INSIDE THE SERIES

- Arkansas and Louisiana Tech will meet for the sixth time overall and the fourth time in Fayetteville on Tuesday night.
- Prior to the 2023 WNIT matchup in Fayetteville, the teams had not met since 1983.
- The Razorbacks won the last meeting, 100-60, on Dec. 7, 2023.
- The Lady Techsters own a 3-2 advantage in the all-time series.
- Arkansas' record against:

 - In Ruston: 0-2
 - Neutral: 0-0
 - Postseason: 1-0

LAST TIME OUT

- Arkansas hosted UA-Fort Smith on Oct. 30 for its only preseason exhibition and won the game 100-42.
- The Razorbacks won the boards, 61-34, with 21 on the offensive side.
- Arkansas forced 33 turnovers and took advantage, with 36 points off turnovers.
- Musick played all 11 available players and the bench accounted for 48% of Arkansas' points.
- Maria Anais Rodriguez finished with 11 points and five rebounds, which would've set a career high for points and tied her career high in rebounds.
- Taleyah Jones led all scorers with 21 points and went 10-11 from the free-throw line. The senior also grabbed eight boards.
- Jenna Lawrence recorded the game's only double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds.

QUICK HITS

- Tuesday night's game will be Kelsi Musick's first as Arkansas' head coach.
- Musick was hired on March 21, 2025 after spending three seasons at Oral Roberts.
- The Canton, Oklahoma native made a name for herself in the Division II ranks and won 259 games in 13 seasons at Southwestern Oklahoma State, a member of the Great American Conference.
- Musick is no stranger to the state of Arkansas and has coached in the state against the Razorbacks, Harding, Arkansas Tech, Henderson State, Ouachita Baptist, Arkansas-Monticello and Southern Arkansas.
- Louisiana Tech is led by preseason C-USA Player of the Year Paris Bradley and was picked to win the C-USA by the league's head coaches.

COMMUNICATIONS

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Game Notes

CUE THE MUSICK

- Arkansas enters its first season under Kelsi Musick, the 10th head coach in program history. Musick was hired on March 21, 2025.
- The Razorbacks are 40-9 in season openers and Musick is 0-3 in season openers as a DI coach. She opened against Oklahoma, TCU and Oklahoma State in each of her three seasons at ORU.

50 SEASONS

- Arkansas women's basketball will celebrate its 50th season in 2025-26. The program was founded in 1976 and has accumulated 883 wins since its first game against North Arkansas CC on Nov. 19, 1976. The Razorbacks' first win came on Dec. 1, 1976 against John Brown, 92-87.

ON THE LADY TECHSTERS (VIA LA TECH NOTES)

- Head coach Brooke Stoehr enters her 10th year at the helm of the Lady Techsters, the longest tenured active head coach at Louisiana Tech. With only four letterwinners returning and nine newcomers, she was able to general an 18-win campaign, capped off with a narrow defeat in the Great 8 of the WNIT. This year the Lady Techsters return 71 percent of its scoring and 59 percent of its rebounding, as well as four starters from last year.
- Head coach Brooke Stoehr enters her 10th year at the helm of the Lady Techsters, the longest tenured active head coach at Louisiana Tech. With only four letterwinners returning and nine newcomers, she was able to general an 18-win campaign, capped off with a narrow defeat in the Great 8 of the WNIT. This year the Lady Techsters return 71 percent of its scoring and 59 percent of its rebounding, as well as four starters from last year.

WITH A WIN

- Kelsi Musick would win her first game as Arkansas' head coach, her first season opener as a DI head coach and her first game against a C-USA opponent.
- The Hogs would improve to 41-9 in season openers and would pick up its first season-opening win since 2023.
- The all-time series with Louisiana Tech would be tied 3-3.

MUSICK LESSON

- If you hear Kelsi Musick talk, chances are she'll bring up her high-octane offense, and for good reason. Musick runs the dribble-drive offense with her own twists and learned it while she was an assistant at Fresno State in the early 2000s.
- Her offense transformed Southwestern Oklahoma State into a national powerhouse on the DII level, with 10 conference championships, multiple NCAA Tournament runs and a trip to the DII National Championship game in 2019.
- At ORU, Musick led the Golden Eagles to back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time since the 2010-11 and 2011-12 seasons. Her offenses ranked in the top 16 in scoring average nationally in each of her three years in Tulsa. Each of her last two offenses at ORU ranked eighth nationally with 80+ points per game.

THE NEWCOMERS

- The Razorbacks added eight newcomers to the 2025-26 roster: 5 transfers and 3 freshmen
- **Maria Anais Rodriguez** joined Arkansas from Oklahoma State, where she saw action in 10 games during her first season, including three Big 12 games against Colorado, UCF and Arizona. On the FIBA side, she helped Spain to a 6-1 mark and the Silver Medal at the FIBA U18 Women's Eurobasket competition in 2024 and averaged 8.3 points, 4.1 rebounds and 1.9 assists during the event.
- **Taleyah Jones** followed Coach Musick to Arkansas after playing for her during her sophomore and junior seasons. Jones was the Summit League Newcomer of the Year in 2024 and a First Team All-Summit League selection in 2025. Last season, she led ORU's offense that ranked in the top 10 nationally in scoring average (83.2) with 18.1 points per game.
- **Wyvette Mayberry** signed with Arkansas on April 3, 2025, the first signee of the Musick era. Mayberry started her career at Tulsa before transferring to Kansas after two seasons. At Tulsa, she was named to the AAC All-Freshman team and led the Golden Hurricane in scoring her sophomore season with 14.1 points per game. At Kansas, she started in 31 games her junior season and recorded four 20+ point games. She started in all 32 games during her senior year and averaged 9.7 points and 2.4 rebounds per game. She injured her knee during her fifth year and came to Arkansas to



finish her career.

→ **Ashlynn Chlarson** is the only JUCO product on this year's team and joined Arkansas from Eastern Arizona CC in Thatcher, Arizona. In her two seasons with the Monsters, she averaged 8.4 points per game and 7.1 rebounds per game. Last season, she nearly averaged a double-double, with 10.9 points/game and 9.2 rebounds/game. She earned first team all-conference, second team all-region and NJCAA All-Tournament Team honors in 2025.

→ **Emily Robinson** also made the move from Oral Roberts after a successful start to her career. She was named the 2024 Summit League Freshman of the Year after averaging 10.3 points/game, 3.7 rebounds/game and 2.5 assists/game. She was the only freshman in the league to average double figures. She started in all 33 games her sophomore season and averaged 10.0 points/game and led ORU with 3.4 assists/game. She scored 17 points in the Summit League Tournament championship game against No. 24 South Dakota State.

→ Harmonie Ware, Aisha Hassan and Bonnie Deas were part of the 2025 signing class that Coach Musick managed to keep following her hiring in March.

THE RETURNERS

→ Five Razorbacks returned for Musick's first season: Maryn Archer, Jada Bates, Danika Galea, Jenna Lawrence, and Cristina Sanchez.

A FEW FIRSTS

→ Kelsi Musick is Arkansas women's basketball's first female head coach since Susie Garnder led the Razorbacks from 2003-2007.

→ Hometown firsts: Danika Galea is the first Maltin player in Razorback history. Aisha Hassan is the first Egyptian player in Razorback history. Ashlynn Chlarson is the first Arizonan in Razorback history.

A FAMILIAR NAME

→ A familiar name will return to the University of Arkansas as Razorback women's basketball head coach Kelsi Musick announced her first signee at Arkansas, Wyvette Mayberry, a transfer guard from Kansas.

→ Mayberry is the daughter of Razorback legend and former NBA player Lee Mayberry and his wife, Marla. Like her father, Wyvette will wear jersey No. 11.

→ In his four years with the Razorbacks, Lee Mayberry helped Arkansas win a conference title every year, including three consecutive Southwest Conference regular season championships and three consecutive SWC Tournament championships from 1989 to 1991. Arkansas moved from the SWC to the Southeastern Conference in 1992, and Mayberry led the Hogs to the SEC Western Division championship and the SEC overall regular season championship in their first year in the SEC. In addition to the 1990 Final Four, Mayberry helped Arkansas to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 1989 and 1992, plus the Elite Eight in 1991. He is considered one of the greatest point guards to ever play for the Razorbacks.

→ Mayberry was selected by the Milwaukee Bucks in the first round of the 1992 NBA Draft and played five seasons for the Bucks and two seasons for the Vancouver Grizzlies.

THE FIBA FOUR

→ Four Razorbacks represent their countries at this summer's FIBA events.

→ Bonnie Deas (Australia) led her country to a silver medal in the FIBA U-19 Women's World Cup. Deas averaged 12.3 points, 7.7 rebounds and 3 assists in 6 games at the World Cup and earned All-Star Five team honors alongside USA's Saniyah Hall, the No. 1 prospect in the 2026 class, and UCLA's Sienna Betts. Deas was Australia's leading scorer in the championship game with 13 points in an 88-76 loss to the United States.

→ Cristina Sanchez Cerqueira represented Spain in the U-20 FIBA Women's EuroBasket and won gold. Maria Anais Rodriguez also represented Spain at the U-19 FIBA Women's EuroBasket and earned a bronze medal. Danika Galea played for Malta in the FIBA 3x3 Europe Cup and won a silver medal in the qualified in Prishtina, Kosovo.

NEW STAFF

→ Joining Musick for her first season in Fayetteville are new assistant coaches Brad Johnson and Alex Furr. Johnson made the short trip from nearby Farmington, Arkansas, where he was the head coach of the highly-successful Farmington High School girls program, the home of Jenna Lawrence.

The University of Arkansas hired Kelsi Musick on March 21, 2025, to be the 10th head coach of the Razorbacks' women's basketball program.

Musick comes to Arkansas after a successful three-year stint at Oral Roberts, where she led the Golden Eagles to postseason appearances in each of the last two seasons while increasing the team's win total every year. ORU wrapped up their season last night in the first round of the WBIT to finish the year 24-9 and give the Golden Eagles consecutive 20-win seasons for the first time since 2009-12. She built the program each of her three seasons, winning 12 games in the first season, 21 wins in the second and 24 this past season - the most for the Golden Eagles in a single season since Debbie Yow won 26 games in 1982-83. Along the way, her teams were no strangers in taking down opponents from bigger conferences with a pair of wins against South-eastern Conference teams this past season to go with four total wins over teams from the American Athletic Conference over the last two years.

Known for her fast-paced, dribble-drive offense, Musick quickly turned around Oral Roberts. Her Golden Eagles have finished in the Top 20 nationally in points per game each of her three seasons - scoring 78.1 points per game in her first season to finish 16th, 81.8 points per game

last season to finish eighth and averaged 83.2 points per game during the regular season to rank eighth nationally entering postseason play. Musick has also attracted elite talent, coaching 2023-24 Summit League Freshman of the Year Emily Robinson and Newcomer of the Year Taleyah Jones and reigning two-time Sixth Woman of the Year Jalei Oglesby. Jones and Oglesby were both named to the All-Summit League First Team this season after the duo led the Golden Eagles in points per game with Jones scoring 18.1 and Oglesby 17.3, respectively.

"As I spoke to Kelsi and people associated with her, I was impressed by her work ethic, enthusiasm and her ability to maximize resources in building winning programs at each of her coaching stops," Director of Athletics and Vice Chancellor Hunter Yurachek said. "She has proven to be a great relationship builder and communicator throughout her career to the benefit of her teams and student-athletes on and off the court. Having grown up and coached in Oklahoma, she has a familiarity with our area that will help her quickly connect with our state and fan base.

"Kelsi is a rising star in the women's basketball coaching profession. I believe the University of Arkansas is the best place for her to develop her full potential as a coach while also leading our program to success. Throughout my conversations with Kelsi, it was apparent she wanted to be an Arkansas Razorback and welcomed the challenge of building our women's basketball program to compete against the best-of-the-best in the SEC. I want to thank Derita Dawkins, Taylor McGillis and Kat Devenport for their assistance during the search process."

Musick led ORU to a second-place finish in the Summit League this past season after a third-place finish in her second season in Tulsa. Her 2023-24 team made history with the program's first 20-win season since 2011-12 and made it to the postseason for the first time since 2011 by hosting Grambling in the first round of the WNIT.

"I am incredibly honored and grateful for the opportunity to lead the women's basketball program at the University of Arkansas," Musick said. "This is a place with a proud tradition, passionate fans and a commitment to excellence in every way. I'm excited to get to work building something special. I want to thank Hunter Yurachek and his staff for their belief in me, and I can't wait to pour into our student-athletes, compete in the SEC and represent this universi-

ty with pride."

Prior to Oral Roberts, she spent 13 seasons as the head coach at NCAA Division II Southwestern Oklahoma State. Musick amassed a 259-125 (.674) record at SWOSU earning Great American Conference Coach of the Year honors five times while leading the Lady Bulldogs to the national championship game in 2019 as part of seven NCAA Tournament appearances.

The Lady Bulldogs ranked in the Top 10 nationally in scoring offense in seven of her nine seasons, averaging more than 80 points per game in five of those years. In her final season, the team averaged 82.1 points per game to rank third in the nation. That same season, sophomore Makyra Tramble was named the Ron Lenz National Player of the Year and an All-American. Tramble went on to become a three-time All-American and three-time GAC Player of the Year. Musick's 2018-19 team won 35 consecutive games - setting the school record for wins in a single season - and advanced to the NCAA National Championship game.

Musick's career began at Fresno State with one season as the Director of Basketball Operations (2003-04) before becoming the head coach at Canton (Okla.) High School, her alma mater. After two seasons leading Canton, she returned to Fresno State as the Basketball Operations Coordinator (2006-08) before spending one season as an Assistant Coach. The Bulldogs won 20 games in consecutive seasons and captured the Western Athletic Conference regular-season and tournament titles before finishing 24-9 with a trip to the NCAA Tournament in 2009.

Musick played collegiately at Cameron University, where she set school records for career three-point shooting percentage and assists. As a senior, she helped lead the Aggies to a school record 25 wins and the program's first-ever appearance in the NCAA Tournament. She was inducted into the Cameron University Athletics Hall of Fame in February 2025.

Musick and her husband, Josh, have three children - sons, Maddox and Titus, and one daughter, Amaria.

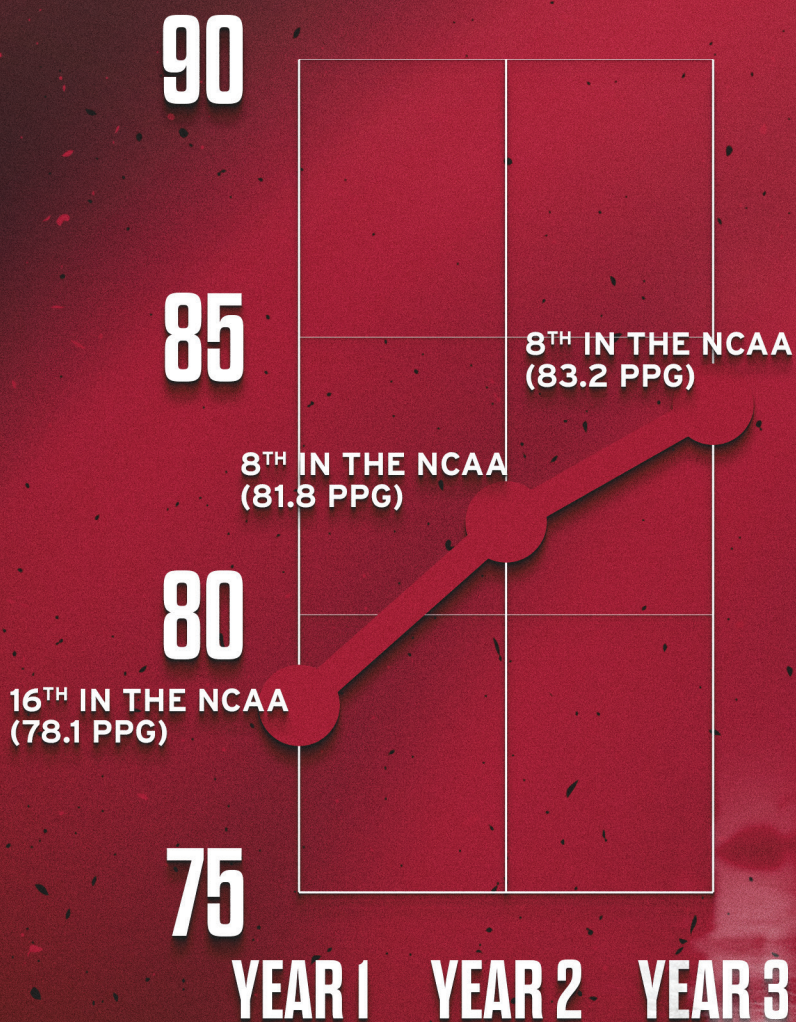
