

2009 Razorback Seniors



2009 PREVIEW

When the 2009 Arkansas softball team takes the field for its Feb. 6 season opener, it will be on the heels of a 37-win campaign last season. The Razorbacks are hoping to parlay the momentum of a 2008 season that included a bid into the NCAA Tournament, the third appearance in program history. With the graduation of three players only, head coach Jamie Pinkerton wel-



comes back 20 letterwinners from last year's team, including a class of seven seniors. The Razorbacks will call upon its veterans and crop of newcomers to fill the shoes left

by Samantha Buckner, Katy Henry and Dayna Huckabee.

Arkansas is led by its senior group of Brandy Baze, Whitney Cloer, Brandy Foust, Hillary Freeman, Amie Hubbard, Kayla Johnson and Jocelyne Moncrief. Along with its seniors, the Razorback roster is filled with six juniors, 10 sophomores and four freshmen.

The most noticeable impact for the Razorbacks may come in the circle where Henry spent her four-year career collecting 56 wins, third all-time on Arkansas' career list, and 756 strikeouts, the second-highest total in school history. Junior Miranda Dixon was the team's No. 2 pitcher during the 2008 season, and will be looked at to step in as the staff leader. Last year, Dixon was 12-13 with a team-best 2.30 ERA in 137 innings of work.

Dixon is valuable at the plate where she hit .317 with 13 home runs and a school-record 47 RBI last season. One of five players to start all 66 games in 2008, Dixon was a mainstay in the Razorback lineup.

Besides Dixon, the only returning pitcher to post a win last season was Kim Jones. The Lenexa, Kan., native

totaled a 5-3 record during her freshman season with a 2.76 ERA. Arkansas returns two other arms, Teighynne Hulsey and Layne McGuirt, from last season. Hulsey appeared in just two games in the circle, while McGuirt worked 20.2 innings, claiming 25 strikeouts and a save.

The Razorbacks went out to the west coast to bring in a young arm as freshman Kelsie Vallies joins the staff after a stellar high school career in which she struck out 820 batters.

Behind home plate, Cloer will shoulder the responsibility of handling the Razorback pitchers. The senior leads the group of four catchers which also includes Amanda Caldwell, Leslie Dixon and Jessica Waddle. All four players saw time behind the plate last season, which will prove beneficial working with the young pitching staff.

Dixon made 10 starts last season, while Waddle was a starter in seven games. Caldwell appeared in five games during her freshman season.

The infield will also feel the effect of losing key defensive and offensive components with the graduations of Buckner and Huckabee. Last season, the two totaled 482 putouts, collectively, and combined for 17 home runs and 72 RBI. Luckily, the Razorbacks have plenty of returning experience and reliable bats on the roster.

Headed by Johnson, Arkansas' top hitter last season, and juniors Brittany Robison and Sandra Smith, the infield is a balance of experience and youth. In 2008, the infield accounted for 50 of the Razorbacks' 82 errors, so cleaning up play from first to third will be key. With 11 players slotted to play the infield, Arkansas will have plenty of bodies to shuffle in and out as the season plays out.

Offensively, the infield will be led by Johnson who scored a school-record 53 runs in 2008. Her 71 hits and .338 batting average were also tops for Arkansas. Robison and Smith hit .265 and .236, respectively, last season for the Razorbacks. Smith etched her named onto the top of the single-season recordbooks with 14 homeruns in 2008.

The depth on the Arkansas infield will be aided by the additions of freshmen Brittany Griffiths and Jessica Robison, a pair of all-state performers from Texas and Oklahoma, respectively.

The senior trio of Freeman, Foust and Moncrief head up the outfield unit that also includes junior Jessica Bachkora, redshirt sophomore Becca Carden, freshman Tori Mort and walk-on Lindsey Wells. Arkansas' outfield stays intact with no players lost from the previous season. Collectively, Bachkora, Freeman and Moncrief started 160 games last season. Bachkora was the Razorbacks' best-hitting outfielder with a .272 batting average in 2008. She also hit a teambest .289 against Southeastern Conference opponents. She was also second on the team with 42 runs scored.

Carden transferred to Arkansas from Northeastern Oklahoma A&M before the 2008 season and redshirted, so she will be a new addition with some collegiate experience. Mort is an all-state performer from Oklahoma who carried a .362 batting average and had 150 hits during her prep career.

Arkansas' schedule features six teams in the USA Today/NFCA Division I Top 25 Preseason Poll. Five of those teams come from the SEC, including topranked Florida which the Razorbacks visit April 25-26 for a three-game series. Arkansas will also travel to No. 3 Alabama (April 18-19) and No. 12 Tennessee (March 25). The Razorbacks return to Norman, Okla., for an April 8 meeting with No. 10 Oklahoma.

The Razorbacks will play host to No. 19 LSU (April 10-11) and No. 22 Geor-



gia (May 2-3) to conclue the regular season.

Arkansas will be opening the doors on its new home facility, Bogle Park, during the 2009 season. The Razorbacks open the building with the Holiday Inn-NWA Razorback Invitational which will be played Feb. 27-March 1. Arkansas will welcome teams from Ball State, Bradley, South Dakota State and Wichita State for the three-day tournament.

The Bogle Park Dedication is scheduled for April 11, the home. series finale against LSU. Arkansas will be looking to earn a spot in the SEC Championship for the first time since the 2002 season, a six-year absence. This year's conference tournament (May 7-9) will be hosted by the University of Tennessee at Sherri Parker Lee Stadium in Knoxville.



Bogle Park, completed before the start of the 2009 season, is the most recent athletic facility on the University of Arkansas campus and is the home field for the Razorback softball team. The 1,200-seat stadium also features outfield seating for fans wanting to relax in the grass. This picture is taken from the center field grass seating. Arkansas will host the Holiday Inn-NWA Razorback Invitational, in addition to home dates against five SEC opponents, including LSU and Georgia.



#1 Brandy Baze



Senior • 5-8 • R/R Infielder Stillwater, Okla. Stillwater HS

2008: Baze appeared in 19 games during her junior season. She pinch ran against No. 15 LSU in game two of a doubleheader and scored during Arkansas' five-run fifth inning. Baze also crossed the plate against Western Illinois and Florida International to finish the season with three runs scored. Off the field, she was named to the 2008 SEC Spring Academic Honor Roll.

2007: In her second season, Baze played in 33 games mostly at second base. She was 1-for-1 against Louisiana-Monroe on March 3. In her first start of the season, Baze hit .333 in Arkansas' win against Nebraska.

2006: Baze posted the second-highest batting average of the freshman class with a .182 clip. Against Oklahoma State on March 29, Baze recorded her first career hit. She played in 22 games and started seven.

HIGHSCHOOL: At Stillwater High School, Baze led the Pioneers to two state semifinal appearances. As a senior, Baze was an all-district selection despite an arm injury. While a member of the Oklahoma City Jitterbugs, Baze led the club team to a seventh-place finish at nationals.

PERSONAL: Born Aug. 12, 1987, she is the daughter of Kurt and Donita Baze. Both of her parents were former Central Oklahoma athletes. Baze has a younger sister, Kirsty, and is majoring in kinesiology.

Senior • 5-8 • R/R Catcher Edmond, Okla. Bishop McGuinness HS

2008: Cloer played in 55 games during the season, which included 50 starts behind the plate. She finished the season third on the team with a .289 batting average. Cloer posted nine multi-hit games, six multi-RBI efforts and had an 11-game hitting streak during her junior season. In a doubleheader against Northern Colorado, she registered a home run, four hits, three runs and six RBI. Cloer tied a season high with three hits against No. 8 Tennessee in the Razorbacks' 5-2 victory. In the regular season's final series, she collected a hit in each game against No. 23 Mississippi State. 



COACHING STAFF



HEAD COACH JAMIE PINKERTON • 5TH SEASON

Jamie Pinkerton begins his fifth season at the helm of the University of Arkansas softball program after leading the Razorbacks to their best record during his tenure, numerous school records and a spot in the NCAA Tournament last season. Coupled with the recent completion of Bogle Park, the Hogs' new home field, Pinkerton appears to have his team positioned for sustained success.

During the 2008 season, Pinkerton and the Razorbacks posted a 37-29 record and received a bid to the Norman Regional in the NCAA Tournament. The win total was the highest for Arkansas since the 2002 season. It had been the same length of time since the last NCAA Tournament appearance (2002).

The Razorbacks were powered by the best statistical output in school history. Three players—Sandra Smith, Miranda Dixon and Samantha Buckner—totaled double-figure home run totals as Arkansas scored the most runs in school history. Pinkerton's team blasted a school-record 65 home runs during the season, more than doubling the previous high (28) set by the 2007 squad.

Under Pinkerton's watch, Dixon emerged as a dangerous player at the plate and in the circle. She became the first Razorback to earn Southeastern Conference Pitcher (April 21) and Player (Feb. 26) of the Week honors during the same season. Dixon was also named a Louisville Slugger/NFCA Division I South All-Region second-team performer.

Behind the strong offensive numbers and a 20-win season from Katy Henry, just the fourth in program history, the Razorbacks claimed a No. 2 seed in the Norman Regional. Henry led a staff that posted a 2.63 ERA during the season, the lowest team ERA under Pinkerton's tenure. The NCAA bid was the first for Pinkerton in his coaching career.

In November 2008, Pinkerton was selected to serve on the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) Division I All-American and Coaching Staff of the Year committee. He will represent the South region on the nine-person board during the two-year term.

In 2007, Pinkerton saw his team set 14 game, season and career records, including individual and team home runs. The Razorbacks' then-season home run record of 28 topped the previous record of 19 that Pinkerton's 2005 squad held. In her first season at Arkansas, Dixon hit seven home runs which put her atop the single-season list at the time.

Pinkerton guided Dixon and Jessica Bachkora, to SEC all-freshman honors.

The 2006 squad registered key upsets throughout the season defeating five top-25 teams, including No. 24 Iowa, No. 12 Georgia, No. 22 Mississippi State, No. 18 Auburn and No. 11 LSU twice. After a three-year absence from the SEC Tournament, the Razorbacks made an appearance as the No. 7 seed. Arkansas also recorded the fewest errors in school history during the 2006 season.

During Pinkerton's first season (2005) in Fayetteville, the Razorbacks made history with their first-ever run-rule of an SEC opponent when they defeated Kentucky, 10-2, in six innings. Arkansas completed the three-game sweep the next day with a

five-inning win to complete its first SEC sweep in three years. The 2005 season also brought Arkansas its first All-SEC performer since 2001 as Rachel LeMaster was voted to the second team.

In the classroom, Arkansas continues to excel. The 2008 team was honored by the NFCA as a Top 25 Division I All-Academic team. The team's 3.314 grade point average ranked No. 22 in the nation. The Razorbacks also had 10 student-athletes named to the NFCA Scholar-Athlete list.

"We have reached one of our team goals by being ranked a top-25 All-Academic team," Pinkerton said. "This speaks to the hard work of our student-athletes, not just on the field, but also in the classroom."

The 2006-07 Razorbacks recorded a 3.30 team grade point average improving upon its GPA from the previous season (3.27). Arkansas' GPA ranked fourth in the conference and 45th in the nation. The Razorbacks posted a 3.22 GPA in Pinkerton's first season.

"We take great pride in our academic accomplishments," he said. "Since I arrived here it has been a focal point of our staff to make improvements in our team GPA and we look forward to maintaining the excellence."

When Pinkerton accepted the head coaching position at Arkansas, he returned to his roots. Pinkerton is a Fort Smith, Ark., native, who was the Tulsa Golden Hurricane head coach from 2001-04.

In his four years at Tulsa, Pinkerton was a two-time Western Athletic Conference Coach of the Year at the school where he began his collegiate career as an assistant coach.

"I feel like I left home, but that I came home," he said. "I grew up as a Razorback fan, and it's special to be head coach at the University of Arkansas. It was the chance to coach in one of the top softball conferences in the nation," he said.

In four years at Tulsa, Pinkerton turned the Hurricane into a winning program, including three straight 30-win seasons and two 40-win seasons. In 2004, Pinkerton guided Tulsa to a 45-18 finish and a WAC runner-up finish. For his efforts he earned his second conference coach of the year award.

The only coach in Tulsa history to post an overall winning record, Pinkerton finished with 140 wins and 105 losses

and holds the program's record for the most wins in school history. Pinkerton also guided the Golden Hurricane to its first-ever national ranking at No. 25 in the USA TO-DAY/NFCA Poll in 2004.

At Tulsa, Pinkerton coached one College Sports Information Directors of America Academic All-American, four CoSIDA All-Academic District VI selections and 21 WAC All-Academic selections.

In his second season at Tulsa, Pinkerton made school history when he directed the

2002 team to the school's first winning season finishing 48-16. The 48-win season followed a 13-42 finish in Pinkerton's inaugural season. The 35-game improvement marked the second-best softball turnaround in NCAA history.

The Golden Hurricane transformation gave Pinkerton his first WAC Coach of the Year honor.
Pinkerton's crews became spoilers, defeating national contenders like Fresno State and Oklahoma.

His teams not only excelled on the field, but also in the classroom. His teams were among the nation's best in academics, with consistent grade point averages over 3.0.

Prior to becoming head coach at Tulsa, Pinkerton was an assistant coach at the University of Virginia from 1998-2000. While with the Cavaliers, Pinkerton's teams posted two runner-up finishes to Florida State in the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament in 1999 and 2000.

Pinkerton's other coaching stints included as a graduate assistant coach at the University of Louisiana-Monroe in 1997-98, where he completed hours towards a master's degree.

In his first stay at the University of Tulsa, Pinkerton was an assistant coach in 1994-97. Pinkerton helped lead the Claremore-Sequoyah High School team to the 1994 state Class AA runner-up finish. As head coach of the Oklahoma Mustangs (ASA) in 1988-94, Pinkerton coordinated recruiting, coaching, fundraising and traveling.

Pinkerton was born in Fort Smith, Ark., and grew up in Broken Arrow, Okla. He graduated from Tulsa in 1997 with a bachelor's degree in history and a minor in secondary education. Pinkerton and his wife, Dori, have two children, a daughter, Sarah, and a son, Dane. The Pinkertons reside in Fayetteville.

ASSISTANT COACH TIFFANY REDDING • STH SEASON

Beginning her fifth season as a Razorback assistant coach, Tiffany Redding continues her hard work on and off the field as Arkansas' first base and infield coach and recruiting coordinator along with her duties with the Razorback camps and clinics.

Redding helped coordinate the campaign that garnered the Razorbacks' seven newcomers to the 2006 squad, 10 to the 2007 team and eight to the 2008 roster. In the staff's fifth recruiting class, Redding assisted with the signing of five high school seniors in November 2008.

On the field, Redding is the first base coach while working with the infielders. In addition to the recruiting efforts, she directs the team's camps and clinics. Redding managed the staff's first summer camp and winter clinic in which more than 200 players participated.

Prior to Arkansas, Redding was an assistant with Pinkerton from 2002-04 at Tulsa, where she was also a four-year letterwinner at shortstop from 1997-2000.

While at Tulsa, Redding ranked as TU's all-time leader in walks, assists, chances, runs, hits and atbats. In 1998 and 1999, she was named Tulsa's defensive player of the year. Redding is one of four players in Tulsa history to have more than 100 putouts and 100 assists in two consecutive seasons.

Redding's academic standing was also recognized as she was named to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) All-Academic Team in 1999 and the Western Athletic Conference All-Academic team in 1999 and 2000. Redding graduated in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in psychology and a minor in sociology.

After graduating from Tulsa, Redding was a gradu-

ate assistant at the University of Virginia, where she earned her master's degree in kinesiology with an emphasis in sports psychology. At Virginia, Redding coached the Cavaliers' defense that finished 52-17 and set the school record for most wins in a season in 2001. During the 2002 season, Redding was the mental training coach for the team.

An Oklahoma native, Redding graduated with honors from

ASSISTANT COACH ALY SARTINI • 5TH SEASON

In her fifth season as an assistant coach, former Razorback infielder Aly Sartini remains a vital component of the Arkansas team. Sartini has many different roles in the program including overseeing the pitching staff and outfielders, travel and equipment

and assisting with academics and community service.

Under Sartini's tutelage, former Razorback Katy Henry posted a 20-win season during the 2008 campaign, the program's fourth 20-win season and first since 2001. Henry and the rest of the Arkansas staff combined for a 2.63 ERA, the fourth-most wins in school history (36) and the fourth-best strikeouts per game (6.18 average).

Sartini saw Henry enter the Arkansas record book with a 15-strikeout performance against Louisiana-Monroe on Feb. 26, 2005, a mark that tied for the second-most strikeouts in a game. Henry matched that feat two years later fanning 15 on Feb. 16, 2007, against Texas-San Antonio. With Sartini's guidance, Henry struck out 224 batters in 2007 and 219 in 2006, which are the second and third most strikeouts in an individual season.

Before returning to Arkansas, Sartini was an assistant coach at Birmingham-Southern College in Birmingham, Ala., for three seasons (2002-04).

At BSC, Sartini served as first base coach and worked with pitchers, catchers and slappers. In addition to her coaching duties, Sartini was the academic coordinator, travel planner, camp director and manager of the Diamond Backers booster club for the BSC softball team.

In her four seasons at Arkansas, Sartini helped lead the Razorbacks to three Southeastern Conference Tournament appearances and an NCAA Regional berth.

A member of the inaugural Arkansas softball team, Sartini was named to the 1999 SEC All-Tournament

team. She played second, shortstop and third for the Razorbacks, is third on the alltime list for assists. Sartini holds the record for most assists in an individual game and still ranks near the top of the record book for most walks and most sacrifice flies in a career. She also holds the program record for at-bats in a game with nine against Alabama in 1999.



The Galt, Ca-

lif., native's coaching résumé also includes one season (2001) as an Arkansas student assistant where she was director of summer camps, infield and hitting instructor and academic coordinator for the Razorbacks. Sartini also worked with the California Grapettes Fast Pitch Organization and numerous summer softball clinics and camps.

In 2002, Sartini graduated from the University of Arkansas with a bachelor's degree in agriculture, food and life science with an emphasis in education, communication and technology. She is a member of the National Fastpitch Coaches Association.


Lawson serves as the primary media relations contact for the Razorback soccer and softball teams, in addition to assisting with all 19 of the university's other sports programs.

2008 REVIEW

The Arkansas Razorback softball team enjoyed it most successful season under head coach Jamie Pinkerton during the 2008 campaign. Along with setting several individual and team records, the Razorbacks collected 37 wins, the fourth-most in program history, and made their first NCAA Tournament appearance since the 2002 season.

All season long, the Razorbacks were powered by their offense which set eight team records at the plate. Arkansas clubbed 65 home runs during the season, more than doubling the previous mark of 28 by the 2007 team. With its homerun total, Pinkerton's team finished second in the Southeastern Conference and tied for 13th in the nation. In addition to the team record, the top five spots on the single-season home run list belong to members of the 2008 club, led by Sandra Smith who knocked a program-best 14 home runs.

Arkansas also set school records in batting average (.267), slugging percentage (.434), on-base percentage (.340), runs scored (299), RBI (267), total bases (749) and walks (162).

Kayla Johnson surfaced as the Razorbacks' top hitter during the season and led the team with a .338 batting average. The Arkansas infielder added more than 100 points to her average from the previous season when she hit just .219. Johnson's .338 batting average is the fourth-highest in program history and her 53 runs scored are the most by an Arkansas player during a single season.

The 2008 season also saw the emergence of Miranda Dixon who made school history when she became the first Arkansas player to win SEC Player and Pitcher of the Week in the same season. Dixon led the Razorbacks in RBI (47), doubles (15), total bases (114), slugging percentage (.623) and on-base percentage (.427). Her RBI, total base, slugging and on-base marks set program single-season records. She was recognized as a Louisville Slugger/NFCA Division I All-South Region second-team performer.

In the circle, Katy Henry closed her collegiate career with a 20-13 record and 2.74 ERA to become the third-most

winningest pitcher in Arkansas history with 56 victories. Her 756 career strikeouts are the second most in program history. Henry also became Arkansas' all-time saves leader when she earned the ninth save of her career in a 5-1 win over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi. Dayna Huckabee also finished a stellar career in which she set the all-time Arkansas triples record (12) and co-owns the home run mark (20).

The Razorbacks picked up four victories over ranked opponents, including a win over No. 8 Tennessee, their first since the 2004 season, and the first-ever win over No. 11 Oklahoma. Arkansas closed out the regular season taking two of three from No. 23 Mississippi State, its first series win over a ranked SEC opponent since sweeping No. 19 South Carolina in a 2000 doubleheader.

Despite missing the SEC Tournament, the Razorbacks earned a No. 2 seed in the Norman Regional of the NCAA Tournament, the program's third appearance in the national tournament. Against Tulsa in game one, the Razorback trailed entering the bottom of the sixth inning, but a tworun single by Johnson capped a rally to seal a 7-5 victory.

In game two, Arkansas faced No. 7 Oklahoma for a spot in the regional final. Entering the bottom of the seventh, the Razorbacks found themselves trailing by two. With no outs and a runner on second, Dixon knocked a two-run home run over the fence to tie the game at five and send the two teams into extra innings. In the top of the 11th, the top-seeded Sooners scored a run to win the game, 6-5. The Razorbacks' season came to a close with a loss to Oregon.

Away from the playing field, the Razorbacks achieved a long-standing team goal when it was honored by the NFCA as a Top 25 Division I All-Academic team for the 2007-08 academic year. Arkansas' team grade-point average of 3.314 ranked No. 22 last season. The Razorbacks also had 10 student-athletes named to the NFCA Scholar-Athlete list and 19 earn SEC academic honors.



The Razorbacks capped their 2008 season with an appearance in the NCAA Tournament (Norman Regional). The third bid in program history, Arkansas' trip to the NCAA Tournament was its first since the 2002 season. Head coach Jamie Pinkerton had his highest win total (37) at the helm of the Razorback program.







SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

As it enters its 13th year of existence, SEC softball has established itself as one of the leading conference in the sport.

The Southeastern Conference qualified a record eight teams for the 2008 NCAA Tournament – Alabama, Akansas, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, LSU, Mississippi State, and Tennessee as the conference made its 11th overall, Women's College World Series appearance. History was made as Florida received the league's first No. 1 national seed. Alabama earned the No. 3 national seed, giving the SEC two top five seeds. Overall, the SEC had five national seeds including No. 9 LSU, No. 13 Tennessee and No. 15 Georgia. Two teams, Florida and Alabama, advanced all the way to the semifinal round of the Women's College World Series, marking the first time ever the SEC had two of the final four teams left in the series.

Florida went 27-1 in the SEC, tying the league record for most wins by a team, to claim the conference and tournament titles. The Gators posted a 70-5 overall record to set an NCAA record for most wins in a single season. Florida's Tim Walton was named Coach of the Year while Stacey Nelson earned Pitcher of the Year honors. Tennessee's Tonya Callahan, who led the league in hitting, was named Player of the Year and Alabama's Kelsi Dunne was named Freshman of the Year and Jordan Praytor was named Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Softball came under the auspices of the Southeastern Conference in the 1996-1997 season. Since that time, nine different conference teams have made appearances in the NCAA Championship, including five teams earning Women's

College World Series berths – one by South Carolina in the inaugural season, Alabama in 2000, 2003, 20005, 2006 and 2008, Florida in 2008, LSU in 2001 and 2004 and Tennessee in 2005, 2006 and 2007.

Eight Teams (Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, LSU, Mississippi State, South Carolina and Tennessee) have made Top 25 appearances and five teams have climbed into the Top 10 (Alabama, Florida, Georgia, LSU and Tennessee) of the NFCA/USA Today Poll. At least one SEC team has been ranked in the poll each week since the inception of SEC Softball

South Carolina is the flagship team of the league with a rich history in softball dating back 34 seasons. The Gamecocks have made 15 NCAA Regional and three Women's College World Series appearances.

Mississippi State played softball for five seasons during the 1980's before resuming the sport when it was added to the SEC. Tennessee added softball in 1995-96, one year before its inception in the SEC. Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, LSU and Ole Miss began softball programs in 1996-97 to give the league 11 representatives (Vanderbilt does not sponsor softball).

The 1999 season was the first in which the conference was for an automatic berth to the NCAA Championships.

As the sport continues to grow in competitiveness and popularity, the SEC has had six different regular season champions and five different conference tournament champions.
