#### ON-COURT SUCCESS

A "players-first" coach whose biggest goal is helping people reach their dreams, John Calipari, a Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer, reached 900 career wins with an overtime in the 2025-26 regular-season finale, while guiding six teams to the Final Four and helping 62 players earn selection in the NBA Draft during his 34-year college coaching career with his pros amassing over \$5.8 billion in contracts.

Calipari took UMass to the Final Four in 1996, guided Memphis to the National Championship game in 2008 and led Kentucky to four Final Fours - including the 2012 National Championship and a runner-up finish in 2014 - to become **only the second coach in NCAA history to lead three different schools to the Final Four**. He has racked up 24 NCAA Tournament appearances and numerous National Coach of the Year honors.

In his first two years at Arkansas, Calipari led the Razorbacks to a back-to-back Sweet 16 appearances and **became just the third coach in NCAA history to take four programs to the Sweet 16**. He won the 2026 SEC Tournament Championship for his 16th conference tourney title and become **the first coach to win SEC championships at two different schools**. Coach Cal helped Darius Acuff Jr. become the most decorated player in school history as he was a finalist for the 2026 National Player of the Year, the Bob Cousy Award winner, unanimous first team All-America and SEC Player of the Year.

At every collegiate stop, Calipari's career has been successful throughout, but his 10-year stretch at Kentucky (2009-19) was among the best decades in NCAA history, reaching four Final Fours (with a 2012 championship and 2014 national runner-up), seven Elite 8 berths and nine trips to the Sweet 16.

The 2015 campaign was highlighted by Coach Cal directing the first-ever college basketball team to own a 38-0 record (before falling in the Final Four) and became one of just three coaches to make four Final Fours in a five-year span. At the end of that 2015 season, Calipari became the 96th coach to join the **Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame**.

Coach Cal has **led three teams to an NCAA-record 38 wins on the court in a season** (once at Memphis and twice at Kentucky), led the NCAA in wins six times (at least once at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky) and tallied 30, 20-win seasons (including 11 30-win campaigns). With his sustained success, Coach Cal received the John R. Wooden Award Legends of Coaching honor in 2024.

While building a program out of obscurity at UMass and returning Memphis and Kentucky to national contenders, he has totaled the second-most wins in NCAA history in the first 20 years of a college coaching career.

#### PLAYER SUCCESS

In his goal to lead a players-first program, he has helped **77 players realize their dreams by being drafted or playing in the NBA**. Calipari's NBA players have **amassed over \$5.8 billion in contracts**, which does not include endorsements nor players that have played overseas. He has had four No. 1 overall picks, tying for most overall, among his **62 players drafted and 43 first-round picks**, both ranking second-most all-time. In 2010, he had a record five first-round draft picks. Two years later, six of his players heard their names called at the 2012 draft, the most in the two-round draft era. Then in 2015, Cal would have six picks again, including a record-tying four lottery selections.

Calipari's players have entered the league NBA-ready. His players have garnered 43 All-Star selections, including a record-breaking seven in 2024, with Anthony Davis winning the game's MVP honor in 2017. **Derrick Rose was named NBA MVP in 2011 and Shai Gilgeous-Alexander was voted NBA MVP in 2025 and 2026 to make Cal just the third person to coach two NBA MVPs in college** (with John Wooden and Dean Smith). Nine of his players have been tabbed All-NBA (a combined 21 times), three have been named NBA Rookie of the Year and 18 players have made the NBA All-Rookie teams. **He is the only coach in history to have a player win each of the NBA's major honors: MVP (three times), Rookie of the Year, Most Improved Player, Sixth Man of the Year (twice) and Clutch Player of the Year (twice)**.

Much like he did at UMass, where his players graduated at nearly 80%, Calipari has stressed academics. Seventeen of his last 20 seniors at Memphis earned their bachelor's degrees, and all 31 players at UK who were eligible to graduate by the end of their senior years walked away with a diploma in hand, including five players who earned their degree in just three years. Calipari's teams routinely have posted a combined team grade-point average of 3.0 or better.

#### COMMUNITY SUCCESS

Calipari has raised millions of dollars to help the lives of those in need. He has had a particular passion to assist those impacted by natural disasters. For instance, in 2010, he used a telethon to raise more than \$1 million for victims of the devastating earthquake in Haiti. He followed that up with telethons in 2012, raising \$1 million for victims of Superstorm Sandy, in 2017 for victims of Hurricane Harvey, played a leading role in the "Kentucky United" efforts that generated more than \$5 million for victims of devastating tornadoes in Western Kentucky in 2021, and raised nearly \$4 million with the Kentucky Flood Relief Telethon and open practice at Rupp Arena in 2022. In his second month on the job at Arkansas, Cal helped with cleanup efforts after tornadoes hit the state. He has continued the Suits & Sneakers Gala in NW Arkansas and continued his tradition of helping families at Christmas with food, presents and paying for rent.

Calipari launched his **THE CALIPARI FOUNDATION** in 2012 and has worked with several key partners to donate more than \$1.5 million, a figure that does not include matching funds that have been contributed from individuals and corporations. In 2013, Calipari initiated hosting an annual alumni weekend around his basketball fantasy experience with the intent to raise money for charity. After generating \$350,000 for selected organizations and charities during the inaugural game, the weekend has generated millions of dollars for charity since its inception.

In 2019, when federal workers were without pay due to a government shutdown, he, his wife and his foundation assisted workers with financial help and grocery gift cards. He and his wife, Ellen, teamed up with Fayette County Public Schools to help families in need during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Additional efforts include spearheading the creation of the **JOHN McLENDON MINORITY LEADERSHIP INITIATIVE**, a nationwide coach-driven initiative to provide minorities a jump-start to their careers through practical experiences, opportunities to build their network and instilling the values of John McLendon: integrity, education, leadership and mentorship. Participants in the initiative will be known as MLI Future Leaders. **In 2026, the McLendon Foundation honored Coach Calipari with the 2026 Legacy of Impact Award**.

He was awarded the Jefferson Award for Outstanding Public Service in Sports by Multiplying Good in 2022. For more than 50 years, Multiplying Good has honored those who put others first. Those receiving the Jefferson Award are empowered to do more, while their stories of extraordinary public service inspire others to action. It is an award that underscores impact. He earned the Race Amity Medal of Honor in 2023.

#### OTHER SUCCESS

In 2017, Coach Cal was named the head coach of the 2017 USA Basketball Men's U19 World Cup Team, which finished third at the 2017 FIBA U19 World Cup in Cairo. Also, he won gold as head coach of the 2012 Dominican Republic team at the Centrobasket Championship.

Author of five books, including the New York Times Best Seller "Players First: Coaching from the Inside Out," Calipari is a master of communication and maximizing talent. He lives by the motto that **"it's never a matter of how far you have fallen, but instead it's about how high you bounce back."**

- Calipari is the winningest coach in NCAA Division I history for a five-year span with 173 victories from 2008-12.
- Calipari is the first coach in NCAA Division I history to record five straight 30-win seasons.
- Calipari is one of only two coaches (Rick Pitino) to lead three different schools to a Final Four.
- Calipari is one of four coaches (Eddie Sutton, Lon Krueger and Rick Pitino) to lead four different schools to the Sweet 16.
- Calipari has advanced to the Sweet 16 in 13 of the last 19 NCAA Tournaments played and on to the Elite Eight 10 times.
- Calipari is one of only three coaches (John Wooden and Mike Krzyzewski) to go to four Final Fours in a five-season span.
- Calipari is one of two coaches to have three teams listed on The Athletics' 25 best college basketball teams from 2000-25 (7/16/25). HE IS THE ONLY COACH to have two teams among the top five and the only coach to lead two different programs on the list – Memphis 2007-08 at #20, Kentucky 2014-15 at #4 and Kentucky 2011-12 at #2.
- Calipari had more wins in a 10-year period than any other coach in college basketball history with 327 from 2006-15.
- Calipari was the third-fastest coach to 900 on-court wins, doing so in 1,185 games. Only Roy Williams (1,161 games), and Mike Krzyzewski (1,183 games) did it faster.
- Calipari's 32 combined regular season and tournament league titles trail only Mark Few (43) of Gonzaga for most among active coaches.
- Calipari's 61 NCAA Tournament wins are tied for the most by active coaches (Tom Izzo) and tied for fifth-most all-time.
- Calipari has helped 62 players earn selection in the NBA Draft, including 43 first-round picks, and has had at least one player selected in 18 straight years, with 11 times having three players drafted, including five times with at least four. He ranks third all-time with his 62 NBA picks (Coach K had 74 and Dean Smith 65) while Cal's 62 1st & 2nd Rd picks are second-most all-time (Coach K's 66) as are his 43 1st rounders (Coach K's 46). Only Dean Smith has a longer streak of consecutive years of having a player drafted at 23 years.

## CALIPARI 3RD FASTEST TO 900 CAREER VICTORIES

With Arkansas's overtime 88-84 win at Missouri on Feb. 7, 2026, John Calipari reached 900 on-court wins. He is the fifth coach to collect 900 wins as head coach while at an NCAA DI program and is 1 of 11 to have 900 on-court wins coaching at any level.

Calipari is the **third-fastest coach to reach 900 wins** (1,185). Roy Williams (1,161) and Mike Krzyzewski (1,183) reached the milestone faster. Cal is the **second-youngest to reach 900**. Coach K won 900 games at the age of 64. Cal turned 67 on Feb 10 and edges Bob Knight, who won his 900th at 67 and 2+ months.

Calipari was the fourth-fastest coach to 800 on-court wins at 1,037 games. Only Adolph Rupp (972 games), Roy Williams (1,012 games) and Dean Smith (1,029 games) did it faster.

**NOTE: Coach Cal's 800th win and his 900th win were both in overtime. Cal was the fourth-fastest to 800, beating Mississippi State, 82-7, on Jan. 25, 2022.**

When he defeated Mississippi State on Jan. 17, 2024, Calipari became the third-fastest active head coach to 400 wins at a single program, trailing only Bill Self (Kansas - 484) and Mark Few (Gonzaga - 499). Overall, Calipari needed just 516 games to reach 400 wins while coaching at UK to rank the eighth fastest in Division I history.

## FIRST BALLOT HALL OF FAMER

John Calipari joined basketball's fraternity of legends in **September of 2015 after being elected to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame** on the first ballot. Calipari joined an elite group of basketball players and coaches in the Naismith Hall of Fame, considered to be one of the ultimate honors in the sport.

The Class of 2015 included Calipari, Dick Bevetta, Louie Dampier, Lindsay Gaze, Tom Heinsohn, John Isaacs, Spencer Haywood, Lisa Leslie, Dikembe Mutombo, George Raveling and JoJo White. Calipari was inducted in Springfield, Mass., and nearly 70 of his former players joined him on stage during his acceptance speech.

## COACH CAL IMMORTALIZED AT UMass, CLARION, CONFERENCE USA

John Calipari's Hall of Fame rise began at **UMass**, and the school honored his program's breakthrough in the 1990s by unveiling a statue of Calipari on the Amherst campus in September 2021. Calipari was one of four icons synonymous with UMass basketball to earn the honor. Calipari's statue was unveiled next to Marcus Camby, Julius Erving and the late Jack Leaman outside the Mullins Center.

At UMass, Calipari led the Minutemen to a 193-71 on-court record in his eight seasons as head coach from 1989-96. His .731 career winning percentage remains the best in school history. Calipari led UMass to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 1992 to 1996 after UMass had gone to the NCAAs only once in the first 81 years of the program. His Minutemen made the Atlantic 10's first and only Final Four appearance during the 1996 season, during which they went 35-2 overall and spent 10 weeks ranked No. 1 in the nation. Following the 1996 season, Calipari was named National Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches, The Sporting News and Naismith.

**Clarion** honored Calipari by having a statue erected and naming the basketball court in his honor. Tippin Gymnasium's floor was officially renamed the John V. Calipari Court in September 2021 and is better known as "Coach Cal Court." Calipari started his college playing career at UNC Wilmington before transferring to Clarion in 1981, helping the Golden Eagles reach their first NCAA Division II Tournament in program history that year.

In the summer of 2022, Calipari was enshrined into the **Conference USA** Hall of Fame. Calipari was honored by the league for his impressive tenure as head men's basketball coach at the University of Memphis, where he coached from the 2000-09. Calipari led the Tigers to the 2008 NCAA title game, including an NCAA, single-season record 38 wins. As a result, he earned his second Naismith National Coach of the Year honor, becoming only the second coach to earn the honor multiple times since its inception in 1987. Calipari, the 2009 Sports Illustrated National Coach of the Year, led the Tigers to nine straight 20-win campaigns and nine consecutive postseason appearances, the only Memphis coach to do that. He posted 252 on-court wins - 28.0 wins per season - as the Tigers' head coach, making him the winningest coach in school history. From 2006-08, the Tigers won 104 games, making Calipari the winningest head coach in NCAA Division I history in a three-year span.

## A WOODEN AWARD LEGEND OF COACHING

On Oct. 3, 2023, it was announced that John Calipari would receive the **John R. Wooden Award "Legends of Coaching" honor**. On April 12, 2024, the newly named Razorback head basketball coach was on hand for the trophy presentation at the Los Angeles Athletic Club.

The "Legends of Coaching" honor recognizes coaches who exemplify Coach Wooden's high standard of coaching success and personal integrity. The award was adopted by the Wooden Award Steering Committee in 1999. The honorees are selected based on character, success on the court, graduation rate of student-athletes in their basketball program, coaching philosophy, and identification with the goals of the John R. Wooden Award. He will be presented the honor along with the 2024 Wooden Award winners on April 12, 2024.

Chairman of the Wooden Award Steering Committee Sam Lagana said, "Coach John Calipari has been a significant part of the Wooden Award experience, dating back to his first head coaching assignment at UMass. He has supported the Award and stood with his candidates and winners every step of the way. Coach Wooden had an appreciation for Coach Cal that carried through the years and Coach Calipari has demonstrated great reverence for Coach Wooden as both shared a 'players first' mentality, with emphasis on care for the student-athlete and in the value of competitive greatness. John Calipari is a wonderful addition to the fraternity of Wooden Award 'Legends of Coaching' recipients."

Calipari's on-court success is well publicized and culminated with the highest honor in the sport by being inducted into the Naismith Hall of Fame. Off the court, Coach Calipari's impact has been felt in his community and abroad. In 2012, he founded the John Calipari Foundation which has partnered with many organizations, including: Samaritan's Feet, 4 Paws for Ability, One Parent Scholar House and Team Focus. He has partnered with the American Red Cross to raise millions of dollars to help people affected by disasters such as the 2010 Haitian earthquake, 2012 Superstorm Sandy, and the 2022 flooding in Eastern Kentucky. He helped spearhead the creation of the John McLendon Minority Leadership Initiative, a national coach-driven initiative to provide minorities with a jump-start to their careers.

## CALIPARI HONORED BY McLENDON FOUNDATION WITH 2026 LEGACY OF IMPACT AWARD

The McLendon Foundation is pleased to announce that John Calipari, head basketball coach at the University of Arkansas, has been selected as the **2026 recipient of the Legacy of Impact Award, the Foundation's highest honor. The award will be presented at the second-annual Secret Summit on Thursday, April 2, 2026**, in downtown Indianapolis ahead of the 2026 Men's Final Four weekend.

The Legacy of Impact Award recognizes individuals whose leadership and actions have meaningfully advanced the values and vision of Coach John McLendon, one of the most influential figures in the history of sports. Coach McLendon was a trailblazer whose legacy centered on access, education, leadership, and opportunity both on and off the court.

Coach Calipari was selected by the McLendon Foundation Board of Directors for his commitment to creating opportunities and opening doors for aspiring leaders in sports. He was instrumental in the early vision and formation of the McLendon Leadership Initiative and has supported the program through advocacy, personal investment, and the encouragement of others across the coaching community to engage and contribute.

## DREAM MAKER

As someone who prides himself on helping young men reach their dreams, John Calipari has helped 77 players get drafted or play in the NBA as free agents, including 62 players going in the NBA Draft.

- ^ **62 NBA Draft picks ranks third all-time, trailing only Mike Krzyzewski (74) and Dean Smith (65)**
- ^ **62 1st and 2nd round draft picks rank second all-time, trailing Mike Krzyzewski (66) ... Roy Williams has the third-most (32)**

Eleven of his former players have combined to earn 48 NBA All-Star honors, 10 have been tabbed All-NBA (21 times), three were named NBA Rookie of the Year, and 19 players have made the NBA All-Rookie teams. Derek Rose was named NBA MVP in 2011 and Shai Gilgeous-Alexander was the NBA MVP in 2025 and 2026.

## CHANGING FAMILIES LIVES ... \$5.8 BILLION AND COUNTING

John Calipari hasn't just signed the best talent in the country; he's been the best at developing that talent, making those players better prepared than anyone else and getting them ready for all things at the next level. The proof is in the numbers.

Entering the 2025-26 NBA season, **Calipari's NBA pros will have amassed over \$5.898 billion in NBA contracts over their careers**, which does not include endorsement deals or players on overseas contracts. Through 2024-25 his players on NBA rosters have tallied over \$2 billion alone. For the 2025-26 NBA season alone, **Cal's players are set to earn over \$563 million.**

## CALIPARI UNRIVALED IN CONFERENCE

John Calipari has **won a combined 16 league regular-season championships** in his career (including six Southeastern Conference titles). Calipari has **won a combined 16 conference tournament titles** in his career (seven in the SEC - **one while at Arkansas**) 10 more than his closest competitor (Nate Oats with five).

Cal has tallied a **427-145 (74.5%) all-time record within conference play** as a head coach including a **219-80 (73.2%) SEC record**.

Although he's been publicly outspoken against conference tournaments - only because he doesn't favor playing three or more games on consecutive days to win the tournament - his teams have gotten up for them. **Calipari's teams at UMass, Memphis and Kentucky have been to 19 conference championship games in his career, winning a remarkable 15 of them.** Calipari is 59-17 (77.6%) all-time in conference tournaments, including 25-9 (73.5%) in the SEC. Calipari's 25 SEC Tournament wins ties for third all-time.

## THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

John Calipari-coached teams have posted an **all-time record of 502-63 (88.8%) record at home** (28-5 at ARK - 16-1 in '25-26).

Calipari's best home winning streak came when he began his career at UK with a 54-game home win streak at Rupp Arena. He additionally had a 42-game home win streak at UK (2014-17).

He has gone undefeated at home 10 times overall - adding eight times with just one loss - while going undefeated at home in league play 14 times.

## LIFE AWAY FROM HOME ISN'T SO BAD EITHER

As good as John Calipari's team's have been at home, they're pretty good in hostile environments on the road. His teams are **224-142 (61.3%) overall on the road** (9-11 at ARK).

**At neutral-site venues, his teams are 179-81 (68.8%)** - 12-7 at ARK - 7-3 in '25-26 - with 6 seasons with at least 10 neutral-site wins.

## CALIPARI IN ELITE COMPANY WITH CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS

When Kentucky clinched a share of the 2017 Southeastern Conference championship, John Calipari became the first NCAA Division I coach to lead three different programs (UMass, Memphis, Kentucky) to five on-court, regular-season league titles three different times.

- ^ UMass won five Atlantic 10 titles (1992, '93, '94, '95 and '96).
- ^ Memphis claimed five Conference USA crowns (2004, '06, '07, '08 and '09).
- ^ Kentucky captured the SEC Championship six times (2010, '12, '15, '16, '17 and '20).

**When Arkansas won the 2026 SEC Tournament, Calipari became the first coach to win SEC Tourney titles at two difference programs.** With his 16 total conference tourney championships, Calipari has 32 combined regular-season and tournament championships. That trails only Mark Few of Gonzaga (43 titles) and Kentucky's Adolph Rupp (41) for the most combined championships. Bill Self (Kansas) has 31 combined titles.

## CALIPARI AT NO. 1

John Calipari is one of just two coaches (Frank McGuire) to lead three programs to a No. 1 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25. Calipari has led 10 of his teams to a No. 1 AP ranking.

- ^ His teams are 110-13 (89.4%) as when ranked #1 by AP #1, including 69-8 at UK, 32-4 at UMass and 9-1 at Memphis
- ^ His 110 victories are the most among active coaches with victories at No. 1

## CALIPARI RECEIVED 2022 JEFFERSON AWARD

John Calipari received the **Jefferson Award for Outstanding Public Service in Sports by Multiplying Good** on Nov. 2, 2022. Underscored by more victories than any other coach or program, more Final Four appearances, a record number of NBA Draft picks and the 2012 national championship, John Calipari was named the **College Basketball Coach of the Decade by Sporting News** in January 2020.

Calipari is one of two coaches (with Coach K) to have three teams listed on **The Athletics' 25 "Best College Basketball Teams from 2000-25"** (7/16/25). He is the only coach to have two teams among the top five and the only coach to lead two different programs on the list - Memphis 2007-08 at #20, Kentucky 2014-15 at #4 and Kentucky 2011-12 at #2.
