GYMBACK NOTABLES

Gymbacks Fall to Minnesota in Season Opener

While the Gymbacks weren't able to pull out a victory over Minnesota, they did open the season with a strong 196.700 team score, the second-highest for a first meet in program history. The day was highlighted by Arkansas' three all-arounders: freshman Alison Cucci, Hailey Klein and Morgan Price. It was the first time since the 2020 season that three all-arounders competed for Arkansas in the same meet, and first time ever that three Gymbacks made their Arkansas all-around debut in the same day. Cucci claimed the all-around crown with a score of 39.350, with no scores under 9.800. Her best mark of the day came on vault with a 9.900, which also secured her a share of the vault title, split with teammate Lauren Williams. Arkansas also claimed at least a share of first on every other event: Leah Smith on bars (9.875), Joscelyn Roberson on beam (9.950) and Price on floor (9.875).

Arkansas Ranked No. 10 in WCGA Preseason Poll

The Gymbacks will start the season ranked as a top 10 team for the second consecutive year, as Arkansas checked in at No. 10 in the WCGA preseason coaches poll announced on Dec. 16. The ranking is the second-highest preseason outlook under head coach Jordyn Wieber, second in the top 10, and sixth in the top 15. The Gymbacks are coming off another impressive season in 2025, in which they finished No. 12 in the country. Arkansas posted four top 10 victories, including knocking off the No. 2 team twice - LSU on Jan. 24 and Florida on Feb. 7. Their upset over LSU was the highest ranked for the program since 2011. The team matched its program high of 49.575 on beam and had three top 10 total scores (197.725, 197.550, 197.425). Arkansas returns several standouts this season, including sophomore Joscelyn Roberson. Roberson ended the season at NCAA Championships, where she competed as an all-around individual and scored a 39.425, the best-ever mark by an Arkansas freshman at nationals. She earned All-American honors on beam at nationals and from the WCGA in addition to an All-SEC nod on the event. Earlier in the season, Roberson broke the program freshman all-around record with a score of 39.600. Following the NCAA slate, Roberson returned to elite gymnastics and finished third all-around and second on floor at the Xfinity US Gymnastics Championships in August. In October, she was named to the 2025 World Gymnastics Championships squad for Team USA, where she earned a bronze medal on vault, her first-ever individual medal at Worlds. The Gymbacks also see redshirt junior Lauren Williams and fifth-year trio Frankie Price, Leah Smith and Cami Weaver back in action for 2026. Williams was sidelined due to injury in 2025 but had a great rookie campaign in 2024 that included All-SEC vault honors. Smith earned all-conference on floor and Weaver on beam in 2024, and both shared All-American honors at nationals. Price has been one of the nation's best vault and floor performers throughout her collegiate career. She sustained an injury in Arkansas' regional semifinal in April but looks to come back with a bang for her final season. Price was a WCGA Second Team All-American and All-SEC on floor in 2024. Along with Arkansas' key returners, the team also adds eight outstanding newcomers to the team. Two transfers - sophomore Madison Gustitus and senior Morgan Price - and six freshmen - Addison Bare, Bradley Burton, Avalon Campbell, Alison Cucci, Riley Jandorf and Avery King - will be key to the team's success. Gustitus and Price were both All-SEC performers in 2024 and will be key contributors to the team's success. The Gymbacks' freshmen arrived to campus as the No. 2 ranked recruiting class per College Gym News and bring depth to all events. Alison Cucci, a five-star recruit, was named one of College Gym News' most anticipated freshmen on all events and in the all-around. At the 2025 Development Program National Championships in May, she took home a national title on beam and finished second all-around. This came after Cucci claimed national titles on vault and all-around in 2024. Campbell and King were also five-star recruits, and Bare and Burton four-stars. Arkansas fans also helped to elevate the program on the national stage in 2025. It was the Gymbacks' first season to have all home meets hosted at Bud Walton Arena, in which new average attendance (7,915), total single season (39,575), and season ticket holder records were set.





Arkansas Gymnastics Adds Another Top 10 Signing Class for 2026-27

Four new members of the Arkansas gymnastics program made it official on Wednesday as they solidified their commitments to the program on National Signing Day. Simone Brown, Tori Hess, Finley Scott and Sabrina Visconti are the group of newcomers set to join the Gymbacks on The Hill next year, a class currently ranked No. 10 by College Gym News for the 2026-27 year. Brown is a five-star recruit per CGN, Hess and Scott are four-stars, and Visconti enters as a three-star. "I'm beyond excited to officially welcome our four newest signees to the Razorback Gymnastics family. This incoming class is packed with talent that will make a lasting impact not only on our program, but on the national stage as well," head coach Jordyn Wieber said. "Tori Hess is the definition of consistency, combining dynamic gymnastics with outstanding form and precision. Simone Brown adds grace, poise, and artistry to our lineup, with beautiful lines and the true spirit of a Razorback. Finley Scott has established herself as one of the nation's premier vaulters, earning multiple perfect 10s throughout her club career. Sabrina Visconti, a two-year elite competitor, brings valuable experience performing under pressure. Her gymnastics showcases incredible power and strength that will elevate our team."

Roberson Concludes World Championships with Bronze Medal on Vault

Arkansas sophomore Joscelyn Roberson wrapped up her second World Gymnastics Championships on Oct. 24 in Jakarta, Indonesia and is coming home with her second Worlds medal as she earned bronze in the vault event final. Roberson, part of the U.S. first place worlds squad in 2023, secured her chance at a first individual medal after she finished in the top eight of the vault standings in the qualifying competition on Monday with a combined score of 13.633. She also competed floor on the day, where she finished 16th. With Arkansas coach Chris Brooks at her side, Roberson showed great poise and confidence in Monday's vault final and was second in the order. Following an uncharacteristic balk from one of the world's best vaulters, China's Deng Yalan, Roberson managed to perform very well under pressure and delivered a solid Mustafina vault for her first score, a 13.966. Her second vault, a double twisting Yurchenko, went 13.600 for a combined average of 13.983. Joscelyn remained at the top of the standings through five vaulters, until Canada's Lia-Monica Fontaine received a combined score of 14.033 to push Roberson into second. 2025 world all-around champion Angelina Melnikova went seventh and delivered two clean vaults for a 14.466 to take the lead. After the eighth competitor, Roberson's score held up and was good enough to make the podium. Roberson has now earned 12 medals at international assignments in her senior elite career: seven golds, four silvers and one bronze.

Gymbacks Post Record High GPA, 14 Named Scholar All-Americans

As a new academic year begins, the Arkansas gymnastics team is coming off its best ever in 2024-25, as the Gymbacks registered a new program high GPA and saw 14 athletes named Scholar All-Americans by the Women's Collegiate Gymnastics Association (WCGA). In the WCGA's academic report, Arkansas checked in at 21st in the country for team GPA with a 3.72, also a new program high. The Gymbacks were ranked second among SEC teams in GPA and were one of just 25 gymnastics programs to post a GPA of 3.70+. It's the ninth time that Arkansas has made the top 25 in team GPA - first since 2016 - and the highest ranking in head coach Jordyn Wieber's tenure, easily besting the previous high in the last five years, 33rd nationally. The team's

success came with 14 individual WCGA Scholar All-America honors, given to athletes who maintain a 3.5+ GPA. This is a new best for the squad, and Arkansas has had at least 10 Scholar All-America honorees in five of six years of the Wieber era. Chandler Buntin, Grace Drexler, Reese Drotar, Kaity Ewald, Kalyxta Gamiao, Maddie Jones, Ja'Leigh Lang, Priscilla Park, Frankie Price, Leah Smith, Cally Swaney, Mati Waligora, Julianna Weeks and Lauren Williams all received the honor. Buntin, Drotar, Ewald, Gamiao, Park, Price, Smith and Waligora all posted GPAs of 4.0, which puts Arkansas in second in the SEC for total 4.0s, just behind Alabama with nine. In addition to the WCGA nods, the Gymbacks had every member of the team receive either SEC Winter Honor Roll or First Year Honor Roll accolades to round out their record year in the classroom.

Six-Time National Champion Morgan Price Commits to Gymbacks

The Gymbacks continue to reload in the offseason as six-time national champion, three-time All-American and viral sensation Morgan Price has committed to the program for the 2026 slate. Morgan - the younger sister of Arkansas star Frankie Price - has spent the last three seasons at Fisk University, a founding member of the first-ever HBCU gymnastics program. In that time, she's been a powerhouse for the Bulldogs with six WCGN titles, which includes back-to-back all-around crowns in 2024 and 2025, and a full sweep of the event titles this season. Price is a three-time First Team All-American and holds a 9.900+ career high on all events. She became the first-ever HBCU gymnast to score a Perfect 10 in February, with a flawless routine on bars. She earned the mark en route to a 39.500 all-around score, which she earned twice in 2025 and currently stands as her personal best. Morgan has been an excellent ambassador for the sport the past three years, garnering widespread recognition and honors. She was named the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame Amateur Female Athlete of the Year in 2024 and also received the 2024 HBCU Sports Female Athlete of the Year award. Prior to her collegiate career, Morgan Price was a two-time Nastia Liukin Cup qualifier and Level 10 nationals qualifier. In her final two years of Level 10, she collected 10 of 10 Texas state event and all-around titles, eight regional titles, and four top three national finishes.

JORDYN WIEBER

SEVENTH-YEAR HEAD COACH



Olympic gold medalist Jordyn Wieber was introduced as the head coach of the Arkansas Women's Gymnastics program on Wednesday, April 24, 2019, by Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Hunter Yurachek.

Following a historic slate in 2024, the Gymbacks kept up the consistency in 2025 as they finished No. 12 in the nation and had four top 10 wins on the season. Wieber coached standout freshman and Olympic alternate Joscelyn Roberson to All-SEC honors, and Roberson qualified for NCAA Championships as an individual competitor. In Fort Worth, Roberson scored a 39.425, the best-ever mark by an Arkansas freshman at nationals, and she also earned All-American honors on beam.

The 2025 season was Arkansas' first to have all home meets hosted at Bud Walton Arena. The Gymbacks saw a new average attendance record of 7,915, a total single season record of 39,575, and a new season ticket holder record.

Season five in 2024 was the best yet for Wieber in her tenure, as she led the Gymbacks to their first NCAA Championships team appearance in eight years in 2024. Arkansas finished seventh of eighth to conclude the season ranked No. 7, the highest final rank for the team since 2012. The season was filled with milestones for the program, including five of the top 11 program high scores for Arkansas, including a new best of 198.100 set on March 15. The Gymbacks set and broke their program score record two other times, and finished 2024 with 11 marks of 197+, the most in a single season by six. Arkansas has now earned all of its top program team scores in Wieber's tenure, and in 2024, five athletes matched the program-high 9.975 individual scores across all four events: Hailey Klein on vault, Reese Drotar on bars, Priscilla Park on beam and Maddie Jones and Frankie Price on floor.

In Fort Worth, Drotar earned First Team All-America honors on bars with a sixth place finish and matched the program NCAA Championships bars record with a score of 9.925. Leah Smith and Cami Weaver garnered Second Team honors on vault as they tied for 13th overall with matching scores of 9.8875. Wieber has now coached six athletes to 10 All-America honors over the last five years, at least one each season dating back to 2021.

Arkansas began the 2024 postseason at SEC Championships, where the Gymbacks placed sixth with a score of 197.050, the first time ever scoring 197+ at the event and a new program best at SECs. Six athletes earned All-SEC honors: Lauren Williams on vault, Hailey Klein and Cami Weaver on beam, and Maddie Jones, Frankie Price and Leah Smith on floor. Six ties the program record for Gymbacks on the All-SEC list in a single season, and is the most under Wieber so far.

The Gymbacks compiled an 8-6-1 regular season record and 15-15-1 record overall, the most wins for the program since 2012. Arkansas went 4-2-1 in SEC competition, the most conference victories in eight years, another high for Wieber in her fifth season at the helm.

During her fourth season in 2023, Wieber guided the Gymbacks to their 19th consecutive regional appearance. The team set a then-new regional team score record of 197.275, and a new regional floor record of 49.500. The team finished the year ranked 17th in the country, maintaining the program's 18-year streak in the top 20.

Graduate transfer Norah Flatley and freshman Lauren Williams both earned berths to the NCAA Championships as individuals, extending Wieber's unblemished national appearance streak in each eligible year. Flatley earned her fourth All-American honor at the event on balance beam with a score of 9.9375, which is the best-ever score by a Gymback as an individual beam qualifier.

Arkansas' 196.825 at SEC Championships in 2023 and placed seventh. Five Gymbacks earned All-SEC or All-SEC Freshman honors at the meet: Norah Flatley (VT, FX, AA), Lauren Williams (VT, FX), Reese Drotar (UB), Frankie Price (VT) and Cami Weaver (VT).

The Gymbacks continued to grow their fanbase with new single meet (11,031), home single season (36,619), and average attendance (7,324) records in 2023, the latter two ranking sixth and seventh in the country. Arkansas also sold out Barnhill Arena for the first time in program history on Jan. 27, when 7,147 fans were in the building to watch the Hogs take down the LSU Tigers.

Wieber has coached five regular-season All-Americans in Sophia Carter (2020), Maggie O'Hara (2021), Kennedy Hambrick (2020, 2021), Frankie Price (2024) and

Joscelyn Roberson (2025).

Hambrick became the new all-around score record holder (39.750) during the 2021 season, a record that had gone unbroken for seven years prior. Under her guidance in and out of the gym, the Gymbacks were awarded the Arkansas Athletics Lee Spencer Cup for the first time ever in 2022, which is awarded to the team that earns the most points in the areas of personal and career development, community engagement, and academic and athletic excellence. Arkansas also saw its first SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 10 years in 2022 with Bailey Lovett.

The Gymbacks earned their first-ever spot in the SEC night session in 2021 and advanced to the NCAA regional final after scoring a 197.250 on day one. In total, Arkansas registered five scores of 197.000 or better in 2021, for the first time in program history.

In 2020, the Gymbacks ranked as high as fourth in the nation on floor and finished the season ninth in the nation. Arkansas scored a 49.00 or higher in 14 of 16 events over the course of four home meets, nearly 90 percent of all events.

The Razorbacks' success on floor helped them lock in back-to-back SEC wins against No. 20 Missouri and No. 10 Georgia midway through the season. The consecutive wins marked the first time since 2017 that Arkansas won two-straight conference meets and consecutive meets against a ranked opponent.

Arkansas saw six Gymbacks wrap up the 2020 season ranked in the top 100 by Road to Nationals in at least one event, with four Hogs finishing with multiple top 100 rankings. With Wieber's lead, Arkansas won 27 event titles through 10 meets. Hambrick finished the season with the most individual titles among the Gymbacks, securing 11 event titles including a team-high four all-around titles.

The first home meet of the Wieber era was held on Jan. 17 against No. 3 Denver, bringing a then-record crowd of 6,714 fans to Barnhill Arena. On Feb. 21, Coach Wieber and her Arkansas squad hosted Auburn for a Women's Empowerment Meet, the first of its kind in NCAA gymnastics and now an annual tradition for the Gymbacks.

Wieber wrapped up her third season as a volunteer assistant coach at UCLA and her sixth with the program in 2019, assisting the team in a variety of roles during her first three years in Westwood following her Olympic career. Wieber coached the Bruins on floor exercise, an event in which UCLA finished the 2018 and 2019 regular seasons ranked No. 1 in the nation. In 2019, the Bruins recorded scores of 49.5 or better in 11 of 14 meets, averaging a national-best 49.604 on floor. Four Bruins earned regular season All-America honors in the event - Katelyn Ohashi, Kyla Ross, Gracie Kramer and Felicia Hano. At the 2019 NCAA Championships, Wieber coached future Arkansas assistant Ross to the individual floor title with a score of 9.950, the program's second in as many years. After winning their semifinal session with a 197.650, UCLA finished third overall in the finals.

The 2018 Bruins scored 49.4 or higher in 11 meets and 49.6 or higher in three meets, including a national season-high of 49.775 set on Feb. 25. She and her fellow UCLA coaches were named the 2018 West Region Assistant Coaches of the Year, as they helped lead the Bruins to Pac-12, NCAA regional and NCAA national titles.

Wieber, who has been a vocal advocate for safe sport, has won many awards in the past several years, including the Arthur Ashe Courage Award at the ESPYs, the Rising Star Award by the Los Angeles Business Journal, and the Giant Steps A Hero Among Us Award.

A member of the "Fierce Five" United States squad that won team gold at the 2012 Olympics, Wieber was a two-time U.S. all-around champion (2011 and 2012) and the 2011 World all-around champion. Her illustrious elite career included three medals (all-around and team gold, beam bronze) at the 2011 World Championships, four U.S. senior national titles (all-around, bars and floor in 2011 and all-around in 2012). She was also the 2008 U.S. junior all-around, vault and floor exercise champion and the American Cup all-around champion in 2009, 2011 and 2012. She dominated the competition at the 2010 Pacific Rim Championships, winning four gold medals (all-around, uneven bars, floor exercise, team) and one silver (vault). In her first international competition at the 2007 Junior Pan American Championships, she won gold medals on uneven bars and balance beam, silver in the all-around and bronze on floor exercise. Wieber officially retired from competitive gymnastics in 2015.

Wieber, from DeWitt, Mich., graduated from UCLA in 2017 with a degree in Psychology. She was a 2016 inductee into the Greater Lansing Sports Hall of Fame, a 2021 Michigan Sports Hall of Fame Inductee and is also a member of the USA Gymnastics Hall of Fame.
