TAR HEEL TIDBITS

The Matchup

- Carolina and Arkansas are set to meet for the first time since 2023 where the Tar Heels picked up a 3-1 win.
- The Tar Heels will make the trip to Fayetteville for the first time in seven seasons. Last time UNC faced Arkansas on the road, they dropped the match, 2-0. The match in 2019 is the only loss Carolina has had against Arkansas.
- Carolina has outscored Arkansas 24-3 all time.
- The Tar Heels have shut out the Razorbacks in three previous matchups while only allowing one goal in the other three meetings.
- Team Leaders
 - » Bella Devey leads the nation in total goals with five and points with 10. She was tabbed ACC Offensive Player of the Week Aug. 18.
 - » Summer Denigan recorded a brace in the team's second match of the season while dishing out two assists.
 - » Hope Munson has compiled three goals and two assists this season. She recorded her first career brace in the season opener.
 - » Zoe Susi and Aniyah Nurse-Whyte have each recorded a goal for Arkansas this season. Susi's goal came from the team's only penalty kick attempt so far this season.
 - » Jordyn Bryant has recorded the Razorbacks' lone assist this season.

Last Time Out ... No. 8 Carolina women's soccer hosted Quinnipiac Sunday afternoon where the Tar Heels picked up a dominant 8-0 win.

The UNC offense put together another impressive performance with five different Tar Heels contributing to the team's eight goals.

Carolina had two early chances to score but just missed the mark. Staying on the attack, Hope Munson found Bella Devey in front of the 6-yard box to net the first goal of the day in the ninth minute.

Just two minutes later, Summer Denigan dished the ball to Munson who blasted a shot to the upper right corner of the goal. The defender's goal extended the Tar Heels' lead to 2-0.

UNC continued to pour it on as Devey netted her second goal of the day in the 13th minute off a header. The goal marked Devey's second straight brace this season.

Devey continued to set the tone on the offensive end as she added her third goal of the match less than one minute later. Scottie Antonucci found the striker sprinting full speed ahead inside the 18-yard box. Despite the Quinnipiac goalkeeper attempting to make a play, Devey slipped the ball past her to secure the goal.

Quinnipiac was able to slow the Carolina offense down just enough to prevent another goal in the first half. The Tar Heels headed into the break up 4-0.

In the 54th minute of play, Munson played a cross to Lilliah Blum at the left corner of the 6-yard box. Blum took a couple touches to line up her shot and then recorded her first goal as a Tar Heel. The senior's goal put Carolina ahead by five early in the second half.

A foul on the Bobcats in the 66th minute resulted in a penalty kick for UNC. Denigan stepped up to take the PK, but the Quinnipiac goalkeeper made a diving save to prevent the goal. Despite the initial save, the ball bounced back eventually finding the right foot of Denigan to net Carolina's sixth goal of the day. Her goal marked the first of her career here in Chapel Hill.

The Bobcats got their best look of the day in the 70th minute. Tatum O'Brien's shot nearly missed the goal after hitting the top

right cross bar keeping Quinnipiac scoreless.

Denigan later found the ball inside the 18-yard box where she drilled a shot right past the keeper. The goal extended the Tar Heels' lead to 7-0 while giving Denigan a brace on the score sheet.

Following the previous goal, the match entered a weather delay. The teams would return to the pitch an hour later.

UNC picked up right where they left off after the delay. The Tar Heels worked to maintain possession and eventually Logan Tongberg found her opportunity to score. Her long ball secured the eighth goal of the game for Carolina while marking the first of her career.

The Tar Heels went on to claim their second straight shutout of the season, 8-0.

Rising Sophomore... After leading the nation in scoring, Bella Devey was named ACC Offensive Player of the Week Aug. 18. The weekly award is the first of Devey's career.

Across both matches of opening week, Devey tallied five goals and 10 points. Her five goals also tied her total goal count from last season. The sophomore now leads the NCAA in total goals and points to start the 2026 season.

The Draper, Utah native netted two goals in the season opener marking the first brace of her collegiate career.

Devey followed with another impressive performance against Quinnipiac. She recorded a hat trick becoming the first Tar Heel since 2021 to notch three goals in a match. The striker's three goals all came within a five-minute window during the first half of the game.

Devey's play helped lead the team to a 2-0 start to the season while outscoring their opponents 12-0.

Preseason Praise... The ACC released the 2026 Preseason All-ACC Team where Bella Devey represents UNC on the list. Devey is Carolina's top returning scorer. She notched five goals and four assists during her rookie season last year.

Izzi Stratton was featured on the watch list for defenders. Stratton was a mainstay in the BYU lineup last season leading the team with 1,900 minutes played. She also garnered All-Big 12 honors.

Graduate transfer Summer Denigan was named to the MAC Hermann Trophy Midfielders Watch List. Last season, Denigan capped off her standout career at Georgia as a MAC Hermann Semifinalist and First Team All-America honoree.

Key Returners... With a roster featuring 15 newcomers, the Tar Heels will look to the leadership and skill of key returners Aven Alvarez, Bella Devey, Riley Kennedy, Hope Munson, and Ashley Pennie.

Aven Alvarez and Hope Munson will help lead the Carolina defense this season. Munson was named to the 2025 Freshman All-ACC Team. Alvarez is set to return to the pitch after missing the remaining six games of last season due to injury. The duo has also been mainstays on the U-20 USWNT this year where they have attended training camps and competed in international friendlies in preparation for the U-20 FIFA World Cup.

Bella Devey will look to lead the Tar Heel strikers this season. While recording five goals, Devey was also the only freshman and one of just four Tar Heels to start all 21 matches last season. Three of her five goals were game winners.

Riley Kennedy and Ashley Pennie are prepped to lead in the midfield this season. Combined, the pair logged 2,706 minutes on the pitch last year while dishing out four assists. Kennedy contributed to four shutouts last season while Pennie was involved in all seven shutouts.

From the Portal... Carolina bolsters their roster for the 2026 season with three standout transfers. The Tar Heels add seniors Lilliah Blum (Utah) and Izzi Stratton (BYU) along with graduate Summer Denigan (Georgia), all who started training with the team in the spring. The transfer class ranks no. 4 in the final Transfer Portal Rankings by TopDrawerSoccer.

The trio brings high-level experience to the pitch boasting 175 combined career starts. Across their previous conferences, they all

garnered all-conference honors and national recognition throughout their career.

Lilliah Blum heads to Chapel Hill after playing the past three seasons at the University of Utah. The midfielder led the Utes with four goals including the game-winner against NC State last season. While at Utah, Blum made 57 appearances with 55 starts compiling seven goals and nine assists. Prior to college, the Verona, Wis. native was a Second Team All-State and United Soccer Coaches All-Region honoree.

Summer Denigan joins the Tar Heels after a standout career at Georgia. The midfielder recently wrapped up an impressive junior campaign where she was named a MAC Hermann Trophy Semifinalist, First Team All-America, First Team All-Southeast Region, First Team All-SEC, and TopDrawerSoccer Best XI Third Team. Denigan was also ranked no. 30 in the TopDrawerSoccer Postseason Top 100 List. As a Bulldog, Denigan appeared in 64 matches with 54 starts tallying 22 goals and 49 points. The Union, Ky. native netted 11 goals in 2025 becoming the first Georgia player in four seasons to record 10 plus goals in a single season.

Izzi Stratton rounds out the incoming transfers for Carolina. The defender heads to Chapel Hill for her senior season after previously competing at BYU. Stratton was recently tabbed Second Team All-Big 12, Second Team All-Midwest Region, and Big 12 All-Tournament. The Alpine, Utah native was an anchor for the Cougars' defense last season racking up a team-leading 1,900 minutes on the pitch and received Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week honors for the first time in her career. In her sophomore season, Stratton was named to the NCAA College Cup All-Tournament Team. Throughout her career at BYU, the defender appeared in 68 matches with 66 starts.

No. 1 Recruiting Class... In typical Carolina fashion, the program is reloading the roster with strong talent despite losing 10 members of last year's team. UNC welcomes the no. 1 recruiting class for the 2026 season, including five of the top-25 ranked players (Scottie Antonucci - no. 7, Sealey Strawn - no. 8, Cali O'Neill - no. 11, Deus Stanislaus - no. 14, Amari Manning - no. 21).

This season marks the first time since 2022 that the Tar Heels welcome the top rated

Scottie Antonucci heads to Chapel Hill from Rancho Cucamonga, Calif. The midfielder has previously competed with Legends FC where she was tabbed ECNL Southwest Player of the Year twice and a three-time ECNL All-American. Antonucci is also a familiar face on the U.S. U-17 National Team. The California native has competed in two U-17 world cups bringing home a bronze medal in 2024.

Sealey Strawn joins the team as a forward from Prosper, Texas. The forward competed with Dallas Trinity FC where she was named 2024 USL Young Player of the Year. Strawn was also an ECNL National Champion in 2023 and four-time All-Texas Conference First Team.

Cali O'Neill, a local from Durham, N.C., joins the team as a defender. O'Neill has previously played at NC Courage while making appearances with the U.S. National Team. The defender was a member of the U-17 National Team that competed in Trinidad and Tobago before being named to the 2025 World Cup roster. O'Neill also played in the 2025 and 2026 TST 7v7 Tournament.

Deus Stanislaus is a midfielder from Fort Washington, Pa. The midfielder has competed with Players Development Academy and won an ECNL National Championship in U-14. Stanislaus was also tabbed U-15 North Atlantic Conference Player of the Year and two-time First Team ECNL All-American.

Amari Manning heads to UNC as a forward from Flemington, N.J. Manning trained at Players Development Academy where she became a U-14 ECNL National Champion. The forward was also a U-13 ECNL National Finalist and U-15 Nike Premier Cup Champion. The Flemington, N.J. native also comes with experience on the U.S. Youth National Team after becoming a U-15 Concacaf Champion.

Luck of the Heels... Carolina will travel to Dublin, Ireland to play Shelbourne FC on August 28, the day before UNC's football program will play TCU in the 2026 Aer Lingus College Football Classic.

The back-to-back matchups will showcase the UNC brand internationally and provide a unique experience for Tar Heel student-athletes and fans. UNC will face the Reds at Tolka Park 2 p.m. EST/7 p.m. IST, and its trip to the Emerald Isle will mark the program's first international trip as a team since 2011, when it visited Germany for the World Cup, which included a pair of matches against Leipzig and Bayern Leverkusen.

"We're incredibly excited for the opportunity to take our program to Ireland this fall and compete against Shelbourne FC," UNC women's soccer head coach Damon Nahas said. "It presents a special opportunity for our team and university to have this experience alongside the football program. It will also be meaningful to share this experience with a former Tar Heel, Maggie Pierce, on Shelbourne — those connections are what make Carolina

women's soccer so special. We're grateful for the opportunity and looking forward to what's to come for UNC football and women's soccer in Ireland."

Shelbourne FC is a member of the League of Ireland Premier Division. The Reds will provide experienced, high-level competition for the Tar Heels as they gear up for the ACC season. Most recently, Shelbourne FC won the 2026 All-Island Cup, 2024 FAI Women's Cup, and 2025 FAI Women's President's Cup while finishing as league runner-up in three consecutive seasons.

The Tar Heels will also see a familiar face during their trip abroad. UNC alumna Maggie Pierce is currently a midfielder on the Shelbourne FC roster. Pierce returned to the club after a stint with the USL team Carolina Ascent. As a Tar Heel, the midfielder made 80 appearances over the course of her career while helping the team advance to the College Cup in 2019 and 2022.

TST Stars...The Soccer Tournament is a premier 7v7 soccer festival that brings the top players and clubs from around the world to compete for \$1 million prizes.

Carolina has had several players represent the program on the TST stage in previous tournaments. In the 2026 tournament, 12 current Tar Heels competed across various teams. Five were featured on the U.S. Women roster (Scottie Antonucci, Lilliah Blum, Summer Denigan, Bella Devey,

and Hope Munson), five others played for Sportive FC in their tournament debut as a team (Bella Gaetino, Riley Kennedy, Caitlin Mara, Cali O'Neill, and Ashley Pennie), while Liya Brooks competed for Speedy Turtles FC and Izzi Stratton with Ultrain FC.

The U.S. Women made it to the semifinals before falling to Simply Futbol FC.

In 2025, Bella Devey competed with the U.S. Women where she won TST MVP while helping the team win the tournament and \$1 million prize for the second consecutive year.

Championship Experience... This year's roster features nine players from the 2024 National Championship team, who's experience and competitive nature will help guide the newcomers.

In their freshman season, Aven Alvarez and Bella Gaetino were featured in the national championship starting lineup. The duo played all 90 minutes en route to the team securing the 23rd national championship in program history. Alvarez and Gaetino now head into their junior season.

Another returner that saw action in the 2024 College Cup is Ashley Pennie. The midfielder made an appearance in the semifinal match against Duke.

UNC in the ACC ... UNC women's soccer has been dominate both nationally and within the Atlantic Coast Conference. Carolina has won 22 of the 34 official ACC championships since the league began play in 1987. The Tar Heels were last Regular Season ACC champions in 2022 and ACC Tournament champions in 2019.

The Tar Heels lead the conference with a total of 195 selections to the first, second, or third All-ACC teams in program history.

Within the program's history, 19 Tar Heels have been tabbed ACC Player of Year. Most recently, Ally Sentnor was named Player of the Year in 2023.

Carolina heads into the 2026 season ranked no. 5 on the ACC Preseason Poll. Bella Devey was tabbed Preseason All-ACC.

The Tar Heels finished the ACC in 7th place with four players making All-ACC teams

(Thomas - First Team, Faasse and Ullmark - Third Team, Munson - Freshman).

University of National Champions ...

Across all sports, UNC has the eighth-most titles in NCAA history with 52 (13 men and 39 women). The women's soccer program owns 22 of them, plus an AIAW title in 1982 for 23 total national championships. No other Division I women's soccer team has more than four.

One of the preeminent programs across all of college sports, North Carolina's unrivaled women's soccer dominance saw nine straight NCAA titles between 1986-1994. The team's 23 NCAA championships are tied for the fifth-most by any program in DI history.

Carolina is the only team in the country to appear in all 44 NCAA Women's Soccer Tournaments since the first one was held in 1982. The Tar Heels have appeared in 32 NCAA Women's College Cups, 18 more than the second closest team.

Pro Heels... The game grows here. UNC women's soccer is known for developing athletes into successful professional players and National Team members.

After last season, the Tar Heels had three players join the professional ranks after signing contracts with teams in the NWSL. Olivia Thomas became a member of the league's newest team, Denver Summit, while Kate Faasse and Linda Ullmark signed with Houston Dash.

On the NWSL opening day, Carolina had 21 players featured on rosters across the league. UNC tied for the most alumni on NWSL opening day rosters this season.

Over 10 Tar Heels play professionally all across the world. Many of which are considered some of the best athletes in the sport. Alessia Russo continues to impress at Arsenal alongside Carolina and international standouts, Emily Fox and Lotte Wubben-Moy. Lucy Bronze is also in conversations as one of the greats while playing for Chelsea. Bronze, Russo, and Wubben-Moy all play on England's National Team and recently defended their title winning the UEFA Women's Euro 2025.

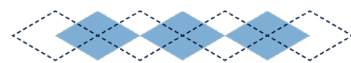

HEAD COACH DAMON NAHAS

After leading the Tar Heels to their 23rd national championship, Damon Nahas was officially named head coach of the University of North Carolina women's soccer team in December 2024. He is the second head coach in program history, succeeding the legendary Anson Dorrance. He has been part of the Tar Heels' coaching staff since 2015, first serving as an assistant coach before being elevated to associate head coach in 2021.

Along with Erin Matson (field hockey, 2023), Carlos Somoano (men's soccer, 2011) and Dave Klarmann (men's lacrosse, 1991), Nahas is the fourth UNC head coach to win a national championship in their first year at the helm.

NORTH CAROLINA CAREER

In his second year at the helm, Nahas guided Carolina to their 43rd appearance in the NCAA Tournament where they advanced to the third round. In the 2025 season, the Tar Heels tallied 13 wins with six coming in ACC play. Nahas coached Olivia Thomas who led the team with 13 goals, seven assists, and 33 points and reached All-America status for the first time in her career. Along with Thomas, he helped coach midfielder Linda Ullmark to her first All-America nod. The duo was named All-ACC along with Kate Faasse and Hope Munson.

In 2024, Nahas led the Tar Heels to a 22-5 overall record and a 7-3 mark in Atlantic Coast Conference play en route to the NCAA title. It was the 21st 22-plus-win season in program history, and seventh since the turn of the century. Prior to being No. 1 in the final poll, the team was ranked in the top 10 and NCAA RPI's top four every week. He was named TopDrawerSoccer's Coach of the Year at the end of the 2024 season.

The program reached several notable milestones in 2024 with Nahas at the helm, including its 250th regular season ACC win (Oct. 10), 950th all-time win (Nov. 7) and 150th NCAA Tournament win (Nov. 24). The Tar Heels knocked off No. 1 Duke in the ACC Tournament semifinals before defeating them once again in the NCAA College Cup semifinals, its first win over a top-ranked opponent in five years.

Nahas also produced three All-America selections, three All-Atlantic Region honorees and six All-ACC performers in 2024. Four players landed on both the All-ACC Tournament Team and All-NCAA Tournament Team, highlighted by Olivia Thomas and Clare Gagne being named the NCAA Tournament Offensive and Defensive MVP, respectively.

He coached junior Kate Faasse, who totaled just four goals in her freshman and sophomore seasons combined, to a nation-leading 20 goals and eight game-winning goals. Faasse won the prestigious 2024 MAC Hermann Trophy, presented to the United Soccer Coaches National Player of the Year. She became the eighth Tar Heel to win the Hermann Trophy in program history.

A renowned recruiter, Nahas has spearheaded UNC's efforts to sign a top-four recruiting class for ten consecutive years and has had a top-five class in all of his 11 complete seasons on staff.

Nahas, also experienced and skilled in player development, has had great success guiding players to the highest levels in the sport, both domestically and abroad. Since Nahas has been on staff, over 30 Tar Heels have gone onto the professional ranks – highlighted by a team-record 11 players signing first-division professional contracts at the conclusion of the 2023 season.

Emily Fox (2017-20) has become a mainstay on the U.S. Women's National Team, recently earning gold at the 2024 Olympic Games. Alessia Russo (2017-19) helped the Lionesses win their first UEFA Euro title in 2022 and was tabbed the England Women's Player of the Year for 2023-24. Lotte Wubben-Moy (2017-19) was a reserve player for England at the 2020 Olympics and joined Russo in the Euro 2022 championship.

Nahas has also had a hand in helping players flourish at the youth international level, with countless Tar Heels participating in U.S. Youth National Team training camps, friendlies and tournaments. Maddie Dahlien, Savy King and Ally Sentnor earned bronze with Team USA at the FIFA U20 World Cup in September 2024. A few months later, Trinity Armstrong helped the U.S. secure another bronze medal at the FIFA U17 World Cup and Sentnor made her USWNT debut.

Players who have come through UNC's program have also experienced success at the professional level – largely due to Nahas. At the 2024 National Women's Soccer League Draft, UNC set NWSL records for most players selected by a single school in the first round (3) and overall (6). Sentnor and King were the respective No. 1 and No. 2 overall selections, the second Tar Heel duo to earn the top two picks in the event's 12-year history.

PREVIOUS COACHING EXPERIENCE

Nahas brought with him extensive experience in club coaching, national team directing and player development for 15 years. He developed a U7-U11 technical academy, Next Level Academy, in 2000 which continues to be a leader in player development in The Triangle.

He also served as the technical director of Capital Area Soccer League in Raleigh, one of the most successful youth clubs in the country. He developed and executed a technical curriculum at CASL and coached teams which won two ECNL national championships, a U.S. Club national championship, a Super Y League national title, four state championships and two Disney showcases.

Beginning his national-level coaching tenure with U.S. Soccer in 2011, Nahas was the U15 girls' national team coach until 2014. Three years later, he started a stint as the U17 National Team assistant coach, a position which included scouting players and assisting with training sessions.

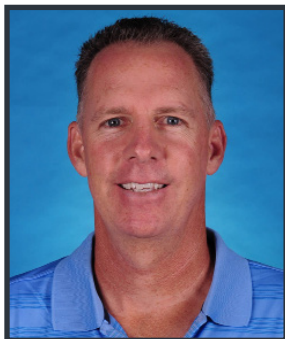
In 2014, Nahas was invited to serve as an assistant coach for the full senior U.S. Women's National Team during various camps, where he conducted technical training sessions for the team.

Among his other past coaching experiences have been stints with Cary Clarets PDL (head coach), Carolina RailHawks (assistant coach) and Cardinal Gibbons High School (men's head coach).

The upcoming season marks the 31st season Chris Ducar has been part of UNC women's soccer.

Ducar transitioned to the position of general manager in 2021 after spending 26 years serving as the goalkeeper coach. In Spring 2024, he resumed his responsibilities as an assistant coach working with the goalkeepers while simultaneously maintaining his role as general manager.

Ducar's experience as an assistant coach and recruiter was recognized at the conclusion of the 2006 season when he was named the national assistant coach of the year by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA). He also won the same assistant coach of the year award for the NSCAA's South Region that season as well as Carolina concluded a 27-1 season and captured the 2006 ACC and NCAA championships.

During his long coaching tenure at Chapel Hill, Ducar has helped lead Carolina to NCAA championships in 1996, 1997, 1999, 2000, 2003, 2006, 2008, 2009 and 2012 and to ACC Tournament championships in 14 years as well, most recently in 2017. Carolina has finished atop the ACC regular-season standings 15 times during his coaching tenure, most recently in 2018.

Ducar served as goalkeeper coach for the 1998 U.S. U21 women's national team which won silver at the Nordic Cup. He also served as goalkeeper coach for the 1997 U.S. U21 national team that won the gold medal in the 1997 Nordic Cup in Denmark.



TRACEY BATES LEONE
ASST. COACH

Tracey Bates Leone heads into her third season as assistant coach with the UNC women's soccer program.

The three-time UNC women's soccer national champion and pioneer in the sport's growth in the United States, returned to Chapel Hill as an assistant coach ahead of the 2024 season. She brings with her over three decades of coaching and playing experience at the collegiate and international level.

A standout midfielder under Dorrance in the late 1980s, Leone – then known as Tracey Bates – led the Tar Heels to three national championships (1986, 1987, 1989) and one runner-up finish (1985). She scored the game-winning goal against Colorado College in 1986.

She was named the 1989 NCAA College Cup Defensive MVP and was twice tabbed to the All-NCAA College Cup Team. Leone graduated as a three-time All-America selection, All-ACC honoree and served as team captain during her senior year.

In 2002, she was selected to the Atlantic Coast Conference 50th Anniversary Team as one of the best players in league history.

Leone played for the USWNT from 1987-91, also under Dorrance, earning 29 caps with 21 starts. She scored five goals and dished out two assists. Leone and Team USA won the first-ever Women's World Cup in 1991.

She arrives back in Chapel Hill having most recently been the head coach at Colby College during the 2022 and 2023 seasons. Prior coaching stops included Creighton, Clemson, Arizona State, Harvard and Northeastern.

Thank You, Anson Dorrance

... Anson Dorrance, one of the most successful coaches in college athletics history, announced his retirement after 45 seasons directing the women's soccer program at North Carolina. He informed UNC Director of Athletics Bubba Cunningham of his intention to retire on Aug. 9, and told the team on Aug. 11.

Dorrance, a 1974 Carolina graduate, is one of the most successful coaches in college athletics history. His 21 NCAA championships are the most by a head coach in any Division I sport in college athletics history.

The Tar Heels' first and only women's soccer head coach to date, Dorrance led UNC to a **934-88-53** record in 45 seasons (1979-2023). He also was head coach of the men's soccer team from 1977-88, when he won 172 games and guided UNC to an ACC title and NCAA Final Four berth in 1987. Combined, Dorrance's teams went **1,106-152-74** over 47 years.

UNC women's soccer has won 22 national championships (AIAW in 1981 and 21 NCAA titles), played in six other NCAA title games, finished first or tied for first in the ACC regular season 25 times and captured 22 of 32 ACC Tournaments.

The Tar Heels have played in 31 of the 42 College Cups ever played, 17 more than any other program, and are the only team to have competed in every NCAA Tournament. The 934 wins, 21 NCAA titles, 147 NCAA Tournament wins and 31 College Cups are the most in women's soccer history.

A seven-time national coach of the year, Dorrance is a member of the National Soccer Hall of Fame and United Soccer Coaches Hall of Fame. He coached 19 players who won National Player-of-the-Year honors, including three-time recipients Cindy Parlow Cone and Mia Hamm. He has also produced 29 first-round draft picks.

Dorrance led the Tar Heels to five perfect seasons (unbeaten and untied) and six other seasons with no losses and three or fewer ties. UNC set the NCAA record winning 92 consecutive matches from 1990-94. From 1986-1990, the Tar Heels played 103 consecutive games without a loss (97-0-6); following an overtime loss, the program then played 101 consecutive games from 1990-94 without suffering another defeat (99-0-2).

One of Dorrance's favorite achievements is playing more than 600 consecutive games over a 25-year period (1986-2010) when UNC either won, tied or lost by only one goal.

Dorrance was the head coach of the USWNT from 1986-94, leading Team USA to the title in the first-ever Women's World Cup in China in 1991. Fifty-nine Tar Heels have played for the USWNT. At least two Tar Heels have been on the U.S. Olympic Team each of the five times it has won gold. Fourteen Tar Heels have won a combined 21 Olympic gold medals.
