GAME NOTES

- » Arkansas has scored in 61 consecutive games, which is the sixth-longest streak in program history and the longest since a 64-game streak from Nov. 14, 1987, to Nov. 11, 1995. The last time Arkansas was shut out was Oct. 2, 2021, in a loss to No. 2 Georgia.
- » The Razorbacks' 234 consecutive extra-points made streak, which began on Dec. 5, 2020, is the longest streak nationally by date.
- » **LB Ben Bogle's** nine tackles were an FBS career-high and the most since he registered nine against Indiana State on Oct. 26, 2024, while at Southern Illinois.
- » **QB AJ Hill's** 37-yard pass to **WR Chris Marshall** in the second quarter tied the longest of his career, which he initially set against UAB on Oct. 18, 2025 while playing at Memphis.
- » The Arkansas defense recorded 6.0 tackles for loss, including 3.0 sacks. The previous high of 2.0 by a Georgia opponent this season was accomplished by Western Kentucky on Sept. 12. Entering today's game, Georgia had limited opposing defenses to 3.0 tackles for loss with zero sacks through its first two games.
- » **DL Quincy Rhodes Jr.** registered his first sack of the season and the 10th sack of his career at the 3:26 mark in the first quarter. Rhodes recorded 8.0 sacks last season.
- » **WR Chris Marshall** eclipsed 100 receiving yards in a game for the second time in his FBS career. The Missouri City, Texas product hauled in seven passes for a total of 136 yards. Additionally, he had two 100-yard performances while at Kilgore College. He is the sixth Arkansas player in history with a 100-yard receiving game against Georgia, and the first to accomplish the feat against the Bulldogs since WR Treyton Burks in 2020. Marshall's 136-yard performance was the 173rd 100+ yard receiving game in program history and the most in an SEC game since Treyton Burks had 136 yards on seven receptions during a 52-51 loss at Ole Miss on Oct. 9, 2021
- » Arkansas had 12 receivers catch a pass in today's game, marking the third consecutive game this season that the Hogs had 10+ receivers register a reception.
- » **LB Ja'Quavion Smith** tallied a career-high eight tackles, including two tackles for loss and a sack. His previous career high in tackles was seven which was set on two occasions during the 2025 season while at Howard.

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ARKANSAS QUOTES

Ryan Silverfield, Arkansas Head Coach

Opening Statement:

"Thank you guys for being here. I want to start by thanking our fans that showed up, and, for an 11 a.m. kickoff, they did their part. They did a great job showing up, so thanks to them. Clearly, we didn't go out there and execute like we needed to. It starts with, offensively, the ineffectiveness to run the football. And I think, ultimately, that allows for a disadvantage of other things. I don't think the quarterback's played particularly well. We've got to make better decisions in the pass game. And then, I believe, six inopportune drops. So those things, we've got to be able to get cleaned up. We've got to be able to get them cleaned up in a hurry. Defensively, the inability to stop the run, and clearly giving up the explosive run whether that was a handoff for a 12 yard gain, or the quarterback beating us with his legs. Then special teams giving up a block punt is inexcusable. So, the guys believed before taking the field at 11:04, the guys believed at the end of the first quarter, the guys believed at halftime, and they believed going into the fourth quarter that we had the opportunities and they were going to continue to fight till the very end. I thought they played very hard, but not well enough. So I told everybody in the locker room, all 200 people involved in this organization, we have to find ways to get better. Ultimately, it will always start with me. But we have got to find ways to improve. The guys are frustrated, and rightfully so. But what I told them is we've got to continue to stick together, and we've got to continue to find ways to grow and improve. If we make steady improvements every single week and we keep building, keep fighting, good things are in store for us."

On offensive game plan:

"We had some drops. Then you look at the first quarter and the ability to move the ball with decent efficiency was there, and then, maybe a self-inflicted wound. We knew we had to be aggressive on third and manageable, because a lot of those fourth downs we were going to have to be go for it. We knew we were going to be aggressive in this ball game given where we need to go out there and execute. So, yeah, in reality, not enough, but early on, I think you got to see some flashes. You got to see some decent decision making and some of the guys making plays. Decent pass protection, but we weren't able to do so for all four quarters."

On playing two quarterbacks:

"We had decided on Monday that that's what we were going to do. The whole plan all along was to get KJ [Jackson] two series, right? And, regardless of how those went, then AJ [Hill], the next two series, and then make a decision from there. I think part of it is, what we did this past week, and clearly not to the level we needed to, or to the improvement we needed to is. What plays can KJ run well and read well, and what plays can AJ run well and read well. Not just give them a menu of, hey, here are the 250 plays we've run in this past 10 years. What else do you like? And you saw today probably 20 plays that we've never run before. Some were effective, some weren't, and we've got to continue to put them in a better position as coaches. And they've got to continue to do a better job of making decisions with the football."

Ty Lockwood, Arkansas TE

On progress from last week:

"Yeah, I think we did (make progress). I think it was a couple plays, each drive, that just kind of killed us. A couple drops, a couple missed protections. I think we got so close, and if we clean that up, I think it'll get rolling."

On two quarterbacks making a difference:

"No, we don't really notice that. I think the offense is the offense; system is a system. They both run it really well. They're both great players, they come in, and we've been doing that since spring ball. We're used to it."

On keys to get the run game going:

"I think Tuesday, Wednesday, we do a great job. We just got to figure out how to translate that to Saturdays. I think us, whatever the scheme is, us doing our jobs, whatever it is we are going to keep working on it. We do what we do. We'll come back and make it better. We are going to be focused."

On Chris Marshall's catch:

"It was unreal. I was in the flat, to the right. And I looked back, and I didn't even know he caught it at first, but then everybody started going crazy. He's an unreal player, that's what he does."

Ja'Quavion Smith, Arkansas LB

On the defense game plan:

"I feel like we came out hot. It's all it comes down to everybody just doing their job the whole four quarters. I feel like we didn't do that to our standard, and that's why the results were the results."

On Georgia's quarterback run game:

"I feel like the pressure was getting to him, so he had to break the pocket. We just have to contain him. Coverage was good, so he didn't have a choice but to run. He's a good runner, and we just have to do our job and contain."



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ARKANSAS QUOTES

On consecutive penalties leading to a score:

"We were supposed to get off the field. Two penalties never end well. Even with the two penalties, we just have to bounce back and keep fighting until they get in the end zone. We have to bounce back from it. We have to be disciplined down there."

On building defensively from this game:

"I feel like we're a very good defense. When everybody is doing their job, the whole 11 are on the same page. I feel like nobody can do anything on us. That's what it comes down to is just discipline."



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GEORGIA QUOTES

Kirby Smart, Georgia Head Coach

Opening Statement:

"I'm really proud of our guys today. Hot environment, tough environment to come in and play. We talked all week about road games in the SEC. I am proud of this team. I am excited about this team. We got a lot we can get better at, but man, they buy into it. They are physical. They believe in who we are, and we continue to get better. We've got to improve, but that is always tough to go on the road when 50% of your team is in a first-time environment. And hell, really the whole team was in a first time here, because we've never been here. So, a lot of respect for the way their team fought, but I really appreciate the way our team fought and the things we did in the game to control the game."

On the versatile play of Gunner Stockton:

"He's a weapon. A lot of those were drop back passes that become explosive plays. Any time your quarterback can take off and run, it's a value too. He's made really good decisions so far on when to run and when not to run, and also when to get down and when to take a hit."

On the run game:

"Well, we had a lot of shot plays in there. A couple of the shot plays were no plays, meaning they didn't count in the stats, because of penalties and things, but I think Gunnar does a good job making us right. Several of those were pass plays that became run plays. It's all relative to what they're doing and what they're giving us. There's certain looks we don't want to throw into, there's certain looks we want to run into. So again, the defense dictates some of that. We're going to take what they give us."

Chris Cole, Georgia LB

On what stood out offensively about Arkansas:

"They have a lot of great running backs; also their quarterbacks, both of them can run... One's a righty and one's a lefty, but we just tried to have a great practice on stopping the run."

On being prepared for two quarterbacks:

"Yes we were. The whole week, we knew the other quarterback could play so we studied both of them like they were both going to start."

Gunner Stockton, Georgia QB

On where him and OC Mike Bobo are at as far as his strengths and understanding of the offense:

"I think it goes back to practice. Repping and doing what we do. You know we do a bunch of scenarios in practice and really attacking practice."

On how big of a pick me up it is for him to hit his deep throws on line:

"It's awesome, I've done it a lot in practice, and doing it is pretty neat ahead of the game."

On what it's like to have a QB like Gunner Stockton that can move like he does:

"Yea it's awesome. To have a QB that's a little mobile. That kind of makes my job a little easier. It's awesome watching 14 take off for big play down the field like that."

On how Gunner Stockton's mobility helps the offense:

"It's kind of the new day and age in college football. A lot of people start running quarterbacks, and it kind of benefits our offense that we can do that with Gunner. We just gotta make sure we do our job giving him space."

On how it was enduring the heat today with getting more snaps:

"It was great to finally go out there a little bit longer with the guys and compete. You know it wasn't the best work I could have put out there for sure. We just continue to get better, team continue to get better."

KJ Bolden, Georgia DB

On the Chris Marshall catch and if that was one they just kinda had to shrug off:

"Yea, its football, you know. You're gonna make those type of plays. You're gonna have guys that make those type of plays. That was a great catch by that guy. Our corner ending up slipping on the play. I feel like he would've made the play, but he ended of slipping and (Marshall) made a great catch. Kudos to that guy but I feel like we did a great job playing next play and not letting that let the whole drive go downhill."
