Hoops for St. Jude Tip Off Classic

- Arkansas head coach John Calipari returns to the FedEx Forum sidelines on Oct. 27 (Monday) when the Razorbacks face the Memphis Tigers as part of the Hoops for St. Jude Tip Off Classic presented by Bad Boy Mowers, benefiting St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.
- The exhibition game will be a doubleheader with the Memphis women's program, which hosts Vanderbilt at 5:30 pm (CT). Tipoff for the men's game is set for 8 pm (CT). Both games will be broadcast on ESPN.
- "The Tip Off Classic is more than a game. It's a powerful expression of what can happen when a community unites to hoop for hope," said Ike Anand, President and CEO of ALSAC, the fundraising and awareness organization for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. "It's deeply meaningful to witness these incredible college programs take the court not just to compete, but to champion the mission of St. Jude. The energy in FedExForum, the pride of Memphis, Arkansas, and Vanderbilt, and the generosity of fans fuel the work St. Jude does for children with catastrophic diseases both here and around the world."

THE SERIES: Arkansas/Cal vs Memphis

- Arkansas and Memphis have each won 11 games in 22 regular-season games.
- ^ The Tigers have won two straight in the series, including 84-79 in the semifinals of the Battle for Atlantis on Nov. 23, 2023.
- ^ However, Arkansas has won 9 of the last 13 in the series.
- Arkansas trails 4-6 in games played in Memphis. **HOWEVER...**
- ^ The last time Arkansas played in Memphis was the 2002-03 season, which was Coach Calipari's first year as head coach with the Tigers. Arkansas won, 90-73. (NOTE: The following year, Cal's Tigers came to Bud Walton Arena and won 72-69.)
- John Calipari is 1-0 all-time versus Memphis.
- ^ Cal's UMass Minutemen ousted the Tigers, 64-61, on Jan. 4, 1996 in Worcester, Mass.

Coach Cal While at Memphis

- John Calipari, who is entering his second season as Arkansas head coach, served as head coach at Memphis from 2000-09.
- ^ Led the Tigers to a 252-69 record (.785) over his nine seasons
- ^ Memphis won seven league titles - posting a 117-25 conference ledger (.824)
- ^ Memphis reached six NCAA Tournaments - including a national runner-up and a total of four Sweet 16s
- ^ Played in a pair of NITs, winning the event in 2002 and reaching the Final Four in 2005.
- In games as head coach at both Memphis and Kentucky, Coach Cal is 154-20 in games played in FedExForum.
- During his tenure as head coach of the Tigers, Calipari had a 153-19 record in games played in Memphis between games played in The Pyramid and FedExForum. (Note, one of the 19 losses came at the hands of the Razorbacks.)
- ^ Memphis called The Pyramid home for Calipari's first four years and went 60-9 (.870) in the facility.
- ^ In 2004-05, the Tigers moved to the FedExForum and Cal led Memphis to a 93-10 record (.903) there over 5 seasons.
- In games as head coach at both Memphis and Kentucky, Coach Cal is 94-11 in games played in FedExForum.
- ^ While the head coach at Kentucky, Calipari played two games in the FedEx Forum and went 1-1, beating UCLA in the NCAA Sweet 16 before falling to North Carolina in the Elite 8.

RECAP: Arkansas - Cincinnati Exhibition ... The CareSource Invitational - Fayetteville

- The #14/15 Arkansas men's basketball program led by 20 at halftime, used a 23-10 run to start the second half and cruised to an 89-61 victory over Cincinnati for an exhibition game at Bud Walton Arena dubbed the CareSource Invitational - Fayetteville, Supporting Mental Health.
- The Cincinnati-Arkansas matchup is part of a broader, mission-aligned initiative sponsored by CareSource, a nonprofit managed care organization. The initiative aims to normalize the mental health conversation nationwide, break the stigma and promote the overall well-being of children and teens.
- Arkansas had five players score in double figures, including a combined 35 points from freshmen Meleek Thomas (18 points) and Darius Acuff Jr. (17 points). Thomas also led the team with seven rebounds. Trevon Brazile had 15 points, Karter Knox had 13 and Billy Richmond III added 10.

FIRST HALF: ARK: 48 - CIN: 28

- Arkansas started the game with an alley-oop dunk by Trevon Brazile from Darius Acuff.
- Cincinnati answered with a 3-pointer but the Razorbacks took control after that. The Hogs made four straight baskets while Cincinnati was just 1-of-7 from the field to give Arkansas a 12-5 lead and forced a Bearcat timeout.
- Later, Arkansas used a 6-0 run capped by a fastbreak tomahawk dunk by Billy Richmond which forced a second Cincy timeout.
- After back-to-back 3-pointers by Cincinnati before a media timeout, Arkansas came out of the break with an 11-0 run to lead 39-22.
- Arkansas was led by Darius Acuff with 13 first-half points.
- The 48 points by Arkansas were its best first half in an exhibition versus an NCAA Division I opponent. The previous best was 45 last year versus #1 Kansas.
- Arkansas shot 53.1% from the field while Cincinnati shot just 27.8%.

SECOND HALF: ARK: 41 - CIN: 33

- Arkansas opened the second half with a 23-10 run.
- Meleek Thomas had a team-best 11 points in the second half.
- Much as it did in the first half, Arkansas shot 53.3% from the field while holding the Bearcats to 28.9%.

NOTES:

- Arkansas improved to 75-11 all-time in exhibition games, including a 67-9 mark in Bud Walton Arena. Arkansas has won 39 consecutive home exhibition games.
- **Cincinnati, which won at #7 Michigan, 100-98, in an exhibition, only had one player score in double figures, Halvine Dzellat with 10 points. SEE FULL BOX SCORE ON THE FINAL PAGE OF THESE NOTES**

Razorbacks Ready for Year Two Calipari Era

- Naismith Hall of Fame coach John Calipari, who has led six teams to the Final Four, enters his 34th season as a collegiate head coach and second at Arkansas.
- **He is 23 wins from 900 career on-court wins** and is on-pace to be the second or third-fastest coach to reach 900 wins.
- Calipari became the fourth-fastest coach to 800 on-court wins ever at 1,037 games. Only Adolph Rupp (972 games), Roy Williams (1,012 games) and Dean Smith (1,029 games) did it faster.
- Of the 32 NCAA Tournaments held during his collegiate coaching career, he has led 24 teams to the NCAA Tournament, including 16 trips to the Sweet 16, 12 appearances to the Elite 8, six Final Four births, three national title games and a national championship. (Note, in 2019-20, Kentucky was 25-6 and won the SEC with a 15-3 record but the NCAA canceled the tournament due to COVID-19.)
- Calipari is one of two coaches in NCAA history to take three different programs to the Final Four and just is one of three coaches to lead four different schools to the Sweet 16.
- His teams have won an NCAA-record 38 games three times - twice at UK ('12 & '15) and once at Memphis ('08).

Recapping Last Year

- Arkansas finished 22-14 overall and 8-10 to tie for 9th in the SEC.
- Despite an 0-5 start to SEC play and falling out of the national polls, Arkansas reached the Sweet 16 to finish #20 in the AP and #25 in the coaches polls.
- Arkansas earned a #10 seed in the West Regional for its 37th NCAA bid in program history while making its fourth Sweet 16 appearance in five years.
 - ^ 10th seeded Arkansas was the only Sweet 16 team with higher than a #6 seed. Arkansas was one of 8 SEC teams to reach the Sweet 16.
 - ^ Arkansas is just the second team in the shot clock era to reach the Sweet 16 after starting 0-5 in league play.
- Big wins included:
 - ^ at Miami (Fla.) in the SEC/ACC Challenge
 - ^ vs Michigan in the Jimmy V Classic
 - ^ at #12 Kentucky
 - ^ season sweep versus Texas
 - ^ vs Kansas in the NCAA 1st Rd
 - ^ vs #5 (#2 seed) St. John's in the NCAA 2nd Rd

Bud Walton Sold Out ... AGAIN

- For the fifth consecutive year, season tickets for Arkansas men's basketball sold out prior to a game being played. After a major re-seating of the Arena that started on Aug. 5, season ticket allotments were sold out by the end of the month.

Hall of Famers Square Off

- Arkansas, led by 2015 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee John Calipari, and Michigan State, led by 2016 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Tom Izzo, are set to play a home-and-home series. The series is set to begin this fall on Nov. 8 (Saturday) in the Spartans' Breslin Center.
- The programs have only met on two previous occasions - on neutral courts - with Michigan State winning both.
 - ^ The first meeting came in the 1991 Maui Classic championship game when the second-ranked Razorbacks fell to Michigan State, 86-71, on Nov. 27.*
 - ^ The teams faced off again nearly four years to the date later (Nov. 28, 1995) as part of the Great Eight Tournament, played at The Palace in Auburn Hills. Michigan State edged the #25 Razorbacks, 75-72. That game came in Izzo's first year as the Spartans' head coach (his fourth game) and was his second career victory (first versus a Division I opponent as Michigan State beat Chaminade in the Maui Classic opener to start the season).*
- While Arkansas and Michigan State's history is limited, the teams' head coaches have played in several high profile matchups - all on neutral courts - with Calipari holding a slight 3-2 advantage over Izzo. Coach Cal was 2-2 at Kentucky and 1-0 at Memphis versus Izzo's Spartans.
- While at Kentucky, Calipari's four meetings with Izzo and his Spartans were all played in November as part of the Champions Classic. While Cal was in Memphis, the Tigers beat MSU was in the 2008 Sweet 16.

Hogs Host Louisville in ACC/SEC Challenge

- For the third consecutive year, Arkansas will participate in the ACC/SEC Challenge. The Razorbacks will host the Louisville Cardinals.
- In the first two years of the Challenge, the SEC leads 21-9, thanks to a 14-2 scoresheet last season. Overall, the series stands at 1-0-1 in the SEC's favor.
- Last year, Arkansas traveled to Miami and defeated the Hurricanes 76-73.
- In year one of the Challenge, Arkansas defeated #7 Duke, 80-75, in Bud Walton Arena before the largest crowd in facility history (20,344).
- **ARKANSAS VERSUS LOUISVILLE**
 - The Arkansas and Louisville series is tied 4-4. The Razorbacks evened the series with an 80-54 victory over the Cardinals in the opening round of the 2022 Maui Invitational.

ON-COURT SUCCESS

A "players-first" coach whose biggest goal is helping people reach their dreams, John Calipari, a Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer, is fast approaching 900 career wins while guiding six teams to the Final Four and helping 62 players earn selection in the NBA Draft during his 33-year college coaching career with his pros amassing over \$5.8 billion in contracts.

Calipari took UMass to the Final Four in 1996, guided Memphis to the National Championship game in 2008 and led Kentucky to four Final Fours - including the 2012 National Championship and a runner-up finish in 2014 - to become **only the second coach in NCAA history to lead three different schools to the Final Four**. He has racked up 24 NCAA Tournament appearances and numerous National Coach of the Year honors.

In his first year at Arkansas, Calipari led the Razorbacks to a Sweet 16 appearance, his 16th as a head coach, and **became just the third coach in NCAA history to take four programs to the Sweet 16**. Also, after beating Kansas and St. John's to reach the 2025 Sweet 16, Calipari pushed his NCAA Tournament wins total to 59, tying for sixth all-time.

At every collegiate stop, Calipari's career has been successful throughout, but his 10-year stretch at Kentucky (2009-19) was among the best decades in NCAA history, reaching four Final Fours (with a 2012 championship and 2014 national runner-up), seven Elite 8 berths and nine trips to the Sweet 16.

The 2015 campaign was highlighted by Coach Cal directing the first-ever college basketball team to own a 38-0 record (before falling in the Final Four) and became one of just three coaches to make four Final Fours in a five-year span. At the end of that 2015 season, Calipari became the 96th coach to join the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

Coach Cal has **led three teams to an NCAA-record 38 wins on the court in a season** (once at Memphis and twice at Kentucky), led the NCAA in wins six times (at least once at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky) and tallied 30, 20-win seasons (including 11 30-win campaigns). With his sustained success, Coach Cal received the John R. Wooden Award Legends of Coaching honor in 2024.

While building a program out of obscurity at UMass and returning Memphis and Kentucky to national contenders, he has totaled the second-most wins in NCAA history in the first 20 years of a college coaching career.

PLAYER SUCCESS

In his goal to lead a players-first program, he has helped **77 players realize their dreams by being drafted or playing in the NBA**. Calipari's NBA players have **amassed over \$5.8 billion in contracts**, which does not include endorsements nor players that have played overseas. He has had four No. 1 overall picks, tying for most overall, among his **62 players drafted and 43 first-round picks**, both ranking second-most all-time. In 2010, he had a record five first-round draft picks. Two years later, six of his players heard their names called at the 2012 draft, the most in the two-round draft era. Then in 2015, Cal would have six picks again, including a record-tying four lottery selections.

Calipari's players have entered the league NBA-ready. His players have garnered 43 All-Star selections, including a record-breaking seven in 2024, with Anthony Davis winning the game's MVP honor in 2017. **Derrick Rose was named NBA MVP in 2011 and Shai Gilgeous-Alexander was voted NBA MVP in 2025 to make Cal just the third person to coach two NBA MVPs in college** (with John Wooden and Dean Smith). Nine of his players have been tabbed All-NBA (a combined 21 times), three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year and 18 players have made the NBA All-Rookie teams. **He is the only coach in history to have a player win each of the NBA's major honors: MVP (twice), Rookie of the Year, Most Improved Player, Sixth Man of the Year and Clutch Player of the Year**.

Much like he did at UMass, where his players graduated at nearly 80%, Calipari has stressed academics. Seventeen of his last 20 seniors at Memphis earned their bachelor's degrees, and all 31 players at UK who were eligible to graduate by the end of their senior years walked away with a diploma in hand, including five players who earned their degree in just three years. Calipari's teams routinely have posted a combined team grade-point average of 3.0 or better.

COMMUNITY SUCCESS

Calipari has raised millions of dollars to help the lives of those in need. He has had a particular passion to assist those impacted by natural disasters. For instance, in 2010, he used a telethon to raise more than \$1 million for victims of the devastating earthquake in Haiti. He followed that up with telethons in 2012, raising \$1 million for victims of Superstorm Sandy, in 2017 for victims of Hurricane Harvey, played a leading role in the "Kentucky United" efforts that generated more than \$5 million for victims of devastating tornadoes in Western Kentucky in 2021, and raised nearly \$4 million with the Kentucky Flood Relief Telethon and open practice at Rupp Arena in 2022. In his second month on the job at Arkansas, Cal helped with cleanup efforts after tornadoes hit the state. He has continued the Suits & Sneakers Gala in NW Arkansas and continued his tradition of helping families at Christmas with food, presents and paying for rent.

Calipari launched his **THE CALIPARI FOUNDATION** in 2012 and has worked with several key partners to donate more than \$1.5 million, a figure that does not include matching funds that have been contributed from individuals and corporations. In 2013, Calipari initiated hosting an annual alumni weekend around his basketball fantasy experience with the intent to raise money for charity. After generating \$350,000 for selected organizations and charities during the inaugural game, the weekend has generated millions of dollars for charity since its inception.

In 2019, when federal workers were without pay due to a government shutdown, he, his wife and his foundation assisted workers with financial help and grocery gift cards. He and his wife, Ellen, teamed up with Fayette County Public Schools to help families in need during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Additional efforts include spearheading the creation of the **JOHN McLENDON MINORITY LEADERSHIP INITIATIVE**, a nationwide coach-driven initiative to provide minorities a jump-start to their careers through practical experiences, opportunities to build their network and instilling the values of John McLendon: integrity, education, leadership and mentorship. Participants in the initiative will be known as MLI Future Leaders.

He was awarded the Jefferson Award for Outstanding Public Service in Sports by Multiplying Good in 2022. For more than 50 years, Multiplying Good has honored those who put others first. Those receiving the Jefferson Award are empowered to do more, while their stories of extraordinary public service inspire others to action. It is an award that underscores impact. He earned the Race Amity Medal of Honor in 2023.

OTHER SUCCESS

In 2017, Coach Cal was named the head coach of the 2017 USA Basketball Men's U19 World Cup Team, which finished third at the 2017 FIBA U19 World Cup in Cairo. Also, he won gold as head coach of the 2012 Dominican Republic team at the Centrobasket Championship.

Author of five books, including the New York Times Best Seller "Players First: Coaching from the Inside Out," Calipari is a master of communication and maximizing talent. He lives by the motto that **"it's never a matter of how far you have fallen, but instead it's about how high you bounce back."**

CALIPARI 4TH FASTEST TO 800 CAREER VICTORIES; NEARING 900

With Kentucky's overtime win over Mississippi State on Jan. 25, 2022, John Calipari reached 800 on-court wins, all at the Division I level. At the time he was one of just 22 coaches, regardless of NCAA level of classification, to reach that barrier. Overall, only 16 coaches have done it with at least 10 seasons at the Division I level.

Calipari was the fourth-fastest coach to 800 on-court wins at 1,037 games. Only Adolph Rupp (972 games), Roy Williams (1,012 games) and Dean Smith (1,029 games) did it faster.

Calipari is nearing his 900th career win and he is on pace to reach that plateau as potentially the second-fastest coach in D-I history to do so, trailing Roy Williams (1,161 games) and possibly beating Mike Krzyzewski at 1,183 games.

Although Calipari is still climbing the charts, he is doing it nearly as fast as anyone else in NCAA history. When he defeated Mississippi State on Jan. 17, 2024, Calipari became the third-fastest active head coach to 400 wins at a single program, trailing only Bill Self (Kansas - 484) and Mark Few (Gonzaga - 499). Overall, Calipari needed just 516 games to reach 400 wins while at UK to rank the eighth fastest in Division I history.

FIRST BALLOT HALL OF FAMER

John Calipari joined basketball's fraternity of legends in September of 2015 after being elected to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on the first ballot. Calipari joined an elite group of basketball players and coaches in the Naismith Hall of Fame, considered to be one of the ultimate honors in the sport.

The Class of 2015 included Calipari, Dick Bevetta, Louis Dampier, Lindsay Gaze, Tom Heinsohn, John Isaacs, Spencer Haywood, Lisa Leslie, Dikembe Mutombo, George Raveling and JoJo White. Calipari was inducted in Springfield, Mass., and nearly 70 of his former players joined him on stage during his acceptance speech.

COACH CAL IMMORTALIZED AT UMASS, CLARION, CONFERENCE USA

John Calipari's Hall of Fame rise began at UMass, and the school honored his program's breakthrough in the 1990s by unveiling a statue of Calipari on the Amherst campus in September 2021. Calipari was one of four icons synonymous with UMass basketball to earn the honor. Calipari's statue was unveiled next to Marcus Camby, Julius Erving and the late Jack Leaman outside the Mullins Center.

At UMass, Calipari led the Minutemen to a 193-71 on-court record in his eight seasons as head coach from 1989-96. His .731 career winning percentage remains the best in school history. Calipari led UMass to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 1992 to 1996 after UMass had gone to the NAAs only once in the first 81 years of the program. His Minutemen made the Atlantic 10's first and only Final Four appearance during the 1996 season, during which they went 35-2 overall and spent 10 weeks ranked No. 1 in the nation. Following the 1996 season, Calipari was named National Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches, The Sporting News and Naismith.

Clarion honored Calipari by having a statue erected and naming the basketball court in his honor. Tippin Gymnasium's floor was officially renamed the John V. Calipari Court in September 2021 and is better known as "Coach Cal Court." Calipari started his college playing career at UNC Wilmington before transferring to Clarion in 1981, helping the Golden Eagles reach their first NCAA Division II Tournament in program history that year.

In the summer of 2022, Calipari was enshrined into the Conference USA Hall of Fame. Calipari was honored by the league for his impressive tenure as head men's basketball coach at the University of Memphis, where he coached from the 2000-09. Calipari led the Tigers to the 2008 NCAA title game, including an NCAA, single-season record 38 wins. As a result, he earned his second Naismith National Coach of the Year honor, becoming only the second coach to earn the honor multiple times since its inception in 1987. Calipari, the 2009 Sports Illustrated National Coach of the Year, led the Tigers to nine straight 20-win campaigns and nine consecutive postseason appearances, the only Memphis coach to do that. He posted 252 on-court wins – 28.0 wins per season – as the Tigers' head coach, making him the winningest coach in school history. From 2006-08, the Tigers won 104 games, making Calipari the winningest head coach in NCAA Division I history in a three-year span.

A WOODEN AWARD LEGEND OF COACHING

On Oct. 3, 2023, it was announced that John Calipari would receive the John R. Wooden Award "Legends of Coaching" honor. On April 12, 2024, the newly named Razorback head basketball coach was on hand for the trophy presentation at the Los Angeles Athletic Club.

The "Legends of Coaching" honor recognizes coaches who exemplify Coach Wooden's high standard of coaching success and personal integrity. The award was adopted by the Wooden Award Steering Committee in 1999. The honorees are selected based on character, success on the court, graduation rate of student-athletes in their basketball program, coaching philosophy, and identification with the goals of the John R. Wooden Award. He will be presented the honor along with the 2024 Wooden Award winners on April 12, 2024.

Chairman of the Wooden Award Steering Committee Sam Lagana said, "Coach John Calipari has been a significant part of the Wooden Award experience, dating back to his first head coaching assignment at UMass. He has supported the Award and stood with his candidates and winners every step of the way. Coach Wooden had an appreciation for Coach Cal that carried through the years and Coach Calipari has demonstrated great reverence for Coach Wooden as both shared a 'players first' mentality, with emphasis on care for the student-athlete and in the value of competitive greatness. John Calipari is a wonderful addition to the fraternity of Wooden Award 'Legends of Coaching' recipients."

Calipari's on-court success is well publicized and culminated with the highest honor in the sport by being inducted into the Naismith Hall of Fame. Off the court, Coach Calipari's impact has been felt in his community and abroad. In 2012, he founded the John Calipari Foundation which has partnered with many organizations, including: Samaritan's Feet, 4 Paws for Ability, One Parent Scholar House and Team Focus. He has partnered with the American Red Cross to raise millions of dollars to help people affected by disasters such as the 2010 Haitian earthquake, 2012 Superstorm Sandy, and the 2022 flooding in Eastern Kentucky. He helped spearhead the creation of the John McLendon Minority Leadership Initiative, a national coach-driven initiative to provide minorities with a jump-start to their careers.

As someone who prides himself on helping young men reach their dreams, John Calipari has helped 77 players get drafted or play in the NBA as free agents, including 62 players going in the NBA Draft.

CHANGING FAMILIES LIVES ... \$5.8 BILLION AND COUNTING

John Calipari hasn't just signed the best talent in the country; he's been the best at developing that talent, making those players better prepared than anyone else and getting them ready for all things at the next level. The proof is in the numbers.

Entering the 2025-26 NBA season, Calipari's NBA pros will have amassed over \$5.898 billion in NBA contracts over their careers, which does not include endorsement deals or players on overseas contracts. Through 2024-25 his players on NBA rosters have tallied over \$2 billion alone. For the 2025-26 NBA season alone, Cal's players are set to earn over \$563 million.

CALIPARI UNRIVALED IN CONFERENCE

John Calipari has won a combined 16 league regular-season championships in his career (including six Southeastern Conference titles). That is six more than the next-closest coach in the SEC (Bruce Pearl has 10). Calipari has won a combined 15 conference tournament titles in his career (six in the SEC), 10 more than his closest competitor (Nate Oats with five).

Calipari has tallied a 414-141 (74.6%) all-time record within conference play as a head coach and owns a 206-75 (73.3%) record since joining the SEC.

Although he's been publicly outspoken against conference tournaments – only because he doesn't favor playing three or more games on consecutive days to win the tournament – his teams have gotten up for them. Calipari's teams at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky have been to 19 conference championship games in his career, winning a remarkable 15 of them. Calipari is 59-17 (77.6%) all-time in conference tournaments, including 25-9 (73.5%) in the SEC. Calipari's 25 SEC Tournament wins ties for third all-time (Adolph Rupp 57, Billy Donovan 27, Wimp Sanderson 25).

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

John Calipari-coached teams have posted an all-time record of 486-62 (88.7%) record at home. Calipari's best home winning streak came when he began his career at UK with a 54-game home win streak at Rupp Arena. He additionally had a 42-game home win streak at UK (2014-17). He has gone undefeated at home 10 times overall – adding seven times with just one loss – while going undefeated at home in league play 14 times.

LIFE AWAY FROM HOME ISN'T SO BAD EITHER

As good as John Calipari's team's have been at home, they're pretty good in hostile environments on the road. His teams are 219-137 (61.5%) overall on the road. At neutral-site venues, his teams are 172-78 (68.8%) including six seasons with at least 10 neutral-site wins.

CALIPARI IN ELITE COMPANY WITH CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS

When Kentucky clinched a share of the 2017 Southeastern Conference championship, John Calipari became the first NCAA Division I coach to lead three different programs (UMass, Memphis, Kentucky) to five on-court, regular-season league titles three different times. UMass won five Atlantic 10 titles (1992, '93, '94, '95 and '96). Memphis claimed five Conference USA crowns (2004, '06, '07, '08 and '09). Kentucky captured the SEC Championship six times (2010, '12, '15, '16, '17 and '20). Perhaps more impressive is that Calipari has 31 combined regular-season and tournament championships. That trails only Mark Few of Gonzaga (41 titles) and Kentucky's Adolph Rupp (41) for the most combined championships. Bill Self (Kansas) also has 31 combined titles.

CALIPARI AT NO. 1

John Calipari is one of just two coaches (Frank McGuire) to lead three programs to a No. 1 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25. Calipari has led 10 of his teams to a No. 1 AP ranking. His teams are 110-13 (89.4%) as when ranked #1 by AP #1, including 69-8 at UK, 32-4 at UMass and 9-1 at Memphis. His 110 victories are the most among active coaches with victories at No. 1. He has coached 123 career games as #1, 4th-most in NCAA history, trailing Mike Krzyzewski (255), John Wooden (228) and Adolph Rupp (127). Among coaches who have owned a #1 ranking in at least 119 games, Calipari's winning percentage of 89.4% trails only Wooden (95.2%)

PRESIDENT CALIPARI

University of Arkansas head coach John Calipari served as the President of the NABC Board of Directors for the 2024-25 season. "John Calipari is one of basketball's most impactful leaders, and he has a passion for addressing issues that impact the sport and the coaching profession," said NABC Executive Director Craig Robinson. "Coach Calipari has long been a vocal advocate for coaches from all levels, and I'm confident our entire NABC membership will benefit from his service in this role." Calipari first joined the NABC Board of Directors in 2013, and served as its First Vice President for the 2023-24.

CALIPARI RECEIVED 2022 JEFFERSON AWARD

John Calipari received the Jefferson Award for Outstanding Public Service in Sports by Multiplying Good on Nov. 2, 2022. For more than 50 years, Multiplying Good has honored those who put others first. Those receiving the Jefferson Award are empowered to do more, while their stories of extraordinary public service inspire others to action. It is an award that underscores impact. Founded over 50 years ago by Jackie Kennedy Onassis, Sen. Bob Taft Jr., and Sam Beard, Multiplying Good is the world's most foremost and highly celebrated organization focused on and honoring public service. Other recipients of the Jefferson Award include Arthur Ashe, Tom Brokaw, Larry Fitzgerald, Betty Ford, John Glenn, Bob Hope, Steve Jobs, Shaquille O'Neal, General Colin Powell, John D. Rockefeller and Oprah Winfrey. Calipari is the first men's college basketball coach to receive the honor.

CALIPARI NAMED SPORTING NEWS' COACH OF THE DECADE FROM THE 2010'S; HONORED BY THE ATHLETIC TOO

Underscored by more victories than any other coach or program, more Final Four appearances, a record number of NBA Draft picks and the 2012 national championship, John Calipari was named the College Basketball Coach of the Decade by Sporting News in January 2020. In a piece penned by national writer Mike DeCourcy, Sporting News credited Calipari for changing the college basketball landscape. Detailing Calipari's success - what DeCourcy described as a "college basketball revolution" - DeCourcy wrote that "no one defined the 2010s in the same way as Calipari ... nor achieved the same degree of consistent success." Calipari is one of two coaches (with Coach K) to have three teams listed on The Athletics' 25 "Best College Basketball Teams from 2000-25" (7/16/25). He is the only coach to have two teams among the top five and the only coach to lead two different programs on the list – Memphis 2007-08 at #20, Kentucky 2014-15 at #4 and Kentucky 2011-12 at #2.

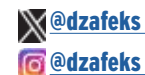
