GAME NOTES

- » **LB Wyatt Simmons** blocked an LSU punt that was recovered by **DB Caleb Wooden** and returned 16 yards for a touchdown at the 11:09 mark of the first quarter to open the scoring. The blocked punt return for a touchdown was the Hogs' first since Oct. 31, 2009, when Seth Armbrust (1-yard return) accomplished the feat in a 63-27 win over Eastern Michigan. Simmons became the first Razorback to block a punt since Quincey McAdoo did so against Liberty on Nov. 5, 2022.
- » **WR Raylen Sharpe** has caught at least one pass in 39 consecutive games dating back to Sept. 24, 2022, while at Missouri State. His 39-game reception streak is tied for the second-longest mark nationally. He extended his streak on a 12-yard pass from Taylen Green with 4:09 on the clock in the second quarter. Sharpe finished his day with a team-high 65 yards on four catches.
- » **WR Courtney Crutchfield** registered his first career reception with 42 seconds on the clock in the second quarter courtesy of a 26-yard pass from Taylen Green.
- » The Razorbacks' 221 consecutive extra-points made streak, which began on Dec. 5, 2020, is the second-longest such streak nationally based on date, behind Northwestern (Oct. 24, 2020).
- » Arkansas wore the uniform combo of white helmet, red jersey and red pants for the first time in program history.
- » **DL Justus Boone** recorded his first sack as a Razorback at the 7:44 mark of the second quarter.
- » **LB Xavian Sorey Jr.**'s had a career-high 2.5 tackles for loss, eclipsing his previous career-high of 2, set on four occasions.
- » **QB Taylen Green** registered a 55-yard rush in the third quarter. It was the first 50+ yard rush by an Arkansas player since Mike Washington Jr.'s 57-yard rush against Texas A&M on Oct. 18.
- » **OL Fernando Carmona Jr.** started his 47th consecutive game on the offensive line, dating back to his redshirt freshman season at San Jose State in 2022.
- » **RB Mike Washington Jr.** now has seven rushing touchdowns on the season, one shy of his single-season career high of eight he set in 2024 while at New Mexico State.
- » With his 11-yard rushing score, **QB Taylen Green** (7 rushing + 19 passing) has tied QB Matt Jones (8 rushing + 16 passing in 2003) for ninth on the Arkansas single-season touchdown responsibility list with 26.

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ARKANSAS QUOTES

Bobby Petrino, Arkansas Interim Head Coach

Opening Statement:

"We just had a lot of chances to win that game, going all the way back to the first half. We were down in the red zone too many times to come away with no points, which certainly hurt us. The last play of the half on offense and not getting it in on fourth and inches. Both of those are plays that we need to make and have to make. Defensively, we did a really nice job in the first quarter and came out prepared and ready to go. We played really hard. We needed to find a stop in the fourth quarter on that last drive. The big scramble just kills you. We did drive the ball down and get into field goal position, where we felt like we were in good shape, but did not get the field goal. Offense, defense and special teams all had our opportunities to find a way to win the game and did not get it done."

On goal line situation:

"The first one, we did a play that normally Braylen Russell carries it into the end zone, but Braylen was not with us today. Unfortunately, Cam (Settles) just slipped and fell. He did a good job running it in practice, and he is going to be a great player for us, but he just slipped and did not get it in. We then ran an off-tackle play that did not get off tackle. Mike (Washington Jr.) cut back instead of getting to the track where we needed to be. It felt like we could get it in. We have not been stopped all year on the sneak and we felt like we could get it in on that."

On the blocked punt:

"We did a good job on that. We practiced it all week. We had the extra day on Sunday night, so we focused on blocking a punt. We did a great job in practice all week, working on it. Working on getting it on time, but also working on the technique to block it, scoop, and score. Wyatt (Simmons) and Caleb (Wooden) did a hell of a job. That was a really good play."

On looking ahead to Texas:

"We will come back and work hard to get prepared. We need to learn a little bit about that rivalry between Arkansas and Texas. We need to revisit the past a little bit and make sure everyone understands how big of a game it is to all the Razorback fans and Razorback alumni."

On the season:

"It is frustrating. We went through the spring, summer, and fall camp, and now we are at a point where we only have two wins, and week after week is two-three point losses, so it is super frustrating. We still have pride. There is no quitting in us."

Caleb Wooden, Arkansas DB

On the blocked punt:

"We looked good in practice all week long. We knew that tackle was going to block down and we were going to come free off the edge. We practiced it all week long to have the success we had in the game. It is huge, anytime you get a blocked punt in a game your chances of winning go through the roof ... I had no idea if me or Wyatt (Simmons) got it. I will have to go look at the film. I know that I came off the edge, and I saw the ball on the ground and picked it up and ran with it."

On the season:

"Adversity brings out the best in people, and this game is not just teaching you about the game of football; it teaches you about life. I had a conversation with my mom and it's like, you know, what are you gonna do quit? No. You sweat all January, February, then go through spring, then go through summer, then go through fall camp. And granted, the season ain't going the way any of us wanted it to go, but what are you gonna do, give up? You gonna quit? That just ain't in me, that just ain't in us. We are gonna flush this loss, and like Mike said, it's frustrating. It's frustrating, man. Keep coming up short, coming up short, you get out on teams, and then you just can't finish. But, you know, we're gonna flush this loss and get ready for Texas next week."
