#### BY THE NUMBERS...

Returning players for Memphis from the 29-6 American Championship squad last season. The Tigers are one of only 9 programs in the country that don't return a single player from 2024-25.

> Memphis is the ONLY program in the country to have produced one of the nation's top-10 leading scorer in each of the last three seasons: Kendric Davis (21.9 - 8th), David Jones (21.8 -6th), PJ Haggerty (21.7 - 3rd).

Programs in the nation that have won at least 18 games in each of the last 24 seasons starting in 2000-01 (Memphis, Kansas, Gonzaga).

> The combined number of games of Division I experience the Tigers have amongst 15 players. Five guys have played 80+ games: Tariq Ingrham (98), Zach Davis (95), Dug McDaniel (92), Thierno Sylla (84) and Sincere Parker (83).

#### **SETTING THE SCENE**

- The Memphis Tigers are in their 105th season of basketball and their 13th as a member of the American Conference.
- The Tigers were picked as the favorite in the American Preseason Coaches poll with 143 total points and 11 first-place votes. South Florida was second with 128 points and the final two first-place nods.
- Memphis has secured at least 20 wins in all seven seasons under Penny Hardaway.
- The Tigers are coming off a banner year that saw them go 29-6 overall and 16-2 in league play, winning both the American Conference regular season and tournament championships.
- · It was the program's first regular season title of any kind since taking the C-USA crown in '12-13
- Memphis earned a No. 5 seed in last season's NCAA Tournament - the program's highest seed since being a No. 2 in 2009 - but fell to No. 12 Colorado State (78-70) in the first round in
- Hardaway has led Memphis to an NIT title in 2021, two American Tournament titles in 2023 and 2025, an American regular season crown in 2025 and three NCAA Tournaments in 2021-22, 2022-23 and 2024-25.
- Monday's tilt will be the second-ever Hoops for St. Jude Tip Off Classic presented by Bad Boy Mowers, benefiting St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.

#### HOOPS FOR ST. JUDE

- Memphis hits the hardwood for the first time since suffering heartbreak last March in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in the Hoops for St. Jude Tip Off Classic presented by Bad Boy Mowers, benefiting St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.
- The Tigers will square off with preseason No. 14
   Arkansas and former head coach John Calipari
   on Monday, Oct. 27 at FedExForum.
- The exhibition game is a doubleheader with the Memphis women's program, which hosts Vanderbilt at 5:30 pm on ESPN+.
- "The Tip Off Classic is more than a game. It's a powerful expression of what can happen when a community unites to hoop for hope," said Ike Anand, President and CEO of ALSAC, the fundraising and awareness organization for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.
- "It's deeply meaningful to witness these incredible college programs take the court not just to compete, but to champion the mission of St. Jude. The energy in FedExForum, the pride of Memphis, Arkansas, and Vanderbilt, and the generosity of fans fuel the work St. Jude does for children with catastrophic diseases both here and around the world."

#### **HOME-OPENING SUCCESS**

- In 104 seasons of Memphis basketball, the Tigers own a record of 74-30 (.716) in season openers.
- They have won seven-straight lid lifters with the last loss coming Nov.10, 2017 against No. 25 Alabama.
- Memphis has won 22-straight home openers, dating back to 2003.
- The Tigers last loss in a home opener was Nov. 22, 2002 when Austin Peay snuck out of town with an 81-80 overtime victory.

#### **AMERICAN PRESEASON AWARDS**

- Memphis had two players honored on the American Preseason Awards list.
- **Dug McDaniel** and **Aaron Bradshaw** were each selected to the first team.
- Memphis was tabbed as the league's preseason favorite in the coaches poll with 143 votes and 11 first-place nods.
- South Florida was picked second with 128 votes and the final two first-place nods.
- Tulane's Rowan Brumbaugh was a unanimous first-teamer and voted preseason POTY.

#### **ABOUT THE ROSTER**

- This season's Tiger squad features zero returners from last year's team, and were forced to bring in 15 new players.
- The newcomers are made up of 13 Division I transfers, a Division II transfer and one freshmen
- Memphis had to replace 11 players who played in a game last season.
- Only nine teams in Division I return no players: (Arkansas State, Baylor, Cleveland State, Memphis, Miami, Murray State, New Mexico, North Texas, Sacramento State)

#### **ELITE SCORERS**

- Over the last three seasons, Memphis has produced three of its top eight single-season scorers in program history.
- Kendric Davis transferred in from SMU for the 2022-23 season and passed Penny Hardaway for the 2nd-most points ever in a season (744).
- Davis ranked 8th in the country in scoring (21.9)
- In 2023-24, **David Jones** (Rutgers) produced 698 total points for 7th on the school chart.
- Jones ranked 6th nationally in scoring (21.8).
- PJ Haggerty bested them both last season, finishing just three points shy of the all-time single-season record with 758.
- Haggerty ranked 3rd nationally in scoring (21.7)

#### TIGERS VS. RAZORBACKS

- Memphis and Arkansas have met 22 times in the all-time series, with each side winning 11.
- Though the two sides have met just twice in the last 24 years, the Tigers have taken both: 72-67 on Jan. 2, 2003 and 84-79 on Nov. 23, 2023 in the Battle 4 Atlantis semifinal.
- The Tigers lead the series at home, 6-4.
- The last time Arkansas played in Memphis was the 2002-03 season, which was Coach Calipari's first year as head coach with the Tigers.
- Penny Hardaway is 1-0 as head coach against the Razorbacks.
- John Calipari is 1-0 against Memphis. He led his UMass Minutemen over the Tigers, 64-61, on Jan. 4, 1996 in Worecester, Mass.
- The first-ever meeting came Dec. 16, 1966 wih Memphis winning 43-36 at home.

#### IT JUST MEANS MORE

- Memphis has not been afraid to play the best teams in the country under Penny Hardaway, and that is especially true against Southeastern Conference opponents.
- In seven seasons under Hardaway, the Tigers have played 24 contests against SEC foes and are 14-10 in those games.
- The Tigers are 10-4, however, in such games over the last three seasons.
- In 2025-26, the Tigers are scheduled to

#### NON-CON SUCCESS

- The Tigers have a 64-25 mark versus non-American conference opponents and have held 49 of those foes to 70 points or less during the Coach Hardaway era.
- Memphis has posted a 25-16 record against Power 6 squads (ACC, BIG EAST, Big Ten, Big 12, SEC, Pac-12) under Coach Hardaway.

#### **CALIPARI'S REUNION**

- Monday's tilt will be the first time John Calipari has coached a game inside FedExForum since March 26, 2017 when he led his No. 2-seed Kentucky Wildcats to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament, ultimately falling 75-73 on a buzzer beater from Luke Maye and the eventual national champion No. 1 North Carolina.
- Besides that matchup, Monday's exhibition will be Calipari's first time on the sidelines at FEF since leaving town following the 2008-09 season as head man for the Tigers.
- During nine seasons with Memphis, Calipari led the Tigers to a 252-69 (.785) record before the NCAA vacated 38 wins from his record for the Final Four run in 2007-08.
- Calipari helped Memphis win seven conference titles going 117-25 in league play -, reach six NCAA Tournaments, including 3-straight Elite Eights and a national runner-up finish.
- In those nine seasons, Calipari coached 57 total Tigers. On Monday, 37 of those former players will reunite on the floor pregame to honor Coach Cal and his era of Memphis Basketball.

### HARDAWAY: THE TIMELINE

A former prep standout at Treadwell High, he averaged 36.6 points





and 10.1 rebounds as a senior in 1990 and was named *Parade Magazine* National High School Player of the Year.

A two-time All-American and two-time Great Midwest Conference Player of the Year, Hardaway averaged 22.8 points, 8.5 rebounds, 6.4 assists and 2.4 steals in 1992-93.

Hardaway remains the only Memphis player to have two career triple-doubles and his 1,319 points (in only two seasons) rank 17th on the school's career scoring list. The 729 points he scored during the 1992-93 season are the most by a junior in Tigers history.

In his two seasons, Hardaway led the team to a 43-23 record – including eight wins over nationally ranked schools -- and directed the Tigers to two NCAA Tournament appearances, including an Elite Eight trip in 1992.

After his junior year, Hardaway declared for the NBA Draft and began a 14-year pro career with the Orlando Magic (1993-99), the Phoenix Suns

(1999-2004), the New York Knicks (2004-06) and the Miami Heat (2007).

The No. 3 pick in the 1993 NBA Draft, Hardaway quickly rose to stardom with the Magic. He averaged 16.6 points, 6.6 assists and 5.4 rebounds in his first season and was named to the NBA All-Rookie Team.

During the 1994-95 season, he averaged

20.9 points and 7.2 assists, started the NBA All-Star Game and was named to the All-NBA First Team, while leading Orlando to the NBA Finals against the Houston Rockets. Hardaway

averaged 25.5 points and eight assists in the series.

After the 1995-96 season, he played on the U.S. Olympic basketball team that won a gold medal in Atlanta, Ga.



Hardaway had a successful run at East High School, which won state titles in 2016, 2017 and 2018. With Hardaway as head coach, the Mustangs defeated Whitehaven High for the 2018 Class AAA championship.





Hardaway returned to his alma mater and becomes the school's 19th head coach and the third former Tiger player to hold the position.

Hardaway was inked to a six-year, \$16.5 million extension on Oct. 12, 2022, which takes him through April 15, 2028.

# MEMPHIS & THE ASSOCIATION

The Memphis Tigers have had significant success in the Draft in recent seasons. After James Wiseman (PK2) and Precious Achiuwa (PK15) were selected in the first round in the 2020 NBA Draft, Jalen Duren (PK13) followed suit in the 2022 Draft.



- Duren was the 16th Tiger selected in the first round and the 53rd Tiger selected overall, while Josh Minott was taken No. 45 in the second round.
- Besides 2020, the last and only other time Memphis had two NBA first rounders was in 2006 (Rodney Carney, No. 16 to Chicago; Shawne Williams, No. 17 to Indiana).
- Memphis, Kentucky, and North Carolina are the only schools to have players selected each of Nos. 1-7 in NBA Draft history.
- After coaching Wiseman, Tigers head coach
  Penny Hardaway is the only NCAA head
  coach to have been picked in the top three
  of the NBA Draft and have been the college
  head coach of a player taken in the top

# FEDEXFORUM THE HOME OF THE TIGERS

The 2024-25 season marks the 21st for the Tigers in their home arena, FedexForum, which officially opened in September 2004. Located just a few feet off Beale Street on historic Highway 61, FedExForum rises to extend the heart of the Memphis entertainment district.

Memphis plays its home contests in the 18,400-seat arena, which served as host for 2019 American Athletic Conference Championship. It also will be the site for the 2024 NCAA Tournament First and Second Rounds. Since it opened in 2004, FedExForum has hosted six Conference USA Tournaments, three NCAA Men's South Regionals (2009, 2014, 2017), two American Athletic Conference Tournaments (2014, 2019) and one NCAA Women's South Regional (2010).

At 135 feet high, FedExForum provides a backdrop for historic Beale Street. The 805,850 square-feet arena, covering 13.8 acres, features five levels as well as state-of-the-art locker rooms and facilities for sports teams, as well as an exceptional dining and entertainment experiences for its patrons.

This stand-alone facility encompasses offices, locker rooms, 3,250-square-foot weight room, training facilities, two NCAA regulation courts, as well as spaces for student-athletes to study, train, eat and develop.





In addition, the history of Memphis basketball is showcased via a large atrium in the grand lobby known as Traditions Hall, a 7,300-square-foot area that will double as a museum designed to be an interactive celebration of Tigers basketball for the general public.

The new practice facilities, part of the University's "Time to Shine" capital campaign, represent a major commitment from the University and Memphis community to compete at the highest
