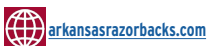

Versus UCA

- Arkansas and UCA met in the 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2024-25 seasons. However, before that, the in-state programs had not met since the 1946-47 season.
- The Razorbacks are 9-0 all-time versus the Bears, including a 5-0 record in games played in Fayetteville.
- The series dates back to Arkansas' first season of basketball. The teams met on back-to-back days during the 1923-24 season (Jan. 11 and 12) in Fayetteville with the Razorbacks winning 62-27 and 34-14, respectively. The programs also met in the 1933-34 season, on back-to-back days in the 1935-36 seasons and the aforementioned 1946-47 season.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET • DEC 14, 2024 • ARK: 82 • UCA: 57 @ NLR

- Arkansas had six players score in double figures as the Razorbacks cruised to an 82-57 victory over Central Arkansas in the Hogs' annual trip to Simmons Bank Arena.
- Boogie Fland led the way with 16 points, nine assists (with just one turnover) and a career-high five steals. Fellow Karter Knox came off the bench to score 14 points. D.J. Wagner, who had six assists, and Jonas Aidoo, who was 6-of-6 from the floor, each scored 13 points. Trevon Brazile, who had five blocked shots, and Johnell Davis each scored 11 points.
- Arkansas played without leading scorer Adou Thiero, who sat out due to illness.
- Arkansas raced out to a 22-7 lead to start the game and never looked back. UCA did get to within 10 after that but the Razorbacks answered with a 9-0 run and led comfortably the rest of the game.
- Elias Cato led UCA with 15 points with Lane Taylor and Ben Fox adding 13 and 12 points, respectively.
- The Razorbacks shot 60% from the field, handing out 23 assists on 33 made baskets. On the other end, Arkansas held UCA to 33.3% shooting as the Bears only had eight assists. Also, Arkansas only had five steals, compared to six thefts by UCA, but the Hogs had 21 fastbreak points compared to zero for the Bears.
- Cal is 1-0 all-time versus UCA, but is 3-0 versus UCA head coach John Shulman.

Razorbacks Ready for Year Two Calipari Era

- Naismith Hall of Fame coach John Calipari, who has led six teams to the Final Four, enters his 34th season as a collegiate head coach and second at Arkansas.
- **He is 22 wins from 900 career on-court wins** and is on-pace to be the second or third-fastest coach to reach 900 wins.
- Calipari became the fourth-fastest coach to 800 on-court wins ever at 1,037 games. Only Adolph Rupp (972 games), Roy Williams (1,012 games) and Dean Smith (1,029 games) did it faster.
- Of the 32 NCAA Tournaments held during his collegiate coaching career, he has led 24 teams to the NCAA Tournament, including 16 trips to the Sweet 16, 12 appearances to the Elite 8, six Final Four births, three national title games and a national championship. (Note, in 2019-20, Kentucky was 25-6 and won the SEC with a 15-3 record but the NCAA canceled the tournament due to COVID-19.)
- Calipari is one of two coaches in NCAA history to take three different programs to the Final Four and just is one of three coaches to lead four different schools to the Sweet 16.
- His teams have won an NCAA-record 38 games three times - twice at UK ('12 & '15) and once at Memphis ('08).

RECAP: Arkansas - Cincinnati Exhibition ... The CareSource Invitational - Fayetteville

- The #14/15 Arkansas men's basketball program led by 20 at halftime, used a 23-10 run to start the second half and cruised to an 89-61 victory over Cincinnati for an exhibition game at Bud Walton Arena dubbed the CareSource Invitational - Fayetteville, Supporting Mental Health.
- Arkansas had five players score in double figures, including a combined 35 points from freshmen Meleek Thomas (18 points).

RECAP: Arkansas - Memphis Exhibition ... Hoops for St. Jude

- Meleek Thomas sparked a first-half run and led all scorers with 23 points as #14/15 Arkansas pulled away in the second half for a 99-75 victory at Memphis in the Hoops for St. Jude Tip Off Classic presented by Bad Boy Mowers.
- Thomas also tied for the team lead with seven rebounds with Trevon Brazile and Karter Knox, while getting a team-best four steals and ranking second on the team with four assists.

RECAP: Arkansas - Southern Season Opener

- Trevon Brazile recorded his 11th career double-double, scoring a career-high 25 points and grabbing 11 rebounds, while freshmen Darius Acuff Jr. and Meleek Thomas combined for 43 points to lead #14/15 Arkansas to a 109-77 season-opening victory over Southern Monday night at Bud Walton Arena.
- The 109 points tied the most by a Razorback team under Razorback head coach John Calipari, was the most in a season opener since scoring 142 in the 2020-21 season opener versus Mississippi Valley State and the fifth-most all-time in a season opener.
- Brazile's career-high 25 points came on the strength of going a career-best 8-of-10 at the free throw line. Overall, Arkansas went 25-of-29 at the free throw line.
- Acuff finished with 22 points, scoring 20 in the first half, while adding four assists.
- Thomas scored 21 points and tied for the team lead with seven assists while leading the team with three steals.

RECAP: Arkansas at Michigan State

- Michigan State opened the second half with a 9-3 run, grabbed a 45-42 lead and held off a late Arkansas charge to win, 69-66, at the Breslin Center.
- The #22/21 Spartans turned the tables on #14/15 Arkansas in the second half, shooting 45.6% from the field and holding the Razorbacks to just 28.6% shooting. In the first half, Arkansas shot 50% from the field while the Spartans made just 37.8%.
- Michigan State, which was just 1-of-14 from 3-point range, led by as many as eight (66-58) with 5:21 left before Arkansas went on an 8-0 run, capped by a Nick Pringle dunk and later a free throw to tie the game at 66 with 1:41 left.
- While Michigan State did not score a field goal over the final 6:02, Arkansas would not score after tying the game at 66. Michigan State made three free throws over the final 1:41 to secure the win.

NBA OPENING DAY ROSTERS

- The Razorbacks have nine players on 2025-26 NBA opening day rosters.
- The last two years, Arkansas had 11 #ProHogs on NBA rosters to mark the most Razorbacks in the NBA in the same season. The previous best was nine players in the 1992-93 season and 1995-96 season.
- Arkansas is one of 10 NCAA programs to have at least nine players on NBA opening day rosters. Arkansas is also second among SEC programs.
- Razorback head coach John Calipari has an NBA-best 26 players on NBA opening day rosters.

ON-COURT SUCCESS

A "players-first" coach whose biggest goal is helping people reach their dreams, John Calipari, a Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer, is fast approaching 900 career wins while guiding six teams to the Final Four and helping 62 players earn selection in the NBA Draft during his 33-year college coaching career with his pros amassing over \$5.8 billion in contracts.

Calipari took UMass to the Final Four in 1996, guided Memphis to the National Championship game in 2008 and led Kentucky to four Final Fours - including the 2012 National Championship and a runner-up finish in 2014 - to become **only the second coach in NCAA history to lead three different schools to the Final Four**. He has racked up 24 NCAA Tournament appearances and numerous National Coach of the Year honors.

In his first year at Arkansas, Calipari led the Razorbacks to a Sweet 16 appearance, his 16th as a head coach, and **became just the third coach in NCAA history to take four programs to the Sweet 16**. Also, after beating Kansas and St. John's to reach the 2025 Sweet 16, Calipari pushed his NCAA Tournament wins total to 59, tying for sixth all-time.

At every collegiate stop, Calipari's career has been successful throughout, but his 10-year stretch at Kentucky (2009-19) was among the best decades in NCAA history, reaching four Final Fours (with a 2012 championship and 2014 national runner-up), seven Elite 8 berths and nine trips to the Sweet 16.

The 2015 campaign was highlighted by Coach Cal directing the first-ever college basketball team to own a 38-0 record (before falling in the Final Four) and became one of just three coaches to make four Final Fours in a five-year span. At the end of that 2015 season, Calipari became the 96th coach to join the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

Coach Cal has **led three teams to an NCAA-record 38 wins on the court in a season** (once at Memphis and twice at Kentucky), led the NCAA in wins six times (at least once at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky) and tallied 30, 20-win seasons (including 11 30-win campaigns). With his sustained success, Coach Cal received the John R. Wooden Award Legends of Coaching honor in 2024.

While building a program out of obscurity at UMass and returning Memphis and Kentucky to national contenders, he has totaled the second-most wins in NCAA history in the first 20 years of a college coaching career.

PLAYER SUCCESS

In his goal to lead a players-first program, he has helped **77 players realize their dreams by being drafted or playing in the NBA**. Calipari's NBA players have **amassed over \$5.8 billion in contracts**, which does not include endorsements nor players that have played overseas. He has had four No. 1 overall picks, tying for most overall, among his **62 players drafted and 43 first-round picks**, both ranking second-most all-time. In 2010, he had a record five first-round draft picks. Two years later, six of his players heard their names called at the 2012 draft, the most in the two-round draft era. Then in 2015, Cal would have six picks again, including a record-tying four lottery selections.

Calipari's players have entered the league NBA-ready. His players have garnered 43 All-Star selections, including a record-breaking seven in 2024, with Anthony Davis winning the game's MVP honor in 2017. **Derrick Rose was named NBA MVP in 2011 and Shai Gilgeous-Alexander was voted NBA MVP in 2025 to make Cal just the third person to coach two NBA MVPs in college** (with John Wooden and Dean Smith). Nine of his players have been tabbed All-NBA (a combined 21 times), three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year and 18 players have made the NBA All-Rookie teams. **He is the only coach in history to have a player win each of the NBA's major honors: MVP (twice), Rookie of the Year, Most Improved Player, Sixth Man of the Year and Clutch Player of the Year**.

Much like he did at UMass, where his players graduated at nearly 80%, Calipari has stressed academics. Seventeen of his last 20 seniors at Memphis earned their bachelor's degrees, and all 31 players at UK who were eligible to graduate by the end of their senior years walked away with a diploma in hand, including five players who earned their degree in just three years. Calipari's teams routinely have posted a combined team grade-point average of 3.0 or better.

COMMUNITY SUCCESS

Calipari has raised millions of dollars to help the lives of those in need. He has had a particular passion to assist those impacted by natural disasters. For instance, in 2010, he used a telethon to raise more than \$1 million for victims of the devastating earthquake in Haiti. He followed that up with telethons in 2012, raising \$1 million for victims of Superstorm Sandy, in 2017 for victims of Hurricane Harvey, played a leading role in the "Kentucky United" efforts that generated more than \$5 million for victims of devastating tornadoes in Western Kentucky in 2021, and raised nearly \$4 million with the Kentucky Flood Relief Telethon and open practice at Rupp Arena in 2022. In his second month on the job at Arkansas, Cal helped with cleanup efforts after tornadoes hit the state. He has continued the Suits & Sneakers Gala in NW Arkansas and continued his tradition of helping families at Christmas with food, presents and paying for rent.

Calipari launched his **THE CALIPARI FOUNDATION** in 2012 and has worked with several key partners to donate more than \$1.5 million, a figure that does not include matching funds that have been contributed from individuals and corporations. In 2013, Calipari initiated hosting an annual alumni weekend around his basketball fantasy experience with the intent to raise money for charity. After generating \$350,000 for selected organizations and charities during the inaugural game, the weekend has generated millions of dollars for charity since its inception.

In 2019, when federal workers were without pay due to a government shutdown, he, his wife and his foundation assisted workers with financial help and grocery gift cards. He and his wife, Ellen, teamed up with Fayette County Public Schools to help families in need during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Additional efforts include spearheading the creation of the **JOHN McLENDON MINORITY LEADERSHIP INITIATIVE**, a nationwide coach-driven initiative to provide minorities a jump-start to their careers through practical experiences, opportunities to build their network and instilling the values of John McLendon: integrity, education, leadership and mentorship. Participants in the initiative will be known as MLI Future Leaders.

He was awarded the Jefferson Award for Outstanding Public Service in Sports by Multiplying Good in 2022. For more than 50 years, Multiplying Good has honored those who put others first. Those receiving the Jefferson Award are empowered to do more, while their stories of extraordinary public service inspire others to action. It is an award that underscores impact. He earned the Race Amity Medal of Honor in 2023.

OTHER SUCCESS

In 2017, Coach Cal was named the head coach of the 2017 USA Basketball Men's U19 World Cup Team, which finished third at the 2017 FIBA U19 World Cup in Cairo. Also, he won gold as head coach of the 2012 Dominican Republic team at the Centrobasket Championship.

Author of five books, including the New York Times Best Seller "Players First: Coaching from the Inside Out," Calipari is a master of communication and maximizing talent. CALIPARI 4TH FASTEST TO 800 CAREER VICTORIES; NEARING 900

With Kentucky's overtime win over Mississippi State on Jan. 25, 2022, John Calipari reached 800 on-court wins, all at the Division I level. At the time he was one of just 22 coaches, regardless of NCAA level of classification, to reach that barrier. Overall, only 16 coaches have done it with at least 10 seasons at the Division I level.

Calipari was the fourth-fastest coach to 800 on-court wins at 1,037 games. Only Adolph Rupp (972 games), Roy Williams (1,012 games) and Dean Smith (1,029 games) did it faster.

Calipari is nearing his 900th career win and he is on pace to reach that plateau as potentially the second-fastest coach in D-I history to do so, trailing Roy Williams (1,161 games) and possibly beating Mike Krzyzewski at 1,183 games.

Although Calipari is still climbing the charts, he is doing it nearly as fast as anyone else in NCAA history. When he defeated Mississippi State on Jan. 17, 2024, Calipari became the third-fastest active head coach to 400 wins at a single program, trailing only Bill Self (Kansas - 484) and Mark Few (Gonzaga - 499). Overall, Calipari needed just 516 games to reach 400 wins while at UK to rank the eighth fastest in Division I history.

FIRST BALLOT HALL OF FAMER

John Calipari joined basketball's fraternity of legends in September of 2015 after being elected to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on the first ballot. Calipari joined an elite group of basketball players and coaches in the Naismith Hall of Fame, considered to be one of the ultimate honors in the sport.

The Class of 2015 included Calipari, Dick Bevetta, Louis Dampier, Lindsay Gaze, Tom Heinsohn, John Isaacs, Spencer Haywood, Lisa Leslie, Dikembe Mutombo, George Raveling and JoJo White. Calipari was inducted in Springfield, Mass., and nearly 70 of his former players joined him on stage during his acceptance speech.

COACH CAL IMMORTALIZED AT UMASS, CLARION, CONFERENCE USA

John Calipari's Hall of Fame rise began at UMass, and the school honored his program's breakthrough in the 1990s by unveiling a statue of Calipari on the Amherst campus in September 2021. Calipari was one of four icons synonymous with UMass basketball to earn the honor. Calipari's statue was unveiled next to Marcus Camby, Julius Erving and the late Jack Leaman outside the Mullins Center.

At UMass, Calipari led the Minutemen to a 193-71 on-court record in his eight seasons as head coach from 1989-96. His .731 career winning percentage remains the best in school history. Calipari led UMass to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 1992 to 1996 after UMass had gone to the NAAs only once in the first 81 years of the program. His Minutemen made the Atlantic 10's first and only Final Four appearance during the 1996 season, during which they went 35-2 overall and spent 10 weeks ranked No. 1 in the nation. Following the 1996 season, Calipari was named National Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches, The Sporting News and Naismith.

Clarion honored Calipari by having a statue erected and naming the basketball court in his honor. Tippin Gymnasium's floor was officially renamed the John V. Calipari Court in September 2021 and is better known as "Coach Cal Court." Calipari started his college playing career at UNC Wilmington before transferring to Clarion in 1981, helping the Golden Eagles reach their first NCAA Division II Tournament in program history that year.

In the summer of 2022, Calipari was enshrined into the Conference USA Hall of Fame. Calipari was honored by the league for his impressive tenure as head men's basketball coach at the University of Memphis, where he coached from the 2000-09. Calipari led the Tigers to the 2008 NCAA title game, including an NCAA, single-season record 38 wins. As a result, he earned his second Naismith National Coach of the Year honor, becoming only the second coach to earn the honor multiple times since its inception in 1987. Calipari, the 2009 Sports Illustrated National Coach of the Year, led the Tigers to nine straight 20-win campaigns and nine consecutive postseason appearances, the only Memphis coach to do that. He posted 252 on-court wins – 28.0 wins per season – as the Tigers' head coach, making him the winningest coach in school history. From 2006-08, the Tigers won 104 games, making Calipari the winningest head coach in NCAA Division I history in a three-year span.

A WOODEN AWARD LEGEND OF COACHING

On Oct. 3, 2023, it was announced that John Calipari would receive the John R. Wooden Award "Legends of Coaching" honor. On April 12, 2024, the newly named Razorback head basketball coach was on hand for the trophy presentation at the Los Angeles Athletic Club.

The "Legends of Coaching" honor recognizes coaches who exemplify Coach Wooden's high standard of coaching success and personal integrity. The award was adopted by the Wooden Award Steering Committee in 1999. The honorees are selected based on character, success on the court, graduation rate of student-athletes in their basketball program, coaching philosophy, and identification with the goals of the John R. Wooden Award. He will be presented the honor along with the 2024 Wooden Award winners on April 12, 2024.

Chairman of the Wooden Award Steering Committee Sam Lagana said, "Coach John Calipari has been a significant part of the Wooden Award experience, dating back to his first head coaching assignment at UMass. He has supported the Award and stood with his candidates and winners every step of the way. Coach Wooden had an appreciation for Coach Cal that carried through the years and Coach Calipari has demonstrated great reverence for Coach Wooden as both shared a 'players first' mentality, with emphasis on care for the student-athlete and in the value of competitive greatness. John Calipari is a wonderful addition to the fraternity of Wooden Award 'Legends of Coaching' recipients."

Calipari's on-court success is well publicized and culminated with the highest honor in the sport by being inducted into the Naismith Hall of Fame. Off the court, Coach Calipari's impact has been felt in his community and abroad. In 2012, he founded the John Calipari Foundation which has partnered with many organizations, including: Samaritan's Feet, 4 Paws for Ability, One Parent Scholar House and Team Focus. He has partnered with the American Red Cross to raise millions of dollars to help people affected by disasters such as the 2010 Haitian earthquake, 2012 Superstorm Sandy, and the 2022 flooding in Eastern Kentucky. He helped spearhead the creation of the John McLendon Minority Leadership Initiative, a national coach-driven initiative to provide minorities with a jump-start to their careers.

As someone who prides himself on helping young men reach their dreams, John Calipari has helped 77 players get drafted or play in the NBA as free agents, including 62 players going in the NBA Draft.

- ^ 62 NBA Draft picks ranks third all-time, trailing only Mike Krzyzewski (74) and Dean Smith (65)

CHANGING FAMILIES LIVES ... \$5.8 BILLION AND COUNTING

John Calipari hasn't just signed the best talent in the country; he's been the best at developing that talent, making those players better prepared than anyone else and getting them ready for all things at the next level. The proof is in the numbers.

Entering the 2025-26 NBA season, Calipari's NBA pros will have amassed over \$5.898 billion in NBA contracts over their careers, which does not include endorsement deals or players on overseas contracts. Through 2024-25 his players on NBA rosters have tallied over \$2 billion alone. For the 2025-26 NBA season alone, Cal's players are set to earn over \$563 million.

CALIPARI UNRIVALED IN CONFERENCE

John Calipari has won a combined 16 league regular-season championships in his career (including six Southeastern Conference titles). That is six more than the next-closest coach in the SEC (Bruce Pearl has 10). Calipari has won a combined 15 conference tournament titles in his career (six in the SEC), 10 more than his closest competitor (Nate Oats with five).

Calipari has tallied a 414-141 (74.6%) all-time record within conference play as a head coach and owns a 206-75 (73.3%) record since joining the SEC.

Although he's been publicly outspoken against conference tournaments – only because he doesn't favor playing three or more games on consecutive days to win the tournament – his teams have gotten up for them. Calipari's teams at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky have been to 19 conference championship games in his career, winning a remarkable 15 of them. Calipari is 59-17 (77.6%) all-time in conference tournaments, including 25-9 (73.5%) in the SEC. Calipari's 25 SEC Tournament wins ties for third all-time (Adolph Rupp 57, Billy Donovan 27, Wimp Sanderson 25).

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

John Calipari-coached teams have posted an all-time record of 486-62 (88.7%) record at home. Calipari's best home winning streak came when he began his career at UK with a 54-game home win streak at Rupp Arena. He additionally had a 42-game home win streak at UK (2014-17). He has gone undefeated at home 10 times overall – adding seven times with just one loss – while going undefeated at home in league play 14 times.

LIFE AWAY FROM HOME ISN'T SO BAD EITHER

As good as John Calipari's team's have been at home, they're pretty good in hostile environments on the road. His teams are 219-137 (61.5%) overall on the road. At neutral-site venues, his teams are 172-78 (68.8%) including six seasons with at least 10 neutral-site wins.

CALIPARI IN ELITE COMPANY WITH CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS

When Kentucky clinched a share of the 2017 Southeastern Conference championship, John Calipari became the first NCAA Division I coach to lead three different programs (UMass, Memphis, Kentucky) to five on-court, regular-season league titles three different times. UMass won five Atlantic 10 titles (1992, '93, '94, '95 and '96). Memphis claimed five Conference USA crowns (2004, '06, '07, '08 and '09). Kentucky captured the SEC Championship six times (2010, '12, '15, '16, '17 and '20). Perhaps more impressive is that Calipari has 31 combined regular-season and tournament championships. That trails only Mark Few of Gonzaga (41 titles) and Kentucky's Adolph Rupp (41) for the most combined championships. Bill Self (Kansas) also has 31 combined titles.

CALIPARI AT NO. 1

John Calipari is one of just two coaches (Frank McGuire) to lead three programs to a No. 1 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25. Calipari has led 10 of his teams to a No. 1 AP ranking. His teams are 110-13 (89.4%) as when ranked #1 by AP #1, including 69-8 at UK, 32-4 at UMass and 9-1 at Memphis. His 110 victories are the most among active coaches with victories at No. 1. He has coached 123 career games as #1, 4th-most in NCAA history, trailing Mike Krzyzewski (255), John Wooden (228) and Adolph Rupp (127). Among coaches who have owned a #1 ranking in at least 119 games, Calipari's winning percentage of 89.4% trails only Wooden (95.2%)

- ^ Calipari is 6-7 all-time when playing an AP #1 team.

PRESIDENT CALIPARI

University of Arkansas head coach John Calipari served as the President of the NABC Board of Directors for the 2024-25 season. "John Calipari is one of basketball's most impactful leaders, and he has a passion for addressing issues that impact the sport and the coaching profession," said NABC Executive Director Craig Robinson. "Coach Calipari has long been a vocal advocate for coaches from all levels, and I'm confident our entire NABC membership will benefit from his service in this role." Calipari first joined the NABC Board of Directors in 2013, and served as its First Vice President for the 2023-24.

CALIPARI RECEIVED 2022 JEFFERSON AWARD

John Calipari received the Jefferson Award for Outstanding Public Service in Sports by Multiplying Good on Nov. 2, 2022. For more than 50 years, Multiplying Good has honored those who put others first. Those receiving the Jefferson Award are empowered to do more, while their stories of extraordinary public service inspire others to action. It is an award that underscores impact. Founded over 50 years ago by Jackie Kennedy Onassis, Sen. Bob Taft Jr., and Sam Beard, Multiplying Good is the world's most foremost and highly celebrated organization focused on and honoring public service. Other recipients of the Jefferson Award include Arthur Ashe, Tom Brokaw, Larry Fitzgerald, Betty Ford, John Glenn, Bob Hope, Steve Jobs, Shaquille O'Neal, General Colin Powell, John D. Rockefeller and Oprah Winfrey. Calipari is the first men's college basketball coach to receive the honor.

CALIPARI NAMED SPORTING NEWS' COACH OF THE DECADE FROM THE 2010'S; HONORED BY THE ATHLETIC TOO

Underscored by more victories than any other coach or program, more Final Four appearances, a record number of NBA Draft picks and the 2012 national championship, John Calipari was named the College Basketball Coach of the Decade by Sporting News in January 2020. In a piece penned by national writer Mike DeCourcy, Sporting News credited Calipari for changing the college basketball landscape. Detailing Calipari's success - what DeCourcy described as a "college basketball revolution" - DeCourcy wrote that "no one defined the 2010s in the same way as Calipari ... nor achieved the same degree of consistent success." Calipari is one of two coaches (with Coach K) to have three teams listed on The Athletics' 25 "Best College Basketball Teams from 2000-25" (7/16/25). He is the only coach to have two teams among the top five and the only coach to lead two different programs on the list – Memphis 2007-08 at #20, Kentucky 2014-15 at #4 and Kentucky 2011-12 at #2.

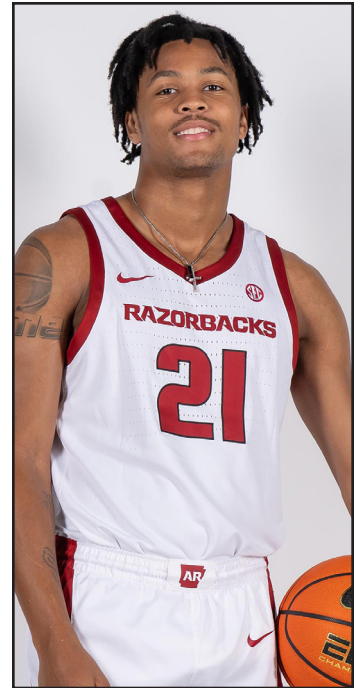

IN MEMORY OF DAVE ENGLAND

- Dave England, who served the University of Arkansas as an athletics trainer and administrator, died last Tuesday (Nov. 4) at the age of 69.
- Counting his time as a student starting in 1975, England worked more than four decades at Arkansas, including as head athletic trainer from 1989-2019. He was best known for his work with the Razorbacks' men's basketball team, serving on teams coached by Eddie Sutton, Nolan Richardson, Stan Heath, John Pelphrey and Mike Anderson.
- In addition to football and basketball, England worked with the Razorbacks' baseball teams coached by Norm DeBriyn. He left Arkansas in 1981 to work with the St. Louis Cardinals' minor league teams, then returned to Fayetteville in 1984.
- In 1999 he was inducted into the Hall of Fame for the Arkansas Athletic Trainers' Association.



IN MEMORY OF MIKE NAIL

- Mike Nail, who narrated the golden era of Arkansas basketball as the team's radio play-by-play voice, died Saturday (Nov. 8). He was 80.
- During his time behind the mic, Arkansas won the 1994 national championship, advanced to additional Final Fours in 1990 and 1995, and won 11 regular-season or tournament championships in the Southwest Conference and Southeastern Conference under Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame coaches Eddie Sutton and Nolan Richardson.
- Nail served as the deep, gravelly voice of the Razorbacks for 29 years before retiring at the conclusion of the 2009-10 season. On the day of Nail's final home broadcast, bobbleheads with his likeness were given to those in attendance.
- He was inducted to the Arkansas Sportscasters and Sportswriters Hall of Fame in 2022
