COUGAR NOTABLES

• BYU softball hits the road again, visiting Incarnate Word in San Antonio before taking part in the Texas State State's Up Invitational.

• The Cougars will face host Texas State, No. 18 Clemson, No. 9/11 Arkansas and Wichita State in San Marcos.

• BYU went 1-4 at the NFCA Leadoff Classic on Clearwater, Florida, during opening weekend, picking up a win over Notre Dame (8-5), but falling to No. 4 Tennessee (10-0, 5), Michigan State (8-4), Penn State (4-3, 8) and Missouri (9-6).

• Lefty Gianna Mares picked up the win against the Fighting Irish, while Duke transfer utility player Hailey Shuler earned a save in the contest.

• The Cougars homered three times over the course of the weekend, with solo shots by Lily Owens and Shuler to go along with a three-run shot by freshman Rita Tavita.

• After five games of play, Shuler leads the team with a .467 batting average, while Ilove'a Brittingham is hitting .313. Hailey Morrow (.294), Owens (.273) and Bre Townsend (.231) follow just behind.

• Shuler, who was named to the Leadoff Classic's all-tournament team, also has a team-high three multi-hit games, tallying two twice and three once. Brittingham has a pair of two-hit games as well, while Danica Acosta and Morrow have one apiece.

• Mares and Shuler were joined by Kaysen Korth and Jada Villegas in the circle, striking out 27 across 32.1 innings of work on a 6.49 ERA.

• Through opening weekend, BYU ranks No. 22 nationally in double plays (3) and No. 24 in double plays per game (0.60). It is also 50th in sacrifice flies (2).

• Individually, Shuler ranks eighth in saves (1), Owens is 14th in walks per game (1.40), Morrow is 22nd in triples (1) and Brittingham/Mares are 30th in sacrifice flies (1).

• The Cougars, facing Incarnate Word for the first time in series history, will also match up with Clemson for the first time, as well as Arkansas and Wichita State for just the second time.

• Following their trip to Texas, the Cougars will make their annual trip to Palm Springs for the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic.

STORYLINES

POSTSEASON (IN)CONSISTENCY

After earning trips to the NCAA Tournament in 16-consecutive seasons, BYU has been left out of the postseason in four-straight years. The Cougars clinched a share of the WCC title in 2022, but finished second behind LMU in 2023 and accepted an invite to the NISC, winning three games before falling to Iowa in the title game. Despite advancing to the Big 12 Championship semifinal in 2024 and the quarterfinal last season, BYU has been the "first team out" two years in a row, and looks to return to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2021.

FRESH FACES

While the Big 12 Conference will look the same for the first time since the Cougars joined the league in 2024, BYU head coach Gordon Eakin will face five programs he has yet to coach against in his previous 23 seasons at the helm: Abilene Christian, Clemson, Incarnate Word, Michigan State and Omaha. Since 2003, Eakin has met 178 different schools during his tenure. The Cougars were set to play Omaha in Ames, Iowa, back in 2023, but the Iowa State tournament got snowed out.

PRESEASON SIXES

BYU was picked to finish sixth in the Big 12 by the league's coaches, a spot that it has finished in each of the last two seasons. The Cougars sit behind No. 2/T-1 Texas Tech, No. 24/20 Oklahoma State, No. 17/18 Arizona, Arizona State and UCF in this year's poll. BYU finished behind national runner-up Texas Tech, Arizona, Iowa State, Oklahoma State and Arizona State last year, and Texas, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Baylor and UCF in 2024.

RECEIVING VOTES

The Cougars received two votes in this year's ESPN.com/USA Softball preseason poll. BYU picked up four votes in last season's preseason NFCA coaches poll, three votes after opening weekend and four after week two, but none the remainder of the season. The last time BYU was ranked, in a preseason or mid-season poll, was 2018.

RETURNING PRODUCTION

Despite graduating five student-athletes last season in catcher Lindy Milkowski, third baseman Keila Kamoku, outfielder Aleia Agbayani, outfielder Lauren Flanders and relief pitcher Alyssa Aguilar, the Cougars return 68.8% of their hits, including 70.6% of their doubles and 61.3% of their home runs. Ilove'a Brittingham (66 hits), Lily Owens (51 hits) and Hailey Morrow (44 hits) represent three of the BYU's top four hitters last year to return, with Maddie Udall-Woolley, Bre Townsend, Miranda Mansfield and Danica Acosta all turning in double-digit hit totals as well.

GETTING OVER THE HUMP

Outside of their loss to then-No. 4 Tennessee, the Cougars led at some point in their other three defeats at the NFCA Leadoff Classic to Michigan State, Penn State and Missouri. BYU is 1-1 when scoring first this season, 0-1 when plating a run in the opening inning and 0-2 when its opponents score first. The Cougars were 22-4 when scoring first last season, including 17-3 when that run came in the first inning. They were also 10-13 when opponents scored first, and 7-8 when the run was in the opening frame.

QUEEN B

Sophomore Ilove'a Brittingham had a historic season last year, breaking BYU's freshman RBI record (69) and tying its freshman home run record (19). The catcher/outfielder was named the Big 12 Freshman of the Year and an NFCA Third Team All-American, the Cougars' first All-America nod since 2018. She was a unanimous pick on this season's preseason All-Big 12 team, and was also named to USA Softball's Collegiate Player of the Year Top 50 watch list. Brittingham is hitting .313 this year, with five hits, including one double, and a team-high six RBI.

SENIOR LEADERS

Aside Brittingham are seniors Hailey Morrow and Lily Owens, who are set to play shortstop and left field, respectively. The pair turned in a combined 95 hits, 90 runs, 59 RBI, 47 walks, 17 home runs and 15 doubles last season, with Owens' .354 season batting average good for second on the team and Morrow's .310 good for fifth best. They each received national preseason recognition along with Brittingham as Morrow was ranked No. 9 on D1Softball's preseason shortstop rankings while Owens was No. 21 on the outlet's preseason outfielder list. The duo are third and fourth in batting through five games, posting .294 (Morrow) and .273 (Owens) averages after opening weekend.

IF THE SHU FITS

Sophomore Duke transfer Hailey Shuler made an impact in her first games at BYU last weekend. The utility player leads the team with a .467 batting average and .733 slugging percentage, posting seven hits, including one double and one home run, two RBI and two walks. She made three appearances as a pitcher, tossing 3.2 innings, striking out two and earning the save against Notre Dame, the Cougars' lone win in their first five games.

LOOK GOOD, FEEL GOOD

BYU unveiled a new royal jersey with white and black accents prior to the season, the lone new thread for 2026. After debuting a navy and royal colorway with last names stitched on the back last year, the Cougars had eight different uniforms in 2025, with four royal accented jerseys and four navy accented threads. BYU was 21-8 last season in royal and 10-8 in navy. The Cougars' individual record in each jersey this season is as follows:

EAKIN AT A GLANCE

Eakin is entering his 24th season as the Cougars' head coach and his 27th season at BYU overall. He was named head coach in July 2002 after working as an assistant coach since the softball program's inception in 2000. Since that time he has led the Cougars to eight West Coast Conference championships, five Mountain West Conference championships, one Western Athletic Conference tournament championship and 16 NCAA tournament appearances.

The five-time WCC Coach of the Year has coached 21 All-Americans, 16 conference players of the year, 12 conference freshmen of the year, eight conference pitchers of the year and four conference defensive players of the year during his tenure.

He led BYU to one of its most successful seasons in 2017, reaching 46 wins, tied for the most in program history. The Cougars were ranked for 12 weeks of the season and had a program-best 22-game win streak.

After going 42-10 in 2022, Eakin helped BYU to a 35-17 finish last year, culminating with a 3-1 record at the National Invitational Softball Championship (NISC) in Fort Collins, Colorado, where BYU advanced to the tournament's title game before falling to eventual champion Iowa.

In 2010, Eakin guided the Cougars to 46 wins, the most in school history, as BYU advanced to the NCAA Super Regionals for the first time ever with wins over East Carolina and host Texas before ending its season at national runner-up Arizona. The Cougars finished second in the country in batting average, seventh in scoring and ninth in slugging percentage as a team.

Known as one of the best hitting coaches in the country, Eakin has helped BYU finish in the top ten nationally eight times in slugging percentage, seven times in home runs per game, five times in batting average and five times in scoring.

In addition to his duties at BYU, Eakin was also an assistant coach and hitting coach for the USA National Team in 2009. In the summer of 2010, Eakin helped guide the National Team to a 17-2 record as USA won the World Championship in Venezuela, the World Cup in Oklahoma and the Japan Cup championship in Sendai, Japan.

Before entering the coaching ranks, Eakin was a successful baseball and softball player. After playing collegiate baseball at the University of Utah, Eakin signed with the Oakland Athletics organization where he played for three years.

Eakin went on to join the United States All-Star team, playing in three U.S. Olympic sports festivals in 1986, 1993 and 1994, winning bronze, silver and gold, respectively. While on the team, Eakin was honored on the ISC All-World First Team and was an ASA All-American. He would later play shortstop on the internationally ranked Larry H. Miller Toyota Fast Pitch team, eventually earning induction into the Utah Fast Pitch Hall of Fame in 1998.

A native of Holladay, Utah, Eakin graduated from Granite High. He currently resides in Sandy, Utah, and is married to Barbi. They are the parents of three children (Alicia, Ryan and Parker) and have 11 grandchildren.

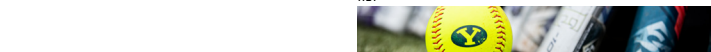

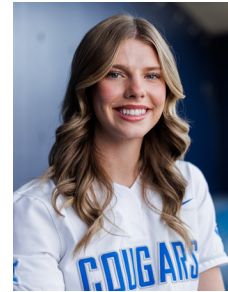
