academic integrity within the athletics program, student-athlete well-being, and institutional control of the athletics program. Dr. Hunt is involved in the student-athlete advisory council on campus and chairs the Academic Credential Review Committee and Athletic's Academic Integrity Committee, and serves as an ex-officio member of the Faculty Athletics Committee. In addition, she travels to represent the University of Arkansas at various SEC and NCAA meetings.

Dr. Hunt was instrumental in establishing the graduate athletic training education program in the College of Education and Health Professions, and she has worked closely with athletics on that program. The athletics department provides support to students in the athletic training education program in the form of a stipend, books and travel to the Arkansas Athletic Trainers' Association annual meeting. Two endowed scholarships for athletic training students in honor of longtime Razorback trainers Dean Weber and the late Bill Ferrell were established through the athletics department.

Dr. Hunt has been married to David Hunt since 1973, and they have an adult son and daughter as well as a grandson.

## Athletic Director Jeff Long

## VICE CHANCELLOR FOR INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS & DIRECTOR OF

Entering his fourth full year as Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics, Jeff Long has guided the University of Arkansas' Department of Intercollegiate Athletics through a period of unprecedented transition while revitalizing a tradition-rich athletics program encompassing 19 sports and more than 460 student-athletes.

Long leads a comprehensive athletics program uniformly committed to the development of student-athletes academically, athletically and socially. A part of Chancellor G. David Gearhart's Executive Committee, Long is helping to chart the course for the future of higher education at the University of Arkansas while integrating Razorback Athletics into the campus community. In each of the past two years, Razorback Athletics has made a \$1 million gift to support the university's academic mission bringing the department's support of the greater university community to nearly \$4 million.

In Long's tenure, Arkansas has captured eight conference championships and advanced to 53 post-season competitions, including the school's first Bowl Championship Series appearance in football, while drawing more than a million fans annually to campus to cheer on the Razorbacks. In 2010-11, Arkansas finished in the top 25 of the NACDA Sports Directors Cup for the third time in the past four years, marking the first time in school history that has been accomplished.

In the classroom, the Razorbacks continue to set new standards including posting a student-athlete grade point average exceeding 3.0 for an unprecedented third consecutive year. Arkansas exceeds the national APR multi-year rate by more than 10 points in 18 sports and has seen a steady rise in graduation success rates.

Student-athlete development has also been a priority including the establishment of the Razorback Leadership Academy, the first of its kind in the Southeastern Conference. In the community, Razorback studentathletes are more active than ever volunteering more than 3,300 hours of

time for more than 80 agencies, organizations and schools.

Long was selected to replace legendary athletic director and former Razorback football coach Frank Broyles and even before he officially took the reins on Jan. 1, 2008, Arkansas announced that it would combine its previously independent men's and women's athletic programs into one combined athletic program. Long adeptly blended the men's and women's athletic departments into one unified department and established a new administrative structure.

He has recruited some of the nation's most successful coaches to Arkansas including head football coach Bobby Petrino and head men's basketball coach Mike Anderson. He also signed head baseball coach Dave Van Horn to a long-term deal to remain in Fayetteville. In fact, Arkansas is

Van Horn to a long-term deal to remain in Fayetteville. In fact, Arkansas is one of only four schools in the nation to boast coaches who have made a BCS bowl game, the Elite Eight and the College World Series.

Long has also worked tirelessly to maintain long-time relationships and to forge new relationships for the benefit of the Razorback program including extending Arkansas' relationship with War Memorial Stadium and helping re-establish the Razorbacks' presence in Texas, partnering with former Razorback Jerry Jones to develop the Southwest Classic, a 10-year football series with Texas A&M played at the spectacular Cowboys Stadium football series with Texas A&M played at the spectacular Cowboys Stadium.



economic indicators beginning to point toward challenging economic times, Long signed Arkansas to a deal with IMG College to form Razorback Sports Properties that guarantees the Razorback program \$73 million during the course of the decadelong agreement. Long also negotiated an extensive all sports apparel and footwear agreement with NIKE, Inc. that will outfit all 19 Razorback sports programs

outht all 19 Razordack sports programs through the 2014-15 season.

Working alongside the Razorback Foundation leadership team, the athletic department recently launched the "Answer the Call" campaign to help meet the granting francial needs of fielding the growing financial needs of fielding a nationally competitive all sports program. More than 2,600 new members have joined the Razorback Foundation

while helping generate much needed support for Razorback student-athletes. A number of athletic facilities have also seen a transformation with Bud Walton Arena undergoing extensive renovations, including replacement of the lower seating bowl and the addition of courtside seating, ribbon boards and a courtside club room. In the spring of 2009, a new synthetic playing surface was installed at Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium.

With an eye towards the future, Long commissioned a master plan to assess the future facility needs of the program. Construction of a new football center is already underway with a targeted completion date in 2013.

A veteran administrator with a track record of the highest commitment to the concept of "student-athlete," Long has had more than two decades experience in athletic administration at the Division I level including at the University of Pittsburgh, University of Oklahoma, University of Michigan, Virginia Tech University, Eastern Kentucky University and Rice University. Long also understands the coach's perspective from time spent in coaching staff positions at Duke University, University of Michigan and North Carolina State University.

His experience as an athletic director and administrator in America's most prestigious conferences – the Big 12, Big Ten, Big East, Atlantic Coast and now SEC - gives Long a uniquely informed perspective on intercollegiate athletics. During his career, Long has served in five of the six Bowl Championship Series leagues.

On the forefront of NCAA governance, Long has served on the NCAA Management Council, the NCAA's Sports Wagering Task Force and as a member of the Executive Committee of the Division I-A Athletic Directors' Association. Long currently serves on the NCAA Championships\Sports Management Cabinet.

Prior to assuming his current roles at Arkansas, Long served for four years as the athletic director at the University of Pittsburgh. Long redefined Pitt athletics, most notably through the "Quest for Excellence" campaign that raised nearly \$34 million to enhance the student-athlete experience. During his tenure the Panthers' were selected as the No. 17 overall program in the nation in the December 2006 Sports Illustrated on Campus' All-Sport

Before arriving at Pitt, Long was senior associate athletic director at Oklahoma for two and a half years overseeing external affairs for the Sooners. In addition, Long was the primary administrator for the Sooners' highly successful football and men's basketball programs, along with sport supervision of baseball, wrestling and both golf teams.

Long's first appointment as a director of athletics was at Eastern Kentucky where he served for two and a half years. Prior to Eastern, Long had a brief stay with Virginia Tech as an associate athletics director.

He began his career in college athletic administration at Michigan, hired by legendary coach and athletics director, the late Bo Schembechler. During his seasons with the Wolverines, Long was promoted through a series of posts to the position of associate athletics director.

A former two-sport athlete at Ohio Wesleyan, Long earned seven varsity letters for the Bishops in football and baseball before completing his degree in economics in 1982. He started his post-graduate career in athletics working in economics in 1982. He started his post-graduate career in athletics working on head coach Tom Reed's staff as a graduate assistant football coach at the cradle of coaches, Miami University of Ohio. Long earned his master's in education at Miami in 1983, moving on to football staff positions at Rice, Duke and N.C. State prior to joining Michigan.

An Ohio native from Kettering, Long is married to the former Fanny Gellrich of Ann Arbor, Mich. The Longs have two daughters, Stephanie and

Bev Lewis has served the University of Arkansas and its Razorback athletic programs for more than three decades.

The former women's athletic director prior to the department merger in 2007-08, Lewis now serves as the associate vice chancellor and executive associate athletic director for administration and sport programs. Lewis is also the coordinator of a five-member sport administrator group that provides day-to-day administrative support for each of Arkansas' 19 sports. Lewis is the sport administrator for men's and women's cross country, men's and women's track and field, men's and athletic training and sports medicine program as well as overseeing the media relations and new media divisions. She also serves as a liaison to the faculty senate and the faculty stabletic committee, and coordinates the department's NCAA certification, Title IX compliance and strategic planning. Lewis was elected to the 2011-12 Southeastern Conference Executive Committee assisting the league office in a leadership role.

The largest portion of her service to the university was her 19-year tenure as the Director of Women's Athletics. As a result of her strong emphasis on the classroom, Razorback female studentathletes received numerous academic honors including national academic All-American of the year, team academic national titles and the university's first two SEC/H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athletes of the Year.

Her leadership was also a part of the success of the university's Campaign for the Twenty-First Century. Lewis directed Women's Athletics to over \$11.5 million in direct support for women's teams. During the campaign, Lewis received one of her greatest personal honors as Bob and Marilyn Bogle requested that Arkansas' \$6 million facility be named the Bev Lewis Center for Women's Athletics.

Lewis served collegiate athletics at the highest level as an administrator, first with the NCAA Championship Cabinet and recently on the NCAA Management Council. Prior to assuming the duties of AD, Lewis was women's cross country and track coach. Her Arkansas coaching milestones included the first women's squad to achieve a national ranking and the first conference championship team with the 1988 Southwest Conference Cross Country Championships.

Lewis earned her bachelor's degree from Central Michigan in 1979 and followed it with her master's from Purdue prior to her arrival at Arkansas in 1981.

Overseeing Razorback facilities, event management and equipment operations, Matt Trantham joined the University of Arkansas in 2008 as the senior associate athletic director for internal operations.

Supervising several major projects in his first year with the Razorbacks, Trantham guided the \$2.5 million renovation of Bud Walton Arena and the \$1.3 million restoration of synthetic playing surface at Donald W. Reynolds Razorback stadium in 2008-

This year, he is overseeing the Master Plan currently underway for all athletic facilities. One of the first projects within the master plan is scheduled to begin in the 2011-12 academic year with the expansion of the football practice facilities including meeting rooms, academic center and offices.

Prior to joining Arkansas, Trantham began his career with the University of Oklahoma in July 1999 as the promotions director for the athletic department where he worked with all 20 of OU's teams. He was named assistant athletic director for event management in 2004 and was promoted to associate athletic director in 2006.

In his role as associate AD for event management, Trantham oversaw more than 500 events a year, coordinated the efforts of more than 1,500 event staff members and was responsible for activities within 13 athletic facilities. He also served as OU's liaison with all postseason events including both Big 12 and NCAA championship competitions. Prior to joining the Sooners, Trantham spent five seasons in professional sports in Washington, D.C. Trantham earned his bachelor's of science degree in business management from Centenary College in 1990 and a master's degree in sports management from the United States Sports Academy in 1998.

#### **ACADEMIC SERVICES**

Recognizing the difficulty of balancing the demands of athletic competition at the highest level and completion of the rigorous academic standards of a Carnegie research-level university, the Razorback Athletic Department provides support services through both facilities and personnel to guide Arkansas student-athletes to their ultimate goal: University of Arkansas diploma.

The key components of the Student-Athlete Academic Support and Achievement (SAASA) are personal development, career development, academic tutoring, study hall facilities, class attendance monitoring and incentive awards recognizing academic achievement.

#### THE BOGLE ACADEMIC CENTER

There is no higher priority for the University of Arkansas Athletic Department than the academic progress of its scholarathletes. Thanks to the generous gift of Bob and Marilyn Bogle, the home of the Razorback Athletic Department's Student-Athlete Academic Support and Achievement program is the Bob and Marilyn Bogle Academic Center. The 15,000-square foot Bogle Academic Center is located in the east side of Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium. Under the overall direction of Senior Associate Athletic Director Jon Fagg, the Bogle Academic Center houses the Arkansas Razorbacks Academic Support Program, the Razorback Office of Student Life and the Career Development Program.

Associate Athletic Director for Student-Athlete Support Services Melissa Harwood-Rom oversees the staff of professionals dedicated to directing student-athletes to reach their personal academic goals, and to do so in ways that balance their academic, athletic and personal lives.

## STUDY HALL AND TUTORS

A quiet setting for uninterrupted study, the Bogle Academic Center provides three types of study hall space. The computer lab has more than 30 stations for individual computer-based study. An open study hall is available for group or individual study, and monitored by staff members of the SAASA. There are 17 individual study carrels that provide space for tutors to meet with student-athletes for individual instruction in specific subjects.

Each Razorback team sets its own criteria for study hall attendance. The use of tutors is a key element for academic

success, allowing for individualized assistance and for reaching academic excellence in advanced subjects.

#### STUDENT-ATHLETE DEVELOPMENT

The mission of the Student-Athlete Development Office is to contribute to the personal growth and character development of Razorback student-athletes through holistic programming for success in life.


## FRANK BROYLES
