GAME NOTES

- » QB Taylen Green became the first QB in program history to throw for 300+ yards and rush for 100+ yards in the same game. The Lewisville, Texas product completed 22-35 passing attempts for 305 yards and a touchdown while rushing 14 times for 115 yards and a touchdown.
- » QB Taylen Green moved into a tie for seventh all-time in career rushing TD by an Arkansas QB with 10, joining Scott Bull (1972-1975) and George Walker (1954-1957).
- » QB Taylen Green (14 carries, 115 yards) became the first Arkansas quarterback to record a 100-yard rushing game against Ole Miss since QB Matt Jones in 2004. Green also became the first Arkansas QB to rush for 100+ yards in consecutive games since Jones did so in 2004 against South Carolina (111, 11/6/04) and Ole Miss (126, 11/13/04).
- » RB Mike Washington Jr. registered his sixth career multi-rushing touchdown game and his first as a Razorback with a 47-yard rushing touchdown in the second quarter and a three-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter. Washington Jr. finished the night with 65 rushing yards on 13 carries.
- » RB Mike Washington Jr. became the first Arkansas RB to record rushes of 40+ yards in consecutive games since Raheim Sanders did so in 2022 against South Carolina and Missouri State. Washington completed the feat on a 47-yard TD run with 13:22 left in the second quarter.
- » The Razorbacks' 199 consecutive extra-points made streak, which began on Dec. 5, 2020, is the second-longest such streak nationally based on date, behind Northwestern (Oct. 24, 2020).
- » WR O'Mega Blake found the endzone on a 30-yard pass from Taylen Green with 10 seconds on the clock in the first quarter. Blake became the first Arkansas WR to register a TD reception in three consecutive games since Matt Landers accomplished the feat during the final four games of the 2022 season. Blake led the Hogs with six catches for 81 yards and a touchdown.
- » TE Jaden Platt registered his second-longest career reception on a 34-yard pass from Taylen Green during the game's opening play from scrimmage. It marked his longest as a Razorback and longest since he recorded a 39-yard reception while at Texas A&M on Dec. 27, 2023, against Oklahoma State in the TaxAct Texas Bowl.
- » OL Fernando Carmona Jr. started his 40th consecutive game on the offensive line dating back to his redshirt freshman season at San Jose State in 2022.
- » DB Julian Neal registered 2+ pass breakups for the second consecutive game with 2 tonight, becoming the first Razorback to accomplish the feat since De'Jon Harris did so in 2019 with two against Colorado State (Sept. 8, 2019) and North Texas (Sept. 15, 2019), respectively.
- » For the second consecutive game, Arkansas did not allow a single sack, marking the first time since 2021 that the Razorbacks allowed no sacks in consecutive games when they allowed no sacks against Texas (Sept. 11, 2021) and Georgia Southern (Sept. 18, 2021).

ARKANSAS QUOTES

Sam Pittman, Arkansas Head Coach

Opening Statement:

"It was a heck of a game by two good offenses. It came down to the end where we had a chance to win it and unfortunately we could not. I was really proud of our offense they kept us in it ... We have problems on defense that we have to get fixed. The offense kept us in the game and the defense got a three and out. We had a chance to win it at the end. Two good SEC football teams out there and unfortunately we came up on the short end."

On the defense:

"We have to communicate better. Two or three of the scores in the first half they had guys wide open. Could not cover ... We were checking to check and Lane's check. We cut all of that out in the second half because we had to give our guys a chance. We did not open field tackle very well. Especially in the first half. We did not put pressure on the guarterback. Those were some things at half that we're talked about."

On the offense line:

"They faced a good defensive line too. Taylen (Green) took off some but not necessarily because of the pressure. We rushed for 200+ yards and threw for 300+ yards. The offensive line seems to me to get better and better and better. They did not really feel any problems on the edge. A lot of times they went to rushing three and dropping eight because we were hitting them so much with crossing routes. Our offensive line played really well."

On the defense:

"I would say we just needed more execution and things like that. We have not watched film. So on Monday once we watch the film we will know exactly what the problem was. Coming right out of the gates we just needed better execution."

On moving forward:

"We were on the road. It was a night game and it is hard to win on the road at night against a good team too. It is early in the season. We still have a long season ahead of us. It is not the end of the world. As long as we get better and keep getting better and better everyday, we will be good.

On generating presure:

"It is very frusturating not to get to the quarterback. We always want to help out the secondary like corners and safeties ... We know not getting to the quarterback puts stress on our defensive backs. We have to be better at getting to the quarterback. Getting him off his mark or getting him on the ground to give our defense a chance. They cannot be covering them (wide receivers) forever."

On moving forward:

"It is early in the season. Everybody has to keep their heads up. Just need to get back to the drawing board and continue to get better."

On offensive success:

"Trusting the game plan and trusting Coach Petrino. The offensive line did a wonderful job of communicating on the road in a hostile environment to give me time in the pocket. Their run blocking too and making holes. That is where it all starts in the trenches. Our receivers, running backs and tight ends did a great job with their ball in the hands."
