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BEFORE THE WHISTLE

Louisville men's basketball is set for its first true road game on Wednesday evening, taking on Arkansas in the ACC/SEC Challenge in Fayetteville. The game will be broadcast on ESPN starting at 7:15.

UofL finished November an undefeated 7-0 for the first time since 2019-20, most recently defeating NJIT 104-47 on Wednesday evening. Arkansas fell to Duke in a neutral site game on Thanksgiving 80-71, moving to 5-2 on the year.

The Cardinals are an even 4-4 against the Razorbacks all-time, but hold a 1-0 mark when playing in Fayetteville. Louisville won the only meeting at Arkansas between the teams, a 91-88 overtime victory on Dec. 21, 1996. UofL head coach has never faced Arkansas, but is 0-1 against Razorback head coach John Calipari as he took his Winthrop team to Kentucky in 2018.

CARDINAL NOTES

- Louisville will face Cardinal Forever, national champion and former head coach of the Cardinals Kenny Payne, who is an assistant for the Razorbacks.
- Louisville netted 20 3-pointers against NJIT on Nov. 26, the second-most made 3's in a single game in program history. It's just the second time ever the Cardinals have made at least 20 3's in a game. UofL is the third team in DI this season to make at least 20 3-pointers against another DI team.
- Louisville's back-to-back 40-point wins (87-46 over Eastern Michigan & 104-47 over NJIT) is the program's first set of back-to-back 40-point victories since 2012-13.
- Senior guard **Ryan Conwell** is the only DI men's basketball player since at least 2010-11 to log at least 32 points, nine rebounds and six assists in 24 minutes or less, according to Sports Reference.
- Louisville has had two games of at least 24 assists, the first time since 2010-11 that the program has had multiple games of 24+ assists; the Cardinals had five games of at 24+ assists that season.
- Louisville's positive 38 rebounding margin against NJIT on Nov. 26 was the third-largest rebounding margin by any team against a DI opponent this season, and the largest rebounding margin in program history.
- Louisville is 34-0 under Kelsey when leading with five minutes to play. **See more on Louisville's record by situation on Page 8.**
- With two 50-point victories on the season (104-45 vs. South Carolina State & 104-47 vs. NJIT), it marks the first time Louisville has had two 50-point victories in one season since 2004-05.
- A pair of Cardinals represent Louisville on the Naismith Trophy Player of the Year Watch List, Oscar Robertson Trophy Preseason Watch List and the Wooden Award Preseason Watch List; both **Ryan Conwell** and **Mikel Brown Jr.** were named to the esteemed lists.
- Freshman guard **Mikel Brown Jr.** was named to the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Award Preseason Watch List while senior guard **Ryan Conwell** was named the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award Preseason Watch List.
- Head coach **Pat Kelsey** is the reigning ACC Coach of the Year - he is one of 10 active DI head coaches that have earned a Coach of the Year honor in three or more DI conferences. **See more on Page 7.**
- There were 14 players returning to DI this season that had made at least 175 3-pointers with a career 3-point field goal percentage of 38% or more; **Ryan Conwell** and **Isaac McKneely** are two of those 14. **See more on Page 6.**

MEDIA CREDENTIALS: To obtain credentials for a UofL home contest, please make the request via the credential link at gocards.com/mbbcredentials. Credentials are held at Media Will Call, located inside the Suite Entrance on the Second Street side of the KFC Yum! Center (front right side of the arena). Credentials will not be mailed. Passes are limited to WORKING MEDIA ONLY. The media room is located on the event level, the first door to the right after entering the Suite Entrance/Media Entrance. Media seating is either at courtside or at tables in designated corner areas of the arena in Section 120/119.

INTERNET ACCESS: Wireless internet access is available throughout the KFC Yum! Center. A password is required for special media access. Wired connections are also available in the media room.

PHOTO: Photographers are limited to working within designated boxes on the baseline at each end of the court. An upper photo area position may be provided if requested in advance. Photo work space, equipped with wired internet access, is available within the media work room (two digital photo rooms). Specific protocols will be provided to those who receive limited credentials.

PARKING: Limited media parking is available in garages within one block of the KFC Yum! Center. Some require a pass to have in hand in advance, others are operated from a list supplied by UofL. Requests should be made well in advance to Dana Brown.

NOTES/STATS: Game notes and statistics will be available online at www.GoCards.com/mbbmedia. Live statistics will be available during the event online on GoCards.com, the CardsMobile app and Louisville.statbroadcast.com. A pdf of the final statistics will be posted postgame on GoCards.com. Broadcast personnel will have access to a computer monitor displaying live game statistics throughout the game.

MEDIA ROOM: The KFC Yum! Center media room will open two hours prior to tipoff and will close two hours after conclusion of the game. Only those who make special arrangements with Dana Brown (dana@gocards.com) in advance will be permitted in the media areas any earlier. If you anticipate needing additional time postgame, you may wish to work from home or another location.

FOOD/REFRESHMENTS: A pregame buffet meal and fountain drinks are planned on game day through our partnership with our concessionaire Sodexo.

POSTGAME: Louisville head coach Pat Kelsey and select Cardinal players will be available to the media postgame as soon as possible following the NCAA-mandated cooling off period. Please coordinate with the visiting SID to confirm their planned postgame protocol. If agreed to by the visiting coach, that coach will come to the interview room at a time which best fits their postgame schedule.

INTERVIEWS: Coach Pat Kelsey (or an assistant coach) and selected players are generally available by news conference prior to each game, schedule permitting. NOTES ON THE PROGRAM

TRADITION OF WINNING

Louisville has an all-time record of 1,818-1,019 in 111 seasons of intercollegiate basketball. The Cardinals rank among the top-15 all-time in winning percentage (does not include 123-3 record vacated by NCAA). The Cardinals played their first official men's basketball game on Jan. 28, 1912 when they lost 35-3 to Louisville YMCA, but did not field teams in 1916-17, 1922-23 or 1942-43. The Cardinals have produced winning seasons in 74 of the last 80 years, including winning 20 or more games in 19 of the last 23 seasons and 30 or more in three of the last 14 years in on-court results.

TOURNAMENT SUCCESS

UofL is tied for eighth nationally with eight Final Four appearances. No other school went to the Final Four four times during the 1980s, and Louisville won two NCAA titles in that decade, winning the national championship in 1980 and 1986. Louisville's 40 NCAA Tournament appearances are tied for eighth best all-time, and its 102 NCAA Tournament games ranks 10th for most played in the event (61-42 record) (does not include four NCAA appearances, a 15-3 record, two Final Fours and the 2013 national championship vacated by the NCAA). The Cards have reached the Sweet 16 on 17 occasions and have advanced to the Elite Eight 11 times.

PRO CARDS

The Cardinals have had 77 players drafted by the NBA, including 25 first-round selections. David Johnson was the latest Cardinal chosen with the 47th pick in the 2021 draft by the Toronto Raptors. Donovan Mitchell was UofL's latest first round selection in the 2017 draft as the 13th overall pick by the Denver Nuggets and was subsequently traded to the Utah Jazz. He's now with the Cleveland Cavaliers and is a six-time NBA All-Star, two-time All-Star starter. Jordan Nwora (2021) and Damion Lee (2022) have both won NBA championships, and Carlik Jones was the 2022-23 G League Most Valuable Player. Nineteen Cardinals have played in the NBA over the last 10 years, while at least 24 former UofL players are expected to play professionally this year in the NBA, G League or overseas.

CROWD SUPPORT

Louisville has ranked among the top seven nationally in average home attendance in 40 of the last 44 years. UofL has played 15 seasons in its spectacular home, the 22,090 seat KFC Yum! Center in downtown Louisville. The Cardinals have a 209-63 record in 15 seasons in the KFC Yum! Center (.768). Louisville attracted approximately 4.4 million fans in its first

15 years in the Yum! Center, including a total attendance of 298,846 in 18 games in 2019-20 (last year pre-COVID). Louisville's attendance against Kentucky on Nov. 11, 2025 of 22,586 was the largest crowd in the building since the Cardinals hosted Notre Dame on March 4, 2017 when there were 22,612 in attendance. The Nov. 11 game was the largest crowd since 22,114 fans were at the game against South Florida on February 29, 2019.

CHAMPIONSHIP GUESTS

The eventual national champion has played in Louisville's home arena, the KFC Yum! Center, in seven of the arena's 15 seasons in existence. Louisville faced eventual champions Connecticut (2011, 2014), Duke (2015) and Virginia (2019) in home games, Kentucky (2012) won a pair of games in the 2012 NCAA second and third rounds in the KFC Yum! Center, 2016 champion Villanova won the NCAA South Regional in Louisville, and UofL won the 2013 itself (later vacated).

NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT

The Cardinals are one of the most televised teams in college basketball. UofL games will be televised on national networks during the 2025-26 regular season on double-digit occasions. Every possible UofL game over the past 42 years has been televised on either a live or delayed basis – a total of over 1,300 games – including over 600 national television appearances.

AMERICA'S TOP BASKETBALL MARKET

Louisville is consistently the highest-rated television market for college basketball. Louisville has been the top market for more than 20 years since organizations began tracking the data. Louisville's 4.2 rating during the 2018-19 season was well above the next closest market (Knoxville with a 2.9 rating). Louisville has historically been the top television market for the NCAA Tournament as well.

AT HOME IN THE TOP 25

The Cardinals have been ranked on 669 occasions in the AP poll, sixth most all-time. Louisville has been among the top 10 on 304 occasions, including 14 times in the 2019-20 season. The Cards entered the Top 10 for first time in five years on March 17, 2025, the final AP ranking before the beginning of the NCAA Tournament. Louisville's No. 1 ranking in the Dec. 2 and 9, 2019, Associated Press polls were just the third and fourth times UofL has ever been ranked as the No.1 team in the nation in the AP poll. The other two were March 16, 2009 in the final AP poll of the season; and Jan. 14, 2013. UofL has been ranked as the No.1 team in the nation in the coaches poll on five occasions, including twice in 2019-20. The other three were in the 1986-87 preseason UPI coaches poll; in the ESPN/USA Today poll on March 15, 2009; and in the final USA Today coaches poll of 2012-13 on April 8, 2013.

RANKED COMPETITION

Louisville has won 48 of its last 121 games against AP ranked opponents. The Cardinals most recently defeated No. 9 Kentucky on Nov. 11 in the Battle of the Bluegrass. It was the highest ranked opponent the Cards have beat since defeating No. 3 Duke 79-73 on Jan. 18, 2020. UofL has a 65-85 record against Top 25 teams over the last 15 years. The Cards have been victorious 10 of the last 32 times they have faced an AP top-five foe. UofL

has won 25 of its last 66 games when facing Top 10 teams.

NON-CONFERENCE DOMINANCE

UofL has a 265-83 record (.761) against non-conference opponents over the last 25 seasons (includes postseason), including a 194-27 record in home regular season non-conference games. The Cardinals are 118-18 at home in regular season non-conference games over the last 16 seasons.

STIFF COMPETITION

Louisville has seven opponents this year ranked currently ranked in the AP Poll with six more receiving votes. The Cards play No. 4 Duke, No. 13 Tennessee, No. 16 North Carolina, No. 22 Indiana and No. 25 Arkansas. Louisville already played and defeated then No. 9 Kentucky. Baylor, SMU, Clemson, NC State, Wake Forest and California are also all receiving votes. Louisville also played then No. 19 Kansas in an exhibition game.

THE 1K CLUB

Louisville is tied for second nationally, behind North Carolina, with 69 all-time 1,000 point scorers. Jordan Nwora (1,294 points in three seasons) was the latest Cardinal to reach that milestone in 2019-20.

ACADEMIC STANDARD

The Cards have attained a collective 3.0 GPA in 28 of the last 33 semesters. They posted a 3.18 team GPA for the entire 2024-25 academic year. UofL was recognized in July as a recipient of the Team Academic Excellence Award from the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC). In order to receive the award, a program must achieve a team GPA of 3.0 or higher for the previous academic year.

NOTES ON THE GAMES

BATTLED IN THE BLUEGRASS

Louisville's eight-point win over Kentucky marked the largest margin of victory the Cards have had over the Cats since 2008. It was the first time UofL has won the Battle of the Bluegrass since 2020, and the first time it claimed victory at home in the matchup since 2012.

KINGS OF HALFTIME

Louisville led 59-15 at halftime against South Carolina State on Nov. 3. The 44-point halftime lead was the largest in program history.

IN DOMINATING FASHION

Louisville's two season opening victories marked the first time the Cardinals had back-to-back 30-point victories since 2016.

AWARDED BY THE ACC

Freshman guard **Mikel Brown Jr.** was named ACC Co-Player and Co-Rookie of the Week on Nov. 17 after averaging 24.0 ppg, 6.0 apg and shooting 48.1% from the floor in Louisville's two Week 2 victories - a 96-88 win over Kentucky and 106-81 win over Ohio.

FRESHMAN PHENOM

Freshman **Mikel Brown Jr.** scored 29 points against Kentucky on Nov. 11, 2025, the fourth-most points in a game by a Louisville freshman ever.

ACC ALL-STARS

The Cardinals landed two players on the Preseason All-ACC First Team, the only program to do so in 2025. Both **Mikel Brown Jr.**, and **Ryan Conwell** earned the First Team nod. Louisville was picked second overall in the league by voting media members.

FROM ALL OVER

Louisville has players hailing from eight different states/districts: Florida (1), Illinois (1), Indiana (1), Kentucky (2), Minnesota (1), Ohio (1), Washington, D.C. (2) and West Virginia (1). Louisville adds four countries other than the United States as well as **Aly Khalifa** from Egypt, **Mouhamed Camara** hails from Senegal, **Vangelis Zougris** is from Greece and **Sananda Fru** comes from Germany.

SHARP SHOOTERS

There are 14 players who returned to DI this season that started the season with at least 175 made 3-pointers with a career 3-point field goal percentage of 38% or more; **Ryan Conwell** and **Isaac McKneely** are two of those 14 players. Conwell is now 263 of 660 (39.8%) while McKneely is 257 of 608 (42.3%) from 3.

REDSHIRT ROCKSTARS

Louisville has three Cardinals that hit the hardwood for the first time since significant injury. Redshirt senior **Kobe Rodgers** returned from a significant knee injury he suffered in Charleston's 2024 NCAA Tournament game; he missed the entire 2024-25 season with the Cards. Redshirt senior **Aly Khalifa** had a lingering knee injury repaired in July 2024 and rehabbed during the 2024-25 season. Both Rodgers and Khalifa hit the court in the season-opener on Nov. 3 against South Carolina State. Sixth year senior **Kasean Pryor** tore his ACL seven games into the 2024-25 season and was sidelined the remainder of the year. Pryor returned to the floor on Nov. 6 against Jackson State, Louisville's second game of the 2025-26 season.

CARDINALS ON THE DANCE FLOOR

Of the 10 players who were on an NCAA DI roster in 2024-25, eight of them were on teams that played in the 2025 NCAA Tournament. The roster has made 14 cumulative NCAA Division I Tournament appearances at their current/previous schools, playing in 10 NCAA Tournament games across their careers.

PORTAL WARRIORS

According to 247Sports, Louisville had the No. 3 transfer class in the country after major roster adjustments. Louisville was amongst the top transfer classes by other recruiting services, including On3 who placed the Cardinals at 21st in the country. According to On3, sophomore transfer **Adrian**

Wooley was the eighth-best player in the transfer portal. **Ryan Conwell** was No. 13 and **Isaac McKneely** was No. 18.

A TALE AS OLD AS TIME

Louisville is one of the older teams in the country this season. When the Cardinals tipped off the season on Nov. 3, the average age of the 15-man roster was 21.3 years of age.

POURING IT IN

UofL has three Cardinals on the roster that have scored over 1,000 DI points: **Ryan Conwell** (1,494), **Isaac McKneely** (1,175) and **J'Vonne Hadley** (1,085). There are three additional Cards that have scored between 500 and 1,000 in their DI careers: **Aly Khalifa** (820), **Adrian Wooley** (683) and **Kasean Pryor** (533). Hadley, Conwell, McKneely and Khalifa have all played at least 2,000 minutes at the DI level. **Kobe Rodgers** has played four seasons between the DI and DII levels and has combined for 901 points in his career.

CAMARA REDSHIRT

Louisville announced on Tuesday, Oct. 28 that freshman **Mouhamed Camara** intends to redshirt for the 2025-26 season. Camara came to The Ville from NBA Academy Africa.

Pat Kelsey, a proven program builder who's won nearly 70% of his career games, was named the new men's basketball head coach at the University of Louisville on March 28, 2024.

The Cincinnati native Kelsey is the 24th head coach in Louisville's 112-year history, and the 10th in the past 79 years.

Kelsey has been a dominant winner across his 14 seasons as a head coach, including his two years at Louisville, three at the College of Charleston and the previous nine at Winthrop. He boasts an impressive 295-130 record (69.4%) across his head coaching career with 11 total conference championships and five NCAA Tournament bids.

In his first year at the helm in Louisville, Kelsey led the Cardinals to a 27-8 overall record, tying for second in the ACC with an 18-2 conference record. Louisville made its first appearance in an ACC Tournament semifinal and championship game as the Cards finished runner-up to No. 1 Duke in the title game. Kelsey, tabbed as ACC Coach of the Year, led Louisville to an at-large bid in the NCAA Tournament. The Cardinals competed in the Big Dance for the first time since 2019, as an eight-seed, and fell to Creighton in the Round of 64.

Kelsey recruited an entirely new team in 2024-25, returning no scholarship players from the previous season. Chucky Hepburn earned All-ACC First Team honors while also being named the ACC Defensive Player of the Year and an AP Honorable Mention All-American. Terrence Edwards Jr. picked up Third Team All-ACC honors.

The Cardinals were one of the most improved teams in the country both in total wins from the previous season and in NET ranking from the end of 2023-24 to the end of 2024-25. Kelsey restored Louisville's standing amongst the elite basketball programs in the country, returning the Cardinals to the AP Top 25, ranking as high as No. 10 on the season in the March 17 rankings.

In 2023-24, College of Charleston finished 27-8, claimed the Colonial Athletic Conference regular season and tournament titles, and earned a No. 13 seed in the NCAA Tournament before falling to fourth-seeded Alabama.

The Cougars became the first team in seven years to win back-to-back Colonial titles. Kelsey was named the league's Coach of the Year, in addition to three All-CAA player honors and a Sixth Man of the Year award for Bryce Butler.

College of Charleston ranks in the top 25 nationally this season in 3-point attempts per game (3rd, 30.6), made 3-pointers per game (8th, 10.5), bench points per game (11th, 30.1), winning percentage (18th, 77.1), rebounds per game (20th, 39.8), assist-to-turnover ratio (22nd, 1.5) and offensive rebounds per game (23rd, 13.1).

During his second season at the helm in Charleston, the Cougars set numerous records with a 31-4 mark and the program's first CAA title since 2008. They won 20 straight games, claimed the 2022 Charleston Classic and spent four weeks in the AP Top 25, peaking at No. 18. Kelsey was named the USBWA and NABC District Coach of the Year, and was on the Naismith Coach of the Year Watch List.

Kelsey arrived in Charleston from Winthrop, where he became the fifth all-time winningest coach in the history of the Big South Conference. He averaged 20.7 wins per game in nine seasons in Rock Hill, S.C., compiling more overall wins and conference wins than any other team in the league.

In his final season at Winthrop, Kelsey guided the Eagles to a 23-2 campaign, a school-record 21-game win streak, a Big South tournament title and a trip to the NCAA Tournament where they fell to Villanova. Kelsey was named 2021 Big South Coach of the Year.

Kelsey also led Winthrop to NCAA Tournament berths in 2020 (canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic) and 2017.

A two-time finalist for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award and finalist for the 2021 Jim Phelan Coach of the Year Award, Kelsey compiled a 186-95 (.662) overall record and an impressive 110-46 (.705) mark in conference play at Winthrop. The Eagles also won the Big South regular-season title four times in 2016, 2017, 2020 and 2021.

In all, 16 Winthrop players were selected all-conference, while three were tabbed Big South Player of the Year, one Big South Freshman of the Year and two Big South Tournament Most Valuable Player honors.

Prior to Winthrop, Kelsey served as associate head coach at his alma mater Xavier from 2009-11. Before that, he worked at Wake Forest as assistant coach (2004-09) and director of basketball operations (2001-04). He began his coaching career at Elder High School in Cincinnati as an assistant from 1998-2001.

Kelsey graduated cum laude in 1998 from Xavier University with a bachelor's degree in business administration and marketing. He began his collegiate playing career at the University of Wyoming, before transferring and playing three seasons at point guard for the Musketeers from 1995-98.

Kelsey and his wife, Lisa, have three children: Ruthie, Caroline and Johnny.
