

BOGLE PARK

Constucted in 2008, Bogle Park, is one of the preeminent softball facililties in the country. Equiped with six modern sky boxes, and a capcity of 1,200, this ball park is way ahead of it's time.

Bogle Park was designed by Browning Day Mullins Dierdorf and their lead architects John Lindstaedt, Dan McCloskey and Chad Lothamer. McClelland Consulting Engineers is the civil engineer for Bogle Park. The mechanical, electrical and plumbing engineers are TME Consulting Engineers and the structural engineers are Engineering Consultants. Construction of the facility is handled by Nabholz Contruction's Ozark division and would not be possible without the many donors and partners of the project.

"There's one thing everybody in America knows about our campus, nothing at the University of Arkansas is less than first class," said Associate Vice Chancellor and Executive Director of Athletics Bev Lewis. "This facility will raise the bar for our softball program. I'm so pleased that the Bogles allowed us to honor them and to honor the university with the naming of this facility."

Bogle Park was made possible thanks to the lead gift made by Bob and Marilyn Bogle and the Bogle family who have also made significant contributions to both the university and the athletic departments over the course of many years. An event celebrating the naming was held Friday, Oct. 26, 2009.

One of the most striking aspects of Bogle Park is the dramatic entrance on the concourse level. Upon entry, fans see the field and then descend down into the seating area which is home to 1,200 chair-back seats. There is space for grilling and groups in the outfield area and six modern skyboxes overlook the field. For the first time, the Razorback softball team has its locker room at the venue along with an indoor practice and batting facility located on the home field side of the stadium. The press box is a state-of-the-art media area.




Bogle Park replaces Lady'Back Yard and moves the Arkansas softball team into one of the elite facilities in America. The new stadium is located on the corner of Leroy Pond Drive and California Drive, just north of Lady'Back Field. It has the same dimensions as current Lady'Back Yard – 200 feet down the foul lines and 220 feet in center field.

Bogle Park also gives the players and staff a high quality facilities including a state- of-the-art locker room with a spacious players lounge.

When the weather prevents the softball team from practicing at Bogle Park, the team moves to the indoor, climate-controlled softball practice facility.

In indoor facility was constructed along with Bogle Park ensuring a uniform feel and consistency in the facility and the field. The interior measures 100x100 and is made of the same infield dirt as the playing field. Removable batting cages allow for hitting, pitching or lift out of the way for infield practice.







The dedication took place on Saturday, April 22, 2009 before the Razorbacks took on conference opponant LSU.

University of Arkansas Chancellor Dr. G. David Gearhart and Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Jeff Long took part in the dedication ceremony of the \$8.5 million facility. Associate Vice Chancellor and Executive Associate Athletic Director Bev Lewis was in attendance to recognize the donor gift supplied by the Bogle family.

LARABEE'S OUTLOOK

University of Arkansas head softball coach Mike Larabee and the Razorbacks are fueled up and ready to take on the 2012 season at full force. The Razorbacks ruturn 12 letter winners from last year's team while adding 12 new faces to the team; ten freshmen and two transfers.

How does your team take steaps to improve from last year?

"The biggest thing is just the work ethic. We worked really hard on building great team chemistry with our team and our coaching staff. I think we have a lot of good continuity going. Just putting in the work is the biggest thing. We have five or six kids last year's freshman class back and being able to draw from that experience while also having a very talented a 2011 class. The leadership has shown so far is far superior to what we had last year."

You have twelve newcomers to your program, how will some of them fit into the mix of girls already here?

"I think they are all going to fit in very well. Clarisa Navarro, a transfer, I think as of right now is going to be our number two hitter and start at shortstop. Andrea Sullivan, the other transfer, could potentially do some great things for us offensively. She is a strong hitter we just need her to make the transfer from a high caliber junior college ball to the SEC. Other newcomers, Katie Harrison, she will probably hit third for us we are not sure where she will be it all depend on how things pan out with other girls. Devon Wallace really showed she could swing the bat well. She had a great fall. Pitching wise, Ciara Clampitt, a freshman left-hander, has really showed a lot of improvement and not an overly hard thrower, but really locates the ball and has good movement. Kimmy Beasley has been a huge surprise, someone that came in a 60, 61 mph and she just hit 66 mph. She just needs to be able to get ahead of hitters, if we can get her to do that she will be a big addition to our pitching team.

Maddie Reese gives us some depth in the infield and outfield. Those are a few of the key newcomers that I think can make a huge difference for us this year."

How will the depth in the circle look for the 2012 season?

"Right now we have four pitchers that are healthy at this point in time. Chelsea Cohen would probably start in the circle if we started today. She has vastly improved from last year. Her work ethic and velocity; she has developed a really nice change-up and has good spin on her down ball. She can really throw all the pitches.

Amanda Summerford said that she wanted to pitch this year and she has showed great improvement and she would be in the mix to throw some innings.

Hope McLemore just had surgery. We are going to have to wait and see how she bounces back. She is in great shape and typically that surgery takes about three to five months to heal and at four months that puts us at beginning of SEC play so we are hoping she can come back.

Victoria Brown, who was injured, was our number two pitcher a very hard thrower. Those two are questions marks right now, but if we can get them back healthy with the other four we are going to have a solid pitching staff."



LARABEE'S OUTLOOK

What are you looking for from your infield this year?

"I would just like them to make the routine plays. As of right now we are not going to have pitchers making 12 to 14 strike outs a game. We may average six to eight strikeouts a game we are hoping. We just always talk about making the routine play and ground balls are outs.

Who are some of the returning infielders from last year's squad?

"Chloe Oprzedek was our starting shortstop last year and fortunately we can bump her over to second because we have Navarro so we really have two shortstops in the middle. Sierra Bronkey was in our program last year, but was injured and redshirted. We are not sure if she is going to be at third base or first so we are just going to have to see how things shake out offensively. Jennifer Rambo can play some first base, she played there last year. So we have some experience coming back.

Who will you be looking for to step into a leadership role this season?

"I think Chelsea Cohen has shown that she has done a great job of leading so far. Hope McLemore is another one of our captains. I think they both have done a great job, and just our two seniors. Tori Mort and Jessica Robison, this is their last year of playing and they have shown some good leadership so far. I think even the freshman and sophomore classes that there is some good leadership players that are developing."

How does your outfield look for the 2012 season?

"I like our outfield a lot. Our philosophy is in the outfield is that you really got to be able to hit a little bit and we are pleased with the progress that Amanda Geile has made, not only offensively, but defensively. When it comes to Tori Mort, I would put up against anybody in the SEC as far as her ability to throw. It is getting her comfortable when she is communicating with the right and left fielders when the ball is in the gap. She has played right field the past couple of years and when you go to the left you don't have anyone else to worry about. I think she has potential she has worked really hard on her swing. Devon Wallace who right now would be our leadoff hitter. She has all kinds of power and very disciplined. She can go get a ball and we are still working really hard on her throwing mechanics. Lin Ketcher is another one that had quite a bit of playing time last year and she is going to be in the mix as well."

How do you look at your team in the near future?

"I think some of the biggest things is how well our team is getting along. The chemistry amongst our players and the coaching staff. Their strength and their explosion, just their athleticism from when we started in late august in strengthen and conditioning. I really like the way we started to play defensively in the infield this fall. I thought we were starting to come together. I think they are very hungry. Nobody was excited about the way we finished last year, but everyone is really excited about this year."

2011 RECAP

Arkansas head coach Mike Larabee and the Razorbacks completed their 2011 campaign with a record of 13-39 overall and 3-23 in Southeastern Conference play. Arkansas started the year with a record-breaking opening game at the 25th Annual Louisiana Classic in Lafayette, La. Five Razorbacks combined for five triples, breaking the previous single-game record of four. Tori Mort, Becca Carden, Linnea Ketcher, Jennifer Rambo and Chloe Oprzedek each picked up an extra base hit against Prairie View A&M (Feb. 11) to help the Razorbacks to a 16-0 shutout in just five innings.

It took until just the second week of the season for the Razorbacks to make a statement in the world of collegiate softball and take down No. 1 UCLA (Feb. 18) at the Louisville Slugger Desert Classic in Las Vegas, Nev. The defending national champion Bruins held the Hogs to seven hits, but that was not enough to keep the Razorbacks back. Carden scored two runs for UA while Brittany Griffiths and Mort plated the other two runs off the bat of Courtney Breault who went 2-for-3 on the day with three RBI. Arkansas had seven strikeouts between pitchers Layne McGuirt and Kim Jones, giving the Razorbacks the 4-3 edge over the national leader.

After 21 games on the road, Arkansas opened conference play with the first home game of the season in March. In the first Southeastern Conference mid-week doubleheader of the season, Arkansas took the No. 24 Kentucky Wildcats (March 16) to 11 innings. Sophomore Hope McLemore earned her longest complete game of the season with 11.0 innings pitched. With two strikeouts on the day, McLemore and the Razorback defense managed to hold the Wildcats to a two-run tie until the 11th inning before falling 7-2.

It was a doubleheader against Ole Miss (March 23) that brought the first league win for the Razorbacks. Back-to-back home runs for

Carden and a two-RBI single by pitcher Chelsea Cohen helped boost the Hogs to a 7-6 victory in game two of the double bill, marking the first SEC win for Arkansas in 2011.

UA picked up another season-highlighting win near the end of SEC play against the Georgia Bulldogs (April 23). The third-ranked Bulldogs were held to just one run by senior pitcher Kim Jones on Senior Day at Bogle Park. Jones pitched six strikeouts on the day and just one run allowed while the UA defense held four other hits from rounding the bases. Oprzedek hit a two-RBI double to give the Razorbacks their second edge over a top-three opponent.

Jones saw numerous career accolades in her final season as a Razorback. She pitched a career-high 12 strikeouts against Rhode Island (Feb. 13). She had two perfect innings with three strikeouts in a row and allowed just two hits in the five inning, 5-0 win over URI. Jones tossed at least six strikeouts in 10 of her 25 appearances in the cir-

The Razorbacks final win of the season came just two days later against Louisiana Monroe when the Hogs took a 2-1 win away from the Warhawks in a midweek game at Bogle Park.

Arkansas finished the 2011 season with a .231 batting average. It was Carden who earned the best batting average on the team. She finished the 2011 season with a .335 batting average with 28 games as the leadoff hitter. She hit career-highs in hits (53), runs (24), RBI (24), at bats (158) and games started (51). The Miami, Okla., native had

six home runs on the season to lead the Razorbacks and highlighted her senior season with back-to-back home runs against Ole Miss,

Her senior-season accolades gave Carden the sixth spot in the record book for batting average and slugging percentage in a single season. Her career batting average of .286 is sixth all-time for the Razorbacks as well.

Mort was second on the team with a .294 batting average. The junior tallied 10 RBI off her 20 hits on the season, but it was Ketcher that led the newcomers in batting average. She finished the season batting .292 with five RBI off her 28 hits on the season. The Weber State transfer brought in 11 runs in 2011 and was 6-7 in stolen bases.

The freshmen were led by outfield slapper Macy Burr. She had 16 hits on the season and plated eight runs with one RBI on the year for a

As a team, UA maintained the fifth best stolen base percentage in a single season with a .787. The team collected 48 steals off 61 attempts. Ten of those successful stolen bases came from Carden and eight came from Ketcher.

Off the field, the Razorbacks garnered several honors as well. Caldwell was honored for the second year in a row with SEC Community Service team honors for her volunteer work around the University and in the community. Carden was named to the Capital One Academic All-District second team selection concluding the 2011 season as well. The senior graduated with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology in May of 2010. She completes her first year of graduate school this spring. As an undergraduate, Carden boasted a 3.56 GPA and has maintained a 3.33 while pursuing her master's degree. She represents one of the 12 student-athletes chosen from District 6 for their achievements in the classroom. To be available for selection, nominees must carry a 3.30 cumulative grade point average.

TORI MORT#3 -- OF -- SENIOR -- CLAREMORE, OKLA. OWASSO HS

2011: Tori Mort started in 26 games for the Razorbacks in 2011. Appearing most often in right field, she had 72 putouts with just one error. Mort combined for 14 runs and 10 RBI off 20 hits on the season with a .294 batting average. She picked up her first career home run against Texas Southern (Feb. 25) at the Holiday Inn Emerald Beach Islander Classic in Corpus Christi, Texas. She entered as a pinch hitter for the home run, giving her three RBI and lifting the Razorbacks to a 14-4 win over the Tigers. She helped the Razorbacks break the single-game record in the first game of the year with one of the five triples against Prairie View

A&M (Feb. 11). She had three runs and an RBI in that game, helping Arkansas to the five inning, 16-0 win. Mort went 3-for-4 against Sam Houston State (Feb. 12). She had three base hits, including a double to center and three RBI in the 6-5 victory over SHSU. A broken hand pulled Mort from her spot in the outfield after game one of the series against No. 1 Alabama. Used as a pinch runner after that, Mort finished the season with six stolen bases. In the Razorbacks game against No. 3 Georgia (April 23), Mort collected a stolen base and a run, helping the Razorbacks to beat the third-ranked SEC foe.

2010: Mort appeared in 52 games as a sophomore with 26 starts in right field. She went 2-for-3 with a run scored against Central Florida. Mort went 1-for-1 at the plate after coming in as a defensive replacement against Mississippi State on March 27. Mort made six starts in conference play, including an eighth-inning run off a sacrifice fly to give the Razorbacks a 3-2 victory over Georgia (April 2). Mort collected a double and scored twice in the series against Florida. She went 2-for-5 in three games against LSU and batted .286 against Alabama with a run scored. Strong defensively, Mort committed only one error in 19 chances to finish the season with a .977 fielding percentage.

2009: Spending all but two games at the No. 2 spot in the lineup, Mort finished the season with 23 runs scored. In the season opener against Southern Miss, she collected a pair of hits, two sacrifices, an RBI and one run. She tied for the team lead with nine sacrifice hits during the season. Mort picked up her lone home run of the season against Ball State, an inside-the-park hit that proved to be the difference as the only run scored in the game. She tied for second on the team with 10 multi-hit games, including a season-high three hits in a midweek matchup against Missouri State. She posted two hits, two RBI and two runs scored in the second game of Arkansas' doubleheader against South Carolina, helping the team to a sweep of the conference opener. Against No. 13 Oklahoma, Mort scored the game-tying run in the top of the sixth to spark the five-run inning for the Razorbacks.

HIGH SCHOOL: Mort was a three-year starter and four-year letter-winner at Owasso High School. Her team finished top-5 in the state during each of her four years with the Rams. She earned all-conference honors three times and was an all-region and all-state pick during her senior season. She owned a .362 career batting average with 150 hits and just three errors.

PERSONAL: Born July 12, 1990, she is the daughter of Tim and Angela Mort. She has two siblings, Lance and Callie. Mort is majoring in sports management. She was named to the SEC's Spring Honor Rolls from 2010-11. In 2009, Mort was named to the SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll.

JESSICA ROBISON #14 -- IF -- SENIOR -- OWASSO, OKLA. OWASSO HS

2011: Jessica Robison claimed the starting third base position in 20 games during the 2011 season. She ended her junior season with six hits and three RBI and career highs of 28 putouts and 36 assists. In the final Southeastern Conference game of the season against No. 6/5 Tennessee, Robison came to the plate with two outs and bases loaded when she took 12 pitches from

Ivy Renfroe in order to get the base on balls and bring home the Razorbacks solo run of the game. She had one multi-hit game on the year against South Carolina (April 16). She went 2-for-4 with two base hits, helping the Razorbacks to a 2-1 win over the Gamecocks.

She went 1-for-3 with a double against Drake the following day. Robison had a pinch-hit single in Arkansas' 11-6 win over Mississippi State on March 27. She also added a single in a pinch-hit appearance against Memphis.



2011: Chelsea Cohen pitched 43.2 innings in her sophomore season for Arkansas. She made 17 appearances with two starts in the circle and started one game in the designated player spot. She picked up her first win over Texas Southern (Feb. 25) at the Holiday Inn Emerald Beach Islander Classic in Corpus Christi, Texas. She worked six complete innings and helped the Razor-

backs to a 14-4 win over TSU. In game two of the doubleheader at Ole Miss (March 23), Cohen picked up her second win of the season in a 7-6 victory over the Rebels. Cohen came in as a relief pitcher in the second inning and pulled the Razorbacks out of a bases loaded, no outs situation. She worked 5.1 innings in the circle and walked just two batters. She made her first plate appearance of the season with a two-RBI single up the left side.

2010: Cohen made six starts inside the circle for the Razorbacks and posted a 3-2 record with a 5.08 ERA. In 41.1 innings pitched, she allowed 46 hits, 30 earned runs and struck out nine. She also made eight appearances in relief. Cohen got the win in her first collegiate start on Feb. 27 against Iowa. She allowed just one earned run on seven hits with one strikeout in six her innings in the circle. She added another win against Tulsa as she limited the Golden Hurricane to two hits over seven innings. Cohen made seven appearances in SEC play, including starts against Georgia, LSU and Alabama. Against

the Tigers, Cohen took the loss despite allowing only three runs on seven hits through 9-2/3 innings.

HIGH SCHOOL: Cohen joined Arkansas softball after earning all-state honors three times. In her first high school start for the Reed High School Raiders, she pitched a nine-inning, no-hitter and struck out 15 batters in a 1-0 win. She finished her freshman year with a 1.56 ERA and 120 strikeouts in 99 innings pitched. As a sophomore, she carried a 1.87 ERA and threw seven shutouts while striking out 165. She helped her team to finish second at the Oklahoma 4A State Championships in her junior year. Cohen was also a four-year letterwinner in volleyball. She was involved with student council and the Reed Mentoring program.




LINNEA KETCHER

2011: Ketcher joined the Razorbacks after transferring from Weber State after her freshman season. She stared 34 games for Arkansas and held the third highest batting average on the team with .292. 2011: Hope McLemore capped off her sophomore season with 12 starts in the circle. She finished the season with a 4-11 record and pitched six complete games for the Razorbacks. She had a season high of nine strikeouts on the season against East Tennessee State (March 5), leading the Razorbacks to a 4-2 win over the Bucs. She combined for 85.1 innings pitched and tallied 71 strikeouts during the 2011 season. McLemore

had seven starts and three complete games during SEC play, including an 11 inning battle against No. 24 Kentucky in the opening week of league play. McLemore had just two strikeouts, but held the score at two apiece until the 11th inning. She finished the season at a 4.43 ERA. McLemore made four appearances as a pinch runner for the Razorbacks as well during the year. She scored her first run of her career as a pinch runner against Mississippi State (March 20) when senior Amanda Caldwell hit a grand slam in the top of the fourth.

HEAD COACH

THIRD SEASON AT ARKANSAS - EIGHTH SEASON OVERALL

Mike Larabee enters his third season as head coach of the Arkansas Razorbacks and his eighth season as a Division-I head coach.

Larabee was an assistant coach to Team USA during the Pan American Games in October of 2011. There, Larabee and Team USA captured the gold medal by going 9-0 and outscoring its opponents 78-8

During the 2011 season the Razorbacks finished 13-39 overall and 3-29 in the Southeastern Conference. Early in the season the team showed their tenacity after knocking off No. 1-ranked UCLA (4-3) at the Louisville Slugger Desert Classic. The team finished the season with a .231 batting average while also

achieving the fifth best stolen base percentage in a single season with .787.

The 2011 season was filled with numerous academic accolades. Larabee landed eighteen student-athletes on the Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll, seven of those being first-year recipients. To be eligible for the award, student-athletes must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.00 or above, be on scholarship or a letter winners, have completed 24 semester hours and been a member of a varsity squad for the entire year.

"We strive to have a team that does well on the diamond as well as in the classroom," Larabee said. "Our Razorback coaching staff always want to bring in student-athletes that can compete in the SEC and have academics be a main focus." Becca Carden was named to the Capital One Academic All-District second team, while Amanda Caldwell was honored for the second year

in a row with SEC Community Service team honors for her volunteer work around the University and in the community. With an overall record of 41-68 at the University of Arkansas, Larabee is going into his third season with a vibrant, young team that is ready to make a statement early on to their conference and to the nation.

During the summer of 2010, Larabee served as an assistant coach for the USA Softball Futures team. He assisted the team at the 2010 KFC World Cup of Softball presented by Six Flags where the Futures faced 2008 Olympic champion Japan, Canada and three-time Olympic champion Team USA. Larabee helped coach the Futures to a bronze medal at the World Cup.

In his first season as head coach of the Razorbacks, the team finished 28-29 and 10-15 in conference play which earned them a berth in the conference tournament which was held at Bogle Park. The back-to-back appearances in the tournament for the Razorbacks were the first for the program since it qualified for the tournament in 2001 and 2002.

Larabee and Razorbacks opened conference play with an 8-2 record in 2010, a mark that represents the best start to SEC play in school history. Arkansas' 10 conference wins, echoed the number reached in 2009.

Under the direction of Larabee, the Razorbacks' finished the 2010 season with a .254 batting average with 58 home runs and 236 RBIs. The team batting average ranks in the top-5 all-time in program history while the home runs and RBI are the second most by a Razorback team. The Razorbacks posted a .353 on-base percentage and 202 walks, which set single-season records in both categories. The team finished the season with a .965 fielding-percentage, only one-thousandth of a point off the school record .966 set in 2001.

"I am appreciative of the opportunity Jeff Long and the University of Arkansas has given me to lead the Razorback softball program," Larabee said. "The University of Arkansas is a place where our coaching staff will work hard teaching and coaching the game while recruiting quality student-athletes.

I couldn't ask for a better opportunity than to coach in the Southeastern Conference at an outstanding institution known for its academic and athletic excellence."

Larabee previously coached five seasons at Wright State in Dayton, Ohio, where his teams ranked among the nation's top-15 in batting average in 2007 and 2008. He won 92 games in the last three seasons with the Horizon League tournament championships and NCAA Tournament bids in 2007 and 2008. In addition to his collegiate coaching experience, Larabee is a two-time member of the United States National Softball Team coaching pool and was a two-time all-world selection during this playing career.

"At Arkansas we have all the ingredients for a nationally competitive program," Larabee said. "Bogle Park is one of the best, if not the best, stadiums in the country. Our facilities will be a great draw in recruiting. When the job first came open, I did some research because I wanted it to be a good fit not only for me but for my family. After looking at the University of Arkansas and Northwest Arkansas, I felt like this was a great opportunity for all of us."





Larabee led Wright State to 34 wins in 2009, second-most in school history, while the 16-8 conference record also gave the Raiders the most league victories in the history of the program. The 33-26 record in 2008 was the first winning record for WSU since 2001, and the NCAA Tournament appearances in '07 and '08 were just the second and third in ever for Wright State.

During his five-year run with the Raiders, Larabee compiled a 114-147 overall record, a 49-51 mark in Horizon League play and a 12-6 record in the league tournament. In Larabee's last two seasons, Wright State went 29-15 in league play.

The 2008 club won the Horizon League Tournament with wins over Loyola, Illinois-Chicago and two over regular-season champion Cleveland State to advance to an NCAA Regional in Ann Arbor, Mich., where the Raiders fell to Michigan and Kent State. Larabee was named Wright State's Coach of the Year following the 2008 campaign.

The 2007 club was 25-35 overall, but won the conference tournament as the No. 7 seed with wins over Cleveland State, Butler, Illinois-Chicago and Cleveland State again. Wright State fell to Northwestern and Notre Dame in the NCAA Tournament in Evanston,

With a 2-2 mark in the 2009 Horizon League Tournament, Larabee led his team to a 10-2 record in conference tournament play during the past three seasons.

Other 2009 highlights include six student-athletes earning All-Horizon League honors, a school record for team fielding percentage (.965), three individual single-season records and six individual career records. The Raiders were No. 15 in the nation with a .309 batting average, No. 35 with 5.15 runs scored per game and No. 37 with a .445 slugging percentage.

Larabee's 2008 squad set 11 school records, including 67 home runs, which shattered the previous mark of 25 in 1999. WSU was No. 5 in the nation with 0.36 triples per game, No. 10 with a .315 batting average and a .510 slugging percentage, No. 12 with 5.85 runs and 1.14 home runs per game, and No. 23 with 1.46 doubles per game.

A former member of the U.S. National Men's Fastpitch Team in 1996 and 2000, Larabee was named to the USA Women's National Team Coaching Pool for the 2005-08 and 2009-12 Olympic Quadrenniums. As a result, he was part of the selection camp committee which chose participants for the Pan American Qualifying Team. That team competed in Guatemala in 2005 and qualified for the 2006 World Championships in Beijing, China, and the 2007 Pan American Games in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. In summer 2006, he was part of the coaching staff of the World University Games in Taiwan and helped the United States win the gold medal.

He was selected as a clinician for the NCAA Youth Education Through Sports (YES) clinic during the 2009 Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City.

Larabee was an assistant at the University of Illinois for three years (2002-04) prior to going to Wright State. In 2003, Illinois earned an NCAA Tournament bid for the first time. In 2004, Illinois ended the year ranked No. 17 in the USA Today/National Fastpitch Coaches Association poll, was the No. 2 seed in the NCAA Waco Regional and came within one victory of advancing to the Women's College World Series.

Larabee was head softball coach from 1998-2001, assistant football in 1997-2000 and coached wrestling from 1999-2000 at Kentlake High School in Kent, Wash. He also taught advanced weight training and speed development. He was named Class 4A softball Coach of the Year in 2001 after Kentlake finished second in the state. His 1998 team was fifth, while the 2000 team placed fourth. He was softball coach and assistant football coach at KHS In 1996 and 1997.

In his six years as a head coach at the prep level, Larabee's teams managed a 145-25 record, with an 88-6 mark in the South Puget Sound League (SPSL), and he was named Seattle-Tacoma All-Area Coach of the Year in 1996 and 1999.

He won six consecutive SPSL North League titles (1996-2001) and his 2001 squad had the highest team grade point average in the state.

Larabee also worked one year as a pitching and outfield coach for the University of Puget Sound baseball team in 1992. Other coaching experience includes participating in the Diamond Basics Softball Clinics in Kent, Wash., from 1994-2001 and working as assistant baseball coach at Kent Meridian High School in 1994-95.

In addition to playing on the U.S. National Men's Fastpitch Team, he also participated in the 1999 Pan American Games National Team Festival. A three-time American Softball Association All-American (1992, 1995, 1997), he played in the U.S. Olympic Sports Festival four times and was named to the ISC All-World Team twice (1990, 1997).

He played baseball at MiraCosta and Green River community colleges, and at Washington State University, where he earned his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1986. He earned his master's in exercise science from WSU in 1988. While working on his master's, he was an assistant baseball coach at WSU, working with the outfielders.

Larabee and his wife Dawn have a daughter, Michaela, and a son, John.









SUE CARPENTER

THIRD SEASON AT ARKANSAS

Sue Carpenter begins her third season as an assistant coach of the Razorback softball team. Carpenter's main duties with the Razorbacks include working with infielders, recruiting, scouting and coordinating camps. Prior to Arkansas, she was an assistant under head coach Mike Larabee during the previous three seasons at Wright State where she assumed the same duties.

In 2010, behind the coaching of Carpenter and Larabee, the Razorbacks saw second baseman Courtney Breault become the fourth Razorback in program history to garner All-Freshman honors. The Roseville, Calif., native finished the season with a .313 average against SEC opponents. Breault drove in 20 of her 32 RBI during conference play and boasted a .943 fielding percentage during those games.

Also under the direction of Carpenter, senior Sandra Smith earned a spot on the SEC All-Defensive Team for her excellent play at third base. Smith finished conference play with 54 assists and a perfect fielding percentage in 78 chances.

During her three years at Wright State, the Raiders made two NCAA Tournament appearances and won back-to-back Horizon League Tournament titles in 2007 and 2008. Carpenter's work with the infielders was put on display when Bridget Henry earned the all-tournament Defensive Award at first base during the Raiders' 2008 run to the conference tournament title. She also helped guide Jherica Williams to the program's first Horizon League Player of the Year award, also in 2008. Wright State went on to win 34 games, the second-most in program history, and record a .974 fielding percentage against conference opponents in 2009.

Carpenter began her coaching career as an assistant on the Cedarville College staff from 1987-89. Carpenter then spent five years on the coaching staff at Colville High School in Washington.

Following Colville, Carpenter began her career as a head coach at Cedarville High School in Ohio. After coaching for two years at Cedarville, Carpenter then served as the head coach at Cedarville University for seven seasons (2000-06) prior to joining the Wright State staff. She led the Lady Jacket softball program to four appearances in the National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA) Tournament and three appearances in the National Association of Intercollegiate Ath-

letics (NAIA) Region IX Tournament. In 2000, Cedarville was the NCCAA Midwest Region champions.

While a student-athlete at Cedarville College, Carpenter was a three-year letterwinner (1984-86) during her collegiate playing career. She was a member of the program's inaugural fast-pitch team in 1985 and was an All-Western Buckeye Collegiate Conference and All-NAIA District 22 shortstop during her final season in 1986.

Carpenter and her husband Kevin have two sons, Nick and Josh.







ASSISTANT COACH COY ADKINS FIRST SEASON AT ARKANSAS

Coy Adkins, formerly of the University of Florida, joined the University of Arkansas' softball coaching staff in June 2011. Adkins assumes the role of pitching coach for the Razorbacks after a successful two-year stint as volunteer coach for Florida's softball program.

While at Florida, Adkins worked as first base coach, while also overseeing the outfield positions and assisting on offensive coaching. The 2010 Florida team hit a then-Southeastern Conference-record 109 home runs. The Gators reset the record in 2011, smacking a nation-leading 124 home runs. Adkins assisted the Gators to a berth in the 2010 and 2011 Women's College World Series and an overall record of 105-23 (.820) during his stay. Florida was national runner-up in 2011.

Adkins brings 11 years of softball coaching experience to the Razorbacks, including experience as a state champion-ship-winning head coach on the Florida high school level. He led Wewahitchka High School to the 2008 Class 2A state championship, compiling a 27-2 overall record. As assistant head coach, Adkins helped the squad to the 2007 Class 2A title. In 2008, the squad hit a state-record 43 home runs. In his six year head and assistant coach career at Wewahitchka, the softball team advanced to the state playoffs every year while winning five regional championships. Adkins compiled a 162-34 (.827) overall record at Wewahitchka.

Before Wewahitchka, Adkins served as the head coach for Chipley (Fla.) High School from 2002-03, where he compiled a 47-14-1 (.766) record. The 2003 Chipley team won the first regional championship in school history.

Adkins founded Team North Florida and served as head coach from 2004-09. Team North Florida was an Amateur Softball Association of America (ASA) 16U National Championship participant in 2006 and placed ninth in 2007. The squad played at the ASA 18U Gold National Championship in 2008 and finished fifth in 2009. Adkins also led the team to Champions Cup 18U Gold in 2009.

Adkins earned a bachelor's degree in mathematics education from Florida State University in 2001. He began his college career at St. John's River Community College on a basketball scholarship after being named to Florida's high school all-state team in 1995. Adkins and his wife, Sonya, have two daughters, Kenna and Anniston, and one son, Hayden.






