LA TECH STORYLINES

• Louisiana Tech and Arkansas are meeting for the sixth time. The Lady Techsters hold a series lead of three games to two with the first meeting coming in the 1978-79 season in Ruston. LA Tech would win the game 82-28, the largest margin of victory in the series. The two teams would play a home-and-home series from 1982-84, both ending with a Lady Techster victory (74-34, 75-52). Arkansas has won the last two meetings, most recently a 100-60 victory in Fayetteville during the 2023-24 season. **Jianna Morris** was the only active Lady Techster to play in that game, **getting the start** and recording eight points.

• Louisiana Tech fell to Illinois State in the Great 8 of the Postseason WNIT. **Paris Bradley** led the way with 18 points and added six rebounds and four assists. **Jordan Marshall** nearly had a double-double with 14 points and nine boards. **Averi Aaron** finished with 14 points on 3-3 shooting from behind the arc.

• **Paris Bradley** was named the Conference USA Preseason Player of the Year following a stand-out freshman campaign. The 5-9 guard led the league's freshman in scoring, FG percentage, FT percentage, and assists. **Bradley** recorded eight games with 20 or more points and earned Conference USA Freshman of the Week honors eight times. She capped off her debut season by being named the Conference USA Freshman of the Year and earning spots on both the All-Conference USA First Team and the CUSA All-Freshman Team. On the season, **Bradley** averaged 14.4 points, 4.0 rebounds, and 3.0 assists.

• The Lady Techsters added junior teammates **Alexia Weaver** and **Kaleigh Thompson** from Three Rivers College this offseason. Over two seasons with the Lady Raiders, the duo combined for 1,368 points, 594 rebounds, and 195 assists. **Weaver** led the team in three-pointers made (52), while **Thompson** paced the squad in scoring (434 points), rebounding (241), and blocks (28). Assistant coach Caleb Livingston also joined Louisiana Tech from Three Rivers and is currently in his second season with the program.

• **Isla Airey** was one of the best shot blockers in the country last season. Her 61 blocks ranked 34th in the country and her 1.82 blocks per game were the 43rd best in the nation. Her seven blocks against Lindenwood is tied for the fourth most in a single game in program history and the most since Shanavia Dowdell had eight in 2008-09. She also ranks third among Lady Techster freshman and 10th overall for a single season.

• **Jordan Marshall** was named to the Preseason All-Conference Team, joining teammate Paris Bradley on the list. This comes after **Marshall** was named to the CUSA All-Freshman team after an outstanding campaign. **Marshall** was only behind **Bradley** among freshmen with 11.5 points a contest. The 6-0 forward was the top rebounder with 8.6 boards a game, ranking third among freshman in the country. Her 11 double-doubles also ranked second in the nation for freshman.

• Louisiana Tech has been selected as the preseason favorite to win the Conference USA women's basketball title. The Lady Techsters earned five first place votes and totaled 128 points in the league's annual coaches poll. This is the first time the Lady Techsters have been the favorite since the 2011-12 season as members of the Western Athletic Conference. Louisiana Tech are the only team in the league to return its top two scorers from the previous season.

• Louisiana Tech has competed in 38 conference tournaments in program history. The Lady Techsters have won 16 conference tournament titles, the last coming in the WAC in 2010. Tech is 3-2 all-time as the No. 5 seed. The Techsters boast a 22-6 record in the semifinals. In the CUSA tournament, LA Tech is 10-11.

• LA Tech is 39-12 all-time in season openers and 42-9 in home openers. Stoehr is 12-1 in the first game of the season. This is the first road opener since 2014-15.

HEAD COACH BROOKE STOEHR

Brooke StoeHR knows the storied tradition of Lady Techster basketball.

During her four years in Ruston, she was a big part of that history as a player under legendary Hall of Fame head coach Leon Barmore.

This fact, combined with her established track record of winning on the hardwood as a head coach, led Louisiana Tech Athletics Director Tommy McClelland to name StoeHR the seventh head coach in Lady Techster basketball history in April 2016.

StoeHR returned to her alma mater after four tremendously successful years at Northwestern State, where she guided the Lady Demons to three postseason tournaments, including a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances.

"I have a deep passion for this program and have a personal investment in it from my time here as a student-athlete," said StoeHR. "I take great pride and responsibility in leading this group of young women and helping move the Lady Techster program forward."

StoeHR surpassed the 150-win milestone with a road win at UAB during the 2020-21 season and topped 100 wins at Tech in a C-USA tournament semifinal win over UAB in March of 2022. StoeHR now sits third all-time in program wins behind Leon Barmore and Sonja Hogg after the 2022-23 season with an overall record of 191-150, including a 120-91 mark in Ruston.

"Brooke was the last point guard I ever coached at Louisiana Tech," Barmore said. "When things were tough and the game was on the line, I wanted Brooke to have the ball. To be honest with you, I'm glad she has the ball now. I love her, and I'm glad she is in charge of this program."

Coach StoeHR has led the Lady Techster program to five postseason berths during her tenure, including back-to-back WNIT selections following her first two seasons (2016-17, 2017-18) and three of the last four seasons (2021-22, 2022-23, 2024-25) in Ruston, including an automatic selection after winning the 2022 Conference West Division title.

Her most recent postseason selection followed a 16-15 campaign during the 2024-25 season. Louisiana Tech received an at-large bid to the Women's National Invite Tournament, marking its sixth appearance in the competition. The Lady Techsters advanced to the Elite 8 after two home victories in Ruston against Texas Southern and Lindenwood. The win over Lindenwood featured Louisiana Tech surmounting a 10-point deficit at the half — the largest comeback of the season.

Her 2022-23 season resulted in a 19-12 record and a postseason berth in the Women's National Invitation Tournament. It marked the first time since 2010 and 2011 that the Lady Techsters recorded back-to-back seasons with at least 19 wins. Additionally, the team's 12-8 Conference USA record secured consecutive double-digit conference win totals for the first time since her initial two seasons in Ruston, and matched the program's highest C-USA win total since the 2016-17 campaign.

During the 2021-22 season, StoeHR led the Techsters to a 21-12 record on their way to winning the Conference USA West Division crown and earning an automatic berth in the WNIT. The Techsters also reached the C-USA finals for the first time since joining the conference after beating UAB and completing an 11-point fourth-quarter comeback over Middle Tennessee in the tournament semifinals.

StoeHR led the Lady Techsters to a 14-10 record in 2020-21, including an overtime win on the road at Marshall to open up Conference USA play and a first-round win over the Thundering Herd in the Conference USA tournament.

She has also seen some impressive wins in the past few years, including wins over P5 programs in Alabama and Ole Miss. Other remarkable wins include a road win over a 14-1 UAB in 2018-19, as well as a victory over the Blazers in the first round of the 2020 C-USA Tournament (first time a 12 seed had defeated a 5 seed in the event).

StoeHR recorded back-to-back winning seasons during her first two years at the helm. After being picked to finish 12th in the 14-team Conference USA in the preseason coaches' poll prior to 2016-17, StoeHR led the Lady Techsters to 18 wins, a fourth-place finish in the regular season standings, and the program's first national postseason berth since 2011 during her first year.

LA Tech won seven straight C-USA regular season games down the stretch, advanced to the semifinals of the league tournament before falling to tournament champion WKU, and then took SMU to overtime in Dallas in the first round of the WNIT.

She followed that up with a 19-12 record in 2017-18, a third-place finish in the C-USA regular season, and a second straight berth in the WNIT. It marked the most wins and the highest league finish since 2011-12.

The Techsters posted a win over Big Ten foe Penn State, its first over a P5 program since 2011-12. LA Tech also recorded a road win over eventual C-USA regular season champion UAB and snapped the Rice Owl's program-record 15-game winning streak.

During her 10 seasons at Louisiana Tech, head coach Brooke StoeHR has recruited and developed numerous All-Conference players, including Paris Bradley — the 2025 Conference USA Preseason Player of the Year. Bradley was also named to the All-Conference USA First Team and awarded Conference USA Freshman of the Year in 2024-25 after leading the Lady Techsters in scoring with 14.4 points per game.

StoeHR previously coached Keiunna Walker, the 2022 Conference USA Preseason Player of the Year, who graduated as the No. 6 all-time scorer in program history. Walker earned multiple honors during her career, including two First Team All-Conference USA selections, a Second Team selection, a Conference USA All-Defensive Team nod, and a spot on the 2022 Conference USA All-Tournament Team.

StoeHR also developed local standout Anna Larr Roberson into a two-time Second Team All-Conference USA honoree, as well as a Conference USA All-Tournament and Preseason Team selection. During the 2022-23 season, Roberson surpassed 700 career rebounds, ranked No. 34 on the program's all-time scoring list, and recorded 20 career double-doubles.

Coach StoeHR also coached three-time All-Conference USA member Kierra Anthony and First Team All-CUSA selection Alexius Malone.

Off the court, the Lady Techsters have been very involved in the local community, volunteering countless hours of community service with several organizations, including DART, Buddy Ball, The Big Event, Special Olympics, and visiting several local elementary schools.

The Lady Techsters continued to make strides in the classroom as well. Over the past six years, 41 players were named to the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll, including a record-high eight Lady Techsters during the 2021-22 season. Taylor Stahly became the first Techster since joining the league in 2013 to earn a spot on the women's basketball All-Academic Team, recording the honor in back-to-back seasons. Stahly, Ashley Santos, Lotte Sant, Amaya Brannon, Robyn Lee, Silvia Nativi, Autumn Smith, and Mackenzie Wurm earned the C-USA Commissioners Academic Medal. Sant, Lee, and Nativi were all selected to the 2023 CSC Academic All-District team, and Nativi was also named Conference USA All-Academic in 2023. The Techsters have also achieved a perfect single-season APR score in two of their last three seasons.

Stahly, who finished her academic career with a perfect 4.0 grade point average, was also named a Google Cloud Academic All-American in 2018-19, just the 16th recipient of the highest academic honor in Louisiana Tech Athletics history.

"Brooke needs no introduction to Louisiana Tech University," said LSU head coach Kim Mulkey. "She is Lady Techster basketball! Her history with the program speaks volumes. She was loved as a Lady Techster player and will be loved as the head coach."

Prior to Louisiana Tech, Stoehr inherited a Northwestern State women's basketball program that had won a total of six games the previous season. In four seasons, NSU compiled a record of 71-58 as the Lady Demons won back-to-back Southland Conference Tournament championships in 2014 and 2015. Those victories produced the first consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances in program history.

In her last season in Natchitoches, Northwestern State earned an appearance in the Women's Basketball Invitational, extending its run of national postseason appearances to three.

On the court, Stoehr developed four-year starting point guard Janelle Perez from a player who had no other Division I scholarship offers into a 1,000-point career scorer, the 2012-13 Southland Conference Freshman of the Year, and a 2014-15 first-team All-Southland Conference selection.

During Stoehr's tenure in Natchitoches, she has also guided Keisha Lee on a path that led the shooting guard to become the 25th player in program history to score 1,000 points and Trudy Armstead to becoming just the seventh player in school history to record at least 1,000 career points and grab at least 700 career rebounds. Armstead also earned 2014 Southland Conference Tournament Most Valuable Player honors before signing to play in Romania.

The maturation of shooting guard Beatrice Attura into the Southland Conference Tournament Most Valuable Player only served to underscore further Stoehr's ability to develop quality guard play, something that marked her playing career at Louisiana Tech.

Stoehr demands just as much or more from her players off the court, and the numbers prove it. In the classroom, Northwestern State finished with the nation's 16th-best cumulative GPA (3.461) in the 2014-15 season and had the fifth-highest among NCAA Tournament teams that season. The team GPA for the Fall 2015 semester was 3.48, trending NSU toward another high ranking nationally when the 2015-16 review is released this summer by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

Each player who completed her athletic eligibility during the Stoehrs' tenure earned their degree.

In addition to her time at Northwestern State, Stoehr spent time as an assistant coach at Texas Tech (2009-12), Southern Mississippi (2008-09), LA Tech (2005-08) and UALR (2003-05).

Stoehr played for the Lady Techsters from 1998 through 2002 and helped guide the program to four NCAA Tournament appearances, two Elite Eights, and one Final Four. She ended her LA Tech career as the NCAA's all-time leader in free throw percentage.

Brooke and husband Scott have a 14-year-old daughter, Aubrey, and a 12-year-old son, Cooper.

• **Paris Bradley** ended the regular season with her eighth CUSA Freshman of the Week honor after two 20-point performances. Against New Mexico State, the Carrollton, Texas, native had 22 points with six rebounds and six assists. **Bradley** followed that up with 24 points on 8-13 shooting and 4-6 from behind the arc in the season finale. She added three boards, three assists, and two blocks.

• **Paris Bradley** picked up her seventh CUSA Freshman of the Week honor after scoring 25 points in LA Tech's 76-55 win over Sam Houston in the Lady Techsters lone game. The 5-9 guard was an efficient 8-9 from the field, including 3-4 from long range and 6-7 from the free throw line, playing all 40 minutes of action. She added five rebounds and five assists. It was the 10th game with five or more rebounds and the seventh time with five or more assists.

• **Paris Bradley** picked up her sixth CUSA Freshman of the Week honor after scoring 29 points against WKU. The Carrollton, Texas, native scored 26 in the second half to lead LA Tech. It was her fourth 20-point game of the season, tying her with Mary Neil Kendrick for the eighth most by a Lady Techster freshman.

• The nine double-doubles by **Jordan Marshall** is tied for the second most by a freshman in the NCAA this season. Kourtney Grossman of Eastern Washington leads the way with 11 followed by Marshall and Destiny Jones of West Georgia with eight.

• With her first basket against Jax State, **Robyn Lee** became the 45th Lady Techster to reach 1,000 career points. Lee has seen her production increase from 2.7 ppg her freshman season to 12.1 this season. The grad student shoots 44.5 percent for her career and has over 400 rebounds.

• **Jianna Morris** passed 500 points against Jacksonville State. The sophomore guard has started all 57 games the past two seasons and scored in double figures in 25. Morris has added 176 rebounds and 119 assists. The Arkansas native shoots 78.5 from the line for her career, ranking ninth all-time for a Lady Techster.

• **Paris Bradley** picked up her fifth Conference USA Freshman of the week following wins over Liberty and FIU. Bradley hit the game winner with 2.7 seconds to beat Liberty, capping off a 10-point fourth quarter comeback by the Lady Techsters. The 5-9 guard finished with 19 points, six rebounds, and seven assists. She followed that up with 17 points, five boards, and four assists against FIU.

• The 12 wins inside the Thomas Assembly Center are the most by the Lady Techsters since 2021-22 when Tech finished 12-3 at home. The most wins in a single season in Ruston is 21 set during the 1979-80 season when the Lady Techsters went 21-0 at home. The most wins in the TAC is 19 set during the 1988-89 season. LA Tech won 18 twice. During the inaugural season of 1982-83, the Lady Techsters lost to #1 Southern California before winning the final 18 -- that loss was the only one of the season before losing to USC in the National Championship. The Techsters' other season with 18 wins came during the 1997-98 season with a perfect 18-0 record inside the TAC.

• The 10-point deficit to start the fourth quarter was the largest the Lady Techsters overcame in the final 10 minutes since Tech overcame an 11 point deficit against Middle Tennessee in the CUSA semifinals in 2022. The game winner was also the first for LA Tech since Salma Bates hit a 3 to beat Boise State 60-57 on November 26, 2021.

• **Jordan Marshall's** six double-doubles are the most by a Lady Techster since Anna Larr Roberson had nine during the 2021-22 season.

• **Paris Bradley's** third 20 point game of the season ties her for ninth most by a freshman in Lady Techster history. Bradley is tied with nine other Tech players at three and is the first freshman with multiple 20-point performances since JaQuan Jackson had three during the 2013-2014 season.

• **Paris Bradley** broke a tie with JaQuan Jackson for the most Freshman of the Week honors after picking up her fourth consecutive after leading LA Tech to a 2-0 week. The 5-9 guard nearly had a double-double with 12 points and nine rebounds against Jacksonville State. She had her second 20-point output with 21 against Kennesaw State.

• LA Tech has started 6-0 at home in conference play for the first time since the 2010-2011 season. It is the first time the Lady Techsters have started 6-0 at home during their stint in CUSA.. The last time Tech started 6-0 at home in a conference was the 2010-11 season when they 8-0 at home in the WAC.

• The 10 wins in the Thomas Assembly Center passes the total number of home wins from last season. It matches the number of home wins from the 2022-23 season.

• Against Jacksonville State, **Airey** broke a tie with Cheryl Ford and passed Adrienne Johnson for the seventh most blocks by a freshman in LA Tech history. Her 33 blocks so far this season is one behind LaShawn Brown (1991-92) for the sixth most. Lori Scott holds the freshman record with 71 set during the 1979-80 season.

• **Paris Bradley** picked up her third consecutive CUSA Freshman of the Week honors on January 13. Bradley scored a career-high 20 points and six rebounds against FIU while adding three assists, two steals and a block. Against Liberty, **#LoveandServe**

Bradley scored 17 points and grabbed four boards. She joined fellow freshman **Jordan Marshall** as the only Lady Techster freshman to score 20 points in a game since JaQuan Jackson in 2014. The three FOW honors also tied Jackson with the most by a Lady Techster since joining CUSA. It is the most consecutive honors for LA Tech in CUSA.

• Tech started 2-0 in conference play for the first time since the 2017-18 season. The Lady Techsters have gone 1-1 three times and 0-2 three times to start conference play since Coach Stoebr has taken over the team. LA Tech last started conference 3-1 in conference play during that same season. They have started 2-2 the past four seasons and 1-3 the two before.

• It is just the fourth time a member of Conference USA had three players from the same team named CUSA Freshman of the Week. The last time was by UTEP in 2022. Southern Miss. (2014) also had three in 2014. Tulane holds the most, with four in a season in 2012. The previous most by the Lady Techsters was two on four occasions; 2016, 19, 22, and 24.

• **Paris Bradley** picked up her second CUSA Freshman of the Week honor on January 6 after helping LA Tech to a 3-0 week. The 5-9 guard had eight points, five assists, five steals, and three rebounds in Tech's 86-41 win over LSU Alexandria to close out 2024. She followed that up with seven points, seven assists, and three rebounds to open conference play against UTEP. Bradley would close out the week with 12 points, five steals, four assists, and three boards against New Mexico State.

• **Isla Airey** continues to be one of the top shot blockers in the country. The Australian has 28 blocks through 13 games for a 2.15 average. She ranks 34th in the country in blocks and 23rd in blocks per game. Both totals are second in CUSA. The record for most blocks in a season for LA Tech is 103, set by Tori Harrison in 1985-86. Airey ranks ninth in LA Tech's single-season freshmen rankings for blocks in a season. The most by a freshman is 85, which Harrison set during the 1984-85 season.

• Against New Mexico State, **Jordan Marshall** became just the second freshman in the country with 150 points and 100 rebounds this season. The 6-1 forward has 164 points and 112 rebounds through the first 13 games of her career.

• **Paris Bradley** earned CUSA Freshman of the Week honors after her performance against Central Baptist. The 5-9 guard scored 17 points, dished out five assists, and had three steals. She shot 63.6 percent from the field and 50 from long range. Bradley reached 100 points during the game, giving LA Tech four players with 100 points through 10 games.

• The Lady Techsters have started three freshmen in consecutive games for the first time since 1979-80 when Jennifer White, Lori Scott, and Tia Sossamon started in 42 of 45 games.

• **Jordan Marshall** earned her second Conference USA Freshman of the Week honor on December 2 after her performance against Baylor. The Arkansas native scored 14 points and grabbed a team-high seven rebounds against the Bears.

• Against Baylor, **Jordan Marshall** reached 100 points during her freshman campaign. She tied LaVerne Henderson ('74), Janice Lawrence ('80), Tamicha Jackson ('96), and Jaquan Jackson ('13) for the third fastest freshmen to reach that plateau. Only Belinda Jones ('74, five games) and Kay Ford ('75, six games) reached 100 points faster during their freshman season.

• **Isla Airey** earned CUSA Freshman of the Week on November 25 after her performances against Mississippi Valley and Southeastern. Against MVSU, the Australian recorded her second double-double of the season with 12 points and 11 rebounds, adding five blocks and three steals. She followed that up with six points, eight boards, two blocks, and two assists against SLU.

• **Robyn Lee, Isla Airey, and Jordan Marshall** are the first trio to record double-doubles in the same game for the Lady Techsters since Shanavia Dowdell, JoKeirra Sneed, and Tarkeisha Wysinger had one against Northwestern State on November 23, 2007.

• **Jordan Marshall** became the first Lady Techster freshman to score 20 points in a game since Jaquan Jackson scored 22 vs. UTSA on February 1, 2014. She also became the first freshman to score double figures in her first five games since Tamicha Jackson scored in double figures in the first seven games to start her career in 1996.

• **Jordan Marshall** earned Conference USA Freshman of the Week on November 11 after helping the Lady Techsters to a 3-0 start. She finished with 12 points and nine rebounds against Nicholls, 13 points and seven boards at South Alabama, and 22 and nine against UT Arlington.

• **Isla Airey** secured her first career double-double against UT Arlington to become the first freshman with a double-double since **Mackenzie Wurm** had one against McNeese on December 22, 2021, with 12 points and 12 rebounds. She recorded her second against Mississippi Valley with 12 points and 11 boards.

• **Jordan Marshall** and **Paris Bradley** became the first two freshmen to start for the Lady Techsters for the first time since March 17, 2022, against Houston in the WNIT when Silvia Nativi and Amaya Brannon got the nod and started two

freshmen in the season opener for the first time since November 9, 2021, when Robyn Lee and Amaya Brannon started against Jarvis Christian.

- The 12 points by **Jordan Marshall** against Nicholls was the most by a freshman in a season opener since Lotte Sant scored 15 against LSU-Alexandria to open the 2019-20 season.
- LA Tech has started 3-0 for the third time under coach Storhr, matching the start to the 2022-23 and 2017-18 seasons. The Lady Techsters reached the WNIT in each of the previous seasons.
- LA Tech added four new staff members this off-season: Assistant Coaches Josh Ashley, Olivia Grayson, Caleb Livingston, and Director of Basketball Operations Mikayla Baillie.
- Tech celebrated the 50th season of Lady Techsters basketball last year and became the fifth program to surpass 1,200 wins with a 66-62 victory over Sam Houston. As one of the most storied programs in NCAA history, the Techsters have three national championships, five runner-up finishes, and 13 Final Four appearances.
- This will be the first season since 2015-16, the first time under coach Stoehr, that the Lady Techsters will not start the season with two consecutive home games. Tech has won eight consecutive home season openers and is 14-2 in the first two games during that stretch.

WHO'S NEW

Louisiana Tech welcomes six newcomers to the roster this year. The Lady Techsters added four transfers and two freshman.

Alexia Weaver and **Kaleigh Thompson** arrive at Louisiana Tech as former teammates from Three Rivers College in Missouri, where they led the Raiders to back-to-back Elite Eight appearances and an undefeated conference season in 2024-25.

Weaver, a 5-foot-8 junior guard from Louisville, Ky., led the team in three-pointers made and averaged 11.3 points per game. She appeared in 67 games for the Lady Raiders, starting 64 times.

Thompson, a 6-foot junior forward, earned Region XVI Player of the Year honors after leading the team in scoring (13.2 ppg), rebounding (7.3 rpg), and blocks (28). She scored in double figures 25 times during her sophomore campaign, including four games with 20-plus points. Thompson also recorded seven double-doubles and four additional games with double-digit scoring and at least nine rebounds.

Joy Madison-Key comes to Ruston after redshirting the 2024-25 season. The 5-foot-8 guard previously played for Tulane, where she totaled 59 points and 57 assists with the Green Wave.

Hillary Dawson joins Louisiana Tech with a decorated high school résumé. The 6-foot-3 forward graduated as the all-time leading scorer at Malakoff High School with 3,067 career points. She helped lead the Tigers to 115 wins, including three district championships and three 30-win seasons.

NEWS AND NOTES

The Lady Techsters welcome sophomore transfer **Kennedy Evans**. MVP of the state tournament as a senior in high school, the 5-foot-10 guard appeared in six games for the Oklahoma State Cowgirls.

FROM THE STRIPE

The Lady Techsters got to the line at a high rate last season. Tech finished second in the league and 12th in the country with 21.44 attempts per game. They also led the conference and were 18th in the nation with 15.09 made per game.

The Lady Techsters increased their FT percentage over the final 20 games. Tech was shooting 65.6 percent from the line but closed out the season shooting 70.4 percent, shooting 73.6 over that span.

In 2023, Tech finished shooting 76.5 percent from the line, which ranks as the best program season from the line, besting the previous year's mark of 75.9.

Five of the last six seasons rank in the top 5 in program history, with the 2020-21 season at .748, ranking No. 3, the 2018-19 as No. 4 (.725), and 2019-20 as No. 5 (.720).

FRESHMEN SURGANCE

LA Tech had four freshmen make significant contributions to start the previous season. The Lady Techsters also saw 3,385 minutes of freshman basketball out of a possible 6,800 -- nearly exactly half the season.

Jordan Marshall quickly made an impact by starting all 34 games. The 6-foot forward was tied for second on the team with 11.6 points and led Tech with 8.6 rebounds per game. The Arkansas native is the first freshman to score 20 points in a game since JaQuan Jackson scored 22 vs. UTSA on Feb. 1, 2014. She also became the first freshman to score in double figures in her first five games since Tamicha Jackson scored in double figures in seven games to start her career in 1996. Marshall was also tied for the third fastest freshman to reach 100 pts in Lady Techster history at seven games. Her 11 double-doubles are the most by a Lady Techster since Whitney Fraizer had 15 in the 2013-14 season and the third most by a freshman.

Another starter, **Paris Bradley** saw her averages double since the Baylor game. On the season she led the team with 14.4 points while adding 4.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists, and 1.4 steals per contest. She scored in double figures for the first time with 13 points against Stephen F. Austin and scored a team-high 15 against Baylor. She became the second Lady Techster freshman to score 20 points in Tech's first CUSA road game against FIU on Jan. 9. She earned four consecutive Freshman of the Week honors on Dec. 23, Jan. 6, Jan 13, and Jan. 20. She scored in double figures in 17 of the final 21 games. Her eight 20-point games are tied for the sixth most in program history by a freshman. She secured CUSA FOW honors four more times on Feb. 10, Feb. 24, March 3, and March 9. She was named CUSA Freshman of the Year, First Team All-CUSA, and All-Freshman.

Isla Airey got her first career start against Baylor. The Australian averaged 5.4 points, 4.3 rebounds, and 1.8 blocks per game. She finished the season ranked 34th in the country with 61 blocks and 46th in blocks per game. She is third all-time among Lady Techster freshman for blocks in a season, and 10th overall.

Averi Aaron saw her first action against Baylor after missing the first month of the season with an injury. The 6-1 forward averaged 6.3 points and 3.7 boards a game. Against the Bears, Aaron had six points in nine minutes. She scored in double figures for the first time against Alcorn with 10 points while adding five rebounds. She set a career-high and led LA Tech with seven boards against Liberty. Her second double-figure scoring output came against Kennesaw State with 13 points.

NEWS AND NOTES

Aaron had a career day against New Mexico State in the CUSA quarterfinals with 18 points, eight rebounds, and five steals. She would follow that up with a team-high 16 points and seven boards against Liberty in the semifinals.

TWO-COURSE DISH

LA Tech boasted two of CUSA's top guards when it came to distributing the ball.

Paris Bradley ranked No. 5 in assists among CUSA players with 102. **Gianna Morris** finished just outside the top 25 with 64 and 56, respectively.

The duo of **Bradley** and **Morris** have combined for 229 assists in their career. **Lee** has 175 in her five seasons at LA Tech and **Morris** has 127 in her two as a Lady Techster. **Bradley**, a freshman, has added 102 in her first season.

Bradley ranked No. 6 in assists per game with 3.0.

Louisiana Tech has three straight seasons with a player having 100 or more assists.

Bradley is the first Lady Techster freshman to reach 100 assists since Kierra Lang had 109 in the 2016-17 season.

ON THE DOUBLE

The returning Lady Techsters recorded 13 double-doubles so far this season. **Jordan Marshall** leads the way with 11, followed by **Isla Airey** with two.

Marshall, Airey, and Robyn Lee are the first trio to record double-doubles in the same game for the Lady Techsters since Shanavia Dowdell, JoKeirra Sneed, and Tarkeisha Wysinger against Northwestern State on November 23, 2007.

Airey got the first double-double of the season with 14 points and 12 rebounds against UT Arlington. Her second came when the trio all had one in the same game against Mississippi Valley. The Australian finished the game with 12 points and 11 boards.

Marshall's 11 double-doubles are the most by a Lady Techster in a season since Whitney Fraizer had 15 during the 2013-14 season. She ranked second among freshman in the NCAA for double-doubles. The sophomore forward recorded her first one with 16 points and 14 rebounds against Stephen F. Austin and had a second straight against MSVU with 18 points and 14 boards. She is the first Lady Techster with back-to-back double-doubles since 2022. She recorded back-to-back double doubles again against FIU and Kennesaw State. Against the Panthers, Marshall had 16 points and 15 rebounds and against the Owls she had 14 points and 11 boards. She would go back-to-back again with 10 points and 11 boards against WKU and follow that up with 11 and 10 against Sam Houston. She has recorded two in the postseason with a 13 point and 13 rebound effort against New Mexico State in the CUSA tournament and a 19 point and 14 board game against Texas Southern in the second round of the WNIT.

Sophomore **Isla Airey** quickly proved to be one of the nation's top shot blockers, ranking No. 34 in blocks (61) and No. 46 in blocks per game (1.8). Her total blocks and blocks per game ranked third among freshman in the country. She ranked third in both categories in CUSA.

She had 13 games with two or more blocks this season and four games with three or more, including five against Mississippi Valley and Middle Tennessee. Her career high would come in a WNIT showdown against Lindenwood, finishing with a Lady Techster freshman record seven.

Her 10 blocks over a four game between Dec. 19 and Jan. 4 are the most during a four-game span since **Mackenzie Wurm** had 10 in a four-game span in 2022-23.

Airey is fifth all-time among Lady Techster freshman.

Louisiana Tech's freshmen scored 20 points in nine games this season, the most by freshmen in a season since 1978-79 season when Pam Kelly and Angela Turner combined for 24.

Jordan Marshall's 22 points against UT Arlington made her the first freshman to score 20 points in a game since JaQuan Jackson scored 22 vs. UTSA on Feb. 1, 2014.

When **Paris Bradley** scored 20 points against FIU it became first time since 1980-81 that the Lady Techsters have two freshmen score 20 points in the same season. That season Kim Mulkey scored 20 once and Janice Lawrence scored 20 in seven games.

The eight 20-point games by **Bradley** are the most since Janice Lawrence had six during the 1980-81 season. It is also the tied for the sixth most in program history.

Overall, Louisiana Tech has had 26 freshmen combine for 118 games of 20 points or more.

Louisiana Tech finished 15-3 inside the Thomas Assembly Center this season. The 15 wins are the most since the 2002-03 season, matching the total from season.

The Thomas Assembly Center opened in November of 1982 and the first Lady Techster game was against No. 1 Southern California. LA Tech would fall 64-58 to the Trojans, but would win the next 62 games in the TAC.

The most wins inside the TAC came during the 1988-89 season when the LA Tech finished 19-1. The Lady Techsters have won 18 games twice, 17 once, 16 twice, 15 nine times, 14 twice, and 13 five times.

The most wins in Ruston was 21 set during the 1979-80 season at Memorial Gymnasium. The Lady Techsters closed out Memorial with 61 consecutive wins.

CHASING RECORDS

Louisiana Tech's three freshmen made an impact for the Lady Techsters in their first season and left their mark in the record book.

Paris Bradley is the first freshman to score 400 points in a season since Tamicha Jackson did during the 2013-2014 season. Bradley also ranks inside the top 10 in free throws made, three-pointers attempted, and three-pointers made.

Jordan Marshall rebounded the ball at a high rate and was one of the top in the country. She currently tied with Angela Turner for the 10th most. Marshall also found herself inside the top 10 in free throws attempted and made for a freshman.

Isla Airey is a top tier rim protector with 61 blocks on the season. She ranked third among freshman in the nation and overall in CUSA in blocks and blocks per game.

Jianna Morris has also placed herself into the record book. A year after getting into the top 10 in several freshman categories, Morris finds herself in the top 10 in those same list as a sophomore (free throws attempted, free throws made, three-pointers attempted, three pointers made, and minutes.)

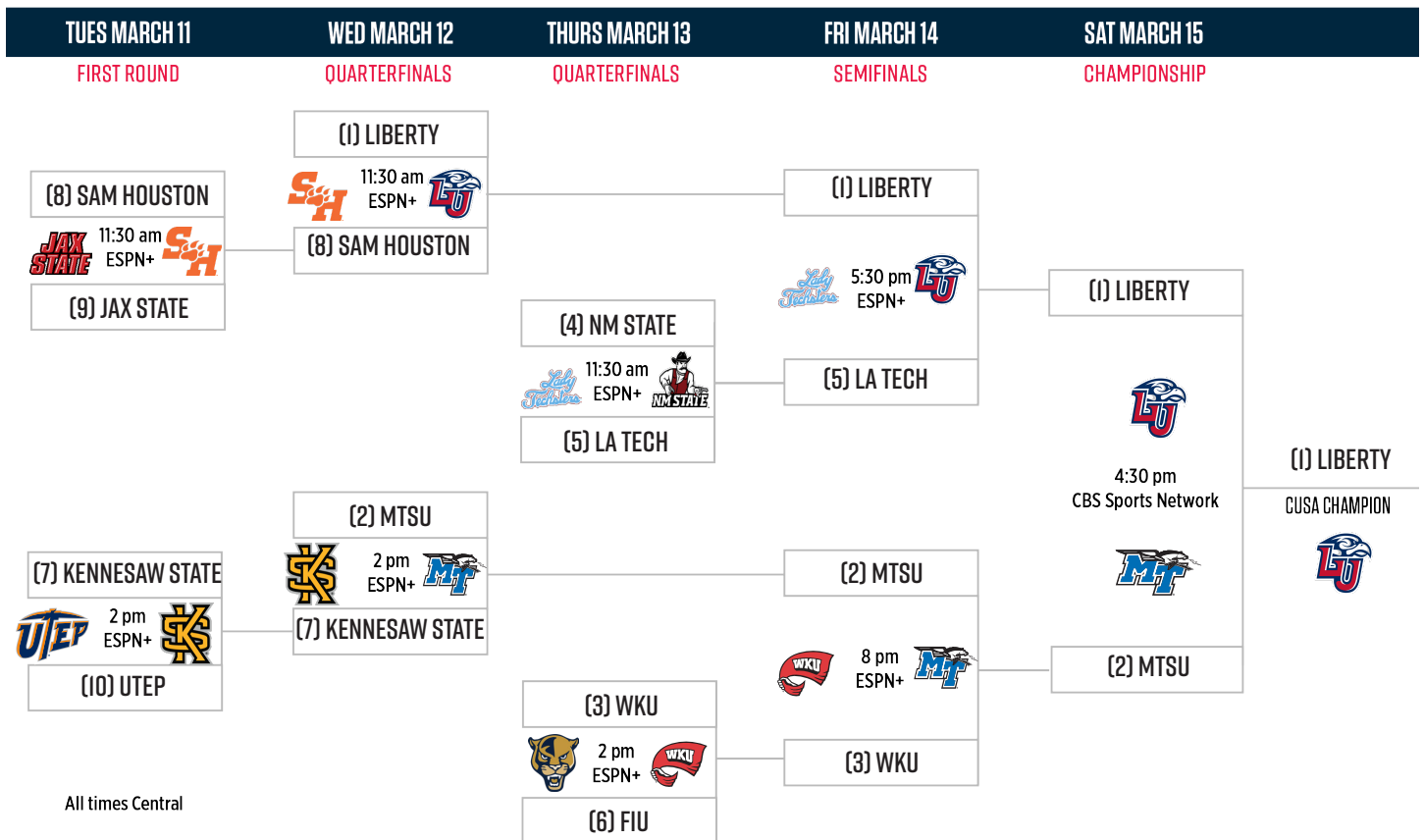

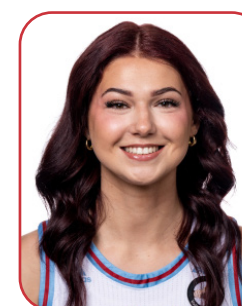
