GAME NOTES

- » Arkansas has scored in 60 consecutive games, which is the sixth-longest streak in program history and the longest since a 64-game streak from Nov. 14, 1987, to Nov. 11, 1995. The last time Arkansas was shut out was Oct. 2, 2021, in a loss to No. 2 Georgia.
- » The Razorbacks' 232 consecutive extra-points made streak, which began on Dec. 5, 2020, is the longest streak nationally by date.
- » Tonight's kickoff at 9:30 p.m. CT was the latest scheduled start to a contest in program history. The previous latest kick time was 9:25 p.m. CT on Sept. 17, 2005 at USC.
- » Since 2020, Arkansas has 64 interceptions in 75 games. The Razorback defense tallied 13 interceptions in 10 games in 2020, 13 interceptions in 13 games in 2021, nine interceptions in 13 games in 2022, 12 interceptions in 12 games in 2023, 10 interceptions in 13 games in 2024, six interceptions in 12 games in 2025 and have one interception through two games in 2026.
- » **DB Christian Harrison** recorded his second career interception at the 12:17 mark in the second quarter. His first career interception also came at Utah while playing for Cincinnati on Nov. 1, 2025.
- » **WR Monte Harrison** registered a career-high three receptions for 19 yards.
- » **DB Khmori House** registered sacks in back-to-back games for the first time in his career courtesy of a third-quarter sack of Utah QB Devon Dampier.
- » **LB Bradley Shaw** led Arkansas with nine tackles in the loss. His nine tackles tied a career high initially set on Oct. 25, 2025 against Auburn.
- » **WR Ismael Cisse** registered a receiving touchdown for the second consecutive game for the second time in his career courtesy of a 21-yard pass from **QB AJ Hill** with 6:43 on the clock in the fourth quarter. Cisse initially accomplished the feat on Aug. 30-Sept. 7 of 2024. The 21-yard touchdown pass was Hill's first as a Hog.

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ARKANSAS QUOTES

Ryan Silverfield, Arkansas Head Coach

Opening Statement:

"Clearly, we were not good enough in any phase of the game. Offense, defense or special teams. Offensively, we struggled to run the football effectively and ultimately our biggest issue was not being able to complete simple passes against man coverage. We could not win the one-on-ones and when you go 46 percent passing, you are going to struggle to win football games. We have to get that fixed. The offensive line has to do a better job of protecting the quarterback but the running backs did a poor job as well. It is a combination of a bunch of things that we have to get fixed and get fixed soon. Defensively, we had too many missed tackles. When we play the triple option, I think our eyes weren't where they needed to be at certain times, and we gave up some explosive plays there. Our special teams were not good enough. All three phases. Guys in the locker room were frustrated and angry. Those are the feelings you are supposed to have. We have to find a way to quickly learn from this game and bounce back. I think all of those guys believe and they will get back to work tomorrow and come out swinging. There is no other way. One loss will not define our season. Was it a bad one? Absolutely. We are 1-1, but we lost this most recent one. How quickly can we learn from this? How quickly can we rebound and come back out this week, attacking and ready to learn and get better."

On the run game:

"It starts with the offensive line not doing a good enough job. They played man coverage almost the entire game or pressured us with a cover three. That means there is always going to be an extra hat in the box. We did a poor job. If you want teams to stop loading the box on you, you have to throw the ball effectively. Our lack of ability to throw the ball down field or beat man coverage means we are going to struggle to run the football. It goes hand-in-hand. Clearly not a good enough job by anybody."

On the play-calling:

"Anytime you do not have success on offense, it is everybody's fault. I always will say I have to do better and have to do a better job during the week of putting our guys in a better position. Play-calling, we have to make plays ultimately. Can it always be better? Certainly. If you are not scoring points like you need to and we are not executing certainly there are some things that need to be blamed there. We also have to find a way. If we can not beat man coverage, then we are going to struggle. We have to find a way. Whether it is a better scheme or finding guys that are able to do it. All of those things come hand-in-hand. Everybody gets the lion's share of the blame on that offensively."

Caden Kitler, Arkansas OL

On the offense:

"I am going to tell you the responsibility is my unit. We have to do a better job during the week, just being more intense with different looks we get. We got twisted a lot, got a lot of pressure, so we did not get hats on hats as we should. Getting two yards a carry is not our standard or what we want to do."

Joker Johnson, Arkansas DB

On the defense:

"It came down to 11 people on their field not doing their jobs. We need all 11 every time. If one person is not doing their job, we can't win games like that. Everyone has to do their jobs. A good team will take advantage, as they (Utah) did. We need all 11, not 10, not nine. It is hard to win with 11, but it is impossible to win with 10."
