2012-13 Arkansas Notes

Five Returnees

The Razorback men's golf team returns five of the six members of its team who saw significant action in 2011-12. Seniors Austin Cook and Josh Eure are joined by junior Sebastian Cappelen and sophomores Kolton Crawford and Thomas Sorensen. The five players were a large piece of the Arkansas puzzle that led to a top 10 ranking for most of the 2011-12 season.

Big Loss

While the Razorbacks return five of six, the one loss was huge in Ethan Tracy. A 2012 honorable mention All-American and the 2012 Western Amateur champion, Tracy led the Razorbacks in stroke average last season and posted the fifth best single-season stroke average in school history as a senior. He finished among the top five individuals in six tournaments in 2011-12 and ended his four-year career tied for third on Arkansas' all-time list of top 10 finishes with 20.

Three Newcomers

Arkansas added three players to the 2012-13 roster, players that should be able to help the Razorbacks this year and beyond. Taylor Moore and Nicholas Echavarria are two of the top six junior players in the nation while Zach Coats is a raw talent.

Fighting for Five

One of the best things about Arkansas in 2012-13 is the fact that there will be lots of competition as players fight for one of the five tournament spots each week. The Razorbacks got a taste of it in 2011-12 and used it to win a school record seven tournaments, so with several players working out for five spots, it should make for some tremendous lineups once the year begins.

School Record

The Razorbacks are coming off a season where they won a school record seven tournaments. Four of the seven were in the fall with three more coming after the winter break. It began with the opening tournament, the Gopher Invitational and continued with the Golfweek Conference Challenge, Windon Memorial Classic and Cabo Collegiate. In the spring, Arkansas added the John Hayt Invitational, Callaway Collegiate Match Play and Woodlands All-American Classic. The Razorbacks broke the school record of five tournament victories which it set during both the 1991-92 and 1992-93 seasons.

Most in a Two-Year Span

Arkansas' seven tournament wins last season gave the Razorbacks 11 over the past two seasons which is a record for any Arkansas team over a two-year span. The previous best was 10 set between the 1991-92 and 1992-93 seasons when Bill Woodley was the skipper of the program. Arkansas' 11 wins over the past two seasons has already matched the three-year record for an Arkansas team (11) which came between the 1992 and 1994 seasons.

Schedule

The Razorbacks' 2012-13 schedule should present some serious challenges to Arkansas as it prepares for a post-season run. Five of Arkansas' 10 regular season tournaments are new for this season and the addition of Missouri and Texas A&M to the Southeastern Conference Championship adds a new dimension to that event as well. The year begins with the Gopher Invitational, a familiar tournament and continues with two new events, the Golfweek/Ping Preview and OFCC/Fighting Illini Invitational. The fall semester closes with the Jack Nicklaus Invitational and Isleworth Collegiate Invite. The 2013 spring semester starts in early February with the Gator Invitational and continues with the John Hayt Invite and General Hackler Championship. The regular season closes with the Natonal Invitational Tournament and Aggie Invitational. The SEC Championships, NCAA Fayetteville Regional and NCAA Championship close the year.

Hosting a Regional

For the first time in school history, Arkansas hosts a major collegiate men's golf tournament when the NCAA Fayetteville Regional opens, May 16-18 at Blessings. The event will draw roughly 14 of the nation's best squads to compete for an opportunity to play at the NCAA Championship.

World Amateur Rankings

The World Amateur Golf Ranking is a system that ranks the top male amateur golfers on the basis of their average performance. The Razorbacks are featured prominently on the list with six players in the top 125. Sebastian Cappelen leads the way at 45th and is followed by Taylor Moore, 74th; Austin Cook, 109th; Kolton Crawford, 119th; Nicholas Echavarria, 120th; Thomas Sorensen, 121st; and Josh Eure, 312th.

Summer Recap

It was a successful summer for the men's golf team as several players finished in the top five or 10 of prestigious amateur events. Sebastian Cappelen played in his second Palmer Cup, going 1-1-2 in his four matches, helping the Europeans win the cup. Austin Cook finished third at the Trans-Mississippi Championship and tied for 15th at the Southern Amateur. Thomas Sorensen finished third at the European Amateur and tied for third at the Danish International Amateur. Newcomer Nicolas Echavarria was a semifinalist at the US Junior Amateur while Taylor Moore finished fifth at the Rolex Tournament of Champions. Josh Eure won the Maryland Amateur and had three other top 30 finishes while Kolton Crawford took 12th at the Texas Amateur and tied for 13th at the Trans-Miss. Joe Doramus tied for third at the Arkansas Stroke Play Championship.

The Media Relations Offices at the University of Arkansas are located in Barnhill Arena just south of Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium.



Brad McMakin

Head Coach Seventh Year Oklahoma, 1991

Brad McMakin is in his seventh year at the helm of the Arkansas men's golf program and is the 14th head coach in school history. The McMakin tenure is the second-longest by an Arkansas men's golf coach and he has signed a long-term contract to remain with the Razorbacks.

A highly successful coach prior to joining the Razorbacks, McMakin turned around the Arkansas program in just two years and took the team to new heights in the spring of 2009 when he led them to a runner-up finish at the NCAA Championships. In his six seasons as the head

Razorback, McMakin's teams have been to five NCAA Regional Championships, two NCAA Championships and placed in the top four of the Southeastern Conference Championships twice. Individually, McMakin was named the SEC Coach of the Year in 2009 and was a finalist for the Dave Williams National Coach of the Year award in 2011.

While his teams have shown an ability to rise to the best competition, it is McMakin's ability to recruit and cultivate top notch talent that makes him successful. Since his arrival, Arkansas has been awarded 13 All-SEC selections and nine All-America honors.

Some of his most recent former standouts include David Lingmerth and Andrew Landry, the tandem that paced Arkansas to the 2009 NCAA runner-up finish. Landry, a three-time All-American, completed his eligibility after the 2009 season, less than a month after that momentous occasion, began his professional career on the Nationwide Tour. Lingmerth earned a second All-America honor in 2010 and became the first Arkansas player to play in the prestigious Palmer Cup that summer going 2-2 in the Ryder-Cup style format.

Arkansas' 2008-09 season was certainly one for the record books as it shocked some of best programs in the nation on its way to NCAA runner-up honors. Finishing outside the top five in just one of 13 tournaments that season, the Razorbacks put together an impressive spring that included five straight second-place finishes which included the SEC, NCAA Regional and NCAA Championships. The Hogs defeated Washington (3 & 2), and Georgia (3-1-1) in match play at the national championships before eventually falling on the final hole to Texas A&M. Arkansas' impressive spring earned McMakin SEC Coach of the Year honors making him the first Razorback skipper to take the distinction.

The Razorbacks enjoyed one of their most successful seasons in school history in 2011-12 when McMakin led Arkansas to a school record seven team victories in 10 regular-season tournaments. His squad also posted one of Arkansas' best team stroke averages and had three players named all-conference, two all-region and nine all-Americans. His seven-win season makes McMakin the second most successful coach in Arkansas history in terms of career victories (16) and he is on pace to shatter the Razorback record held by Bill Woodley who won 24 tournaments over a 14-year career. Overall, McMakin has a winning percentage of .718 (732-283-15).

Before his move to Fayetteville, McMakin was the head coach at Lamar University in Beaumont, Texas, where he spent a decade. In 2006, he led the Cardinals to a ninth-place finish at the NCAA Championships and they won an NCAA-best seven tournaments in 13 events in 2006, placing two golfers in the top 10 individual finishers at the NCAA Championships.

After arriving at Lamar, McMakin revitalized the program, returning it to the top of the Southland Conference (SLC) and back onto the national scene. In his 10-year stint, Lamar won five SLC titles, made six-consecutive NCAA Central Regional appearances and earned its first trip to the NCAA Championships (2006) in 20 years (1986). In McMakin's final six seasons at Lamar, the Cardinals had three players earn All-America honors, three golfers capture SLC individual medalist honors, 21 all-conference performers, a newcomer of the year, three freshmen of the year and the conference's only four-time player of the year.

A native of Beaumont, Texas, McMakin was named the Eaton/Golf Pride South Central Region Coach of the Year in 2006 after leading his squad to the NCAA Championships and a fifth-place showing at the NCAA Central Regional. The Cardinals captured their 20th Southland Conference championship and placed all five players on the all-conference team. McMakin was tabbed as the SLC Coach of the Year five times (1999, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2006) in his 10-year run at Lamar.

Prior to accepting the head coaching job at Lamar, McMakin spent four years as a professional golfer, competing on several mini tours as well as playing on the Nike and Hooters Tours.

Originally signing with Lamar out of high school, McMakin transferred to Oklahoma when former LU coach Greg Grost accepted the Oklahoma men's golf job. It proved to be a wise move for McMakin as he would help the Sooners win a national championship during the 1989 season. McMakin, a co-captain of that squad, served in the same capacity the following year as Oklahoma finished fifth at the national tournament.

McMakin was also a standout golfer on the Kelly High School golf team. He was a regular in the TCIL state tournament and earned medalist honors four times. While at Kelly, McMakin played for former Lamar coach Charles Rodemacher.

The 40-year old McMakin earned a bachelor degree in communications from Oklahoma in 1991. He and his wife, Tonia, have one son - Matthew (8).

Barrett Lais

Assistant Coach Third Year Arkansas, 2008

One of the up-and-coming young coaches in college golf, Barrett Lais, is a former Razorback player who rejoined his alma mater prior to the 2010-11 season. A 2008 graduate of the University of Arkansas' Walton College of Business with a degree in marketing, Lais returned to the Ozarks after a two-year stint with the University of Denver where he served as an assistant coach.

In his two seasons with the Razorbacks, Lais has been an integral part of 11 Arkansas victories, a school record for any two-year span. Arkansas has participated in a pair of NCAA Regionals and advanced to the NCAA Championship in 2011, finishing 15th. He has spent a good portion of his time working with junior-to-be Sebastian Cappelen at various events and the time has paid dividends as the Dane is poised to be one of the best golfers in Arkansas history. Along with his on-course responsibilities, Lais handles travel, recruiting and player development.

"I am really excited to bring Barrett back as an assistant coach," Arkansas head coach Brad McMakin said upon Lais' hire. "Barrett is young and ambitious and brings a knowledge of the Razorback program. He gained a lot of experience in his time at Denver, experience that will help him succeed here. Barrett did an exceptional job recruiting at Denver and signed the No. 1 players from Norway and from Arizona."

Lais helped guide the Denver program to 11 top-five tournament finishes as well as an NCAA Regional appearance in 2009 during his two-year stint with the program. He coached senior Espen Kofstad to the NCAA Championships as an individual. Kolfstad's play earned him PING Division I Honorable Mention All-Region honors. Kofstad and Daniel Wax each earned all-conference recognition and all-region honors in 2009.

Along with his prowess as a recruiter, Lais is also a certified golfing machine authorized instructor.

As a player for the Razorbacks, Lais participated in 15 tournaments over four years and 45 rounds, averaging

75.60 strokes. He placed 11th at the Gopher Invitational in 2007 and hit a career low round of 68 at the Fighting Irish Gridiron Classic, also in 2007. As a senior in 2007-08 he played in a career high six tournaments and 18 rounds with a 75.00 stroke average. He was named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll four times and was named to several University of Arkansas academic award lists. In addition to the time spent on the course and in the classroom, Lais also participated in the First Tee program and served as a golf camp instructor.

Lais is married to Jessica (LaMar), who also graduated from Arkansas. The couple welcomed the birth of their first child, son Hudson LaMar, in February of 2011.
























































2011-12 Notes

All-Americans

Senior Ethan Tracy and sophomore Sebastian Cappelen were named honorable mention PING All-Americans by the Golf Coaches Association of America. Tracy's honor was his first while Cappelen earned his second in two years.

All-Region

The Golf Coaches Association of America named its all-region selections in late May and senior Ethan Tracy and sophomore Sebastian Cappelen were among those selected. Tracy took his third all-region honor (2009, 2011, 2012) with Cappelen taking his second in two years.



Ethan Tracy ended his career with All-America, All-Region and All-SEC honors and was named to the watch list of the Ben Hogan Award.

All-Conference

Senior Ethan Tracy and sophomore Sebastian Cappelen were each named to the first team while freshman Kolton Crawford earned all-freshman honors when the SEC released its list of post-season awards. The three award winners marks the third time in school history that Arkansas has had three on the All-SEC teams, but just the second that it had multiple first-team members.

Hogan Award

Senior Ethan Tracy was a candidate for the Ben Hogan Award when he was named to the prestigious awards' watch list in February. Tracy was one of 28 golfers on the list with the award going to the nation's best golfer.

Team Academic Award

Along with its myriad post-season awards for play on the course, the Golf Coaches Association of America also hands out team academic awards and the Razorbacks earned President's Special Recognition. The Razorbacks were one of 12 teams in the nation to earn a cumulative grade point average of 3.5 or better.

Cook Scholar-Athlete of the Year

Junior Austin Cook became the first Razorback in school history to earn the SEC Men's Golf Scholar-Athlete of the Year award. A biology major with a 3.8 grade point average, Cook was also third on the team in stroke average while participating in all 12 tournaments Arkansas played in.

Cook Academic All-District

Along with his SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year award, Austin Cook was also named first-team Capital One Academic All-District VI in the spring. The honor is Cook's first and placed him on the ballot to be voted on for Academic All-America honors.

School Record

With its victory at the Callaway Match Play Championship, Arkansas set a school record with its sixth tournament win of the 2011-12 season. That record was increased to seven at The Woodlands All-American Intercollegiate. The Razorbacks had won five tournaments in a year two times previously, 1991-92 and 1992-93, but only three or more in a season three times in the past 18 years. Arkansas has victories this season at the Gopher Invitational, Golfweek Conference Challenge, Windon Memorial Classic, Cabo Collegiate, John Hayt Invitational and Callaway Collegiate Match Play Championship and The Woodlands All-American Intercollegiate.

Rankings

The Razorbacks were hot on the golf course last fall and their abilities were noticed. After an early No. 1 ranking by Golfstat, the Razorbacks opened the spring as a unanimous top 10 team. The season ended with Golfstat ranking the Razorbacks No. 12, while *Golfweek* had Arkansas at No. 12.

GolfWeek Individual Ranking

Along with its team ranking, *Golfweek* also has collegiate individual rankings and two Razorbacks are among the top 60 in the country. Ethan Tracy is No. 36 while Sebastian Cappelen is No. 49. Josh Eure (No. 93), Austin Cook (No. 129) and Kolton Crawford (No. 153) are also ranked by *Golfweek*. Thomas Sorensen is No. 12 among players without enough rounds to qualify for the overall ranking.

World Amateur Ranking

Several Arkansas players were ranked in the World Amateur Golf Ranking. On April 29, 2012, Sebastian Cappelen is No. 21, Ethan Tracy is No. 38, Kolton Crawford is No. 80, Austin Cook is No. 116, Josh Eure is No. 172, and Thomas Sorensen is No. 256.

Fifth at SEC

The Razorbacks began the 2012 SEC Championship in rough fashion, going way over par before settling down and finishing fifth overall. Arkansas' finish was an improvement from 2011's sixth-place showing and is the fourth straight season that Arkansas has placed in the top six at the event.

Tracy Cards 67

Ethan Tracy's second-round score of 67 at the SEC Championships matched the fourth best single round score in Arkansas history at the SEC meet. Tracy tied Dalton Owens (2010) and David White (1993) and was three strokes off Bud Still's school record single-round tally of 64 which he set in 1995. Tracy's score also matches the second best at Seaside Golf Course where Arkansas has played the SEC Championships 10 times. Adam Wing's third round 65 at the 2003 Championship is Arkansas' all-time best and Tracy matched Dalton Owns.

Sorensen Finishes Tied for 15th

Freshman Thomas Sorensen had his best event as a collegiate at the 2012 SEC Championship, tying for 15th. Sorensen carded a three-round score of 213, three-over par, with rounds of 72, 70 and 71. Sorensen is the second Arkansas freshman to finish among the top 15 individuals in two years.

Sorensen's Score

Of little note at the time, Thomas Sorensen's overall score of 213, three-over par, matched the seventh best by an Arkansas player at the SEC Championships all-time. Bud Still holds the school record when he won the event in 1995 with a score of 206. Sorensen's 213 is the third best score by an Arkansas player at Seaside Golf Club in Arkansas' 10 years at the course. David Lingmerth shot 210 in 2010, Dalton Owens carded a 211 in 2010 and Sorensen matched Andrew Dahl (2004) with his 213.

Great Second Round

Arkansas' second round team score of 280 at the SEC Championships was two strokes off Arkansas' school record at an SEC event. The Razorbacks' second round consisted of a 67 by Ethan Tracy, 70 by Thomas Sorensen, 71 by Austin Cook and 72 by Sebastian Cappelen and Kolton Crawford. The score matched the mark of 1995's third round and was two off the pace of the 2010 team's first round. That squad counted scores of 67, 69, 70 and 72.

How far They've Come

The Razorbacks walked off the course after the first round of the SEC Championship frustrated with their score of 286, but that score matched the ninth best in school history. It was also the exact same team score as Arkansas shot in 2011 when they left the course feeling good about their first round.

Constantly Improving

One of the best things that you can say about a coach and his staff is that their players are consistently improving and in Arkansas' case that is certainly the case. Of Arkansas' four players that have at least one season, three of the four have improved stroke averages with the fourth close. The largest improvement from career average to this season has been Josh Eure's 1.89, going from 74.52 to 72.63 as a junior. Ethan Tracy's improvement has also been stunning, going from 73.52 to 71.83 as a senior (1.69).

No. 1

Following its victory at the *Golfweek* Conference Challenge, the Razorbacks debuted at No. 1 in the first Golfstat ranking on Sept. 28. It was the first time since Oct. 22, 1997 that Arkansas' men's golf team was ranked No. 1 in the country in any poll.

Palmer Cup

Established in 1997, the Palmer Cup is an annual competition that places the best collegiate players from the United States and Europe in a Ryder Cup-style tournament. Held at some of the most prestigious venues in the world, the Palmer Cup has a growing list of future PGA Tour stars including Luke Donald, Rory Sabbatini, Charles Howell III and 2010 U.S. Open Champion Graeme McDowell just to name a few.

The original Palmer Cup competitions featured players from the United States against those from Great Britain and Ireland, but those rules were amended in 2003 to include all European players.

Following Team Europe's 2012 victory in Northern Ireland, the all-time series stands at an even 7-7-1.

Three Razorbacks have been included in Palmer Cup tournaments over the years with David Lingmerth (Sweden) being the first in 2010. Lingmerth went 2-2 in his one experience before graduating. Sebastian Cappelen (Denmark) was asked to play in both 2011 and 2012 and in two years has built an impressive record of 4-2-2 including an undefeated singles mark of 3-0-1.

Founded in 1871, The University of Arkansas is the flagship institution of the University of Arkansas System. Located in Fayetteville in Arkansas' northwest corner, the U of A is the state's foremost partner and resource for education and economic development.

The U of A offers 213 baccalaureate, master's, doctoral, professional and specialist degree programs. In keeping with its status as Arkansas' land-grant university, the U of A has a 140-year-old mandate to educate, to conduct basic and applied research, and to extend knowledge and resources to the people of Arkansas and beyond through public engagement and service. The Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching recently classified the U of A as a national research university with a very high level of research activity, based on the number of doctoral degrees awarded, research grants received, and other factors. The U of A is the only Arkansas institution with such a ranking and is among just 108 institutions in the United States (out of 4,633) to have received that classification.

The U of A has enormous influence over Arkansans' social, cultural, and recreational life, especially the widespread passion for the university's athletics teams, the Arkansas Razorbacks. The U of A's location in northwest Arkansas is viewed as one of the university's strongest attributes. Fayetteville is widely recognized as one of the best college communities in the U.S. The city's Dickson Street district abuts the U of A campus and features scores of restaurants, shops, and entertainment venues. Northwest Arkansas is a vibrant economic region with a national reputation for its high quality of life.

Three of the U.S.'s largest corporations have their world headquarters in the region: Tyson Foods, J.B. Hunt Transportation, and the world's largest retailer, Walmart, Inc. Because of their presence, many other corporations have established primary or secondary headquarters in Northwest Arkansas. Their close proximity to the U of A campus, along with their executives' and employees' active involvement in university life, offers students and faculty exceptional opportunities for research partnerships, internships, and post-graduation employment.

The U of A boasts one of the most unique features and traditions found on any college or university campus: Senior Walk, a nearly three-mile stretch of concrete sidewalks criss-crossing campus into which the names of every U of A graduate is engraved.

More than 140,000 names currently appear, grouped alphabetically by year of graduation. Senior Walk epitomizes the university's emphasis on "putting students first," a philosophy captured in its tag line, "the YOU of A."

The U of A features distinctive architecture, including its signature building, Old Main, finished in 1875. As the original administrative facility, the iconic building now houses the J. William Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences. The college is named in honor of former U of A President (and, later, U.S. Senator) J. William Fulbright, who

OLD MAIN

One of the original buildings on Arkansas' campus, Old Main symbolizes the strong connection to the past and the focus upon the future which come together in the present at the University of Arkansas. Completed in 1875, Old Main stood the test of time until the mid-1980s when age and modern building codes threatened to send it to the wrecking ball as had happened to its sister building at the University of Illinois. A major fund-raising campaign by alumni totally renovated Old Main. Reopening in 1992, the building maintains the feel of a Victorian-era building with high ceilings and elaborate wooden trim. Just below the surface of the period hardwood floors, Old Main is hard-wired to the internet and built to last well into its second century.

Even with renovation, Old Main remained unfinished until 2005. One of the gifts during the Campaign for the Twenty-First Century specified the installation of a clock, originally planned for the blank faces of the south tower.

As mentioned, Old Main was built from shared plans with its counterpart on the Illinois campus, with one important difference. The north tower of Arkansas' Old Main is taller than the south tower. Legend says this was symbolic of the Civil War as the lead engineer was a northern veteran.







helped create the prestigious international scholarship and fellowship programs that bear his name. The U of A's distinctive Fulbright Peace Fountain, designed by architect Fay Jones, recognizes its namesake's role in promoting peaceful resolution of world conflicts.

Academically, the U of A is organized into 10 schools and colleges: the Dale Bumpers College of Agricultural, Food and Life Sciences; the College of Education and Health Professions; the College of Engineering; the J. William Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences; and the Sam M. Walton College of Business. The university also features the Fay Jones School of Architecture, the Graduate School and International Education, the Honors College, the School of Law and the Global Campus, which provides academic outreach and programs to more than 15,000 learners a year.

The U of A's total annual operating budget for FY2012 is \$528 million. Tuition and fee revenues make up the largest source of revenues, followed by an annual state appropriation. Almost 77 percent of all full-time undergraduate students receive some form of financial aid. U of A undergraduate tuition rates were ranked 38th lowest in the nation among land-grant universities, in keeping with the university's emphasis on keeping itself accessible and affordable.

In August 2011, the U of A enrolled a record 23,119 students. The student body consisted of students from all 50 states and more than 100 countries. More than 300 student organizations also exist on campus. There are plenty of things to do on- and off-campus. The HPER Center, the university's state-of-the-art recreational facility, offers a great place to climb, swim, run, lift weights, do aerobics and yoga, or play basketball. Cultural and recreational options include attending lectures, readings, and theatrical performances, shopping opportunities, and listening to live music on nearby Dickson Street.


In 2009, University Chancellor G. David Gearhart presented a long-range strategic plan that was formally endorsed by the elected leaders of the faculty, staff, and student body. The plan emphasizes a commitment to "students first," and outlines goals and strategies to ensure that all students receive the resources and support they need to achieve their academic goals. SENIOR WALK

The University of Arkansas is proud to be the last university in the nation maintaining what once was a common tradition of etching its graduates' names into the campus sidewalks. The 100,000th graduate's name went down in cement during the 1990s. The names on Senior Walk stretch over three miles of campus sidewalks.

The story of Senior Walk is a perfect example of how the University of Arkansas brings its commitment to the past together with innovations for the future. When the costs involved in hand-etching names into concrete forced numerous other universities to give up, the University of Arkansas turned to its physical plant and engineering school grads to create a one-of-a-kind computerized sandblasting machine -- the SandHog. Each summer, the SandHog roars across the front lawn of Old Main, etching the names of graduates into sidewalks.





DR. G. DAVID GEARHART

CHANCELLOR

Dr. G. David Gearhart became the chancellor of the University of Arkansas on July 1, 2008, following 10 years of service to the university as vice chancellor for university advancement. Previously he was senior vice president of Penn State University, during which time he was named a Fulbright Scholar, studying at Oxford University in Oxford, England.

His Bachelor of Arts degree is from Westminster College in Missouri. Both his law degree and his doctor of education degree are from the University of Arkansas. He is a native of Fayetteville.

Prior to being appointed chancellor, Dr. Gearhart oversaw the Campaign for the Twenty-First Century, the most successful capital campaign in Arkansas history, which raised more than \$1 billion for academic programs.



As chancellor, Dr. Gearhart instituted the first tuition freeze in 24 years and implemented a \$220 million campus building renovation and refurbishment plan, as well as a campus-wide energy savings plan. He has also undertaken a renewed emphasis on the arts on campus, including the establishment of the "All Steinway Campus."

Dr. Gearhart has additionally implemented a major cost savings program that has already resulted in over \$29.4 million in cost reduction and savings to the flagship campus. Campus enrollment has also grown by nearly 4,000 students in the past three years to almost 23,000 students. At the same time, diversity in the student body has increased significantly.

He and his wife of more than 35 years, Jane, have two children and two grandchildren.

DR. SHARON HUNT

FACULTY ATHLETICS REPRESENTATIVE

Chancellor G. David Gearhart appointed Dr. Sharon Hunt to be the faculty athletics representative (FAR) for the University of Arkansas in August 2010.

Dr. Hunt is the first woman and non-lawyer to hold the post. Dr. Hunt has been on the University of Arkansas faculty since 1990, and she served as the department head of the recently renamed Department of Health, Human Performance and Recreation from July 1,1990 until June 30, 2011 except for the 2000-01 academic year, when she served as the interim dean of the College of Education and Health Professions On June 30, 2011 Dr. Hunt stepped down as department head and returned to the faculty at the rank of Professor giving her more time to devote to the FAR position.

A high school athlete, Hunt's involvement with collegiate athletics dates back to her own college days at the University of Arkansas when she played extramural sports with the women's basketball and tennis teams prior to the enactment of Title IX.

After receiving her bachelor's and master's degrees in physical education from the university, she went on to earn a Doctor of Education degree from the University of Georgia, where she taught a variety of undergraduate courses as a graduate assistant. Upon the completion of her doctoral degree, she joined the faculty of the University of Kentucky for 13 years, where she taught both undergraduate and graduate courses and served as the graduate coordinator for the

Department of Health, Physical Education and Recreation. In 1990, she and her family returned to Fayetteville.

The FAR's responsibilities lie in three broad areas: academic integrity within the athletics program, student-athlete well-being, and institutional control of the athletics program. Dr. Hunt is involved in the student-athlete advisory council on campus and chairs the Academic Credential Review Committee and Athletic's Academic Integrity Committee, and serves as an ex-officio member of the Faculty Athletics Committee. In ad-

Dr. Hunt was instrumental in establishing the graduate athletic training education program in the College of Education and Health Professions, and she has worked closely with athletics on that program. The athletics department provides support to students in the athletic training education program in the form of a stipend, books and travel to the Arkansas Athletic Trainers' Association annual meeting. Two endowed scholarships for athletic training students in honor of longtime Razorback trainers Dean Weber and the late Bill Ferrell were established through the athletics department.

Dr. Hunt has been married to David Hunt since 1973, and they have an adult son and daughter as well as a grandson.

VICE CHANCELLOR FOR INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS & DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Entering his fifth full year as Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics. Jeff Long has guided the University of Arkansas' Department of Intercollegiate Athletics through a period of unprecedented transition and gained national attention for his leadership while revitalizing a tradition-rich athletics program encompassing 19 sports and more than 460 student-athletes.

Long leads a comprehensive athletics program uniformly committed to the development of student-athletes academically, athletically and socially. A part of Chancellor G. David Gearhart's Executive Committee, Long is helping to chart the course for the future of higher education at the University of Arkansas while integrating Razorback Athletics into the campus community. In each of the past three years, Razorback Athletics has made a \$1 million gift to support the university's academic mission. The department's total support of university and student programs and initiatives includes \$1.9 million in direct funding of academic programs.

Long's leadership and unwavering commitment to the student-athletes and maintaining integrity within intercollegiate athletics has not gone unnoticed. In 2011-12, Long was named a finalist for the SportsBusiness Journal and SportsBusiness Daily Athletic Director of the Year. In the spring of 2012, the Donald W. Reynolds Foundation and longtime chairman Fred W. Smith made a gift of more than \$1.25 million to the program in recognition of Long's leadership of Razorback Athletics.

In Long's tenure, Arkansas has captured 11 conference championships and advanced to 68 post-season competitions, including the school's first Bowl Championship Series appearance in football, while drawing more than a million fans annually to campus to cheer on the Razorbacks. In 2011-12, Arkansas finished No. 20 in the Learfield Sports Directors Cup, a year-long competition ranking the nation's most successful intercollegiate athletic programs, the fourth time in the past five years the Razorbacks have finished in the nation's top 25.

In the classroom, the Razorbacks continue to set new standards including posting a student-athlete grade point average of 3.07 in 2011-12. It marked the fourth consecutive year Razorback student-athletes posted a GPA exceeding 3.0. Arkansas exceeds the national APR multi-year rate by more than 10 points in 18 sports and has seen a steady rise in graduation success

Student-athlete development has also been a priority including the establishment of the Razorback Leadership Academy, the first of its kind in the Southeastern Conference. In the community, Razorback student-athletes are more active than ever volunteering more than 5,000 hours of time for more than 100 agencies, organizations and schools.

One of the nation's most active athletic directors on Twitter, Long embraces the opportunity to interact with members of the Razorback Nation whether in person or through social media.


Long was selected to replace legendary athletic director and former Razorback football coach Frank Broyles and even before he officially took the reins on Jan. 1, 2008, Arkansas announced that it would combine its previously independent men's and women's athletic programs into one combined athletic program. Long adeptly blended the men's and women's athletic departments into one unified department and established a new administrative structure.

Long has also worked tirelessly to maintain long-time relationships and to forge new relationships for the benefit of the Razorback program including extending Arkansas' relationship with War Memorial Stadium and partnering with former Razorback Jerry Jones to develop the Southwest Classic, a football series with Texas A&M played at the spectacular Cowboys Stadium.

Under Long's leadership, the program has fortified its financial standing ensuring more support for the development of student-athletes. According to the Wall Street Journal, Arkansas is one of only 22 self-sustaining Divi-

As economic indicators were beginning to point toward challenging economic times, Long signed Arkansas to a deal with IMG College to form Razorback Sports Properties that guarantees the Razorback program \$73 million during the course of the decadelong agreement. Long also negotiated an extensive all sports apparel and footwear agreement with NIKE, Inc. that will outfit all 19 Razorback sports programs through the 2014-15 season. In December 2011, Forbes Magazine estimated the value of the Razorback Football program at \$89 million, eighth in the nation. Arkansas saw the largest increase (59%) from the previous rankings released in 2009.

In 2010, Long moved to help meet the growing financial needs of fielding a nationally competitive all sports program. The athletic department launched the "Answer the Call" campaign through the Razorback Foundation which resulted in more than 2,600 new members and helped generate more than \$6.5 million in additional support for Razorback student-athletes.

With an eye towards the future, Long commissioned a comprehensive plan to assess the future facility needs of the program. Unveiled in October 2011, the Razorback Athletic Facilities Master Plan provided a vision and the road map for \$320 million of facility renovations and additions that will help all 19 Razorback sports remain competitive in the Southeastern Conference and nationally over the next 30 years. The first major project from the master plan, the football center, is currently being constructed with a targeted completion date in 2013.

A veteran administrator with a track record of the highest commitment to the concept of "student-athlete," Long has had more than two decades experience in athletic administration at the Division I level including at the University of Pittsburgh, University of Oklahoma, University of Michigan, Virginia Tech University, Eastern Kentucky University and Rice University. Long also understands the coach's perspective from time spent in coaching staff positions at Duke University, University of Michigan and North Carolina State University.

His experience as an athletic director and administrator in five of the six Bowl Championship Series conferences – the Big 12, Big Ten, Big East, Atlantic Coast and SEC - gives Long a uniquely informed perspective on intercollegiate athletics.

On the forefront of NCAA governance, Long has served on the NCAA Management Council, the NCAA's Sports Wagering Task Force and as a member of the Executive Committee of the Division I-A Athletic Directors' Association. Long currently serves on the NCAA Championships/Sports Management Cabinet.

Prior to assuming his current roles at Arkansas, Long served for four years as the athletic director at the University of Pittsburgh. Long redefined Pitt athletics, most notably through the "Quest for Excellence" campaign that raised nearly \$34 million to enhance the student-athlete experience. During his tenure the Panthers' were selected as the No. 17 overall program in the nation in the December 2006 Sports Illustrated on Campus' All-Sport Rankings

Before arriving at Pitt, Long was senior associate athletic director at Oklahoma for two and a half years overseeing external affairs for the Sooners. In addition, Long was the primary administrator for the Sooners' highly successful football and men's basketball programs, along with sport supervision of baseball, wrestling and both golf teams.

Long's first appointment as a director of athletics was at Eastern Kentucky where he served for two and a half years. Prior to Eastern, Long had a brief stay with Virginia Tech as an associate athletics director.

He began his career in college athletic administration at Michigan, hired by legendary coach and athletics director, the late Bo Schembechler. During his seasons with the Wolverines, Long was promoted through a series of posts to the position of associate athletics director.

A former two-sport athlete at Ohio Wesleyan, Long earned seven varsity letters for the Bishops in football and baseball before completing his degree in economics in 1982. Her leadership was also a part of the success of the university's Campaign for the Twenty-First Century. Lewis directed Women's Athletics to over \$11.5 million in direct support for women's teams. During the campaign, Lewis received one of her greatest personal honors as Bob and Marilyn Bogle requested that Arkansas' \$6 million facility be named the Bev Lewis Center. In 1998, she was voted into the University Of Arkansas Hall Of Honor.

Lewis served collegiate athletics at the highest level as an administrator, first with the NCAA Championship Cabinet and recently on the NCAA Management Council. Prior to assuming the duties of AD, Lewis was women's cross country and track coach. Her Arkansas coaching milestones included the first women's squad to achieve a national ranking and the first conference championship team with the 1988 Southwest Conference Cross Country Championships.

Scobey joined the UA athletic staff in 1977 as an assistant athletic ticket manager and became ticket manager in 1983.



ACADEMIC SERVICES

Recognizing the difficulty of balancing the demands of athletic competition at the highest level and completion of the rigorous academic standards of a Carnegie research-level university, the Razorback Athletic Department provides support services through both facilities and personnel to guide Arkansas student-athletes to their ultimate goal: University of Arkansas diploma.

The key components of the Center for Student-Athlete Success (CSAS) are personal development, career development, academic tutoring, study hall facilities, class attendance monitoring and incentive awards recognizing academic achievement.

BOGLE ACADEMIC CENTER

There is no higher priority for the University of Arkansas Athletic Department than the academic progress of its scholar-athletes. Thanks to the generous gift of Bob and Marilyn Bogle, the home of the Razorback Athletic Department's Student-Athlete Academic Support and Achievement program is the Bob and Marilyn Bogle Academic Center. The 15,000-square foot Bogle Academic Center is located in the east side of Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium. Under the overall direction of Senior Associate Athletic Director Jon Fagg, the Bogle Academic Center houses the Arkansas Razorbacks Academic Support Program, the Razorback Student-Athlete Development Office and the Career Development Program.

Associate Athletic Director for Academics and Student-Athlete Development Eric A. Wood oversees the staff of professionals dedicated to directing student-athletes to reach their personal academic goals, and to do so in ways that balance their academic, athletic and personal lives.

STUDY HALL AND TUTORS

A quiet setting for uninterrupted study, the Bogle Academic Center provides three types of study hall space. The computer lab has more than 30 stations for individual computer-based study. An open study hall is available for group or individual study, and monitored by staff members of the SAASA. There are 17 individual study carrels that provide space for tutors to meet with studentathletes for individual instruction in specific subjects.

Each Razorback team sets its own criteria for study hall attendance. The use of tutors is a key element for academic success, allowing for individualized assistance and for reaching academic excellence in advanced subjects.

STUDENT-ATHLETE DEVELOPMENT

The mission of the Student-Athlete Development Office is to contribute to the personal growth and character development of Razorback student-athletes through holistic programming for success in life.

Finally, student-athletes participated in Hogs in Transition, a program designed to help Razorbacks make the move to life after college and athletics. Student-athletes took part in career fairs, corporate office visits and interview training.

New for 2011-12 was the debut of the Hogspy awards, modeled after the ESPY's, to recognize academic and athletic achievements as well as leadership and community service.


FRANK BROYLES
